II. January 21.—A partial Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in North and South America, but will be visible in the Southern Ocean Lat. 68° 59' South, and Long. 124° 24' East.

III. June 17.—A partial Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in North America, but may be seen in the regions about the South Pole.

IV. July 1.—A total Eclipse of the Moon, invisible in America, but will be seen in Asia, Africa, and New Holland.

V. December 10 & 11. A total Eclipse of the Sun, beginning Decr. 10th, 9h. 12m. a., and ending Decr. 11th. 1h. 40m. m., invisible in the British Provinces, but may be seen in the Eastern part of Asia, and in the North Pacific Ocean.

VENUS will be the *Evening* Star until July 21. After which she will be the *Morning* Star to the end of the year.

MARS will be the *Evening* Star during the year.

JUPITER will be the *Morning* Star until May 8. After which it will be the *Evening* Star until Nov. 21. It will then be the *Morning* Star to the end of the year.

SATURN will be the *Evening* Star until April 27. After which it will be the *Morning* Star until Nov. 3, thence the *Evening* Star to the close of the year.

Owing to a remarkable adjustment of the times in which the Moon's synodical revolution, and that of her nodes are performed, eclipses return after a certain period, very nearly in the same order and of the same magnitude. In 18 years there are usually about 70 eclipses; 29 of the Moon, 41 of the Sun; or nearly as two to three.

Seven is the greatest number of Eclipses that can occur in a year, and two the least. If there are seven, five must be of the Sun, and two of the Moon. If there be only two, both must be of the Sun; for in every year there are at least two solar eclipses. There never can be more than three lunar eclipses in a year; and in some years none at all. Though the number of solar eclipses is greater absolutely than of lunar, in the ratio of three to two, yet there are more lunar than solar eclipses visible in any particular place; because while a lunar eclipse is visible to an entire hemisphere, a solar eclipse is only visible to a particular part, and sometimes to a very small part. A lunar eclipse is visible to an entire hemisphere, by reason of the larger shadow and greater proximity of the earth, and the consequent larger immersion of the Moon in its shadow, which is far broader than the lunar diameter. A solar eclipse is only visible to a particular part, on account of the Moon's shadow immersing only a very small portion of the earth's surface by reason of the comparative smallness of the Moon. The lunar shadow traverses the earth at the rate of about 1830 miles an hour. Central or total solar eclipses are phenomena rarely observed; for although there are about 28 such eclipses in every period of 18 years, yet the space over which any one of them appears to be central, is but a narrow belt of the earth's enlightened hemisphere, in some cases scarcely more than a mere mathematical line. LEFT HAND PAGE.

Column.

- 1 & 2.—Contain the days of the month and of the week.
- 3 & 4.—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
- 5.—Days length in hours and minutes.
- 6.—Equation of Time (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or at a quarter before eight o'clock in the morning at Halifax.
- 7.—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th col.
- 8.—The rising or setting of the Moon—the setting being given from the New to the Full Moon, and the rising from Full to New Moon,
- 9.—The place of the Moon in the Ecliptic.
- 10.—The time of the Moon's southing or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Windsor, Truro, &c.
- 11.—Days increase or decrease in hours and minutes.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the first and last quarters, or two quadratures with the Sun.

- 1.—Contains the days of the month.
- 2.—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
- 3.—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.
- 4. Annapolis & St. John, N. B.

All the calculations are made to *mean* solar time, which has superseded the old mode of reckoning by *apparent* time.

It will cost but little labour, keep cattle from them, and natural agents will do the rest. Finish the thrashing of grain, and stow it away beyond the reach of rat, mouse or weevil.

Every cultivator of fruit should thoroughly examine his orchard and fruit garden, before he is interrupted by the approaching busy season. Those who have large trees should give them the necessary pruning; a slight trimming every year or two, is much better than the more frequent practice of heavy pruning after years of neglect. The work should be done as early in the month as possible, that the wounds may become well dried before the sap flows—there is more judgment and care needed in pruning large trees than in any other part of their

management. The operator should constantly bear in mind that a neat, handsome head is to be preserved; that the best shaped and most thrifty branches are to be left; and that the light of the sun should be admitted as far as practicable to all parts of the tree. A thrifty growth of branches will thus be kept up; and in connexion with good cultivation of the soil, the fruit will possess the large size, and fine flavour and appearance, so desirable and usually seen on young trees. The advantages of admitting the Sun must be obvious to every one who has noticed the difference between the rich flavour of fruit fully exposed to the solar rays, and that which has grown under a thick mass of branches and leaves.

whenever leisure permits, and line the barn and hoggards with the muck, a foot thick. Whenever the hogs have well composted their allowance, (and they work very cheap,) give them another. Put it also under the horse-stable, and under the stable windows, wherever there is a sprinkling of manure. With such a resource for manure, what farmer need fear competition. If the farm does not afford muck, other materials may probably be found with which to save the volatile and liquid portions of the manure, as well as to increase the heap. All waste vegetable substances, wherever to be found, should be gathered up and brought to the yards. The accumulations of leaves and vegetable mould in the hollows, at the foot of hill-sides, at the sides of stone walls and rail fences, may be dug up with profit.

most vigorous growth—pasture close with sheep, and you will be able to rid of the under-growth in one or two seasons. Clear off the rubbish and sow grass seed, and you have done. The farmer will always find something to do about his premises, when his crops do not require his attention, either in beautifying or benefitting his premises. Many acknowledge the necessity of improvements, but they never begin to make them. Bushes grow around their fields and meadows, rocks and stones encumber their tillage lands, their fences grow every year more unsightly, and their fruit trees unpruned and ungrafted; and plead they have not time to remedy the evils.

Ploughing is one of the most important branches of Agriculture—necessary even to its existence. The improvement of agriculture, is in proportion to the improvement made in the art of ploughing. The object to be obtained by ploughing is three-fold: 1st, to pulverize the soil; 2nd, to expose a great depth of soil to the action of the atmosphere; 3rd, to hold the many fertilizing substances brought down by rain and snow, and absorbed by the soil. A small proportion of water during rains more or less heavy, sinks into the soil when shallow ploughed; such soil is sooner affected by the drouth, and is dry at a greater

depth than deep earths, as may be shown by an examination of shallow and deep ploughing in a time of drouth. Common ploughing does not reach sufficiently deep, to accomplish all that is desired; but deep ploughing and its good results are effected by following the common plough with the subsoil plough. It simply loosens the subsoil, and leaves it in that state that roots can enter it, that air can permeate it, and water be absorbed by it. A subsequent ploughing, with the common plough, can then easily intermix the surface and subsoil. Ploughing may thus be effected 16 to 20 inches deep. Subsoiling if thoroughly performed, will prove more profitable to farmers for the outlay, than any other one improvement. It can be done in the spring and fall, or when the ground is wet sufficiently deep, at any time in the summer.

even fatten, during the time they are kept on hay, while that of another constantly pines from the time it leaves the pastures, and in the spring is poor and feeble. The difference arises chiefly from the quality of the hay; and the quality of the hay depends on the herbage of which it is composed, on the stage in which it is cut, and on the process of making. The practice of the best haymakers, is to mow the grass closely to the ground, to spread the swaths evenly and lightly, as soon as the dew is fairly off, and the outside of the swath somewhat dried. Rake and cock the hay before sunset. The cocks should be opened on the second day after the ground has become dried and warmed, and the hay should be thoroughly shaken and left so light and open that the air will immediately strike through it.

White Daisy or White Weed.—Where there are but few plants of this kind, it is best to dig them up, root and branch. If meadows are overrun with them, prevent their seeding by mowing as soon as the blossoms appear. In tillage land, kill them as you would any other bad weed, and if they are very numerous, it is advisable to keep the ground in hoed crops for two or three years, during which time, if due attention is paid, they may be nearly exterminated. At all events prevent their seeding, as it is from seed only they are propagated. If moved

green and well cured they make hay that is not disliked by cattle and horses. If they ripen, the seed falls to the earth and vegetates, or goes with the hay to the barn or stack, gets into the manure and is returned to the land. It is in this careless way that the pest is continually renewed and increased. Top-dressing meadows with manure that contains no foul seed, and in every way encouraging the growth of grasses and white clover, will, with the above precaution, drive out the daisy in a few years. It should be an invariable rule with the farmer, to prevent all injurious plants from seeding. This will at all events keep them from spreading, except such as increase by the root.

Every farmer who raises many pumpkins, usually loses a large portion of their value, by freezing during sharp autumnal frosts. Some keep them into winter, and not having cellar room, throw them to the Cows, when frozen about as hard as a brick-bat, and their ice-ribbed exterior resisting the sharpest teeth of a young brindle. Gathering pumpkins and stacking corn-fodder are often performed on the same day; and if the farmer, when he builds his stack of stalks, will make a layer of pumpkins and then a layer of corn-fodder, they will be effectually protected from the frosts of winter, and if perfectly sound when gathered, will even

keep into spring, if the stock is not consumed by that time There is a great advantage in commencing the fattening of animals early in the fall. There are many articles on a farm which may be profitably used at this season, but which, from their perishable nature would be lost, or greatly depreciated in value, by long keeping. Early potatoes, squashes, pumpkins, unmerchantable potatoes, and unsound corn, should be used first. But besides the advantage in saving these kinds of food, there is another important argument in favour of early fattening; the same amount and quality of food will go farther, or will produce a greater amount of meat, in mild weather, than in cold—less food being required to supply the waste of the animal system under a mild temperature, than under a low one.

loss of the urine of the Stock, during the time it is kept at the barn; and even the other portion of the excrement is often so much exposed that one-half its value, probably, is lost. It is washed into the highway, and is seen in the colouring of the water of brooks, which carry off the soluble portions. It would not, probably, be an over estimate of this loss, to say that with many farmers, it is more than equal to the amount they pay in taxes. This loss might be almost wholly prevented, and with but little expense. The first thing towards this would be to use plenty of substances to absorb all the liquids of the stables and yards. More attention should be given to neatness in farm management.

The subject of under draining and the manner of constructing drains is now engaging the attention of many of our farmers. Every farmer who has loose stones on his farm, has the material at hand; while at the same time he is ridding his land of a great detriment to its proper cultivation. Dig a ditch from 2 to 3 feet deep, and 18 inches wide at the bottom—lay stones about 6 inches in diameter on each side, which will leave a water course of 6 inches in the centre—take stones of large dimensions and cover over. By drawing a quantity of stones along the line of the ditch, a selection can be made, and after

Placing some on each side of the top stones, should they not fall out to the sides of the ditch, the remainder can be thrown in at random, on which can be strewed shavings or brush, and then covered. A team and a plough will greatly facilitate the covering operation—flat stones would be preferable for covering should they be obtained. Open drains or ditches are necessary to furnish a rapid passage for the surplus water in the spring, and to prevent the flooding of cultivated fields, an open channel is also necessary when some lawless brook is required to forsake the crookedness of his ways, and flow in a direct line. Wood and timber should be cut as soon as practicable. It is inconvenient working in deep snow; neither men nor teams can do as much as when the ground is bare or only covered with snow enough to make good sleighing.

natural secretions, and actually wastes the bodily tissues. In the distribution of the winter's supply of fodder, the coarser and poorer kinds should be reserved till the coldest weather—the appetites of the animals being then sharpest, it will be eaten with less waste. Those farmers who are not already provided with cutting machines, will do well to procure them. Their use, attended with considerable economy. Coarse hay, straw, or cornstalks, are, by being passed through a cutter, brought into a more convenient form of mastication, and substances are eaten which would otherwise be rejected, or only partially consumed. The feeding of labouring animals on cut food allows them more time to rest—the cutting performing, in a great degree, the work of chewing and preparation for digestion.

The Land Mails (*by Shore Route*) for St. Margaret's Bay, Chester, Lunenburg, Liverpool, Shelburne, and Barrington, are made up on Monday and Thursday morning at 8 o'clock, arrive from on Wednesday and Saturday evening at 5h. 50m. The Mails for Bridgewater are made up on Thursday morning at 8 o'clock, arrive from on Saturday afternoon at 5h. 50m.

Letters addressed to any part of Nova Scotia, or British North America, are liable to a uniform rate of 3d. the half-ounce, *pre-payment optional*. Those addressed to the United States (California and Oregon excepted) *when sent by land Mail*, 6d. the half-ounce. Letters for California and Oregon, 9d. the half-ounce, (the combined Colonial and United States postage) *pre-payment optional*. By Steamer, 5d. if posted in Halifax (and an additional inland rate of 3d. when posted in the interior) both of which must be pre-paid.

Letters having stamps affixed to them equal to the rate of postage, pass free of all other postage in whatever part of Nova Scotia they may be posted, and to whatever part of British North America addressed.

Registered Money Letters will be liable to a charge of 6d. each, *in addition to the postage*, both of which must in all cases be pre-paid. The system of Registration is applicable to all description of letters, without distinction, whether they contain coin or articles of value or not. Letters to be registered must be brought to the Office *half an hour* before the closing of the Mail by which they are to be despatched.

Newspapers published in Nova Scotia, addressed to any part of Nova Scotia, British North America, or the United States when forwarded by *land Mail* pass free of charge—and must be sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the sides or ends. There must not be any words or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the cover, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover, except the name and address of the sender, and of the person to whom it is sent. No paper or thing must be enclosed in any paper. If these conditions are not complied with, it will be liable to be charged as a letter.

Pamphlets, printed Books, and periodical publications will be liable to a charge of 2d. per ounce up to 6 ounces in weight, done up the same as Newspapers, and 3d. for every additional ounce up to 16 ounces, beyond which weight they cannot be received.

Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews, or Pamphlets, whether British, Colonial, or Foreign, can be sent through the Post Office from the United Kingdom to Nova Scotia or *vice versa*, whether by Packet or private Ship, subject to the same conditions and restrictions, except as to weight, to which Newspapers are liable, at the following rates—not exceeding ¼ lb. 7½d.; exceeding ¼ lb. and not 1 lb. 1s. 3d.; exceeding 1 lb. and not 2 lbs. 2s. 6d.; and so on, adding 1s. 3d. to every additional pound or fraction of a pound. When forwarded by Packet they must be sent by the direct route from Halifax—the postage in all cases to be *pre-paid*.

Parliamentary Papers pass free through Nova Scotia, if forwarded by Packet, 1d. for every 4 ounces.

For encouraging Masters of Vessels, not being Post Office Packets, to undertake the conveyance of letters between places beyond the British North American Colonies, and this Province, and for regulating the conveyance and delivery of such letters the Postmaster General may allow to the Master 1½d. for each letter they deliver to the Post Office at the first Port they touch, or arrive at in this Province, or with which they shall communicate when inward bound; and if, from unforeseen circumstances, the Master cannot, upon delivering his letters at an outport, receive the money to which he is entitled, he

shall be paid by an order on the Postmaster General at such other place as may be convenient; and every Master of a vessel inward bound, shall, at the port or place of arrival, sign a declaration, in the presence of the person authorized to take the same, who shall also sign the same.

Letters of Merchants, owners of Merchant vessels, or of the cargo or loading therein, sent by such vessels, or by any person employed by such owners for the carriage of such letters according to their respective addresses and delivered to the persons to whom they are respectively addressed, without pay or advantage for so doing.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of conveying, receiving, collecting, sending, and delivering letters within this Province, and any person who shall (except in the cases herein after excepted) collect, send, convey, or deliver, or undertake to convey or deliver, any letter, or who shall receive or have in his possession any letter for the purpose of conveying or delivering it otherwise than as above, shall, for every letter so unlawfully conveyed, received, delivered, or found in his possession, incur a penalty of *five shillings*—such exclusive privilege, prohibition, and penalty not to apply to—

1. Letters sent by private individuals to be mailed in the first Way or Post Office.

2. Letters sent by a Messenger on purpose, concerning the private affairs of the sender or receiver.

3. Letters addressed to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea and by a private vessel not being a packet boat.

4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province, and immediately posted in the nearest Post Office.

5. Letters of merchants, owners of merchant vessels, or of the cargo, or loading therein, sent by such vessels, or by any person employed by such owners for the carriage of such letters, and delivered to the persons to whom they are respectively addressed, without pay or advantage for so doing.

5. Letters concerning Goods sent by common known carriers to be delivered with the Goods to which such letters relate, without reward or advantage for receiving or delivering them.

6. No person is authorized to collect any such excepted letters for the purpose of conveying or sending them. Way letters, *pre-paid*, may be delivered by the office to the Courier, to be dropped along the route. No person is obliged to send any pamphlet, printed book, or newspaper by post.

British re-prints of copyright works from the United States, by land mail or by steamer, liable to full Letter postage.

All Letters sent by Post in Nova Scotia, and the other Provinces of British North America, are charged by weight, (without regard to the number of enclosures). The Provincial Scale of Rates is

An upper yard having been added to the Ship Staff, it will be used exclusively to designate Steam Vessels, thus :
