ARTICLES OF THE OLDEN TIMES.—This being Centennial Year there will be no doubt great effort made in all parts of our country, to collect and bring together in different localities ancient articles to gratify the curiosity, and foster the habit of preserving old articles that are often destroyed as useless. There are many houses in Braintree where relics of antiquity could be found. They consist of articles of furniture, wearing apparel, artificers tools, implements of agriculture, books, gold, silver and copper coins, and others too numerous to mention. It would be a rich treat to visit the garrets of the old houses, and bring out to light these dusty relics, that the present generation may have opportunity to see what their fathers and mothers used one hundred years ago.—In some houses are hanging maps and pictures of ancient date which would be looked upon with great interest by people of the present day. In a dwelling house near Hayward's Creek, can be seen an old map representing the plan of a battle fought near Lake George, in 1755, between the English and Provincial troops under command of Sir William Johnson, and the French and Indian under command of the Baron Deskau. Another relic may be seen in a house on Commercial Street, in form of a cast iron chimney back, bearing date 1697. If the town vote favorably at the adjourned town meeting in April, in regard to celebrating the Fourth of July next, in a way suited to the great events of the past century, as we trust they will, and make a liberal appropriation therefor, a committee will be chosen to visit all persons having ancient and rare relics to bring to the Town House, and that they may be exhibited on that day.

400 to the acre after the second year. There is little work to be done save to prune them in the spring, and irrigate once in two weeks during the hot weather. The grape can be cultivated in the open soil in Weymouth Landing, North, South and West. It is a judicious investment. The average yield is from \$10 to \$100 per acre, with no expense save to manure it; grapes pay from 100 to 400, second year from cutting; oranges and lemons from \$100 to \$500 per acre, when in full bearing, at 10 to 12 years of age. English walnuts also pay largely, but do not get into full bearing before they are 15 or 20 years of age. They grow from six to 10 feet each season, and make immense trees.
As to distance, we are 12 miles from San Bernardino, 60 from Los Angeles, 125 from San Diego, and 150 from the Atlantic States. Our mail is larger in proportion than in any village I was ever in before. We have good schools, four churches, one lawyer. (In certain towns in Mississippi, where I once lived, the proportion was four churches and sixteen lawyers.) The climate is healthy, and the soil is fertile. Most of whom are invalids, and none get much practice. On the whole, I like the place better than any other I ever saw. F. H. W.
