INTRODUCTION

This, the thirty-fourth edition of the Directory of Officials and Organizations Concerned with Wildlife Protection, is designed to meet the needs of officials charged with the administration of game laws, and for the convenient use of those who desire to communicate with officials and organizations concerning wildlife conditions in various parts of the country. It follows the same general form of previous editions, and includes only those organizations that are national or State-wide in character. Organizations whose activities are purely local must necessarily be omitted, because of the limitations of space.

Under a reorganization of the Bureau of Biological Survey, a new division, known as the "Division of Public Relations", is created, with H. P. Sheldon, formerly United States game conservation officer, in charge. The Divisions of Game and Bird Conservation and of Predatory Animal and Rodent Control are consolidated and merged into a new division known as the "Game Management Division", in charge of Stanley P. Young. This division will administer Federal game laws and regulations, including the Lacey Act. To facilitate enforcement of these laws, and to provide a more mobile field organization, the United States has been divided into eight regions, each

in charge of a regional game-management director, who will directly supervise the operations of a force of game-management agents. The regions are as follows:

No. 1 (Pacific Region).-Washington, Oregon, California, and Nevada.

No. 2 (Mountain-Plains Region).—Montana, Idaho, Utah, Wyoming, Colorado, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Nebraska.

No. 3 (Southwestern Region).-Arizona, New Mexico, Kansas, Oklahoma, and Texas.

No. 4 (West Central Region).-Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa, Illinois, and Missouri.

No. 5 (Southern Region).—Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee, Mississippi, and Alabama.

No. 6 (East Central Region).-Michigan, Indiana, Ohio, and Kentucky.

No. 7 (Southeastern Region).—Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida.

No. 8 (Northcastern Region).—The New England States, New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware.

Communications with respect to violations of Federal game laws should be addressed to the regional directors, whose names and

addresses will be found on page 2.

Persons contemplating hunting or fishing trips are advised to obtain full information concerning the hunting and fishing laws of the States they expect to visit. These laws are published in pamphlet form, and may be obtained upon request to the proper State game official.
