

As an example we may state that the basket containing 100 of Verbenas, Heliotropes, Fuschias, &c., when packed in moss, will only weigh 20 to 25 lbs., basket included. We particularly request our customers, when forwarding orders, to be *particular* and give directions for shipping, in a plain intelligible manner, as we endeavor to follow directions as far as possible, and in no case will any responsibility be assumed after being so shipped, they being then entirely at the risk of the owner. Persons unacquainted with the varieties will do well to leave the selection to us, as they can depend upon getting none but the best.

#### Achyranthus Verschaffeltii-Ireseni Herbstii.

A beautiful new ornamental foliaged plant, having dark crimson leaves, with ribs and stem of a bright carmine purple amaranth, veined metallic, the plant forming a neat, compact bush of about 18 inches in height, well adapted either for pot culture or for the open borders of the Flower Garden. Price, 20 cents each; \$2.00 per dozen.

#### Ageratum Variegatum.

A great acquisition to our variegated plants. Leaves finely variegated, yellow and green, shaded with crimson. Flowers blue, as in the well known A. Mexicanum. Very free grower and a profuse bloomer. Price 20 cents each; \$2 per dozen.

#### Aloysia Citriodora-Lemon Verbena.

We have a fine stock of well grown, bushy plants of this well known variety, so indispensable for the delightful fragrance of its leaves in the formation of a bouquet. Price 25 cents each; \$2.50 per dozen.

#### Aquilegia Glandulasa.
