1. Name of Plant: Ogaki Iron Works. Co. Ltd. (Ogaki Tekkojo)
2. Location of Plant: 480, Imajuku, Miki-mura, Ampachi-gun, Gifu-ken. Code No. 9-13.
3. Reason for Necessity of Exemption:
  - (1) We consider it our important duty to keep the machinery and equipment designated for reparation in a good condition.
  - (2) The building of this plant were greatly damaged by the two earthquakes we had in Dec. 1944 and Dec. 1946. Therefore we intend to reinforce the buildings 16 and 17 in the annexed map, suffered comparatively a slight damage, and move the machines which are now in our custody in the buildings shown in the map (8 and 9).
  - (3) We intend to clearly distinguished machines after the removal of machines and using the buildings the buildings which we appeal you to exempt from reparation, we intend to make fishery tools, mining implements, spinning and weaving machines and agricultural implements which are used in the most important industries for Japan with a view to remove the unrest that the present workers should be discharged after the machines for reparation will have been withdrawn.
4. Condition of Reparation Machinery.
  - (1) Now, we have clearly drawn a line between the designated equipments and the undesignated equipments and distinguished machines in rest from machines in a operation and doing our best to maintain and preserve the machines. The maintenace and custody of the machines will not be affected at all by the transfer of the machines. We believe that the exemption of buildings will bring a better result to their custody and maintenance.
  - (2) Among the buildings numbered 1-44 in the annexed map, we got the permission of exemption of all buildings except those



numbered 6, 7, 8, 9, 20 and 21.

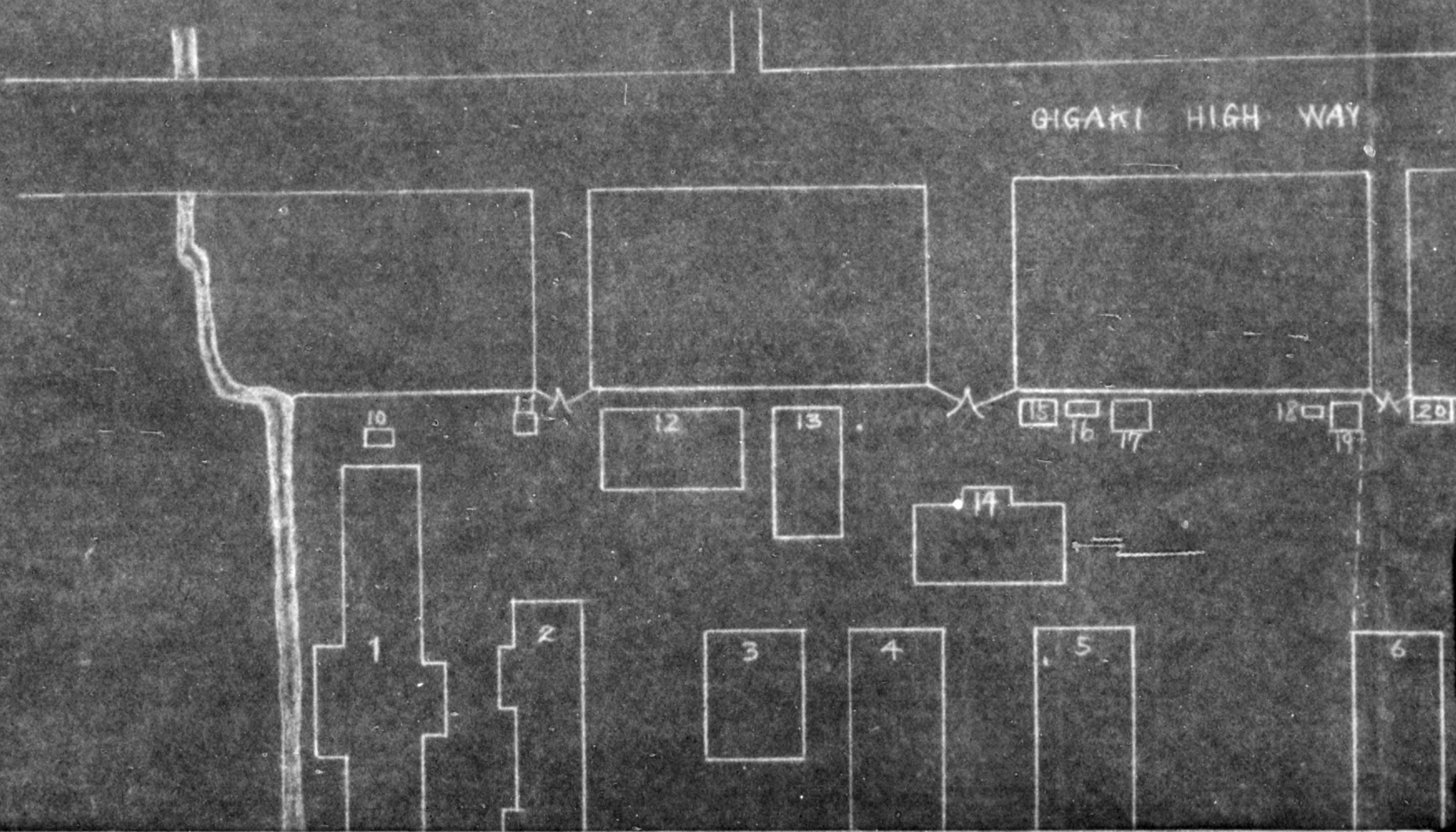

# PLANE OF ŌGAKI

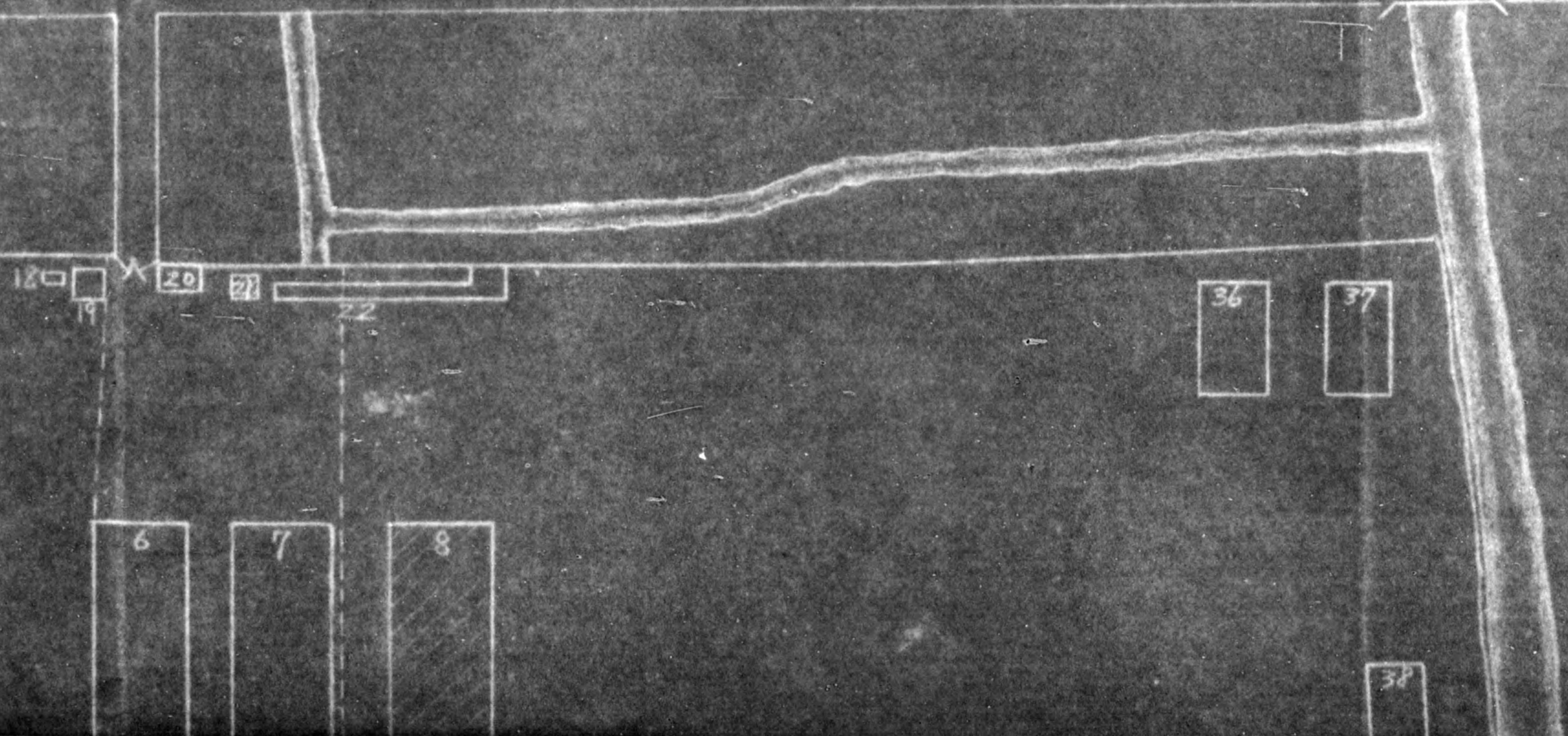

The new President, however, entirely left the managing work to the care of other officials, and mostly devoted himself to chasing his own interest, drawing enormous sum of money out of profit of the company during the several years past, and the company itself was run under personal care of Taichi Ohashi, Chairman of Board of Directorship, aided by Mr. Koichi Ohashi and Yutaka Ohashi who served as the manager of Kagamigahara Plant and Ogaki Plant respectively.

In spite of the fact that the directive of the Allied Forces concerning the reparation was instantly brought to the attention of the President, he still continued his disinterested attitude and never appeared in the office to take up his duty. Not only that, he, in an attempt to interrupt the managing business of the company, sent one of his brother, Mr. Masaji Ohashi, the auditor of the company, to banking firms around mid-August of this year, and urged them to suspend the finance for the company. In this plot, he is said to have employed every detestable tricks such as libel on the active staff officials or scattering slanderous reports of inner affairs of the company, and his treacherous plot hit the company so hard that it could hardly meet the payment of workers wages in some cases.

As the result of this financial stoppage, our vital duty for maintaining the reparation equipment was also badly menaced, but the whole collapse could barely been averted only through the private finance of Chairman of Board of Directorship as well as Mr. Yutaka Ohashi, manager of our plant. But of course their private financial ability cannot be limitless, and now it seems to be nearing almost exhaustion.

To make the matter worse, with the half yearly shareholder's meeting of the company set for Nov. 5, it is reported that the President is planning an extensive S shake up in executive and staff personnels including



factory workers in order to realize his ambition to place the management under his own and his follower's dictatorship.

However, as was previously referred to, he has failed to report to this plant for three years past and entirely lacks knowledge of the actual condition of the plant. In view of this fact and also considering his irresponsible and selfish personality, we all the factory employees came to an agreement to flatly oppose his intention and passed a resolution in mass-meeting demanding his immediate retirement from the present position.

Truly it is the general opinion of all employees that provided the situation was left as is planned by the President, not only the existence of the company is dreadfully jeopardized, but also our uppermost duty of maintenance and custody of thereparation equipment will never be fulfilled to satisfaction.

Under such circumstances, I, based on the general will and wish of all the employees, hereby put forth the actual state of the company and kindly ask you to take some proper action so that such ~~xx~~ an awkward situation can be straightened out without delay.
