The vignette, figure of Hope. On right hand margin a stag—on left, a female figure, with one foot resting on a globe.

100's, altered from Farm. and Mech. Bank, Wisconsin. Detected by observing that the spurious notes have on the right hand margin a medallion head of Lafayette—and on the left, the head of Washington.

Engraved by Durand & Company—the genuine was engraved by Rawdon, Wright & Hatch.

100's, vig. a female holding a shield and flag, and an eagle—the bank has not issued 100's.

Oneach end 1's, counterfeit, same as the 3's that follow. 2's, paper and execution good—observe a blank space under the Bank of Montpelier—letter A. 3's, lett. A., stereotype plate. Payable at Suffolk Bank, Boston; this is not on genuine bill.

A. engraved by Reed & Bessell, S. C., N. Y. A miserable imitation. 2's, lett. A. pay A. Kent or bearer, June 5, 1840, R. Van Cott, Pres., Jno. Billings, Cash. Engraving coarse, paper light.

10's, vig. female, sitting; two "X" on the left, "ten" on the right. Letter B, in German. Barnstable Bank, Yarmouth, [Isaiah Crowell, Pres., Anos Otis, Cash.] 5's, altered from "Citizens' Bank," Augusta, Maine; vig. three females.

Bedford Commercial Bk., N. Bedford, [George Howland, Pres., T. B. White, Cash.] 2's, lett. A. pay E. Perry, dated Sept. 7, 1820. 2's, lett. B. pay Levi Lincoln, 20th April, 1825. 3's, lett. M. pay N. Beverly Bank, Beverly, [P. Lovett, Pres., Albert Thoradike, Cash.] 5's, lett. A. altered from Roxbury Bank; can be detected by the signatures; the altered bills are signed John Phillips, Cash., A. Quimby, Pres.

Blackstone Bank, Uxbridge, [B. Tall, Pres., R. W. Hayward, Cash.] 5's & 10's, altered from 1's; the P in the name of N. P. Deany does not come down to the line. 50's, altered from 3's—well executed.

Boston Bank, Boston, [Robert Hooper, Jr. Pres., James C. Wild, Cash.] 2's, lett. A. pay to J. Bogart, dated July 1, 1839. 2's, lett. A. pay to R. Lush, dated Oct. 3, 1827. 5's, pay to N. Bond, dated Sept. 24, 1824. 5's, lett. L. payable to F. Boyd, Jan. 1, 1834.

Boylston Bank, Boston, [Wm Parker, Pres., D. McB. Thaxter, Cash.] Brighton, Bank of, Brighton, [E. Sparhawk, Pres., L. Baldwin, Cash.] 10's, lett. C. pay C. Strong, May 4th, 1840, vig. two ships, right end ascabomb, female on the left. 10's, lett. A. pay to C. Strong.

Greenfield Bank, Greenfield, [Henry W. Clapp, Pres., Franklin Ripley, Cash.] 10's, lett. A. dated Dec. 7, 1835, pay T. Allen. 10's, lett. A. a. dated Jan. 4, 1838. 10's, lett. A. a. dated Dec. 8, 1835, pay to S. Allen. Vignette, a woman churning.

Hamilton Bank, Boston, [Danl. Denny, Pres., Otis Turner, Jr., Cash.] 1's, 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's, altered from the Lafayette Bank, Boston, which has failed.

Hampden Bank, Westfield, [A. Post, Pres., R. Weller, Cash.] Hampshire Manufacturers' Bk., Ware, [Joseph Bowden, Pres., William Hyde, Cash.] Haverhill Bank, Haverhill, [Thomas West, Pres., James Gale, Cash.] 5's, & 10's, altered from 1's and 2's.

 10's, an alteration—lion and unicorn between the officers names; signing bad.

Lee Bank, Lee, [Walter Laffin, Pres., Thomas Green, Cash.]

 1's, pay to Lyman Waite Paper thin and signatures poor. The letter O in the word ONE, the left margin, smaller than the other letters.

 50's, altered from a smaller denomination by pasting on the word fifty and figures 50. Well done.

 5's, lett. C. pay to S. Brown, dated Aug. 4, 1840. Vignette, a large ship, in full sail, with another crossing her bows. Cashier's name in black, President's in blue.
 10's, dated Jan. 4, 1840, pay to A. Wood. Filling up and signatures blue ink. The principal vignette is a ship under sail, and a brig crossing her wake. The vignette between the Pres't's and Cashier's names is a brig.

 5's, lett. C. very large letter, placed between Cashier's and President's names, on the bottom of the bill, pay to C. Bliss, dated Jan. 9, 1839.

 5's, spurious, vig. shipping, &c. Durnd & Co. engravers. They never engraved for this bank.
