

Reference is made to your recent letter wherein you complain about not being allowed ashore at Okinawa while you were serving aboard the SS PACIFIC VICTORY.

The records at this Headquarters reflect that you were issued a validated merchant seaman's document under the provisions of the President's Executive Order 10173 at New York, New York on 10 April 1951. The authorization for the issuance of this document to you means that you are not now classed as a poor security risk by the Coast Guard under the President's Executive Order 10173. It is emphasized that the issuance of the specially validated document to you means that your activities as a merchant seaman in matters under jurisdiction of the Coast Guard will not be curtailed while you are in possession of this document. It does not imply, however, that you will be granted free movement and access to areas under control of other military authorities. This matter of free movement and access to areas under the control of other military authorities is of necessity a matter which is under the immediate jurisdiction of the local military authorities.

Should you desire to pursue this matter further it is suggested that you should communicate with the Department of the Army, Washington, D. C.

His address is stated to be 425 West 24th Street, New York, New York; next of kin, wife, Helen, whose address is given as Cape Vincent, New York. He is described as being 5'92", with brown eyes and hair and a fair complexion. U. S. Coast Guard records further disclose that he last shipped on the SS MARINE FLASHER, from 9-4-47 to 10-2-47 as an AB seaman. In addition to his service aboard the SS MARINE FLASHER, SHEEHAN has served as Boatswain aboard the SS MARTIN BEHRMAN; SS MAYFIELD VICTORY; SS WOODSTOCK VICTORY; and the SS WASHINGTON.


