

From the period 15 April through 15 October of each year, all civilian employees wear shirts without ties. an accumulation of clothing which would not fit anyone else; also it would present a storage problem for this detachment, since everything in the way of clothing must be stored in a dry closet to prevent mildew. The detachment would necessarily have to assume the responsibility of making certain that excessive amounts of sport clothing are not purchased which would result in an Agent leaving the command with an expended clothing allowance and a civilian wardrobe consisting entirely of sports clothes.

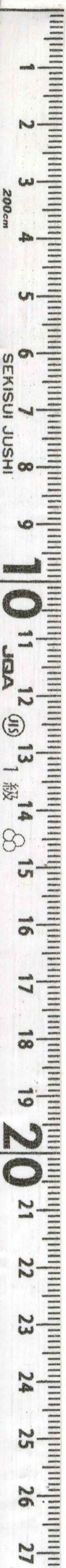

1. Enlisted CIC Agents employed in this command are now required to return to the Z.I. in uniform. As a result operational efficiency of the remaining agents is being impaired.

2. Former military informants and Ryukyans who are aboard MSTs vessels returning to the Z.I. see these agents and are corresponding with friends remaining in the command informing them of the rank of these CIC Agents.

3. The Commanding Officer, 526th CIC Detachment, has recommended that his agents who are returning to the Z.I. for reassignment be allowed to travel in civilian clothes via air. This headquarters concurs with this recommendation as it is believed this problem would thereby be alleviated.
