STATATIONS TO MISS FERGUSON.

Saturday afternoon a large company of ladies and gentlemen assembled at Pitfour House to witness the presentation of gifts, to which they had subscribed, to Miss Ferguson, the elder daughter of Colonel and the Honourable Mrs Ferguson of Pitfour, who is to be married on Wednesday to Mr Francis Crawley of Stockwood, Luton.

At three o'clock the company assembled in front of the house, preparatory to the presentation ceremony, on a platform being Colonel and the Hon. Mrs Ferguson, Miss Georgina Ferguson, sister of Colonel Ferguson; Miss Ferguson of Pitfour, Miss Mary Ferguson, Rev. Edwin and Mrs Ferguson and their daughters, Misses Mina and Dora Ferguson.

Mr Taylor said the Pitfour tenantry were very glad to have the opportunity of congratulating Miss Ferguson on her approaching marriage, and at the same time of asking her to accept a small present from them—a mark of their esteem and a testimony of their hearty congratulations.

Mr Walker, Old Deer, next ascended the platform and asked Miss Ferguson to accept a silver toilet set from the Old Deer Lawn Tennis Club.

Mr Turner, Pitfour House, presented a silver card case from Miss Ferguson's members and candidates of the Scotch Girls' Friendly Society.

The members of the Golf Club, he said, congratulated Miss Ferguson on her approaching marriage, and wished her many happy days and long life and prosperity to her husband.

Mr Burn, rector of St Drostan's Church, Old Deer, next ascended the platform, and presented Miss Ferguson with a diamond and pearl brooch. In doing so he said that after the eloquent tribute which they had just listened to, it ought to be unnecessary for him to say anything more than—"Them's my sentiments"—(laughter and applause).

Mr Ainslie, factor, Pitfour, captain of the Curling Club, said he was proud in having the honour and privilege of presenting to Miss Ferguson on behalf of the curlers of Pitfour, a mark of their respect and esteem.

MARRIAGE OF MISS FERGUSON OF PITFOUR.

REJOICINGS IN BUCHAN.

Yesterday afternoon a fashionable and pretty wedding took place at Old Deer, when Miss Edith Rosa, elder daughter of Colonel and the Honourable Mrs Ferguson of Pitfour, and grand daughter of General Viscount Bridport, Duke of Bronte, was married to Mr Francis Crawley, of Stockwood, Luton. The occasion was one of great rejoicing in the Buchan district, where the Pitfour family are well-known and respected not only among their numerous tenantry, but by all classes of people in the surrounding parishes; and, naturally, there were many outward indications, principally in the form of flags and bunting, that an unusually popular event was being celebrated. Mr George, the gardener at Pitfour, and his men were busy all morning in decorating the entrance gates to the house, and managed to produce a very pretty effect. Over the East Lodge gate, leading to Mintlaw Station, there was a chaise floral and evergreen device in the shape of an arch, surmounted with banners, and exhibiting the well-known line—'Wood and married and a'."

Over the gate at the Old Deer Lodge, by which the marriage party were driven to and from the church, there was a similar floral arch, with the pleasing sentiment, "God bless them." General Russell of Aden had his entrance gates tastefully done up in celebration of the happy event in the family of his respected neighbouring proprietor, and there was prominently displayed over the Old Deer gate the appropriate wish, "Good luck." In the village of Old Deer there was to some extent a general decoration; but in the immediate vicinity of Pitfour, notably at Taitewald, Castlelough, Milladen, the station and hotel and premises of Mr Arthur Pine, grain merchant, there was a liberal display of flags. During the forenoon and afternoon the drivers of the engines passing up and down the line opposite the policies of Pitfour kept up a continual whistling so long as they were within hearing distance in honour of the event. The marriage took place in St. Drostan's Church at one o'clock; but long before that hour the building was crowded, principally with ladies, who were anxious to see what was more than a usually fashionable wedding in the district. The fact was that many were unable to gain admission, the accommodation of the church being taxed to its utmost, the whole of the seats, with the exception of half a dozen on each side of the passage nearest the chancel, which were reserved for the wedding guests, being available to the general public. The chancel of the church was relieved with beautiful decorations, though simple, were chaste. Messrs Shirras, Laing, and Co., Aberdeen, who were entrusted with the embellishment of the church, had an awning erected from the church door to the gate, and from the gate to the pavement, and the footway was covered with crimson cloth, the passages of the church to the chancel being similarly treated. The whole of the marriage party arrived punctually, and at one o'clock the bride, leaning on the arm of her father, and attended by the bridesmaids. The officiating clergymen were Rev. E. A. Ferguson, M.A., rector of Bulwich, Northamptonshire, a brother of the bride, and Rev. J. H. Burn, B.D., rector of St. Drostan's. The service, which commenced with the bymn, "The voice that breath'd o'er Eden," was almost entirely choral, the chanted responses being composed by the organist, Mr John Palmer, by special desire of Miss Ferguson. During the signing of the register the organ pealed out Gounod's "Wedding March," Mendelssohn's "Wedding March" being played as the newly-married couple left the church. The bride, who was given away by her father, Colonel Ferguson, was attended by six bridesmaids—Miss Mary Ferguson, her sister; Miss Nina Ferguson, her niece; Miss Crawley and Miss Florence Crawley, sisters of the bridegroom; Miss M. Acland Hood, and Miss Russell of Aden, the latter two being pretty children. Major Crawley, of the Grenadier Guards, supported his brother as best man. As the newly-married couple left the church, about a hundred children lined up on either side of the pathway to the church strewed the path with flowers, and they were received with loud cheering from a large crowd of villagers outside as they drove to Pitfour House in a carriage. The bride, who looked exceedingly lovely and charming, wore a dress of rich ivory satin duchesse, trimmed with beautiful point lace, the gift of her mother, and festooned with orange blossom. She carried a wreath, also of orange blossom, and she wore over her face a beautiful veil of fine Brussels lace, another present from her mother. Her ornaments were a handsome necklet of pearls, enamel, and diamonds, the gift of her aunt, Miss Ferguson; a pearl and diamond bracelet, the gift of the bridegroom; and the diamond and pearl bracelet presented by the Pitfour tenantry. The dresses of the bridesmaids were composed of white poplin, with sapphire blue busser capes, trimmed with dincilla, and muffs to match; toque of blue velvet and white ostrich plumes. The maids each wore a lovely pearl and turquoise brooch, the gift of the bridegroom. The bride, Mrs Ferguson was handsomely dressed in a gown of pearl-grey poplin, trimmed with velvet, and lined with chenille and silver; a mantle of grey mirror velvet, trimmed with sable and with Parma triangles.

R. and Mrs Mackay, Longside; Rev. J. The bride's travelling gown was of soft French grey cloth, trimmed with sable and mirror velvet, with toque to match, trimmed with sable tails.
