ECLIPSES.

THERE will be FIVE Eclipses in the year 1833: two of the SUN and three of the MOON—as follows:

I. The first will be of the Moon, on Sunday, January 6th, visible here: Beginning, 2h. 4m.; Ecliptic, 3h. 6m.; Middle, 3h. 15m.; End, 4h. 25m.; Duration, 2h. 21m.—Apparent time in the morning.—Digits eclipsed, $5^{\circ} 42\frac{1}{2}'$ on the Moon's northern limb.

II. The second will be of the Sun, on the 20th January, at 5h. 14m. in the evening, and consequently invisible here.

III. The third will be of the Moon, on the 1st July—the latter part only of which will be visible here, as follows:—Beginning, 6h. 22m.; Moon rises here, 7h. 36m.; Ecliptic, 7h. 54m.; Middle, 8h. 0m.; End, 9h. 38m.; Duration, 3h. 16m.—Apparent time in the evening.—Digits eclipsed, $10^{\circ} 18'$, on the Moon's southern limb.

IV. The fourth will be of the Sun, on the 17th July, at 2h. 31m. in the morning, and consequently not visible here.

V. The fifth will be of the Moon, on Thursday, December, 26th, the latter part only of which will be visible here, as follows:—Beginning of the Eclipse, 3h. 3m.; beginning of total darkness, 4h. 3m.; Moon rises here, totally obscured, 4h. 22m.; Ecliptic, 4h. 51m.; Middle, 4h. 55m.; end of total darkness, 5h. 41½m.; end of the Eclipse, 6h. 41m.; Duration, 3h. 38m.—Apparent time, in the evening.—Digits eclipsed, $20^{\circ} 7'$ from the southern side of the Earth's shadow.

SIGNALS

Made at Partridge Island, and repeated at the Tower in Carleton, on the approach of Vessels to this Harbour:

- One Ball close, for one square rigged vessel,
- One Ball half hoisted, for two ditto,
- Two Balls close, for three ditto,
- Two Balls separated, for four ditto,
- A Pendant of any colour, for five ditto,
- A ditto under a Ball, for six ditto,
- A ditto over a Ball half hoisted, for seven ditto,
- A ditto under two Balls close, for eight ditto,
- A ditto between two Balls separate, for nine do.,
- A Flag of any colour, for ten or more ditto,

[The above are hoisted at the East or West yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in, with the addition of a Ball at the centre of the yard, until the rig of the vessel can be made out,—when one or more of the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast head:]

- An Union Jack for a Flag Ship, with or without a squadron.
- Ditto with a red pendant over, for a two decker.
- Ditto with a blue pendant over, for a Frigate.
- Ditto with a white ditto, for a small armed vessel.

A blue Pendant, for a merchant ship.

A red ditto, for a merchant brig.

A white and blue ditto, for a Foreign vessel.

A white ditto, for a topsail schooner or sloop.

A flag blue and white horizontally, a neutral fleet.

A pendant white and blue, a neutral man of war.

A blue flag, a neutral merchant ship.

A flag, red, white, and blue, an enemy's fleet.

A pendant, red, white, and blue, an enemy's man-of-war.

An Union Jack over neutral or enemy's signals, the vessel is detained, or a prize.

A white flag over any signal, the vessel bears a flag of truce.

A red flag pierced white, for the Digby Packet.

A Ball at the mast head, vessel is on shore or in distress.—

☉ Should immediate aid be necessary, guns to be fired.

In thick weather, a gun will be fired at Partridge Island, in answer to each gun heard at sea.—When a vessel requires a Pilot, her descriptive pendant will be shown at a yard arm, instead of a Ball.

TIME FOR GOING THROUGH THE FALLS.

The Falls are level (or still water) at about 3½ hours on the *flood*, and at about two and a half on the *ebb*, which makes them passable four times in 24 hours, about ten or fifteen minutes each time.—No other rule can be given, as much depends on the floods in the river St. John, and the time of high water or full sea, which is often hastened by high winds, and in proportion to the height of them.

LIGHT HOUSES.

Commissioners for Light Houses in the Bay of Fundy:

Charles Simonds, Robert W. Crookshank, Allen Otty, Thomas Barlow,
and John Ward, junior, Esquires.

Cape Sable Seal Island Light.—The first Light in approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South Point of the Seal Island. This Light is elevated about 80 feet above high water mark, and may be seen in approaching the Island from any point of the Compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks called the Blonde Rock, lies about 2 miles S. S. W. by Compass from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island, there are some dangers, the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels therefore ought not to attempt passing between them.

Bryer Island Light.—In advancing up the Bay, the next Light is situated on Bryer Island, about half a mile North East from the North West Point thereof, with an improved lantern and lamp; this light will therefore be much more beneficial to the trade of the Bay than formerly.

Annapolis Gut Light.—The next Light on the coast of Nova-Scotia, is placed at the West side of the Gut of Annapolis; from Bryer Island North Eastward; this coast is very bold and not indented; this light is therefore chiefly intended as a guide into Annapolis Bason.

Gannet Rock Light.—This Light bears from the Light on Bryer Island N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 21 miles. It is intended to warn ships of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Island off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles.

Bearings from Gannet Rock Light House.

To the Old Proprietor, which dries at $\frac{1}{2}$ ebb (very dangerous) E. by N.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ N. 7 miles.

“ Black Rock, (always above water 25 feet) off White Head, N.
E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

“ South West Head of Grand Manan, N. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

“ Northernmost of the Murr Ledges, dry at $\frac{1}{2}$ ebb, N. W. by W.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

“ To the Southernmost of ditto, called St. Mary's Ledge, always
out of water, S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

“ Machias Seal Island Lights, distant about 13 miles, W. by N.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

NOTE.—Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and which extend westward from the Light House about 4 miles; from this range, farther westerly, about 3 miles, lies a dangerous breaker called the Roaring Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the South West end of Grand Manan open. The red glass having been removed from the lantern, this light is now a bright white one.

Head Harbour Light.—Next in order after passing Grand Manan, is Head Harbour Light. This is placed on the North East extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also at all times to enter Head Harbour.

Point Le Preau Lights.—Upon this projecting Head Land two Lights have lately been placed, one above the other, and distant 18 feet. Both lights may be seen from every point of the Compass, where they may be useful.

Partridge Island Light.—This Light at the entrance of the River, and Harbour of Saint John, having been established upwards of 40 years, requires no particular notice.

Beacon Light.—Within Partridge Island and upon a spit, or bar which extends about half a mile, S. S. E. from Sand Point, and which dries at $\frac{3}{4}$ ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. Upon this Tower a Light is established, which is eminently useful to the coasting trade of St. John, and to all other vessels having Pilots on board, as it enables them to enter the Harbour of St. John at all hours of the night.

West Quoddy Light.—This is an American Light, and is placed on the West side of the entrance into the St. Croix by Lubec and Eastport; a new light house has lately been erected here, and the light much improved.

Two fixed lights upon the Machias Seal Island, were put into operation in October last—they are elevated about 45 feet above high water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. N. distant 200 feet, by which they will be immediately distinguished from all other Lights upon the coast (British or American)—the following are bearings from them, viz:

- To the Southernmost Murr Ledge, (St. Mary's,) E. S. E. easterly.
- “ Gannet Rock Light, E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 13 miles.
- “ Southern Head of Grand Manan, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.
- “ Northern ditto, N. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.
- “ N. E. Rock, distant 2 miles, N. E. by N.
- “ Little River Head, N. by W.
- “ Libby Island Light House, (American) N. W. by W.

Vessels in standing in to the Northward, between these Lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack, or haul off the moment they bring these lights in one, as they will then be not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ th of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the Eastward of the lights.

The Commissioners of Light Houses for Nova-Scotia, under date of the 20th October, 1832, gave notice, that the Light House building on Low Point, at the entrance of Sydney Harbour, Cape Breton, would be finished on the 1st November, and lighted on or about the 15th of that month. It would be a fixed light on the East point of the entrance of the harbour.

A *White Beacon* has been erected on the East Head, leading into Louisbourg Harbour, upon the site of the old French Light House— which may be seen at a very considerable distance.
