MEMO for RECORD:

Foregoing msg prepared at direction of CofS pertains to 79th Engr Const Bn now a part of the base construction group on Eniwetok Atoll. Ref msg indicates Bn requires aprx 200 fillers. DA plan contained in ref msg was to provide Eniwetok with 900 replacements from FEC quota, of which 200 would be given to 79th Bn prior to its departure for FEC. Rather than detain unit on Eniwetok awaiting arrival of fillers, it is considered more desirable to fill unit in FEC from FEC replacement stream. CINCFE has previously recommended that Brig Gen Shingler (the Engr Group Commander on Eniwetok) visit FEC for planning purposes at earliest date.

a. Letter, GHQ, FEC, AG 421 (4 Jan 50)GD, subject: Provision of Protective Clothing in the Far East Command, 27 January 1950 (Tab A).

b. Summary Plan for Chemical Corps Support for Military Operations in Korea thru 30 June 1951, with 2 Inclosures (Tab B).

2. ABC (atomic, biological and chemical) warfare service support by the Army (Chemical Corps) to the forces of the FEC during the Korean conflict will consist of:

a. Supply and maintenance of ABC offensive and defensive materiel.\*

b. Furnishing of Chemical Corps personnel and units to:

(1) Operate chemical depot and maintenance facilities.

(2) Decontaminate areas and materiel required for military operations.

(3) Impregnate QM clothing for initial distribution by the QM. (See reference 1a.)

(4) Reimpregnate protective clothing as required.

(5) Operate ABC laboratory facilities.

(6) Conduct technical intelligence operations.

(7) Furnish advice on all matters pertaining to ABC warfare plus certain supervisory responsibilities pertaining to training. (These two functions will not be discussed herein.)

3. ABC service support will be furnished to Army, Navy and Air Force forces of the command in accordance with existing regulations, directives and agreements.

4. There are no Chemical Corps items of equipment and supply specifically designed and standardized for atomic and biological warfare. However, certain chemical protective items do furnish some degree of protection against A and B

\*Note: Organizations other than Chemical Corps have supply responsibility for certain items required of A warfare.

warfare. There are no authorized units solely for A and B service support but some A and B functions are or will be included within the capabilities of Chemical Corps units. To the extent considered necessary, plans are made for the use of local expedients to accomplish B and C functions not provided by chemical organizations. Action has been initiated to procure non-standard instruments.

5. The plan for providing Chemical Corps service support, reference 1b, was based on certain assumptions which are stated therein. There is a degree of calculated risk involved which is believed to be warranted in accordance with the present situation. Plan involves minimum numbers of chemical units as a nucleus for requirements under ABC warfare. These organizations will include maximum numbers of Japanese and Korean employees which can be employed appropriately. Expansion to meet gas warfare requirements will also be accomplished in this manner.

1. By ltr, Hq 8th Army, file AGPOS 414, 11 January 50, subject "Requisition ABCC-96-50", CG 8th A fwded to SCAP a requisition from the Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission for certain office furniture which ABCC desired to purchase on a reimbursable basis from 8th A QM. 8th A fwded the ABCC requisition to SCAP on the basis of a ltr directive (Ltr, GHQ SCAP & FEC, AG 471.6 (7 May 48) GD, 7 May 48, subj "Logistic Support of Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission") which requires that all requests from the ABCC for items of an indigenous nature be fwded to SCAP.

2. In view of the fact that the ABCC desired to purchase the required office furniture on a dollar reimbursement basis, it is believed that the ABCC was under the impression that the furniture was ZI procured. 8th A does not have stocks of ZI procured office furniture that could be furnished ABCC on a reimbursement basis since office furniture used by the U.S. Army installations in Japan is procured from indigenous sources.

3. The ABCC requisition was discussed with Mr. Brewer, local ABCC fiscal and property officer, who stated that the ABCC could purchase the items on the local market. Mr. Brewer was informed of the non-availability of ZI procured office furniture in 8th A stocks. Mr. Brewer requested that the ABCC requisition be fwded to him thru PH&W Section, and stated that he would discuss the matter with the Hiroshima ABCC (ABCC office with which the requisition originated) and arrange for local purchase of the items.

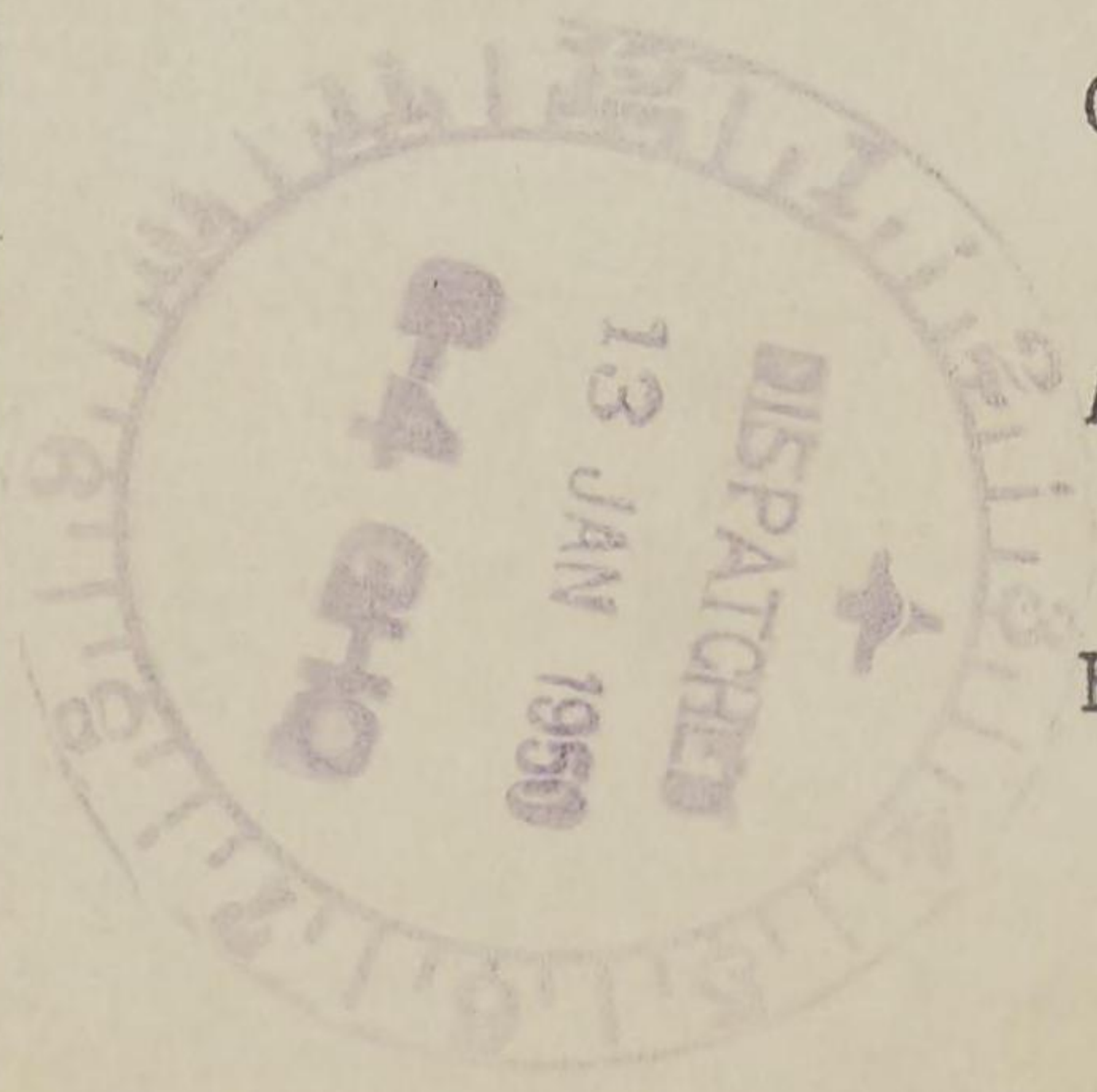

PERSONNEL MEMORANDUM NO. 41

SUBJECT: Changes in Military Regulations Governing Travel

TO : All ABCC Personnel

1. Anticipated changes with respect to travel on Japanese Government Railways have finally become official and the regulations pertaining thereto, made known to this office on this date, are given below for your information and direction.

2. All Japanese trains have been placed "on limits" for other than official travel.

3. OFFICIAL TRAVEL

a. Persons traveling on official orders must personally obtain, since signature is required, their Transportation Orders through the Unit Transportation Officer, located on 4th floor, Hqs. CCAR. The Transportation Order, together with a copy of the official travel orders, will be presented to the Japanese National Railway (JNR) representative at the RTO, who will issue a coach ticket.

b. The JNR representative has no jurisdiction over Allied Sleeper Cars. Reservations for sleepers will continue to be made through the RTO.

c. Tickets for return trips on official orders may be obtained from a JNR representative in an RTO only. Facilities do not exist for the issuance of tickets on official orders at places other than RTOs.

d. Transportation Orders.

- (1) A Transportation Order is required for every stop-over made.
- (2) A Transportation Order must be obtained for the return trip.
- (3) Transportation Orders for the entire trip should be obtained before the start of the trip.
- (4) RTOs are not authorized to issue Transportation Orders. They must be obtained from Unit Transportation Officer.

e. Interurban travel on official business. Persons planning such travel must present a commuter ticket to the JNA representative. These tickets are obtainable from the Unit Transportation Officer and may be used only by Allied Nationals.

f. "On Limits" trains. Persons traveling on official orders must ride on Allied Trains except when travel must be made over rail lines where no Allied Trains run.

4. RECREATIONAL TRAVEL

a. Effective 19 October, all Japanese trains were placed "on limits" for unofficial travel.

b. Unofficial travel can be performed on Allied Trains as in the past.

c. No space will be cleared on Japanese trains for Allied Nationals.

d. After 0001, 21 October 1949, payment must be made for all unofficial travel, whether on Japanese trains or Allied Trains, and such payment will be in Japanese currency. Yen is not obtainable at the RTO. A representative of the Japanese National railway will be in all RTOs to sell tickets.

e. For unofficial travel, the individual must present a copy of his travel orders or Absence and Travel Authority to the JNA representative, who will then sell the tickets.



1. Ltr, 5th Med Depot, 4 Jan 49, fwded priced copies of shipping tickets covering the transfer of certain med equip to the ABCC, requesting that 7 copies of each ticket be signed and ret'd to that depot. By 1st Ind thereto, the ABCC requested that the addnl charge of 43% above procurement cost be confirmed and asked the effective date of such rates and to what items it applied. By 2d Ind to ABCC, 5th Med Depot itemized the charges totalling 43%, explaining that such were according to the provisions of CINCFE msg ZX 49533, 18 May 48.

2. ABCC quoted a msg dtd 28 Apr 49, from ABCC, Wash, as follows:

"Fifth Medical Depot charge of forty three percent handling and packaging charge is in error. SGO informs should be four percent indirect procurement plus three percent handling and packaging for total seven percent."

3. CINCE relayed quoted msg to DA by msg Z 49197, 6 May 49, and further explained the itemization of the 43% addnl cost.

4. DA's reply, contained in msg WCL 40233, 14 May 49, stated that the msg quoted by ABCC (para 2 above), was erroneous, and that charges should be computed in accordance with SR 730-5-10, 20 Apr 49, in conjunction with provisions of Change 2 to AR 40-1705.

5. By C/N 1 to PH&W, G-4 answers the query of ABCC and explains that the pricing guide established in CINCFE msg ZX 49533, 18 May 48, was used in computing the total charge.

6. SDDS - none.

7. No further G-4, action required. Action complete on G-4 Journal No. 82961.

SUBJECT: Facilities for Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission - Hiro

1. On 28 Apr 49, a meeting was held in Col Eastwood's office to discuss the above subject which was attended by the following:

Colonel Eastwood  
Colonel Barr  
Lt. Col. Broyles  
Lt. Col. Lessmer (from Atomic Bomb Casualty Commission)

2. The principal point of discussion was SCAP assistance in providing quarters for ABCC single personnel at Hiro. Lt Col Lessmer presented a map covering the 34th Brigade area (Australian) now held by BCOF. He stated that the area was essentially vacant, pointed out the buildings desired which consisted of quarters for 27 people and a mess hall. He stated that approximately \$6,000 was desired to install the heating systems. This estimate was made by engineers using 8th Army costing figures. The area in question was formerly enemy owned and therefore does not have to be released to the JG within the near future.

3. The following decisions were made informally:

a. The Atomic Bomb Commission personnel are not a part of the occupation forces.

b. G-4 will authorize the expenditure of approximately \$6,000 by the JG to make the area tenable.

c. Rent will be charged to the personnel occupying the quarters at the rate of \$13.00 per month. This is the rate now in effect at the "Black House" (Kure) a similar facility already used by the commission.  
Annual income - 27 x 13 x 12 = \$4,212.00

d. Renovated premises to be occupied for a minimum of one (1) year. If occupied for over two (2) years, it may be necessary for the ABCC to lease this property from JG.

e. R&U/<sup>& fuel</sup> will be furnished at occupation cost.

f. Rental money (c above) should go to the SCAP Trust Fund.

4. Col Eastwood advised the commission to get a SCAP and JG validation for all of its leases.

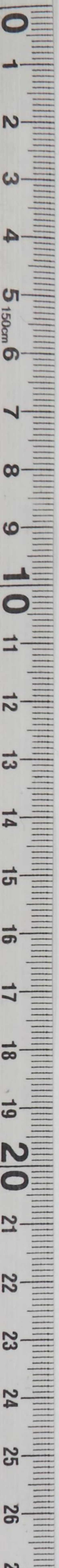

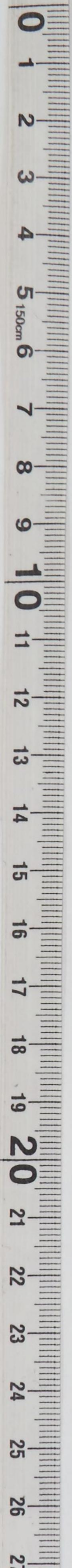
