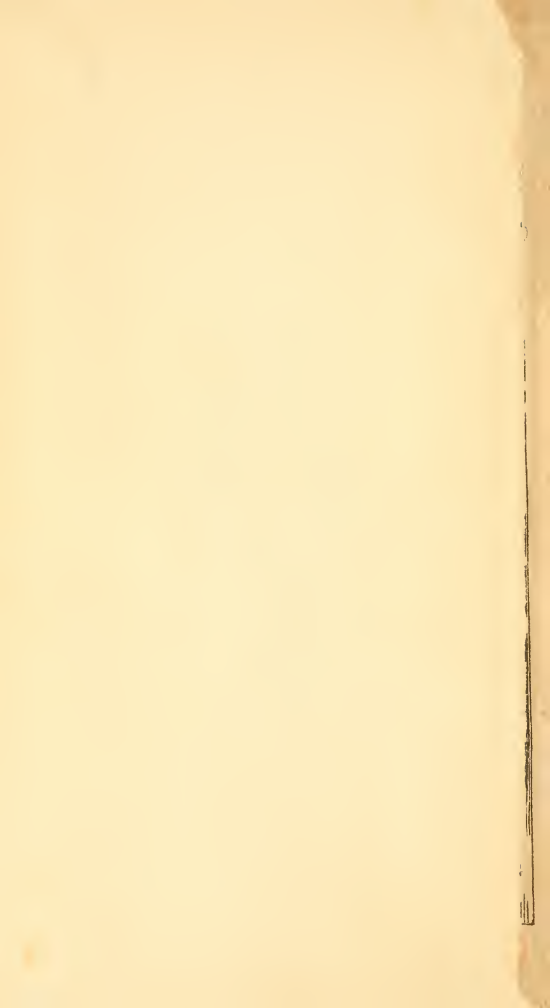

Autumn begins—Sun enters Libra - - - -	Sept. 22, 5 18 Eve.
Winter begins—Sun enters Capricornus - - -	Dec'r 21, 10 59 Morn.

The Year 5609 of the Jewish era, commences on September 28, 1848.
 Ramadan (Month of Abstinence observed by the Turks) commences on August 1, 1848.
 The Year 1265 of the Mohammedan era commences on Nov. 27, 1848.

ECLIPSES, TRANSIT OF MERCURY, ETC.

In the Year 1848, there will be six eclipses, four of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

I. March 5.—An eclipse of the Sun, invisible at Philadelphia, Pittsburg, and Cincinnati; visible in the New England States, the northern parts of the States of New York, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, in Michigan, and throughout British America.

II. March 19.—A total eclipse of the Moon, invisible at Philadelphia; partly visible at Boston, Mass., and throughout the eastern parts of New England.

III. April 3.—An eclipse of the Sun, invisible throughout the United States.

IV. August 28.—An eclipse of the Sun, invisible throughout the United States.

V. September 12.—A total eclipse of the Moon, visible throughout the United States.

The phases of this eclipse, as seen at Philadelphia, Pittsburg, and Cincinnati, will be as follows:

VI. September 27.—An eclipse of the Sun, invisible throughout the United States.

VII. November 9.—A transit of the planet Mercury, partly visible throughout the United States. At sunrise, the planet will be seen, with the telescope, as a small dark spot on the sun, near the lower limb. Passing across the sun's disc from east to west, or, as seen with an *inverting* telescope, from west to east, the planet will disappear from the sun's limb as follows:

Philadelphia, at	- - - - -	11h. 26m. morn.
Pittsburg, at	- - - - -	11 7 morn.
Cincinnati, at	- - - - -	10 49 morn.

The planet Venus will be seen as *Morning star* until near its superior conjunction with the sun, July 22; then *Evening star* to the end of the year.

The planet Mercury may generally be seen above the western horizon, for a few evenings, near the time of its greatest eastern elongation from the sun; and above the eastern horizon, for a few mornings, near the time of its greatest western elongation. Its greatest elongations will occur as follows:

Greatest elongation, east,	Feb. 25; western horizon; eve.
" "	west, April 9; eastern horizon; morn.
" "	east, June 21; western horizon; eve.
" "	west, Aug. 7; eastern horizon; morn.
" "	east, Oct. 17; western horizon; eve.
" "	west, Nov. 26; eastern horizon; morn.

The planet may be distinguished from the neighboring stars by its ruddy colour and steady light.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

All the articles of the Calendar are given to *Mean Time*. In each page

The *first* column gives the *day of the month*.

The *second* column gives the *day of the week*.

The *third* (double column) gives the time of *sunrise and sunset*.

The *fourth* column gives the *length of the days*.

The *fifth* column gives the *equation of time at Noon*.

The *sixth* column gives the time of the *moon's rising and setting*.

The *seventh* column gives the time of the *moon's southing*.

The *eighth* (double column) gives the time of the *morning and evening tides*, at the port of Philadelphia.

The *ninth* column gives the *day of the year*.

The *tenth* column gives the *decimal of the year*, or the portion of the year which has elapsed since January 1st.

The last two columns afford a short and convenient method of computing *interest*. For example, suppose a promissory note for \$1012, payable in 95 days, to be given on Feb. 17, 1848; required, the time when it will become due, and the amount of interest at 6 per cent. Against Feb. 17, we have 48, the day of the year; add 95 days to this, and we have 143, which, by looking over the following pages, we find to stand against May 22, which is therefore the day on which the note becomes due. Also against Feb. 17 is the decimal .129, and against May 22, is the decimal .389. The difference, 260, is the decimal part of a year for which the interest is to be computed. Multiplying the principal, \$1012, by this decimal, .260, and the product by the rate, .06, we have \$15.79, the interest required.

Abstracts from meteorological registers are given at the bottom of the calendar pages, for the first ten months of the year 1847, and the last two months of the year 1846. These have been obligingly furnished by the officers of the Pennsylvania Hospital, and by J. A. McAllister, Esq. The first column gives the *day of the month*; the second, marked H at top, gives the highest, and the third, marked L at top, the lowest range of Fahrenheit's thermometer; the fourth gives the state of the weather.

The Senate is composed of two members from each state; who are chosen for the term of six years, by the state legislatures,—one-third being elected every two years. The House of Representatives is composed of members elected by the people,—“one representative for every 70,680 persons in each state, and one additional representative for each state having a fraction greater than one moiety of the said ratio.” The compensation of each member of the Senate and House of Representatives is eight dollars per day, during the period of his attendance in Congress; and eight dollars for every twenty miles' travel, in the usual road, in going to and returning from the seat of government.

10. The Sunday-school room of the church of the Evangelists was forcibly entered, in the night, and robbed of every thing the sacrilegious thief could lay his hands on—locks, keys, books, lamps, and mission-money.

18. The case of Charles Mosler was brought before Chief Justice Gibson of the Supreme Court. The prisoner was charged with the murder of Eva Mosler, his wife, on the 11th of May last.

19. The driver of Prof. Hodges' carriage, John Donally, was instantly killed, in Chestnut street, above Seventh, while attempting to stop some runaway horses belonging to the Baltimore Circus Company.

28. The waters of the Delaware have been blown out of the river so much that boats at high water cannot get into the docks.

30. The body of Mr. S. E. Cassiday, a Philadelphian, who perished at the wreck of the noble steamer Atlantic, 25th inst., on Long Island Sound, was brought home.

DECEMBER.

2. Four men were committed for a further hearing by Alderman Nichols, for a highway robbery of the person of Mr. Jesse Evans, on the Ridge road.

10. The handsome sloop Germantown, built at the Navy Yard, has just been placed in commission, and is ordered to join the squadron in the Gulf of Mexico.

21. Coroner Leidy held an inquest on the body of J. Leshner, recently sexton of the Universalist Church, Kensington. The examination resulted in the conviction that he came to his death by poison; verdict accordingly.

24. The subscription towards the great Pennsylvania Railroad advances steadily, and the citizens are congratulating themselves upon the certainty of its completion. The committees report upwards of twenty-four thousand shares subscribed; only six thousand more are wanted to complete the whole amount.

27. The noble Liverpool packet-ship, the "Wyoming," was brought to her wharf by the city ice-boat, which also brought, on the 25th, the brig "Paul T. Jones," her first achievement this season.

Events in Philadelphia, in 1847.

JANUARY.

1. The families of one hundred and eight volunteers have been afforded relief by the committee sitting in Independence Hall for the purpose.

4. From the 4th of July to the present time, 2100 persons have registered their names in Independence Hall, and it is calculated that 4000 visitors did not insert their names.

9. A young man named McCauley, aged 19, in turning somersets on a "springing-board," at his re-

sidence, in Camden, fell on his head and broke his neck; he expired almost immediately.

18. The Delaware river is filled with floating ice.

20. The navigation of the Delaware is now open, and vessels have no difficulty in passing up and down.

25. A Frenchman, aged 98, was run over by the cars, at the corner of Ninth and Green, and immediately killed.

26. Canvass-back ducks are now selling in our market, at \$1.50 a pair.

FEBRUARY.

5. Major Daniels was brought to this city from Kentucky, charged with having obtained goods under false pretences.

11. Hon. John Q. Adams passed through the city on his way to the seat of government.

19. A committee sits daily in the Hall of Independence to receive contributions for the relief of the starving population of Ireland; subscriptions amounting to \$2567 have been received.

20. Two notorious rogues, with the flash titles of "Jack Sheppard" and "Joe Blueskin" have been secured and committed to answer for various burglaries.

25. A man named Shrofton attempted to commit suicide by hanging himself at his residence, Tammany st., above Third. His wife discovered him, cut the rope, and saved his life.

MARCH.

2. A huge hog, weighing 1118 lbs. arrived in this city from Bridgeton.

10. Mr. T. L. Kane has been appointed clerk in the U. S. District Court, in place of Francis Hopkinson, removed.

13. Hon. W. D. Kelley took his seat as judge of the Court of Common Pleas.

25. The steam-propeller, Trumbull, left for Tampico, with government stores for the army.

27. The volunteer companies of Capts. Biddle and Bernard left this morning, for Mexico, via Pittsburg.

29. The subscription to the stock of the great Pennsylvania Railroad now amounts to three millions, three hundred and seventy-six dollars, which is more than the amount necessary to secure the charter.

APRIL.

5. It is calculated that two thousand females are now employed in this city making clothing for the army in Mexico.

11. A disgraceful fight took place this afternoon, near Eleventh and Vine, between two fire companies. Brickbats and stones were freely used, seriously injuring a number of persons.

13. Two very large elephants, be-

longing to Raymond and Waring's menagerie, were drowned in the Delaware, this morning, while attempting to swim to Camden.

14. This afternoon, Bishop Potter laid the corner stone of the church of the Atonement, Schuylkill Sixth and Sunner.

19. The entire city was illuminated, this evening, in the most splendid manner, to celebrate the glorious victories obtained by the American arms in Mexico. The streets were thronged until a late hour by admiring crowds, and the whole affair passed off quietly.

23. Charles Mosler was executed within the walls of the county prison, to-day, at 12 o'clock, for the crime of murder. Mr. Sheriff Lelar performed his painful duty with firmness.

MAY.

3. The boiler of the steamer Black Diamond burst, when near Bristol, and severely scalded the engineer.

5. Judge Rogers of the Supreme Court filed his decision in the Pennsylvania Hall case, affirming the award made in the Quarter Sessions, which gives the owners of the Pennsylvania Hall, \$22,658.27 damages. It was destroyed by a mob, in May, 1838.

7. Daniel Barret had his pocket picked of \$1175, at the corner of Market and Eighth.

8. The colors of the vessels in this port were raised in honour of the victory of Palo Alto, May 8, '46.

15. Four fires took place, this evening; all of which were extinguished with slight damage, by our ever-watchful firemen.

20. One hundred and forty Irish immigrants arrived at this port, in the ship Robert Burton.

29. The Colonel Stanton, Major Tompkins, and Secretary Marcy, three U. States steam propellers, built at this port, made an experimental trip to Chester.

JUNE.

6. The steamer Express made the extraordinary time of fifty-six minutes from Chester.

14. The jury in the case of Northerman and Davis were this morning discharged by Judge Kelley, they being unable to agree, after

having been kept out more than a week.

19. The steamer Ohio made her first trip to Cape May, laden with freight and about one hundred passengers.

22. James K. Polk, President of the United States, arrived in this city, and was received with all the honours due to the head of our government.

24. The President, accompanied by the committee appointed to wait on him during his stay in Philadelphia, visited the Mint, Girard College, and other attractive places. The entertainments of the day were closed with a levee at Major Gen. Patterson's.

25. The President left the city upon his tour north, via the Camden and Amboy Railroad, at 7½ o'clock this morning, accompanied by Cols. Florence and Christy, and Com. Stewart.

JULY.

5. The "Glorious Fourth," in the city and districts, passed off with a great degree of quietness—there having been no act to call for the interference of the police. The explosion of fire-works, during the evening, caused several fires, none of which, however, were serious.

7. The dashing hero, Col. May, left, this morning, for New York. At Walnut st. wharf, he found it difficult to get through the crowd that had assembled to have a sight of him.

13. The music of the locust was heard in our squares to-day, for the first time.

15. A destructive fire took place, this morning, at Sixth and Callowhill streets, commencing at the grocery store of Hotz and Kirkbride. The fire having gained the garret, where it appears some gunpowder had been stowed, a tremendous explosion took place, which produced an awful consternation among the residents in the vicinity.

17. Joseph C. Neal, Esq., editor of Neal's Saturday Gazette, died very suddenly, this evening, of congestion of the brain, in the fortieth year of his age.

23. The U. S. steamship Princeton, Commander Engle, bound for Gibraltar, left her moorings at the naval anchorage, this morning, a

little after 7 o'clock, under a salute from the guns of the yard, which she returned, and under a full head of steam bore down the Delaware in gallant style.

26. During the heavy thunder-storm, this afternoon, the German Lutheran church, at the corner of St. John and Brown streets, N. L., was struck by lightning and entirely destroyed.

27. Among the matters presented by the grand jury of the July term, is that of the unrestrained abuse of witnesses by the members of the bar in court.

AUGUST.

2. Scarcely a night now passes without the perpetration of some outrage by a gang of Moyamensing desperadoes called "Killers." Brutal assaults, robbery, stabbing, and murder, help to make up the catalogue of their crimes.

10. The steamer Express from Delaware City brought the first load of peaches this season from Raybold's famous orchards. The load comprised some fifteen hundred baskets, some of which sold for two dollars per basket.

16. Messrs. Bingham & Co. received from the West one million pounds of wool, to be forwarded to Mr. Samuel Lawrence of Lowell, Massachusetts.

Died.—The black dog, named Cassius; well known all over our city and county, but of special celebrity in the vicinity of Fourth and Chestnut streets, on account of his attachment to the Good Intent Hose Company, and his great activity as a runner with the carriage whenever it was taken out.

18. On the Reading Railroad the Company have now in constant use, seventy-five locomotives and four thousand five hundred coal-cars.

22. This was a day of mourning in Philadelphia.—One of the most dreadful fires that has occurred for years, took place at the corner of Bread and Quarry streets night before last, which resulted in the loss of many valuable lives. Mr. Andrew Butler, secretary of the Fire Association, and Mr. C. H. Hines, were killed by the falling of a wall, and several other firemen were badly injured. The loss of

Mr. Broom, the owner of the Sugar Refinery which was burned, is said to have been a sufferer from the amount of \$140,000, about one-fifth of which only is covered by insurance.

SEPTEMBER.

5. This morning, just before the train of passenger cars for Reading and Pottsville started from the depot in Broad street above Vine, a tin box containing several packages and parcels of money, notes and gold, amounting to between \$3000 and \$4000, was stolen from a closet in the first car of the train.

5. Another disgraceful fireman's riot took place this evening near Vine and Tenth streets. Several men were severely injured in the affray.

14. A young man, named Henry Clark, was struck on the head by a brick which fell from the top of the new six story building erecting at the corner of Front and Market. His injuries are supposed to be mortal.

24. The steamer John Stevens was on fire this afternoon, but it did little damage, being extinguished in twenty minutes.

28. George Race, the young man charged before Mayor Belsterling with being a party to the riot at the corner of Brown and Third streets on Tuesday evening last, had a final hearing, and was held to bail in the sum of \$2000.

30. A lad about eight years of age, named Henry Brown, son of a widow living in a court running from Catherine street below Third, Southwark, was missed from home

about noon on Tuesday, and this morning he was found drowned in the dock at Catherine street wharf.

OCTOBER.

1. A most destructive fire took place this morning in Pear street, causing an entire loss of property amounting to \$50,000. The principal building burned was occupied by Messrs. Eisenbrey & Co.'s Mahogany Sawing works. The whole building being a complete tinder-box, fell a quick prey to the devouring element, and made one of the most grand and awful sights ever witnessed.

4. The reception of foreign news and later intelligence from Mexico, caused great excitement in the city and filled the streets with seekers after news.

6. The colored Odd Fellows paraded to-day, and made a neat and creditable appearance.

11. Some vile fellow bespattered the dwelling of C. Gilpin, Esq., in Walnut street to-night with black paint. The Mayor offers a reward of \$500 for the detection of the miscreant who did it.

25. The annual exhibition of the Franklin institute is now taking place at the Museum Buildings in Ninth street, and deservedly attracts a large share of public attention.

28. The Cadets of Temperance paraded to-day, and listened to an address in Franklin Square.

26. The barque General Jessup was launched from the ship-yard of Simpson & Neil. She is a very beautiful specimen of Philadelphia ship-building.

General Events for Nov. and Dec. 1846.

NOVEMBER.

1. The U. S. mail schr. Stranger, W. C. Hamer, master, went ashore on the breakers off Key West, Oct.

11. Crew and passengers saved; vessel and cargo a total loss.

7. The mail pouch from St. Louis to New York of the 1st was robbed, and has not since been heard of. It has been ascertained to have

contained some \$10,000 in drafts on various houses in New York, and a large amount of money.

10. The remains of the lamented Col. Cross reached Washington on Friday last. Their passage through Baltimore was attended with military honours, and in Washington, also, the military paraded, and escorted the corpse to its place of deposit.

12. Prof. Schonbein has recently discovered a method of preparing cotton so that it will explode. Some successful experiments were made with the article last week at Washington by Maj. Talcott of the Engineers.

13. Two splendid steamboats, the *Metamora* and the *Monarch*, were lost last week on the Mississippi river, by striking snags.

Commodore Sloat brought with him to Washington the Mexican flags which were hauled down at Monterey, when taken possession of, in the name of the United States.

16. Capt. Eaton, one of the aids of Gen. Taylor, who bore to Washington the first despatches of the battle of Monterey, passed through New Orleans, on his way to join the army.

18. The Rev. Messrs. E. E. Hastings, G. Ford, W. W. Scudder, and J. E. Chandler, with their wives, (new missionaries,) and Rev. Dr. Scudder, and wife and two daughters, and Rev. Mr. Spaulding and wife, sailed from Boston, for the mission station in India.

The boiler of the steam engine in the "Oregon Foundry," owned by Messrs. Alges, Holland & Co., at Pittsburg, suddenly exploded, and was thrown an immense distance. Machinery and fragments of the engine building were scattered in every direction, instantly killing Mr. William Holland, one of the owners, and Mr. James McCrory, who was running the engine.

21. A murder of the most brutal kind was committed at Springfield, Ohio, upon the person of Mr. Peck, a bricklayer. Mr. Peck was first knocked down with a hammer, and afterward his throat was cut, and his body thrown into Buck creek.

23. Beatty's powder-mills situated seven miles from Baltimore, were blown up. Five lives were lost by the terrific explosion.

28. Great preparations are being made in Baltimore for the funeral of Major Ringgold, Col. Watson, and Captain Ridgely.

The Secretary of the Treasury has given notice that the new tariff, popularly known as the tariff of 1846, will go into operation on the 1st of December.

29. The ship *M. Evans* has arrived in New York, having on board the new and magnificent

telescope constructed at Munich, for the Cambridge Observatory. The new tariff imposes a duty on scientific instruments, of thirty per cent., and this one arrived just in season to save from \$3000 to \$4000.

30. The morning papers bring full and heart-rending details of the loss of the splendid steamboat *Atlantic*, on Long Island Sound. Soon after leaving Allyn's Point, on Thursday morning, her steam-chest exploded, and the wind at the same time shifting, blew a hurricane. After drifting for forty-eight hours, she struck on Fisher's Island, and in five minutes went to pieces, one-half of those on board perished. Among the lost were the Rev. Wm. J. Armstrong, secretary of the American Board for Foreign Missions, and her commander, the well-known Capt. Dustan. For speed, safety, and splendid decorations, this boat was not surpassed by any in the world.

DECEMBER.

10. The steamer *Telegraph* arrived at New Orleans with the remains of the lamented Major Ringgold and Lieut. Cochrane, who fell fighting for their country, under the gallant Taylor.

12. The high prize of \$100,000, in a lottery in Havanna, was recently drawn by a company of fifty negroes, who had clubbed their means to buy a ticket.

28. It is one of the regulations of the State Prison of New York that, on the retirement of the convicts from the workshops to their cells, every night, each one of them shall thrust two of his fingers through the grating in the cell door. The turnkey ascertains in this manner that each man is locked up. One of the convicts, named Oliver Kelly, has taken an ingenious advantage of this rule in order to effect his escape. He carved two fingers in wood, fastened them to the grating of his cell, and then contrived to lurk in the workshops after all the convicts had left. From the workshops, the escape was easy, and he got safely off. The trick was not discovered until the following morning.

29. The Hon. Alexander Barrow died in Baltimore, after a brief, but very severe illness.

30. More than eight hundred immigrants arrived at New York; a large portion of them were entirely destitute.

31. Thomas Billington, aged 95, died in South Kingston, on Tuesday last. He served during the whole revolutionary war, and was in many of the hardest fought battles.

The steamboat Penobscot, while lying at her wharf at East Boston, took fire, near her boiler, and before the flames were extinguished, the deck and part of the hull were consumed. The boat was worth about \$40,000, and the damage is estimated at \$15,000, on which there was no insurance.

General Events in 1847.

JANUARY.

1. During the last year, 5263 marriages were solemnized in the state of Massachusetts, excluding the city of Boston. This is an increase of 400 over the previous year.

6. It is thought that Boston will be supplied with water in two years. The work has been put under contract, and is rapidly advancing. The tunnels are progressing rapidly, and one-half of the line will be ready for the masonry by the middle of April next.

15. The establishment of Mr. W. S. Cochran, in York, Pa., was broken open and entered by thieves. Merchandise to the value of \$200 was stolen. Some suspicious circumstances having induced the belief that the stolen goods and one of the thieves had been taken to Baltimore, Mr. Cochran sent a messenger to Lancaster, from whence a message was despatched by telegraph to Baltimore, via Philadelphia—which arrived at the depot in Baltimore, in time to stop the delivery of the goods.

16. A gale passed through the city of Troy, N. Y., this evening, causing great damage.

A terrible fire took place at Norfolk, Virginia. The property destroyed amounted to \$60,000.

22. An extensive conflagration took place in Boston. About one hundred houses were destroyed.

FEBRUARY.

1. The steamship Hibernia left Boston with upwards of fifty thousand letters from this country, and as many from Canada.

3. The store at the corner of Milk and Washington streets, Boston, occupied by Widdifield & Co., opticians, and Currier & Trott, jewelers, was entered by burglars, and plundered of goods to the amount of \$11,000. The villains were arrested, but for want of sufficient evidence, escaped conviction.

The celebrated forger, Monroe Edwards, died on Friday morning, at Sing Sing prison, New York, of consumption.

16. The board of brokers in New York have appropriated the sum of \$2000 for the relief of the starving population of Ireland.

22. The great battle of Buena Vista was fought this day. The Mexican army, numbering twenty thousand men, under command of Gen. Santa Anna, was beaten in a pitched battle by Gen. Taylor, with only five thousand men, composed almost entirely of volunteers from the different states.

23. The wires of the New York telegraph were cut, about half an hour before the Cunard steamer came to the wharf at Boston.

25. Two of Whipple's powder-mills, in Lowell, Mass., were blown up. No lives lost.

26. Large collections of money, food, and clothing are being made in all parts of the country for the relief of the starving population of Ireland.

28. An exhibition of statuary by a young Buckeye sculptor, Mr. N. F. Baker, of Cincinnati, is attracting much attention in Boston.

29. Eleven hundred passengers arrived in New York from Europe, a large portion of whom are in a destitute condition.

MARCH.

4. Captain Carpender has been found guilty of the loss of the brig Truxtun, and sentenced to be cashiered by a court-martial sitting at Norfolk, but recommended to the mercy of the President, who has commuted his sentence to suspension for one year.

2. The handsome sum of \$40,000 has been contributed in New York, towards furnishing food for the famished Irish.

A notice appears in the Pensacola Gazette of the 7th of November, of the marriage of Mortimer Bright, Esq., at 7 o'clock, A. M., and of his death at 7 P. M., the same day.

4. The auditor of the city of Boston estimates the amount required for the city expenses of the present year, at \$1,208,000.

The bell of the ill-fated steamer Atlantic has been recovered and placed upon a floating chapel in New York.

8. Col. Cushing of the Massachusetts volunteers took his departure for the seat of war.

12. Henry Clay enters upon his seventy-first year to-day.

13. Vermont is strongly against licensing the traffic in intoxicating drinks; nearly or quite every county in the state having given a majority against it at the election. The result in 165 towns stands thus—No License, 16,634. License, 9,615.

18. About \$19,000 has actually been paid over to the mayor of New Orleans, for the relief of Ireland; and there are yet some sums to be collected.

At a recent Presbyterian synod, held at Wetumpka, Ala., a negro named Ellis was admitted to the ministry.

19. A person crossed the Hudson, at Albany, on the ice, in a wagon containing 1700 lbs. weight.

23. Green peas, grown in the open air, at Savannah, were offered for sale in that market.

25. The contract for the building of the Smithsonian Institute, at Washington city, has been given to Messrs. James Dixon & Co., they being the lowest bidders. They contract to build it, to supply it with furniture, and fit it up for \$205,250, being nearly \$37,000 less than the sum appropriated.

Preparations are being made at

the foot of Grand st., Jersey city, for the accommodation of Cunard's new line of steamers from Liverpool, by deepening the channel, &c.

The Dublin correspondent of the London Globe estimates the whole number of deaths by starvation, in Ireland, up to the 25th of February, at upwards of 50,000.

27. Yesterday and to-day, from two to three feet of snow fell at Pittsfield, Mass. Up to Saturday, Feb. 20th, there had been one hundred and fourteen days of uninterrupted sleighing, in that town and vicinity.

APRIL.

9. Capt. John Butler's fine company of dragoons, numbering over one hundred men, reached Harrisburg, en route for the seat of war. The members of the first city troop of Philadelphia have caused a superb sabre to be presented to Capt. Butler.

The Wilmington (Del.) Journal places at the head of its column the names of Zachary Taylor, as the candidate for President, and John M. Clayton, for Vice-president of the United States.

14. A melancholy and disastrous explosion took place this morning, about six o'clock, at the Messrs. Dupont's celebrated powder mills, three miles from Wilmington, Del. Eighteen men were instantly killed and their bodies so mutilated that only a few of them could be recognised. The press and packing houses were utterly destroyed, and about five thousand pounds of powder exploded. The buildings around were slightly injured, but the loss to Messrs. Dupont will be considerable, as the buildings demolished contained no valuable machinery.

18. The storming of the intrenchments at Cerro Gordo took place this day. The Americans under Major Gen. Scott, with twelve thousand men, completely routing Santa Anna, who had twenty thousand.

28. General Dromgoole, a distinguished statesman and orator from Virginia, expired at his residence. Gen. Dromgoole has left his entire estate, with the exception of some trifling legacies, to the children of Dugger, who was killed by him in a duel, some ten years since.

MAY.

1. The new line of steamers from Havre to New York, under the patronage of the French government, have been contracted for, and will soon commence their regular trips. They are to leave Havre every two weeks, which will give a weekly mail from Europe to this country.

9. One of the book-keepers of the Mechanics' Bank of New York has disappeared with some \$40,000, abstracted from that institution by means of false entries.

The lines of European steamers which will shortly be in operation from N. York, will comprise thirty vessels of the first class. It has been calculated that they will consume for their outward voyages alone, the enormous quantity of 113,000 tons of coal per annum.

20. A thousand new canal boats have been added, this season, to the New York canals, making in all, 3500 now in commission. Each boat is eighty feet long, and they would consequently, if formed in one continuous line, make a line of boats fifty-three miles long.

29. Gen. Taylor was nominated for the presidency by a Democratic convention held in Monmouth co., New Jersey.

30. A great race has taken place between the splendid steamboats, Oregon and C. Vanderbilt. The Oregon beat the Vanderbilt, a distance of seventy-two miles, only two minutes and a half. Running time, three hours and nineteen minutes, or more than twenty-two miles per hour.

Santa Anna's cork leg, captured at the battle of Cerro Gordo, has been brought to New Orleans.

JUNE.

1. The new steamship Washington, the first of the American line of ocean steamers, has just been launched at New York, and attracts great attention on account of her beauty and strength.

5. A riot took place at Carlisle, Pa., occasioned by a large number of negroes attempting to rescue three slaves who were arrested as fugitives from justice.

A Major Edson is exhibiting himself at New York, who is thirty-

nine years old, four feet six inches high, and weighs only thirty-five pounds.

6. Gen. Tom Thumb, noted as the smallest man of perfect proportions that has ever lived, is now exhibiting himself at New York.

Four thousand, five hundred and seventy-two bushels of strawberries have been sold in the Cincinnati market, within the last twenty-six days.

9. The ship Macedonian left New York for Ireland. She takes out twelve thousand and sixty barrels of breadstuffs for the famished population of Ireland.

A new and magnificent telescope for the Washington Observatory has been received from Bremen, and will be immediately put up, under the supervision of Lieut. Maury, the superintendent of the Observatory.

12. From Sept. 1st, 1846, to the present time, more than six million barrels of flour have been shipped from this country to Europe.

26. Colonel Doniphan, the distinguished hero of the battle of Sacramento, has arrived at New Orleans with seven companies of his regiment.

Some swindler sent a telegraphic despatch to Buffalo, giving wrong quotations of flour, upon the arrival of the steamship, which caused great excitement, both at Boston and Buffalo.

27. Proposals have been issued for thirty miles of the great Pennsylvania Railroad from Philadelphia to Pittsburg.

The tonnage of the shipping of the United States is now 2,562,084 tons; that of Great Britain is but 3,000,000.

28. The screw-dock at Baltimore gave way with a terrible crash. It will take \$25,000 to restore it to its original state.

30. The steamship from Liverpool brings accounts of the death of the great Irish agitator, Daniel O'Connell, at Genoa.

Since the 2d of April, seven thousand five hundred emigrants have arrived in N. York, most of whom were in a destitute condition.

The Mount Savage Iron Works, first ever started in this country for the manufacture of railroad iron, have suspended payment.

Jos. R. Chandler, Esq., for many

years editor and proprietor of the United States Gazette, published in Philadelphia, has sold out and retired from the editorial chair.

JULY.

3. Mr. Thomas Richards, who has purchased the splendid residence of the late Joseph Bonaparte, ex-king of Spain, at Bordentown, N.J., is about to convert it into a manufactory for glass.

About seven hundred visitors arrived at Saratoga, last week.

5. A fearful riot took place at Annapolis. The steamboat Jewess left Baltimore at seven o'clock in the morning, with over a thousand passengers on board, including the Columbia Riflemen and Eagle Artillerists; they arrived at Annapolis, at one o'clock, and every thing passed off pleasantly until the time for the departure of the boat, when some rowdies on the wharf came into collision with others on the boat, and a general fight took place. Bricks, porter bottles, and finally, fire-arms, were used. Several men were shot, and severely, if not mortally wounded.

12. Silliman's Journal for this month contains an account of the fall of several large meteoric stones in Iowa.

25. The packet-ship Enlatta, on her passage from Havanna to Galway, was overwhelmed by an iceberg. Twenty lives were lost, and the remaining sixteen escaped in an open boat, and were picked up the next day.

31. David Ames, at the advanced age of eighty-seven, died at Springfield, Mass. At one period, he held the office of superintendent of the armory, at Springfield, under the federal government, which office he discharged with great credit to himself. For more than half a century, he has been a manufacturer of paper, and was the first to introduce the modern improvements into his mill.

AUGUST.

7. The Norfolk papers record the death of Capt. J. Thompson, aged seventy-nine years. The deceased was a native of Queen Ann's county, Md., but had resided at Portsmouth since 1802. He was an offi-

cer in the Maryland line, in 1794, when under the order of General Washington, he marched his men to quell the insurrection in Pennsylvania. He also did good service during the last war with Great Britain, and was subsequently a member of the Virginia legislature.

21. In the governor's room of the City Hall, New York, Lieut. Charles G. Hunter was presented with a sword and epaulettes for having captured Alvarado and Tlacotalpam. They were presented by James T. Brady, Esq., several officers of the army and navy being present.

SEPTEMBER.

2. The melancholy intelligence was received this morning of the death of the Hon. Silas Wright, at his residence, Canton, N. Y., in his fifty-second year. Mr. Wright had been governor of New York, and a United States senator, and was unusually respected by all parties. By means of the telegraph, Mr. Wright's death was known simultaneously in Montreal, New York, Boston, Philadelphia, and Cincinnati, and intermediate places.

10. The Portsmouth (N.H.) Journal says: The great desideratum of applying steam and water power to propel common stocking-loom, on which vast sums of money and much time have been unsuccessfully spent in England, has at length been discovered, and three common looms are now in successful operation in this town.

13. The heights of Chapultepec near the city of Mexico, were this day gallantly stormed by General Scott and the American army. One thousand prisoners and an immense amount of the materiel of war were captured.

14. The beautiful city of Mexico was this day taken possession of by General Scott and his victorious army, comprising nine thousand men, all told.

30. A very large public sale of mouseline de laines, and other goods, was held by Messrs. Hagerly, Draper & Jones. The amount was nearly \$300,000, of which nine hundred cases, or two thirds, was in mouseline de laines. The entire stock of the Manchester (N. H.) factory. Considering the large

quantity sold, the prices obtained were good,—the company large.

The large and elegant steamship Hermann, the second in the line between New York, Southampton, and Bremen, was launched this afternoon. It is the intention of the company to have her ready to make her first trip some time in December, under the command of Capt. Crabtree.

The Cunard steamer Britannia having received severe injuries on her last trip from Liverpool, was obliged to go to New York for repairs. As soon as possible, she was placed on one of the screw-docks in that city, and her repairs were executed with great rapidity. On Tuesday morning, steam was got up while she was on the dock, and the moment she touched the water, she headed for sea, and sailed for her destination.

The Chinese junk which has attracted so much attention, of late, in New York, is in the keeping of the United States marshal, in consequence of the libel being put upon her by the Chinese crew.

OCTOBER.

1. Frederick Douglass, the fugitive slave, who has been over to England, and who has travelled through the Northern States, lecturing on slavery, is about to settle at Cleveland, Ohio, where he will print a paper, to be called the "North Star." He has received \$2000 from England, to aid him in establishing the paper.

9. The special convention of the Episcopal church in the diocese of Maine, unanimously elected Rev. Dr. Burgess, of Hartford, Conn., bishop of the diocese.

12. A most terrific calamity occurred at Nashville. During the prevalence of a violent thunder-storm, the lightning struck a powder magazine, and the stroke was followed by an awful explosion, which could be compared to nothing but an earthquake! At least a hundred houses were destroyed, and the loss of life cannot yet be told.

16. An Englishman who has been for some time in the employ of Messrs. Theodore Watson & Son, bakers, of Boston, decamped with

\$2646 in money, belonging to his employers.

17. As Mr. Sawyer, a young gentleman of high respectability, was riding at a very fast rate, to see a female acquaintance, in Dearborn county, Indiana, he came up against the telegraph wires, which cut his throat, producing almost instant death. The wires had been lowered for the purpose of making certain repairs on the line.

20. A box has been shipped from Jefferson city, Mo., directed to "Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, St. James' Palace, London." It was ordered by the lord steward, and contained buffalo tongues, venison hams, various kinds of game, jellies, sweetmeats, &c.

Travellers on Lake Champlain report that the high mountains in that vicinity are white with snow.

Advices have been received of the death of the Hon. Alexander Everett, United States commissioner to China, at Canton, in June last.

23. A young man, named Robert Barr, was arrested in Parkersburg, Va., charged with the commission of a crime in Augusta county. He was lodged in jail, and the next morning was found a maniac. His insanity was occasioned by the abruptness of his arrest, and the consequent fright.

A poor little girl had one of her fingers badly injured by a "straw-cutter," at the fair of the American Institute, held in New York. Her case excited much sympathy, and in addition to donations from visitors, the entire receipts of Saturday, the last day of the fair, were generously appropriated for her benefit, by the managers. From these sources she was put in possession of the munificent sum of \$1500!

28. Ten of the hands belonging on board the Chinese junk, who had received about a month's pay in advance, took a boat from her, and went ashore, at Newport, R. I., and immediately made tracks out of town. Officer Smith was put on track of them, and succeeded in arresting two of them, who are now locked up. The others took "leg-bail" for security, and their whereabouts has not, as yet, been ascertained.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

Letters composed of one or more pieces of paper, but not exceeding half an ounce in weight, sent any distance, not exceeding three hundred miles 5 cents.

Any distance over three hundred miles 10 cents.

On every additional weight of half an ounce, or any fractional excess of half an ounce, an additional postage is charged, according to the distance.

Letters dropped in the office for delivery in the same place, 2 cts. each.

Letters advertised are charged 2 cents each, besides regular postage; or if advertised in two papers, 4 cents.

Circulars, handbills, and advertisements, printed or lithographed, on paper not larger than quarto post, or single cap, folded and directed, but unsealed, 3 cents per sheet, (prepaid,) any distance; when sealed, same as letters.

Circulars on sheets larger than cap, are rated as pamphlets.

On pamphlets, magazines, periodicals, and every other kind of printed or other matter, (except newspapers, circulars, hand-bills, and advertisements,) unconnected with any manuscript communication, weighing one ounce, or less, 2½ cents per copy, for any distance. For every additional ounce, 1 cent. Any fractional excess exceeding half an ounce, to be charged as an ounce; an excess less than half an ounce, to be disregarded.

The postage on newspapers is three cents on each paper, for any distance, and must be prepaid, (except when sent from the office of publication,) or they will not be forwarded.

When the article to be mailed is a circular, pamphlet, or newspaper, it should be so enveloped as to be open at one end—otherwise, it will be charged as a letter.

Foreign Mails.—A mail is forwarded to, and received from England, via Halifax, Nova Scotia, by steamers, twice a month, during May, June, July, August, September, October, November, and December; and monthly during January, February, March, and April.

Letters for the East and West Indies, South America, Mexico, and the Pacific Ocean, are forwarded as opportunity occurs.

GIRARD COLLEGE.

(See Frontispiece.)

This magnificent institution, the pride of Philadelphia, is now entirely completed, and will be in full operation during the present year. It was founded by the celebrated Stephen Girard, and is designed for the gratuitous instruction of destitute orphans. The college now comprises five splendid buildings, of fine white marble,—has been fifteen years in building, and cost the immense sum of \$1,900,000. The main building is in imitation of a Grecian temple, surrounded by thirty-four richly fluted columns, and surmounted with exquisitely sculptured Corinthian capitals. The columns are fifty-five feet high, including capital and base; the diameter is six feet at the base; the base is nine feet in diameter and three feet high. This building, together with the others comprising the institution, was designed by T. U. Walter, Esq., and in point of magnificence and beauty is not surpassed on the continent of America.

ADMISSION OF ORPHANS.

1. As many poor white male orphans, between the ages of six and ten years, are now to be admitted into the college, as the income from the funds in the hands of the mayor, aldermen, and citizens of Philadelphia, as trustees for the college, under the will of Stephen Girard, may be adequate to maintain and educate; and from time to time, as there may be vacancies, or as increased ability from income may warrant, other poor white male orphans, between the ages of six and ten years, are to be admitted.

2. Those orphans for whose admission application may be first made, are to be first introduced, all other things concurring.

3. If at any time there shall be more applicants for admission than can be admitted, and the applying orphans shall have been born in different places, a preference is to be given—*first*, to those born in the city of Philadelphia; *secondly*, to those born in any other part of Pennsylvania; *thirdly*, to those born in the city of New York; *lastly*, to those born in the city of New Orleans.

4. Prior to the admission of an orphan, satisfactory explanation is to be given to the directors of the college, by those applying for his admission, as to the pecuniary circumstances of the orphan and his immediate relatives.

5. The guardians for the relief and employment of the poor of the city of Philadelphia, the district of Southwark, and the townships of the Northern Liberties and Penn, with the consent of the mother, guardian, or next friend of any orphan for whose admission into the college application may be made, and who may be admissible, or on their own authority, are to bind the orphan, by indenture, to the mayor, aldermen, and citizens of Philadelphia, as trustees under the will of Stephen Girard, as an orphan to be admitted into the college, to be there maintained, clothed, and educated according to the provisions and under the regulations and restrictions specified and directed in the said will, and according to any act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, made for the purpose of enabling the mayor, aldermen, and citizens of Philadelphia, as trustees under the will, to carry the intentions of the testator faithfully into effect, and also according to any ordinance of the mayor, aldermen, and citizens of Philadelphia, which may be passed under the authority of any act of said Assembly, for faithfully carrying the testator's intentions into execution.

6. The indenture aforesaid is not to define any time at which the binding is to terminate; but, nevertheless, the binding is to expire, at the furthest, before the orphan shall arrive at the age of eighteen years; or, at the discretion of the trustees, the binding may be terminated at any time when the orphan shall be between the ages of fourteen and eighteen years; and for mal-conduct on the part of an orphan, the trustees may cancel his indenture at any time whatever.

7. By the said indenture the orphan is to be bound to abide by and submit to all the regulations and restrictions which are specified in the will of Stephen Girard, or which may be made and prescribed by any ordinance of the corporation of Philadelphia, or which may be introduced by the directors of the Girard College, under the authority of any such ordinance, as fully as if he had been of legal age at the time of the binding, and had then consented to abide by them.

8. Every orphan admitted into the college is to be entitled to all the benefits thereof, according to the will of its founder; and each party to the indenture is to be entitled to relief for any breach of duty by the other, in the same manner as, and before the same tribunals at which apprentices and their masters and mistresses are entitled to relief, according to existing laws.

9. The founder of the college desired that, by every proper means, a pure attachment to our republican institutions, and to the sacred rights of conscience, should be formed and fostered in the minds of the orphans; and he also desired that all the instructors and teachers in the college should take pains to instil into the minds of the orphans the purest principles of morality. He did not, however, declare what he considered the proper means for accomplishing these important ends; but imposed upon his "fellow-citizens of Philadelphia" the serious and delicate responsibility of selecting them: this duty, it is believed, they will be anxious so to perform as to produce all the benefit anticipated by Stephen Girard.

10. The orphans admitted into the college are to be there fed with plain but wholesome food, clothed with plain but decent apparel, (no distinctive dress to be worn,) and lodged in a plain but safe manner. Their persons and clothes are to be kept clean, and they are to have suitable and rational exercise and recreation, in order that, with other effects, they may have health.

11. Every orphan admitted into the college, as soon as he shall arrive at between the fourteenth and eighteenth year of his age, and before his arrival at the age of eighteen years, is to be bound by the mayor, aldermen, and citizens of Philadelphia, by indenture, to some suitable person in Pennsylvania, in either of the occupations of agriculture, navigation, arts, mechanical trades, or manufactures, according to the will of Stephen Girard, to serve as an apprentice for the term that may be specified in the indenture; so, however, that the term in every instance shall expire when the orphan shall arrive at the age of twenty-one years; and every orphan is to be bound to abide by all the provisions of the indenture as if he had been of full age at the time of its execution.

12. The mayor, aldermen, and citizens of Philadelphia are to be the guardians of every orphan admitted into the college, while he shall remain therein; and, in case any orphan shall become entitled to any property, while resident in the college, they are to take charge of it, attend to its accumulation and preservation, and deliver it to the orphan on his arrival at full age, or to his legal representatives, in case he shall not live unto that age.

13. Those who may apply for the admission of an orphan into the college should furnish to the directors of it information as particular as possible respecting his health, and the diseases which he may have had.

HACKNEY COACHES AND CABS.

RATES OF FARE FOR HACKNEY COACHES.

1. For conveying one passenger from any place east of Broad street, to any other place east of Broad street, within the city limits, 25 cents.
2. For conveying one passenger from any place west of Broad street, to any other place west of Broad street, within the city limits, 25 cents. Each additional passenger 25 cents. Not more than four passengers to be charged for any one carriage.
3. For conveying one passenger from any place east of Broad street, to any place west of Broad street, or from any place west of said street to any place east of the same, within the city limits, 50 cents. If more than one passenger, then for each passenger, 25 cents.
4. For conveying one or more passengers in any other direction, within the limits of the pavement, for each passenger per mile, 25 cents.
5. For conveying one or more passengers, when a carriage is employed by the hour, \$1 per hour. And at the same rate for a longer period.

BAGGAGE.

1. For each trunk or other baggage placed inside, at the owner's request, and which would exclude a passenger, for each passenger that might be excluded thereby, 25 cents.
 2. For each trunk, &c., placed outside, 12½ cents. Baggage placed outside not to pay more in the whole than 25 cents.
- *.* PENALTY for exceeding the above charges, FIVE DOLLARS.

RATES OF FARE FOR CABS.

1. For conveying one passenger from any place east of the centre of Broad street, to any other place east of the centre of Broad street; or from any place west of the centre of Broad street, to any other place west of the centre of Broad street, within the city limits, 25 cents. Each additional passenger, 12½ cents.
2. For conveying one passenger from any place east of the centre of Broad street, to any other place west of the centre of Broad street; or from any place west of the centre of Broad street, to any other place east of the centre of Broad street, within the city limits, 37½ cents. Each additional passenger, 12½ cents.
3. For the use of a cab by the hour, within the city limits, with one or more passengers, with the privilege of going from place to place and stopping as often as may be required, for each and every hour, 50 cents.
4. Whenever a cab shall be detained, except as in the foregoing section, the owner or driver shall be allowed per hour, 50 cents. And so, in proportion, for any part of an hour exceeding 15 minutes.
5. For conveying one or two persons, with reasonable baggage, to or from any of the steamboats or railroads, (except the Trenton and New York railroads,) 50 cents. More than two persons, each 25 cents.

PENALTY for exceeding the above charges, or for refusing or neglecting, when unemployed, to convey any persons or their baggage to any place within the limits prescribed by the ordinance, upon being applied to for that purpose, FIVE DOLLARS.
