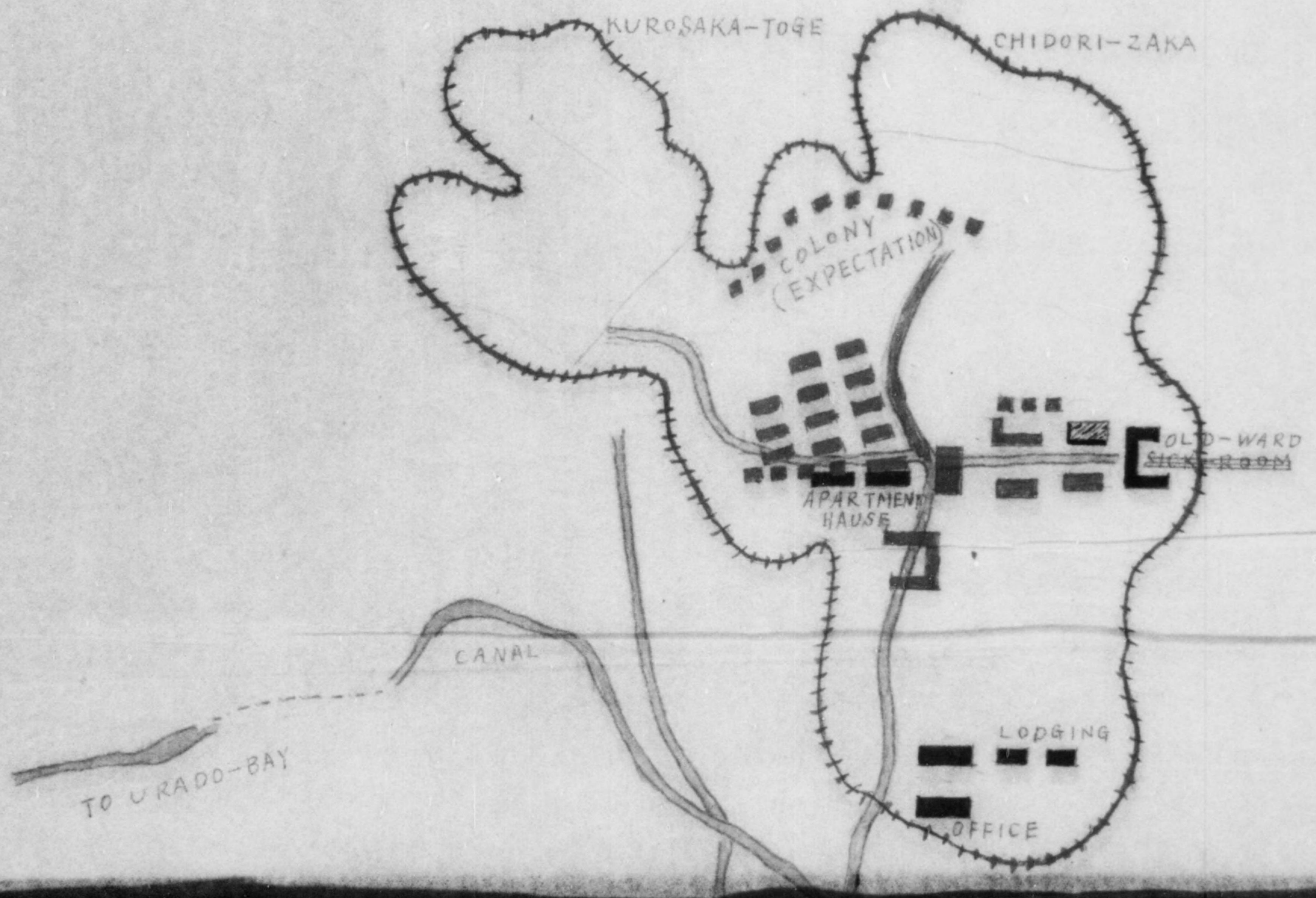

Brief explanation of The National Kochi Sanatorium
(History)

Notwithstanding the fact that our Kochi prefecture has about 20,000 T. B. patients and many intelligent people had sincerely demanded to establish a T. B. sanatorium, we couldn't have even single sanatorium for many years for lack of the necessary ground to built it upon.

The Second World War ended, and Mr. Seijo, the head of the health department of Kochi prefecture, made plans intently to construct the sanatorium on the site of the former naval air corps, and his plan met with farmers' strong opposition, thus the case involved great difficulties in the way of their persuasion.

Fortunately, Kochi Military Government authority who recognized the absolute necessity of a sanatorium, gave him great and good assistance, and he could tide over the trouble at once.

Thus the National Kochi Sanatorium was established at last

April 1, 1947.

Since then, this sanatorium has experienced many troubles in water and food supply, getting employees, and in other matters, but it has conquered those troubles by the kind aid of Kochi prefectural authority and every party concerned.

It can accommodate only 100 patients now. But a ward having accommodation for 50 patients is under construction, and it will be finished by the coming April.

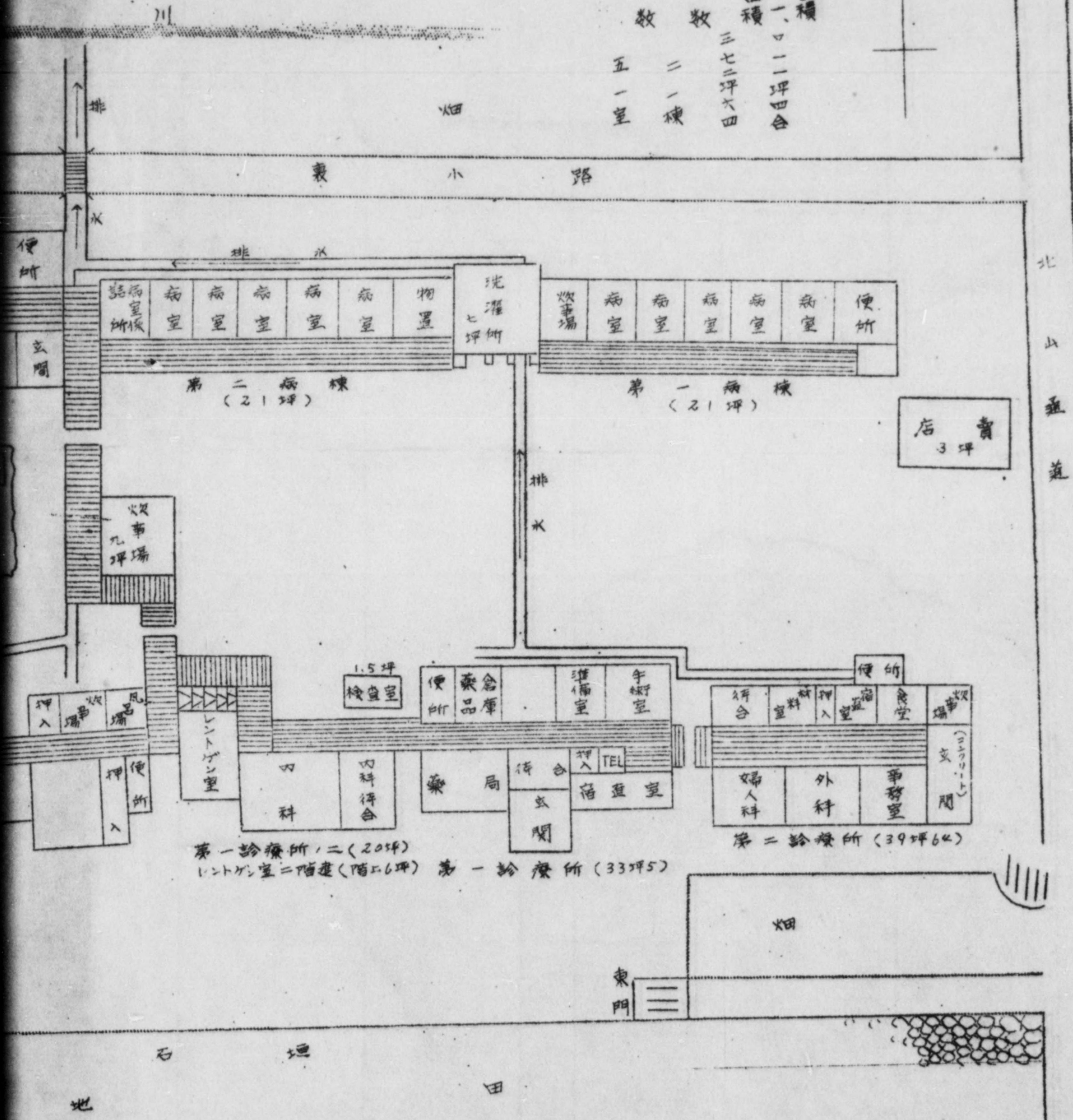
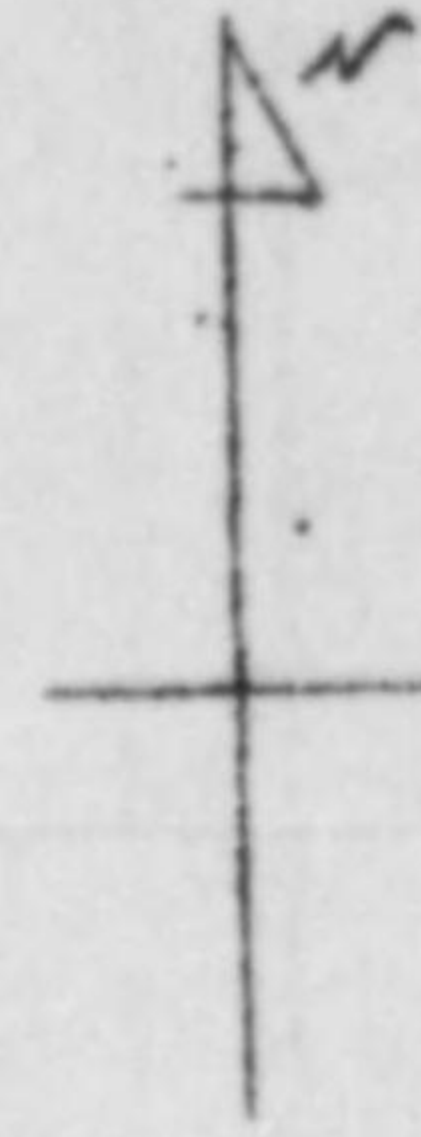

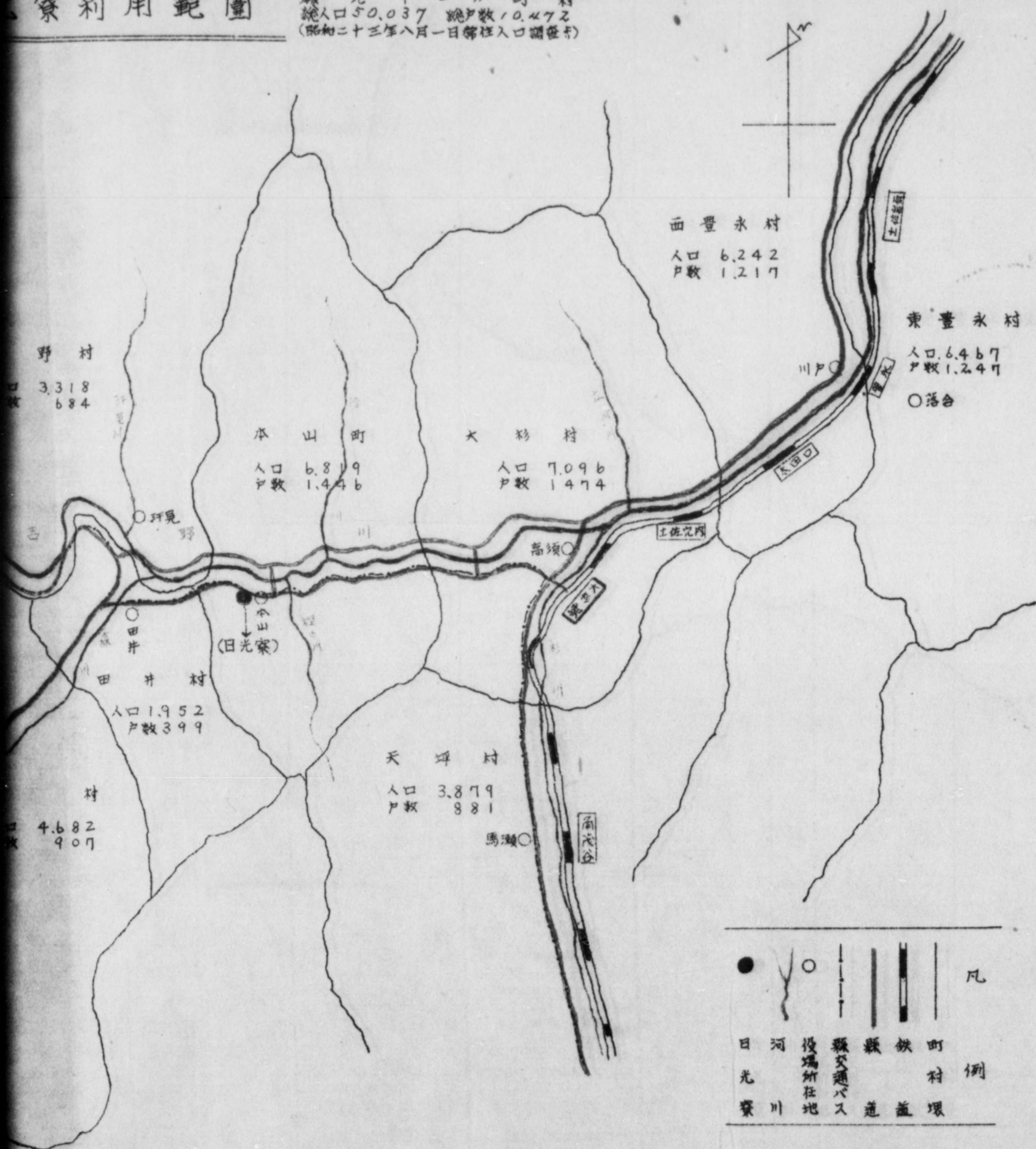
