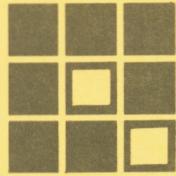


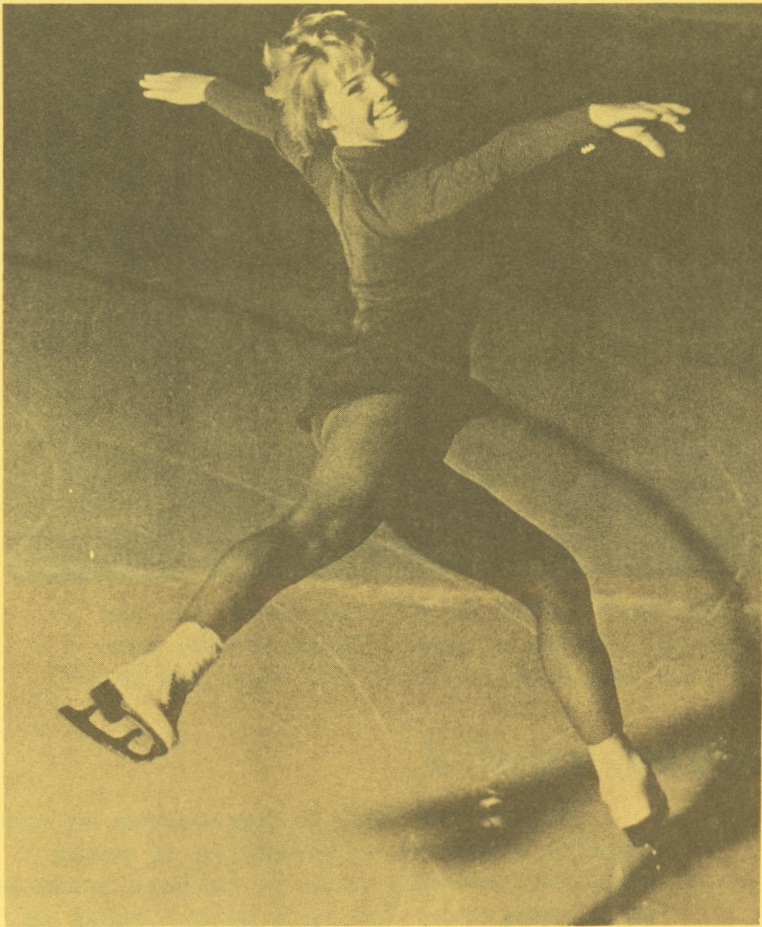

Students To 'Taste' Engineering Programs

An Engineering Day Open House for high school seniors will be held at RIT on Sunday, Nov. 19 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Students and their parents, as well as high school teachers and guidance counselors, from the counties of Wayne, Ontario, Livingston, Genesee, Orleans, Monroe and Erie have been invited to attend the program, which is being sponsored by the student engineer-

Benefit Ice Show Set Nov. 18, 19

Miss Janet Lynn, national senior ladies figure skating champion and a bronze medalist at the 1972 Winter Olympics, will head an all-star cast of Olympic champions at a Benefit Ice Show on Saturday, Nov. 18 at 8 p.m. and on Sunday, Nov. 19 at 2:15 p.m., at the Frank Ritter Ice Arena at RIT.

Sponsored by the Genesee Figure Skating Club of Rochester and sanctioned by the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA), the program is for the benefit of RIT, the Olympic Fund, and the USFSA Memorial Fund.

Featured with Miss Lynn on the RIT ice will be Olympic Skaters Gordon McKellen, Jr., Melissa and Mark Militano; Jane Pankey and Richard Horne, world roller dance champions; along with members of the Genesee Figure Skating Club. Also appearing will be former Ice Capades and Holiday on Ice skater Richard Callaghan.

General Admission charge is a \$3 donation, with reserved section tickets at \$10 donation. Tickets may be ordered by sending a self-addressed envelope to: Post Office Box 18077, Rochester, N.Y. 14618. Checks should be made payable to the Genesee Figure Skating Club. Tickets are also available at all offices of Lincoln First Bank of Rochester, and at RIT's rink office at the Henrietta campus.

Janet Lynn, the 19 year-old from Rockford, Ill., skated for the United States at the 1972 Winter Olympics and earned a bronze medal. She has been the senior ladies national champion every year since 1969, and has held the U.S. Ladies' Figure Skating Title for the past four years. A part-time freshman at Rockford College, she practices

ing professional societies at RIT's College of Engineering.

The program will include tours of the RIT campus and College of Engineering, demonstrations of the types of research and engineering projects conducted by RIT students and faculty, as well as sessions with RIT personnel from the offices of job placement, student aid, admissions, and housing. Faculty from the college will also be on hand to discuss the engineering curriculum offered by RIT. Members of the RIT Student Association will talk on the various aspects of student life and recreational activities on campus.

Co-coordinator of the program, Miss JoAnne Wiczorek, a third-year mechanical engineering student at RIT, stated that the Engineering Day program has been designed "to give the high school student a taste of what engineering is really like.

"Since our society has become so technically oriented, engineering is being used increasingly more by college students as a background for such career areas as medicine, political science, law, government, and scores of other areas. This is one of the key messages that we will be attempting to convey at the Engineering Day program," the 20 year-old coed from Cheektowaga, N.Y. stated.

Gordon McKellen, Jr., also 19, is from Lake Placid, N.Y., and was a team member of Janet Lynn at the 1972 Winter Olympics. He has competed in world figure skating competition for the past two years and won a bronze medal in the 1972 National Championships.
