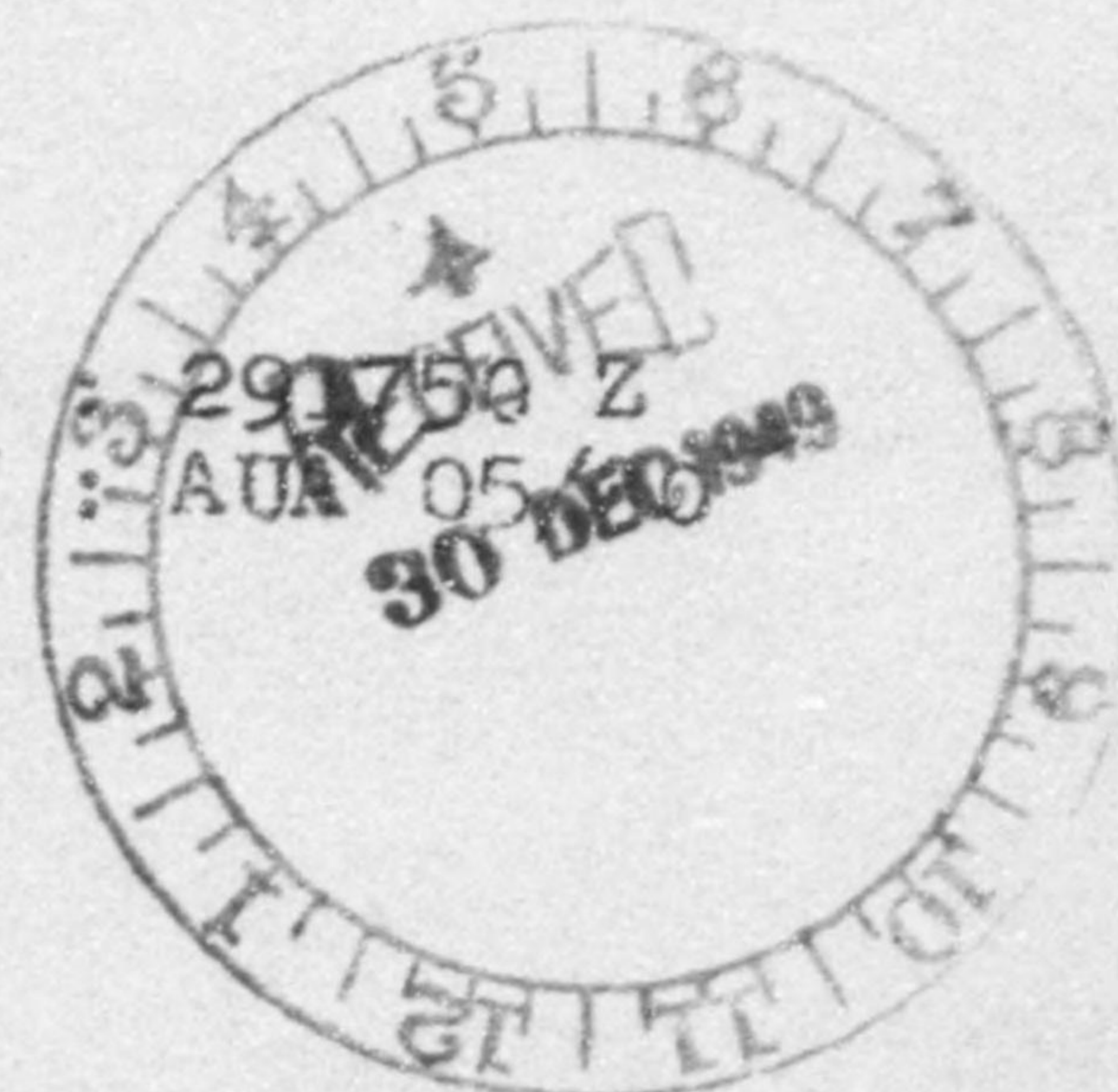

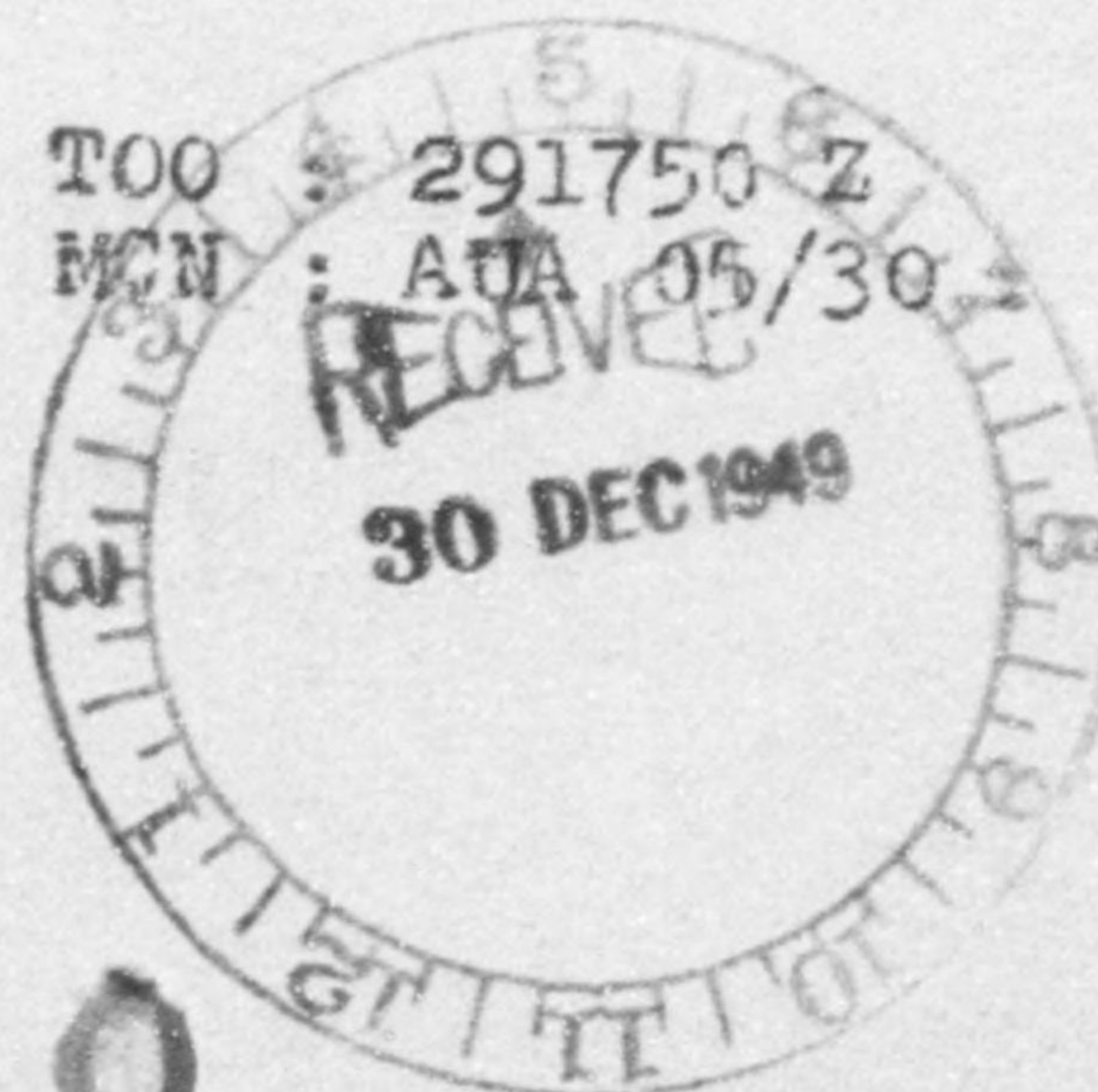



An agreement providing for continued mining with no reservations on the part of any parties thereto and subject to approval by higher authority was reached between the people of Angaur HICOMTERPACIS and SCAP Representatives. Agreement is consistent with hydrological report and takes cognizance of all other considerations. Formal agreement to be air mailed today. A brief of this agreement follows. Continued mining subject to conditions in part recommended by hydrologic survey team and in part demanded by Anguarese as follows:

- A. Test wells will be made and readings taken as stipulated.
- B. All lakes caused by mining to be filled to height of 1 foot above mean water table.
- C. Fill to be taken from taxiway and parking area including land between parking areas on northwest side airstrip.
- D. This land to be dug only to 1 foot above mean water table and left in smooth condition.
- E. Hydrological survey wells and lakes and results of readings therefrom to be under surveillance HICOM Hydrologist, if and when it is determined preventive measures (which are to proceed concurrently with mining) are not effective mining to be terminated. However, hydrologic

team believes that with complete restoration steps demanded by Anguarese it is extremely unlikely preventive measure will fail.

F. Starting 1 January severance fee \$2 per long ton adjusted to 32% P 2 0 5.

G. Processing tax of 15% of Florida value of phosphate to be paid to Treasurer Trust Territory.

H. Severance fees to be used to establish trust fund for Anguarese people. 2/3 of revenue therefrom to be paid in monthly payments equitably to clans owning phosphate areas. 1/3 of revenue to be paid to municipality for distribution in part to clans with no phosphate land but who have supported people evicted from their lands by mining operations and balance for municipal purposes.

I. Starting 1 January and continuing until all severance money is paid into trust fund \$15,000 per year (estimated income from final trust fund) will be used to make the monthly payments as stipulated above.

J. The balance of the \$5,000 fund presently in the bank account of the Anguarese people to remain at their immediate disposal.

K. Also out of severance funds available on 1 January \$50,000 to be made available to Anguarese for business ventures considered economically suitable for them. These ventures subject to approval by HICOM.

L. \$25,000 of the fund will be made available as a calamity fund.

M. After discussion with SCAPLO it was decided mining to continue with caution pending approval or disapproval this agreement. Running notes of Anguar conference will be air mailed as soon as transcribed.

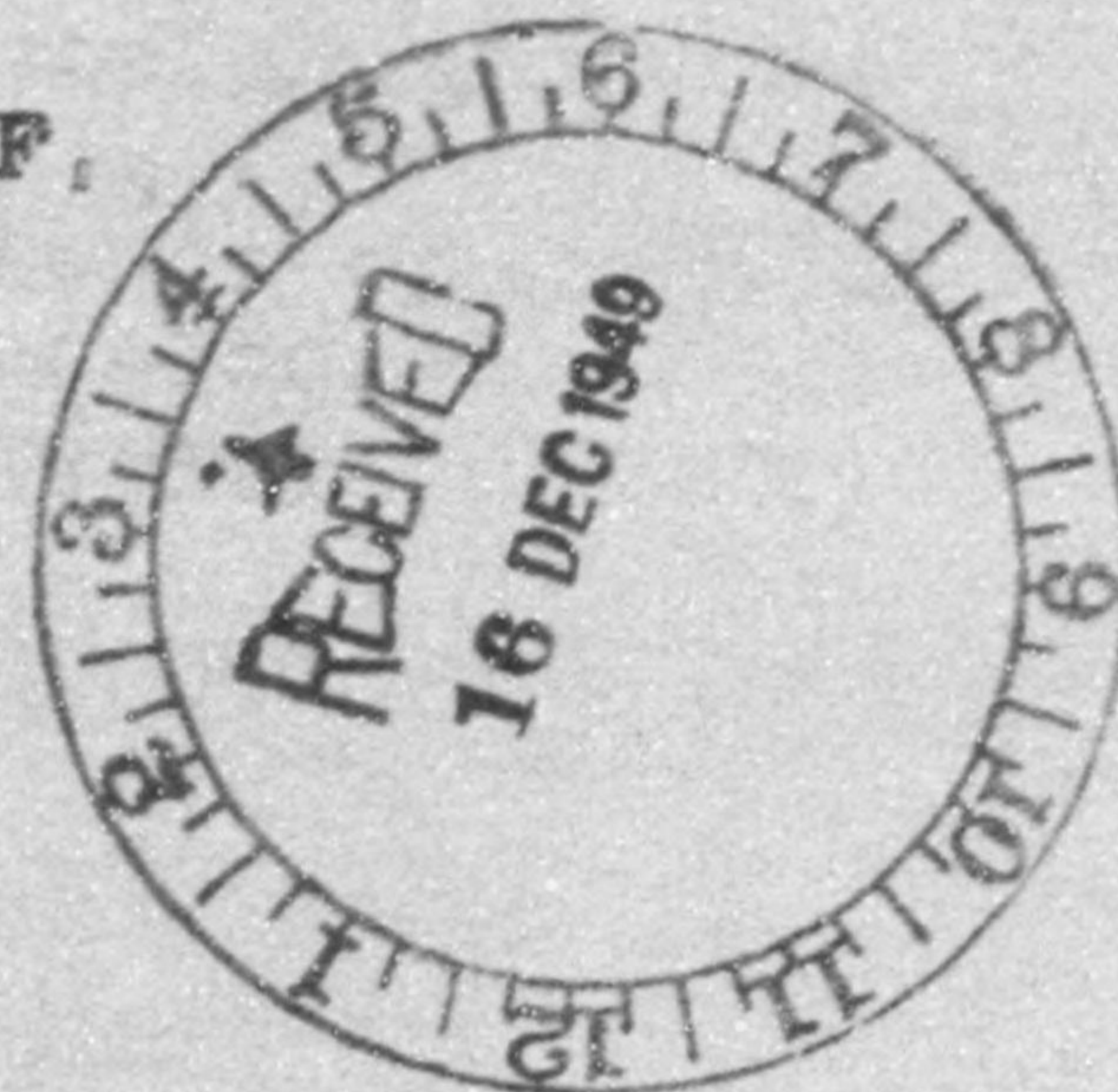

In discussions with dept Brit Group stated that purpose of visit was purely informational. They had no intention making proposals to Japanese re trading arrangements but merely intended examine situation on spot and also provide Japanese with info as to world market situation. They said they fully understood US Govt position re restrictive business practices, that they were convinced US Group supported this policy by US Govt and that they had no intention of "getting within 100 miles of cartel arrangements". They expressed view that while UK apprehensions revival Jap competition genuine they considered these apprehensions had been somewhat exaggerated and that one result of the visit might be allay unnecessary fears. For SCAP's info only, these fears on part UK industry appear have been important factor in reluctance UK Govt agree US proposals obtain most favored nation treatment Jap trade. Head of UK Group (Sir Wm Street) said that he had already discussed visit with Dutch and Indian textile interests.

Both depts see no basis grounds to object. ACMI would be given carefully drafted letter stressing Depts insistence that visit be strictly unofficial in character and limited to purposes stated above and should be regarded as visit rept US-UK private textile Assocs rather than mission. To this end, believe depts and SCAP should avoid use in statements and discussions terms such as "visit of reps of US and UK Cotton Textile Industries" rather than "mission", and in other ways avoid anything which would convey erroneous idea group has official character of any kind, or can accomplish any purpose detrimental in interests of textile industries other countries.

Depts believe US-UK Textile Assoc Reps should be required comply with all procedures applicable businessmen entering Japan and accorded similar treatment. Depts believe Jap Govt and textile reps should be fully informed unofficial nature and limited purposes of visit and cautioned against yielding to pressure for private informal understanding re restrictive production and trade policies.

Depts would appreciate immediate comment by SCAP in view need prompt reply groups concerned. Shall groups apply for clearance in accordance present procedure? Will air mail further info before group leaves.

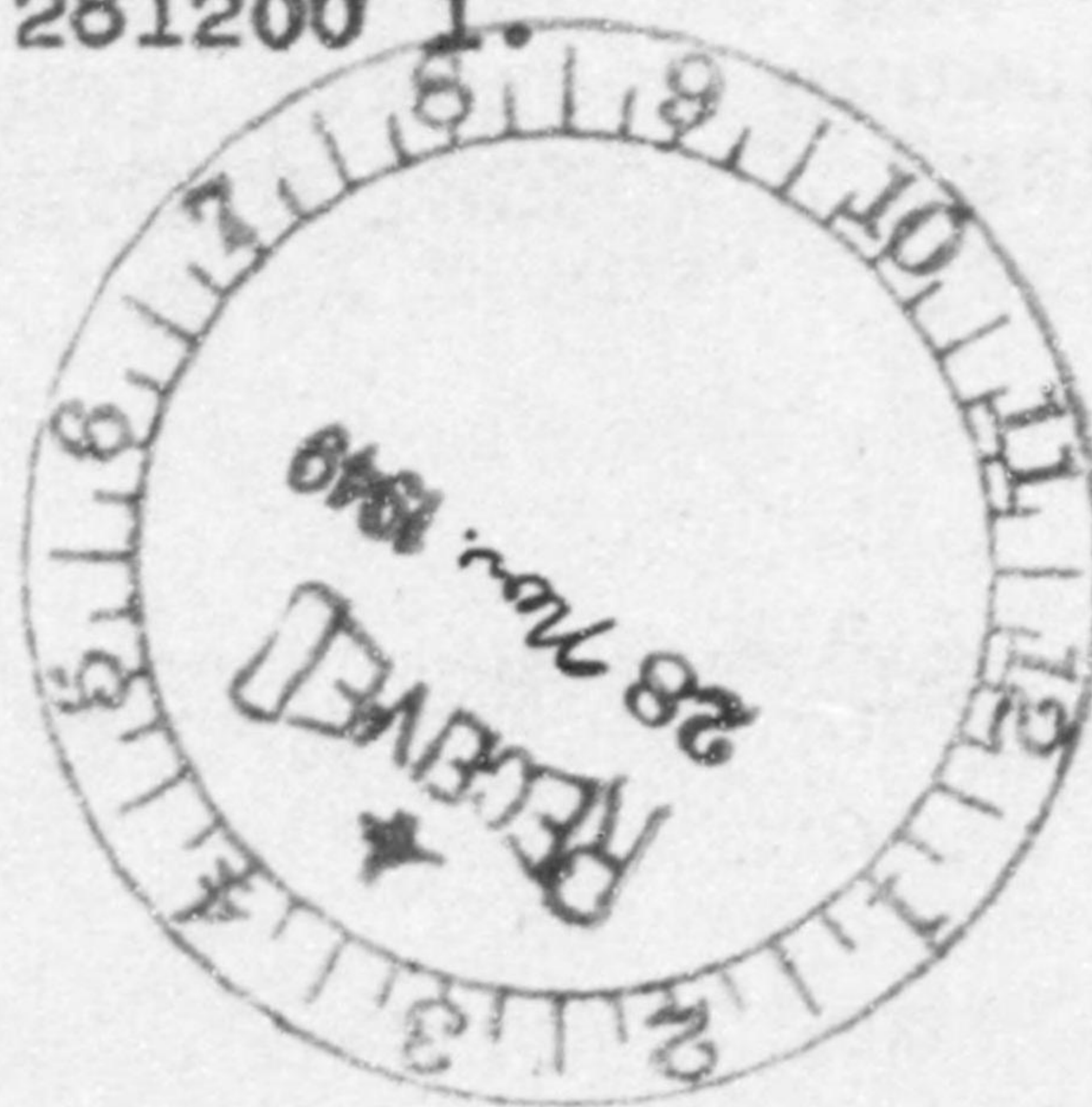

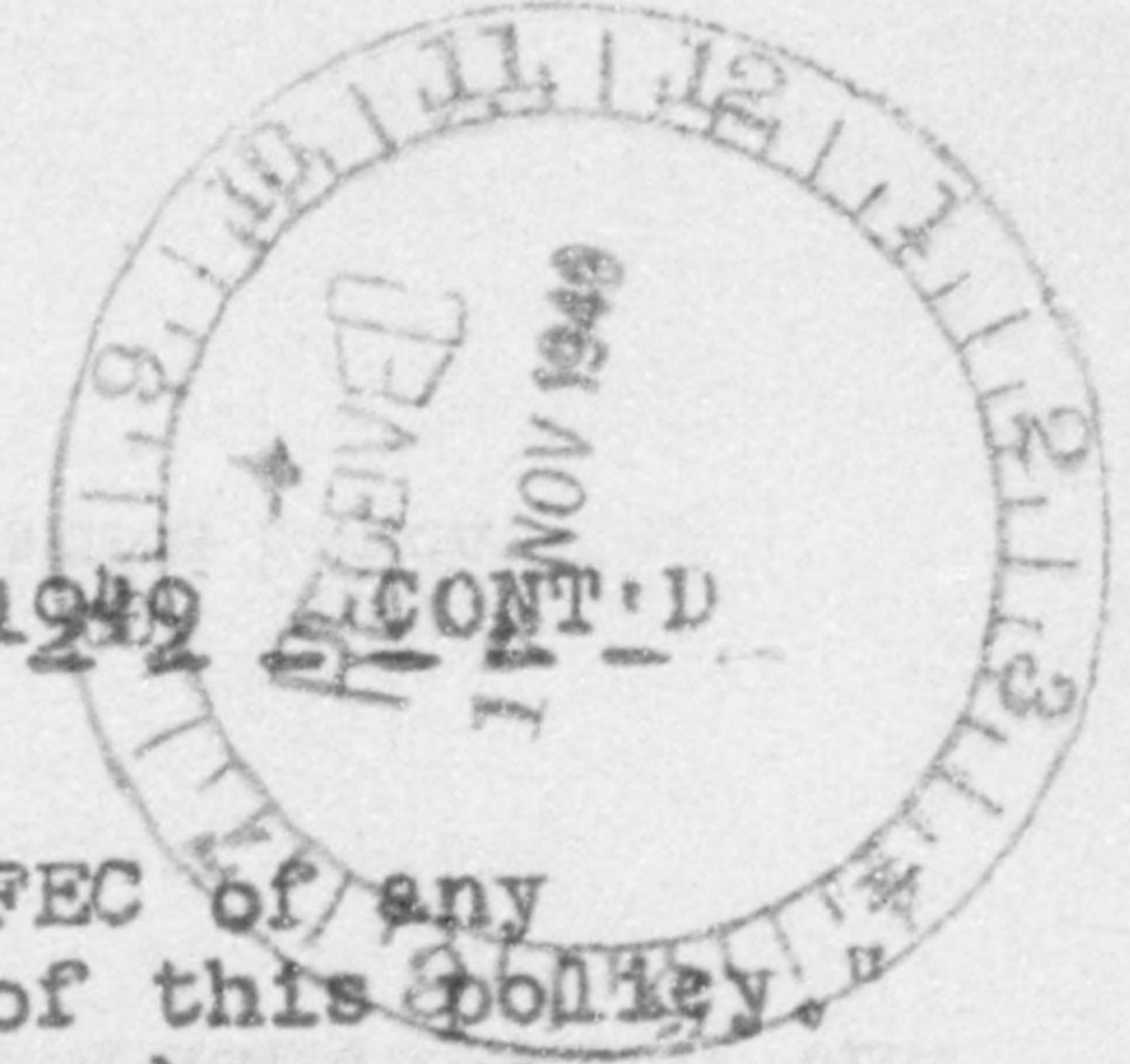

Angaurese Representatives strongly against further mining but desire consult their people again and to have further survey by qualified hydrologist to determine whether remaining agricultural lands or water supply or both will be damaged by continued mining. If this survey shows clearly no such damage to be feared Angaurese Mashe willing to negotiate. At this conference Army and Navy technical experts tissue on danger salt contamination. Army opinion being that further mining would not result in contamination. 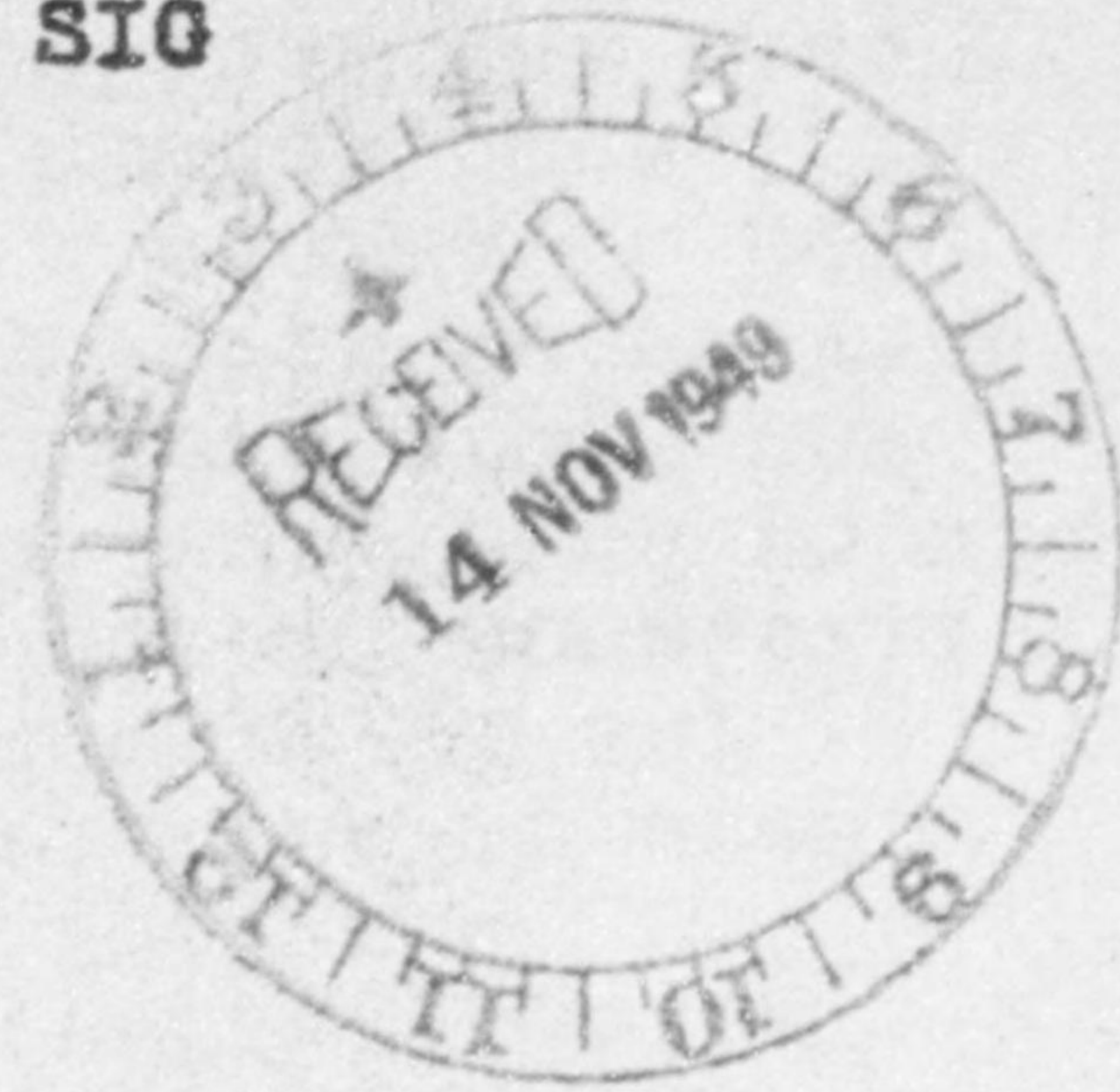

Reps of FEC Countries were invited to call individually at Dept for purpose explaining to them US reasons for wishing press forward with estab, in countries willing receive them, of Jap overseas offices for handling trade promotion, economic reporting and, where necessary, civil status and possibly other limited consular-type functions. These reps are being handed indentic aide-memoire, substance of which fols:

US Govt recommended to FEC last Apr that under SCAP's supervision Jap be permitted attend Internatl mtgs, conventions and adhere to and participate in such internatl arrangements as other countries might be willing conclude with Jap.

At that time US Govt expressed hope that while SCAP already possessed sufficient discretionary powers under exist- ing FEC Policy decisions to permit Jap participation in Internatl Relationships, leadership in bringing Jap back grad- ually into the internatl community would be taken by countries represented on FEC SubCommittee considering this question has focused it's attention on two aspects overall problem:

Additionally, in countries where there are large populations there is pressing need for some Jap agency handling Civil Status and other functions undertaken on practical basis for it's natls resident those areas. Lack of competent Jap authorities to perform notarial services on behalf of countrymen abroad and advise them in matters Jap Domestic Law is confusing legal rights and depriving many persons of citizenship rights and property. Overseas offices would also serve as agency for bringing to attention Jap residents abroad all SCAP Directives and Jap Laws and Regulations with which they might be immediately concerned. Precise scope of activity overseas offices would presumably have to be worked out on bilateral basis through SCAP between Jap and other country concerned.

SCAP has recently suggested to US Govt that it enter into arrangements with Jap Govt, through SCAP, for establishing Jap offices in New York, San Francisco and Los Angeles. SCAP added that if requests should be received from other countries for establishing similar Jap offices SCAP would give them sympathetic consideration on same basis US Govt therefore urges other FEC countries join in course of action designed improve facilities for handling trade and other matters of common concern to them and Jap. US, for reasons cited above, believes it must shortly respond affirmatively to SCAP's msg, but it continues hope other FEC powers will also agree upon desirability such action foregoing summary of Aide-Memoire for your info in case matter raised by govt to which you accredited. 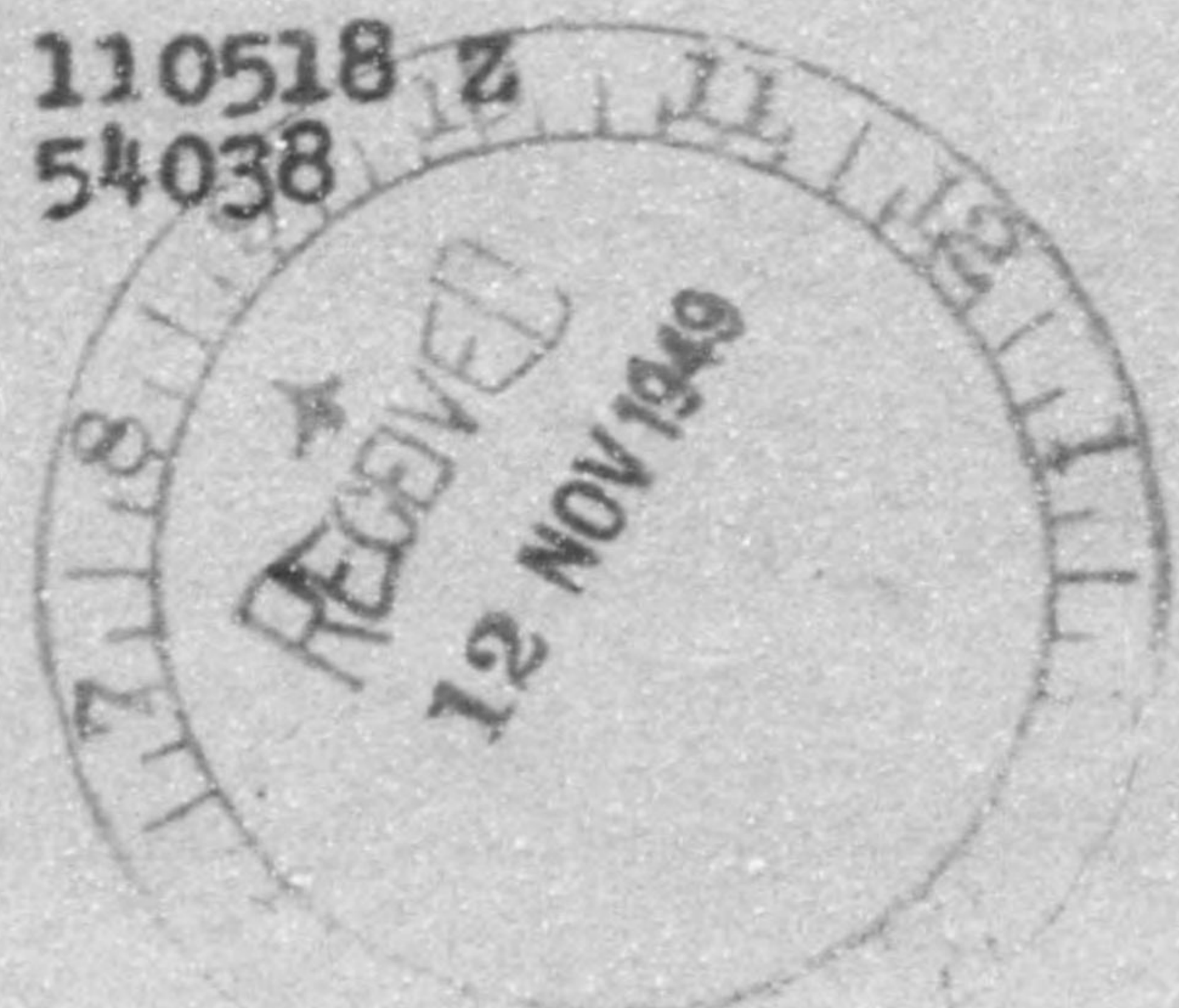

Chinese Communist officials said govt rail needs approx 600 KM weighing about 60,000 tons plus spikes, fish plates etc adding another 10,000 tons. Communist officials said Peoples Govt willing give guarantees to Japan Re End use rails should contract for purchase be in offing. Chinese Communists made clear no assurances to American Consulate General Re End use could be made due lack formal relations between USA and Peoples Govt, but Tighe hoped suitable guarantees would be made to Consulate General Re End use should contract be concluded. Tighe also met S H Hsu, Director Shanghai Railroad Administration, and S C Lu, Deputy Director East China Foreign Trade Bureau concurrently managing Director Overseas Trading Corporation, also a state enterprise, who confirmed proposed barter transaction would meet with approval at his level.

Major points of the proposed treaty said this source include:

ment. The Secret Service and to those who are charged with guard-
ing the life of General MacArthur.

"The attempt on the General's life will take place between
the 1st and 3d of November. The first attempt will be made on
1 November at 0930 and if it fails another will be made on 3
November at 1630 (Tokyo Time). I hope your Excellency will act
on this notice so that measures may be taken to save the life
of General MacArthur. He, the hero will escape thanks to my
intervention, but lacking your intervention you will be re-


