1. This section of Kawasaki plant has finished its conversion in so much as is contemplated. They have converted five sections, Iron Working Shop, Press Shop, Woodwork Shop, Electrical Installation Shop, Automobile Repair and Parts Shop.

2. Machinery of the Kawasaki Aircraft Co. is in very good condition. Most of the machinery is in storage. A large part of the machines have been cleaned and oiled. The balance are in process of being cleaned.

3. Items being manufactured are believed necessary to civilian economy.

4. It is recommended that this plant be permitted to continue production.

5. In the opinion of the Liaison Office, this factory must continue in order to satisfy minimum needs of civilians.

6. It is recommended that the Asahi Factory and Fuji Factory be removed from O.D. #5 Annex. The two factories were completely destroyed and no useful machinery remains at the factories.

7. The Misato Factory has only two machines and they are to be taken to the main factory. When this is accomplished, it is recommended that this factory be removed from O.D. #5.

After the termination of the war this factory and the subsidiaries concerned commenced to adjust the employees at the plant and to put raw materials, machineries, and equipments, which were dispersed, in a good order. At the same time the plan was drafted to reconverse the factory into the manufacture of the civilian essential commodities which would stabilize the livelihood of people for the reconstruction of New Japan. Nov. 20, 1945, the application for a permission of the reconversion was submitted to the Japanese Government through the Commerce and Industry Department at the Prefectural Government and, at the same time, the same foregoing application was submitted to the Commander of the Six Army. At this juncture, a permission was granted in accordance with the formal document, MG. 176, Military Government Section, Headquarters, Six Army, dated Dec. 1, 1945.

3. Reason for Transference and Rebuilding.

Since the time of obtaining the permission for reconversion in November, 1945 the Kawasaki Woodwork Shop, receiving the order from the Gifu Prefectural authorities, has been devoting its efforts for constructing the house for the reconstruction purpose (Welfare A - 1 Type).

The shop has already completed the construction of the two hundred houses by the end of March this year. Having completed the construction stated above, this shop is eagerly looking forward to achieve the mass production of the 39.6 sq.m. prefabricated house planned by the prefectural authorities.

And, at the same time, this shop, with a consent of the prefectural authorities, is about to start the mass production of the agricultural implement which is now bearing the immense deadlock for increasing production of the indispensable foodstuff.

However, since this shop has only the one-storied barrack which is about 990.0 sq.m., the operation in this shop is in such a condition that this shop could not meet the demand mentioned above.

In addition to this, this shop has no saw-mill installation and is encountering with many troubles for construction of the house for reconstruction purpose.

Therefore, this shop is, by transferring and rebuilding of building and by conquering all hindrances for production of the farm implement, going to devote itself for the reconstruction manufacture.

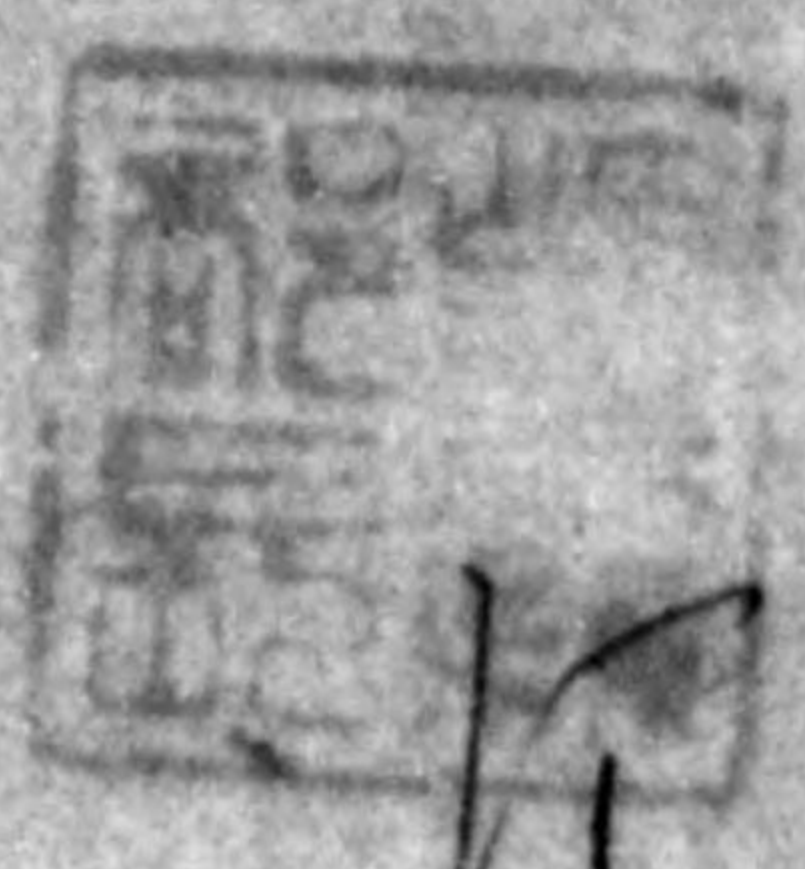

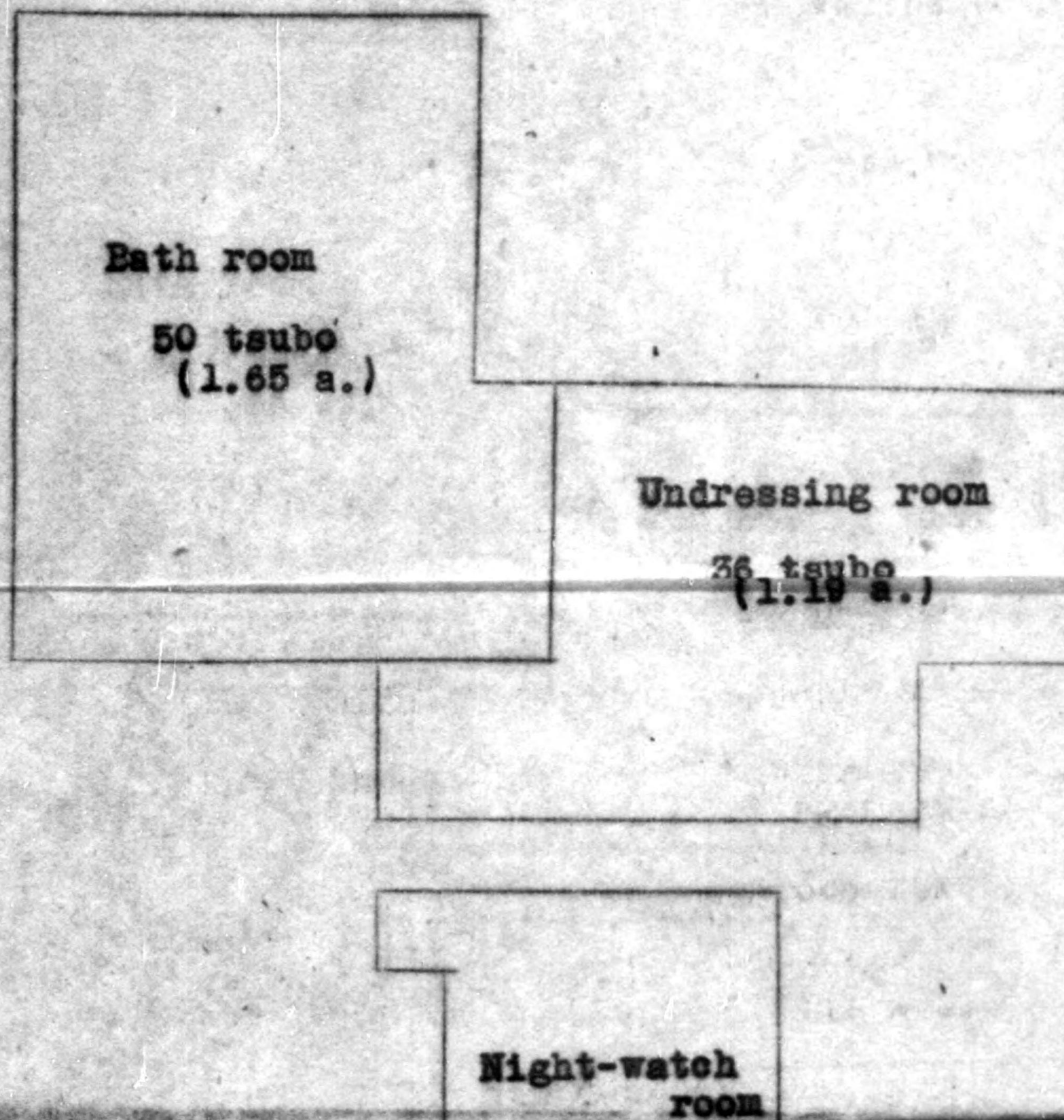

2. Mr. K. Nagano, Chief of the Production Division of the Company has furnished the following verbal facts:

A. The Company was founded in 1937 and operates plants in the general areas of Kobe, Gifu and Miyakonojo. The Gifu office is the center of some 13 plants which are located primarily in and near Gifu, although others are many miles removed.

1. Enclosed herewith are two applications of the Kawasaki Aircraft Manufacturing Co., Ltd., requesting permission (A) to reconvert the Gifu factory to the production of peacetime products (application No. 2) and (B) to utilize in the production of these products, all materials and supplies on hand at this factory (application No. 1). The Company's principal office is located at 100 Otsubo, Kenigasaka, Akashi, Hyogo Prefecture.

2. Mr. K. Nagano, Chief of the Production Division of the Company has furnished the following verbal facts:

A. The Company was founded in 1937 and operates plants in the general areas of Kobe, Gifu and Miyakonojo. The Gifu office is the center of some 13 plants which are located primarily in and near Gifu, although others are many miles removed.

B. Since its inception, this Company has been engaged in the manufacture of military airplanes. At the present time, the major portion of the main Gifu factory is occupied by the U. S. Armed Forces. It is the intention that if permission is granted, the Company will operate 4 plants in the Gifu area, namely the Kiyosu and Iwato plants, a small portion of the main Gifu plant, and a so-called Naka-shop formerly used as a housing unit for the Company's workers.

C. During the war period, the Company has approximately 35,000 employees in the plants under the Gifu office. It has, at the present time, 2,900 employees although no production is in progress at this date.

D. It is the Company's plan to commence production of the products described in detail in item 11 of the application. The Company further contemplates construction of houses for war sufferers, and the manufacture of furniture and fixtures therefore in compliance with the request of the Prefectural Office. It is for this purpose that the Company desires to use the Kiyosu factory which formerly was a woodworking shop. This plant at no time manufactured any war products, but was under the control of the Kawasaki Aircraft Manufacturing Co., Ltd.

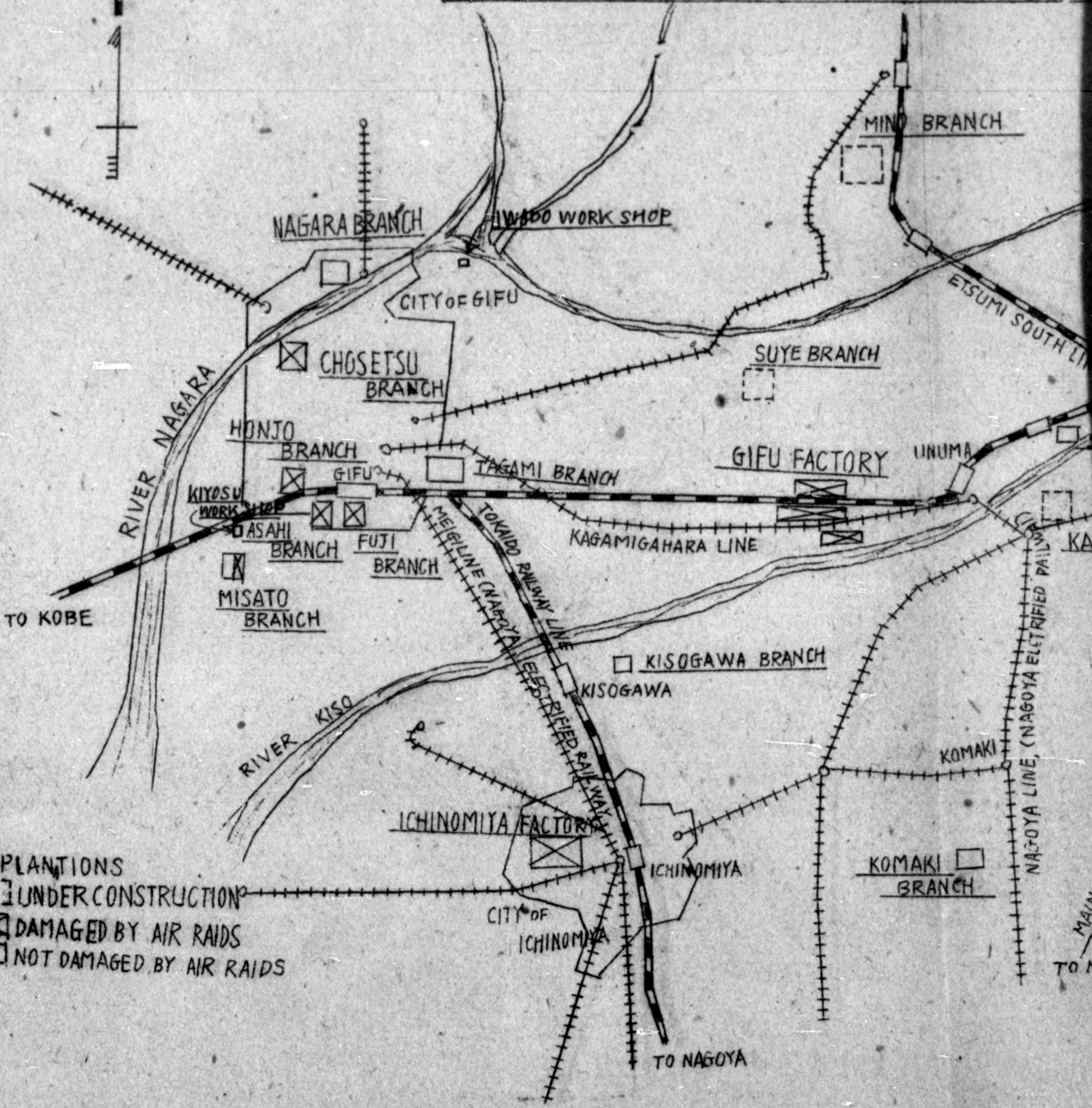
