OBJECT TO THE BILL.

STREET RAILWAY LAW.

A Pedestrian's Duty to Keep a Lookout to Save Himself From Danger.

The New York supreme court, appellate division, in *Hassman vs. Nassau Electric Railway Company*, has held: "A pedestrian in crossing a street trolley track in a suburban neighborhood must keep a lookout. A mere glance on leaving the sidewalk does not show sufficient care."

A motorist is not bound to keep his car under slow control because he sees 250 feet off, a person slowly crossing the street.

No allowance will be made for infringe- ments; their existence, on the contrary, puts the pedestrian on her guard to use extreme watchfulness.

Woodward, J., said: To hold that this plaintiff met the obligation resting on her of insuring reasonable care in crossing the track when she glanced up and down the street from the sidewalk, and then, with no further exercise of her faculties, walked slowly and deliberately upon the track with an approaching car fully in view, with its bell ringing, is absurd.

REVOLUTION IN TELEGRAPHY.

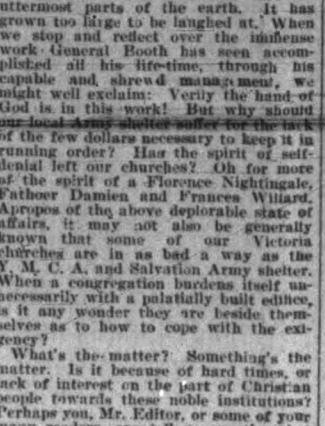
