1. While not objecting to subject bill, LS desires to point out the following undesirable features regarding which it entertains grave misgivings and submit the following suggestions:

a. Article 12 allows the conciliation committee "to prohibit any change in the existing situation, the disposition of things, etc. or order the other necessary matters to the other party or other interested persons" if it deems this "specially necessary for conciliation." It thereby empowers conciliation committees to issue provisional disposition orders. Such dispositions are also dealt with in Articles 755 and the following Articles of the Code of Civil Procedure which, however, is carefully drafted so as to prevent abuse. Thus, Article 755 of the Code of Civil Procedure limits provisional dispositions to cases where "It is to be apprehended that by reason of a change in the existing situation the realization of the right pertaining to a party would be impossible or that material difficulty in the realization thereof would be produced." Similarly, Article 760 allows provisional dispositions only when they are "necessary, in particular, for averting material prejudice, or for preventing imminent violence or for other reasons in cases of lasting (consecutive) relations of right." The standard of Article 12 of subject bill is exceedingly vague. It appears highly illogical to give conciliation committees wider powers than the ordinary courts. (Reference is also made to Article 35 and to Article 11 of the Supplementary Provisions of subject bill, containing the sanctions for violation of orders issued in accordance with Article 12).

2. Article 14 allows the committee to decide that the agreement arrived at between the parties is "improper" and to determine that conciliation shall not be formulated. No standard for such impropriety is given. It must be realized that this decision, in most cases, defeats the very purpose of the conciliation procedure. It is suggested, therefore, that the power of the court to decide that the agreement of the parties is improper be limited by inserting standards, such as illegality of the agreement, etc.

3. Article 20 by allowing the court of suit to submit the pending case to conciliation of its own motion will tend to prolong trial proceedings in complicated cases where none of the parties desire conciliation or where the defendant hopes to postpone an unfavorable decision by the insertion of conciliation proceedings. No conciliation procedure should be forced upon both or even one party in matters of civil disputes.



Such a change would be in direct conflict with the Agricultural Cooperative Association Law, Law 132 of 1947, and the Fisheries Cooperative Association Law, Law 243 of 1948. Furthermore, the change in names would make it appear that the law is to be applied to the agricultural associations and fisheries associations which are now either liquidated or in the process of liquidation.

Bill for Construction of Karuizawa International
Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City

(Purpose)

Article 1. The purpose of this Law is to construct Karuizawa Town as an international comity, sightseeing and cultural city in order to achieve the ideal of eternal peace of the world by enhancing and promoting the international comity and international culture as well as to contribute to the economic rehabilitation of our country by completing the cultural and sightseeing facilities and inducing foreign travellers, in view of the fact that Karuizawa Town has an alpine beauty to be rarely seen in the world and that it is a good health resort and also of the historical fact that it has contributed to the international comity.

(Planning and Enterprise)

Article 2. The city planning for the construction of the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City (hereinafter referred to as the "the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Planning") shall include the planning to have such various

facilities as suitable to an international comity, sightseeing and cultural city beside the city planning as provided for in Article 1 of the City Planning Law (Law No.36 of 1919).

2. The city planning enterprise to construct the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City (hereinafter referred to as "the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Enterprise") shall execute the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Planning.

(Execution of Enterprise)

Article 3. The Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Enterprise shall be executed by the Mayor of Karuizawa Town.

2. The Mayor of Karuizawa Town shall make constant activities living up to the spirit of local autonomy for perfection of the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City, with the cooperation of its inhabitants and aid of various organs concerned.

(Assistance to Enterprise)

Article 4. The state and the organs concerned of local public entities shall, in view of the importance of the purpose mentioned in Article 1, of the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Enterprise, render every possible assistance to the expedition and perfection of the enterprise.

(Special Subvention)

Article 5. In the case where it is deemed necessary for the use of the International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Enterprise, the state may transfer the common properties, regardless of the provisions of Article 28 of the National Property Law (Law No. 73 of 1948), to the public entities which bear the expenses necessary for execution of this enterprise.

(Report)

Article 6. The executor of the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Enterprise shall make efforts for expediting the completion of that enterprise and shall submit report on its progress to the Minister of Construction at least once every six months.

2. The Prime Minister shall report to the Diet once every year on the progress of construction of the Karuizawa International Comity, Sightseeing and Cultural City Construction Enterprise.

(Application of the Law)

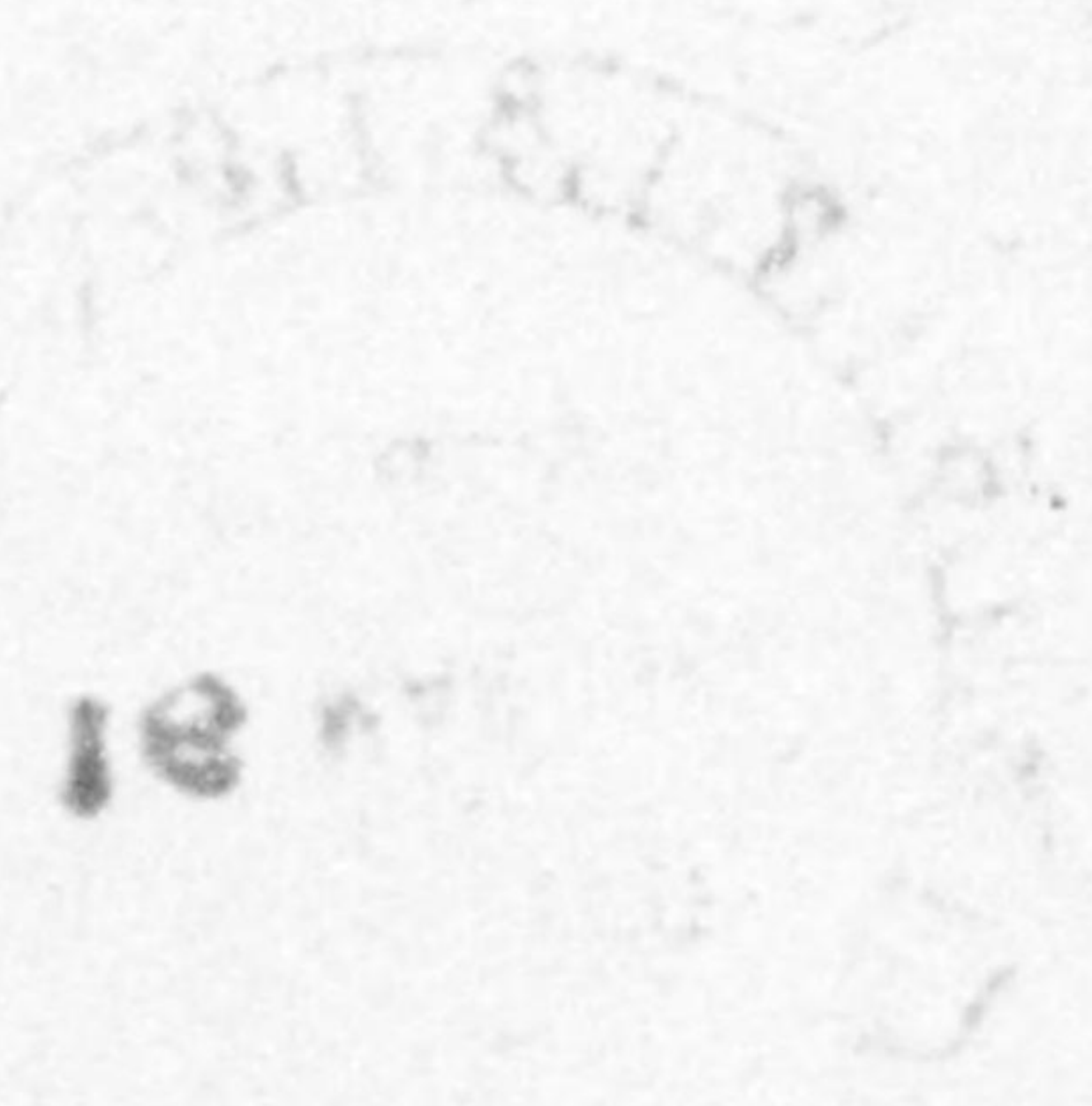

The new regulation provides for their election by the Board of Trustees, who in turn, are elected at the general meeting of shareholders.



As by reference to Article 1 of subject basic law (No. 42 of 1925) will appear, subject Bank is a juridical person, with about 50% of its stock held by the Government and the remainder by numerous other designated juridical persons, such as the Federation of Agricultural Co-operative Associations, etc. (Arts. 4, 4-2, 5, 6, and 6-2). Article 11 of the basic law provides for the appointment of the executive officers of the Bank by the Minister of Agriculture and Forestry.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT : Bill for Mutual Loans and Savings Bank.

1. This bill, sponsored by several Liberal Party members of the House of Representatives, provides for a system of mutual savings banks to finance small and medium business enterprises. All such banks must be licensed by the Ministry of Finance, maintain standard banking safeguards for depositors, and confine their operations to a limited sphere of banking business.

2. The bill was sent by check sheet to ESS on 2 March for comment. About 7 March GS/PPD began making daily telephone inquiries to ESS to expedite action. ESS indicated orally that the use of the word "bank" was objectionable because the type of institution to be set up had no counterpart elsewhere in the world. On 21 March the proposers of the bill submitted to GHQ a revised draft based on their discussions with ESS officials. On 22 March GS/PPD was advised in response to a telephone inquiry that a check sheet listing ESS objections to the revised draft had been prepared. As of 1700 hours 30 March, no check sheet on this subject had been delivered to GS.

3. Meantime the bill's proposers pressed GS for clearance and on numerous occasions the Chairman of the H.R. Finance Committee called personally to argue the case. On 26 March he submitted in writing a four-page explanation on the purpose of the mutual aid banks, and on 28 March the principal author of the measure submitted an additional one-page statement which says in part:

"This bill would be absolutely nonsense if the title of "bank" should not be utilized. As this bill not only has already been agreed upon by the majority of the Diet members, warmly supported by the Government, and greatly desired by the nationals in general, but also judging from the general condition among the bankers there seems no sign of their disagreement to the usage of the title of bank, we earnestly wish you to give approval to the proposed bill, taking into your special consideration, the Japanese particular economical condition."

4. At 1730 hours, 30 March, the above information was related to GS/Rizzo by the undersigned. Fifteen minutes later GS/Rizzo advised GS/Guida to inform the House of Representatives that GHQ interposed no objection to introduction of the bill in the Diet.

Subject bill permits the organization to be called a bank (Ginko), thereby deceiving the general public into believing that it is a member of the central banking system in Japan and thereby subject to those protective measures which have been adopted to safeguard the depositors' and stockholders' interests. It is maintained by the promoters of this bill that the so-called Mutual Loans and Savings Bank cannot operate successfully without this deception.
