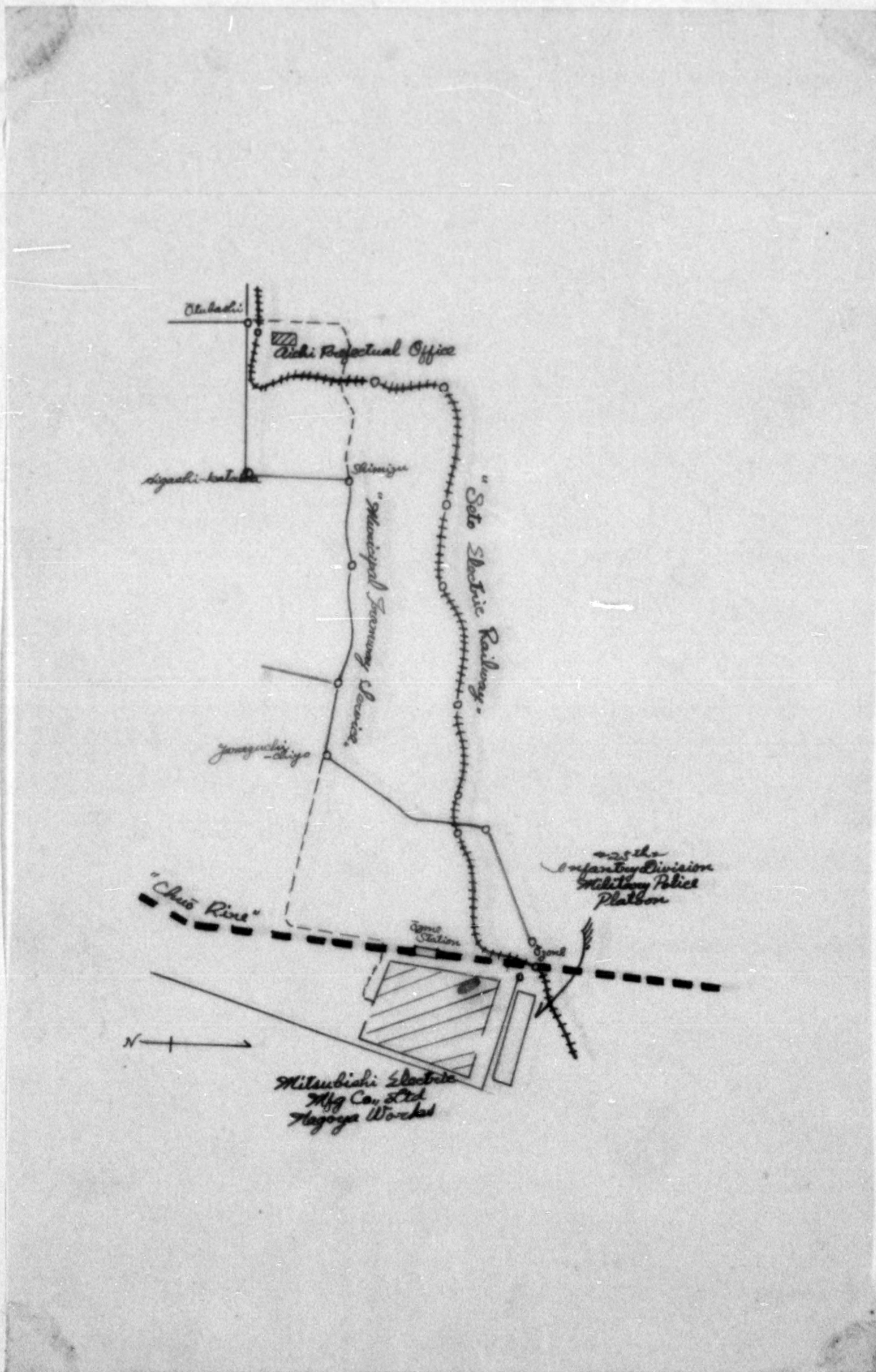

(An extract of the parts of the Operational Directive referred to in these remarks will be found at the end of the list of plants.)

<u>Company</u>	<u>Remarks</u>
<u>AICHI AIRCRAFT CO.</u> Aotsuka Funakata Hotei Ibo Kofu Main Plant Sanno Seto Tsushima (Aircraft)	All of these Aichi plants were removed from the list because of the fact that there was no more machinery in them. The plants were either completely bombed out during the war or the machinery was centralized at one of the fine main plants remaining on the list.
<u>AICHI TOKEI DENKI K.K.</u> Funakata (Munitions)	This plant was constructed and operated solely as a producer of Naval Ordnance. This plant was removed by SCAP from the list at the same time as three other so-called "clock factories" presumably on the theory that the clock industry is essential. This headquarters recommended that this plant remain on the list. (Ref: O D 5/5 Section III, 1 C (1) (2))
Meitoku (Munitions)	The same remarks applying to Aichi Tokei Denki KK, Funakata plant apply to this plant. (Ref: OD 5/5 Section III, 1 C (1) (2))

<u>Company</u>	<u>Remarks</u>
Mizuho (Munitions)	This plant has a long prewar history of clock and meter production. Production of fuses for naval ordnance was apparently a wartime diversion only and under the provisions of OD 5/5 this plant should be excluded from reparations. This headquarters recommended removal. (Ref: OD 5/5 Sec. III, 1 C (1)(2))
<u>ASAHINA TEKKOSHO</u> Nagoya Seisakusho (Aircraft)	The OI-1 report on this plant reports only six usable machines at this bombed out plant.
<u>DAIDO SEIKO K.K.</u> Hoshizaki (Aircraft)	This plant produced no finished aircraft parts but only raw steel which removed it from the category established by OD-5. This headquarters recommended removal. (Ref: OD-5/5 Sec. 3, 1 b (1)(2))
Tsukiji (Aircraft)	This plant produced aircraft forging and was added to the reparations list by I Corps at the recommendation of this headquarters, SCAP, however, refused to add this plant to the list. (Ref: OD-5/5 Sec. 3, 1 b (1)(2))
<u>GUNZE KOGYO K.K.</u> Toyohashi (Aircraft)	This company produced raw silk before the war and converted to the production of bolts and nuts during the war. Since this did not appear to come under the classification of an aircraft factory this headquarters recommended removal from the list. (Ref: OD-5/5 Sec. 3, 1 b (1)(2))

<u>Company</u>	<u>Remarks</u>
<u>HOWA JUKOGYO K.K.</u> Shinkawa (Aircraft)	This headquarters continually recommended that this plant remain on the list and after it was removed a protest was made. I Corps replied long prewar history of non-aircraft production probable reason for removal -- wartime aircraft production merely diversion. (Ref: O D-5/5 Sec. 3, 1 b (1) (2))
<u>NAKAJIMA AIRCRAFT CO.</u> Atsuta Obu Okada Shokudai Yoshino (Aircraft)	The same reason that applies to Aichi Aircraft applies to all of Nakajima's plants.
<u>TAKANO SEIMITSU KOGYO KK</u> Okazaki (Munitions)	This plant began operation before the war as a clock maker and apparently did not make major changes in installed machinery to divert to fuse production during the war this headquarters recommended removal. (Ref: OD-5/5 Sec. III 1 C (1)(2))
<u>TEIKOKU PACKING CO.</u> Ichinomiya (Aircraft)	This plant was completely bombed and nothing of reparations value remains.
<u>TOYODA JIDOSHA KOGYO KK</u> Aichi (Aircraft)	Toyoda began operation of this plant in 1935, producing cotton yard and thread. In 1943 it converted through complete change

of installed machinery to production of aircraft radiators and exhaust manifolds. This headquarters sees apparent legal reason for SCAP removal of this plant early last summer and did not recommend its removal.

Extract from OD 5/5

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"Section 3, 1 b (1) (2)

(b) Plants and facilities engaged in the production of aircraft (references (f), (g), (h) and (i) Section II above), have been considered appropriate installations for reparations providing that the following definitions and criteria for selection apply:

(1) Aircraft industry defined: Those plants and establishments primarily engaged in the manufacture or assembly of finished aircraft, airframes, aircraft engines, and aircraft propellers, or in supplying fabricated materials, semi-finished or finished parts, components or accessories (exclusive of arms and armaments, instruments and communication equipment) especially designed for incorporation in finished aircraft.

(2) Criteria for selection: All facilities in plants and establishments originally designed, constructed and equipped, or converted through major change in the nature of installed machinery and equipment to serve in this category as defined in the preceding paragraph will be subject to designation for reparations removal. Plants and establishments in which the use of products by the aircraft industry represents merely a diversion during the war without major change in character of product from peacetime

consumption, or in the nature of installed machinery and equipment, should not be treated as part of the aircraft industry for purposes of custody and control."

"Section 3, 1 c (1) (2)

(c) Plants and facilities engaged in the production of munitions (reference (c) above), have been considered appropriate installations for reparations providing the following definitions and criterial for selection apply:

(1) Privately-owned munitions plants defined: Those plants and establishments primarily engaged in the manufacture of weapons, missiles, ammunition and military explosives.

(2) Criteria for selection: All facilities within the category defined in the preceding paragraph, that were originally organized for munitions production, or were converted to munitions production through such major change in the volume and character of their equipment as to render them unsuitable for reconversion to peacetime purposes, will be subject to designation for reparations removal."

1. Reference SCAPINS 1129, 1132, 1277 which list selections for the Caustic Soda, Sulphuric Acid, and Synthetic Rubber factories respectively.

2. Information received from higher headquarters indicates that the SCAPINS listed in par 1 above are to be interpreted generally as follows: When a plant designated for reparations is composed of two or more parts, only that portion of the plant should be taken which qualifies under the established criteria for the type of plant indicated.

3. Specifically, the following criteria is to be applied.

a. Synthetic Rubber Plant: The List of Synthetic Rubber Plants accompanying SCAPIN 1277 refers only to such portions of the listed companies as were engaged in the production of synthetic rubber. However, several synthetic rubber plants, because of war-time equipment shortages, utilized items of equipment in their synthetic rubber system which were originally designed for, or located in, other portions of their plant. When production of synthetic rubber ceased, this equipment was incorporated in its original place in the plant scheme. Such equipment, once used in the synthetic rubber system, must be placed under custody.

b. Similarly, a sulfuric acid plant is defined as that equipment regularly used in the manufacture of the one principal product, sulfuric acid. This includes any auxiliary equipment, such as cranes for unloading pyrite ore, conveyor belts for movement of ore, crushers, water circulation pumps serving the plant, electrical equipment (transformers, etc.), bottling plants, etc. Some contact plants also make chemically

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pure acid; the equipment used for this process is also construed to be part of the plant. However, the equipment used to make sulfuric acid derivatives is not part of the sulfuric acid plant. For example, equipment to make dyes, chlorosulfonic acid, etc., does not fall under the definition of a sulfuric acid plant.

c. Caustic Soda Plants: Such a plant includes not only the electrical equipment, cell equipment (which includes mercury in mercury-type cells), and caustic soda evaporators, but also, all equipment used to recover chlorine. Chlorine recovery equipment consists of liquid chlorine bottling plants, bleaching powder and solution plants, hydrochloric acid plants, and auxiliary equipment servicing such plants. Hydrogen blowers and their accessory equipment servicing the caustic soda plants are also included.

(Kyoto, Honshu)

1. This headquarters recommends that the following factories be removed from the reparations list for the reasons stated.

a. DAIDO SEIKO K.K., Hoshizaki Factory

This factory produced steel bar, rolled steel and ingots and did not make aircraft parts. If Japan is to be permitted steel production at all relatively small, non Zaibatsu concerns such as this would seem to be the logical producers.

b. GUNZE KOGYO K.K., Toyohashi Factory

This factory manufactured raw silk before the war and converted to making bolts and nuts for aircraft during the war. Production of bolts and nuts does not appear to fall within the categories of OD-5.

c. OBU KOKU KOGYO K.K., Main Factory

This factory produced cotton yarn and fabric before the war and during the war converted to making aircraft bolts and nuts which production does not appear to fall within the categories of OD-5.

d. TOYODA JIDOSHA KOGYO K.K.,

This plant produced trucks and autos only both before and during the war, and therefore was in no way an aircraft industry.

The war production of this plant was restricted to motor car parts and was therefore not an aircraft industry.
