#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the last two weeks in April the Battalion continued the mission of direct support for the 1st Marine Regiment and Reconaissance elements. Additionally, IOD sites, counter-rocket OP's, and daily aerial VR's supplemented artillery fire to fulfill the assigned counter-rocket task. The Battalion continued to prepare for embarkation scheduled for the coming month of May.

Two FO Teams were dispatched on 14 April and 15 April to Hill 190 and Hai Van Pass in support of local Regional and Popular forces. The Battalion counterrocket observation post located at OP Crowsnest, which had been manned with observer personnel from Mortar Battery, terminated operations on 15 April and displaced to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. On 16 April operational control of Battery "D", 1st Battalion, 82nd Army Artillery passed from this Battalion to the XXIV Corps Artillery. Platoon "CY", with two 105mm howitzers, located at Hill 270, terminated operations on 21 April and displaced all personnel, equipment, and weapons to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. The IOD site located at Hill 270 ceased operations on 22 April, turned the IOD over to the Army, and displaced the remaining equipment and personnel to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. On 23 April the Battalion activated an IOD site on Hill 327-OP Hawk in preparation for the forthcoming high threat period. The IOD site located at OP Reno ceased operation on 30 April and displaced personnel and equipment to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. The Forward Command Post displaced from Hill 34 and resumed operations at the Northern Artillery Cantonment on 15 April 1971. The Battalion fired a total of 1.606 missions and 3,595 rounds were expended.

Enemy activity remained at a low level during the reporting period. Danang Air Base received four enemy 122mm rockets on the morning of 27 April. One rocket landed in a fuel dump destroying one fuel tank, with the remaining three rockets causing no damage. The Battalion Aerial Observer Section continued aerial reconnaissance of the rocket belt and the Battalion counter-rocket observation posts were continually manned.

The scheduled re-deployment during the month of May caused the main efforts of the Battalion to be concentrated on preparation for embarkation.

2. Intelligence. During the last two weeks of April enemy activity continued at a low level of intensity and gradually increased in tempo at the end of the period with the approach of the low lunar illumination period. Firing elements of the Battalion attacked one target of opportunity, an enemy bunker and rocket site, producing 13 secondary explosions, and acting on firm intelligence data attacked a heavily booby trapped area between 23 April and 27 April producing 106 secondary explosions. The surveillance of excellent effect on target was provided by ARVN forces sweeping through the booby trapped area.

During the early morning hours of 27 April the enemy launched four 122mm rockets at the Danang Air Base. One rocket impacted in the Northeast Fuel Dump destroying one large fuel tank with the remaining rockets causing no damage.

The Battalion Aerial Observer Section continued aerial reconnaissance of the rocket belt and the Battalion counter-rocket observation posts continued surveilance throughout the TACR.

3. Maintenance, Equipment, and Supply. During the last two weeks of April logistical functions consisted of routine maintenance, motor transport support, and preparation of unit equipment and supplies for re-deployment. The Battalion established technical assistance contact teams to aid elements of the Battalion in preparing their electronic, motor transport, and ordnance equipment for embarkation. By the end of April, 75% of the Battalion's motor transport assets had been prepared for embarkation. All vehicles satisfactorily passed the agricultural pre-embark inspection and were re-located at the 11th Motor Transport Battalion.

Supply Sections continued preparation and packing of organizational supplies,

equipment and personal effects for re-deployment.

The Battalion, in compliance with Project 805, transferred ordnance items to the Republic of Vietnam's Armed Forces consisting of six 105mm howitzers from Battery "A". Four 155mm howitzers (T) were turned over to FLC for retrograde.

- 4. Training. With the anticipated stand-down for re-deployment of the Battalion next month, preparation for embarkation was emphasized during the reporting period. Daily training to maintain and increase proficiency in responding to calls for fire continued on the battery level.
- 5. Operations. During the last two weeks in April enemy activity continued at a low level of intensity.

On 14 April an FO team composed of one Officer and one radio Operator was dispatched from the Battalion to Hai Van Pass and on 15 April another Battalion FO team was placed on Hill 190 for operation. The Battalion counter-rocket observation post located at Crowsnest, which had been manned with observer personnel from Mortar Battery, terminated operations on 15 April. All personnel and equipment were displaced to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. On 16 April operational control of Battery "D", 1st Battalion, 82nd Army Artillery passed from this Battalion to their parent unit, the XXIV Corps Artillery. Platoon "CY", with two 105mm howitzers located at Hill 270, terminated operations on 21 April and displaced all personnel, equipment, and weapons to the Northern Artillery Cantonment

and the IOD site located at Hill 270 ceased operations on 22 April, turned the IOD over to the Army, and displaced remaining personnel and equipment to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. The Battalion established an IOD site on Hill 327-OP Hawk in anticipation of the forthcoming high threat period. This IOD site was activated on 23 April. On 30 April the IOD site located at OP Reno terminated operations and displaced personnel and equipment to the Northern Artillery Cantonment. The Forward Command Post located at Hill 34 displaced to the Northern Artillery Cantonment and resumed operations from that position.
