The machines and tools mentioned in the annexed paper belonged to the Japanese army during the war and after it they were transferred to Japanese Ministry of Home Affairs by the Allied Troops (annexed paper No.1) and Kyoto-Fu received them.

We have hitherto kept these machines and tools in our charge according to the prohibition order of transfer by the Commander of I Corps. As they play an important role in civilian manufacturing factories, they earnestly ask us to have them disposed of to them by the government.

Thus being the situation will you kindly release the prohibition order of transfer of them and allow us to dispose of them to civilian factories in the best way possible ?

SUBJECT: Improper Transfer of some Equipments in Army Arsenal.

1. When we inspected the Hirakata Branch Arsenal of Osaka Military Arsenal it became known that when they got the transfer permission of material released to Japanese Government a great many of drills and cutting and planing machines as drills, cutters, and chuck-grinders necessary to operate lathes, boring machines and grinding machines had been transferred and sold to the Government Railway Ministry and other civilian businessmen.
2. Lathes and other machines operated with motor would be of no use without those cutting and planing machines.
3. The Liaison Office should at once give instructions to all the organs concerned of Japanese government in the area under the command of I Corps to the effect that such machines and tools should not be transferred from the arsenals and equipment plants mentioned in the Directive (No.5) published by H.Q. of the 8th Army.
4. In controlling the arsenals we have not yet decided whether to make them return those machines and tools already disposed of or not and when it has been decided we will inform you of it.
5. You are requested to inform us by document not later than April 15, 1946 what measures you have taken to instruct all the organs concerned of the government in the area under the command of H.Q. of I Corps.



To assist commanders in making decisions on petitions by the Japanese for the release of machinery or equipment from reparation installations, the following extract of an indorsement from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is quoted:

"At the time an aircraft factory, arsenal, laboratory or privately-owned munition plant is taken into custody all machinery and equipment located in the plant or belonging to the plant but located elsewhere, with the exception of those items specifically exempted by \*\*\*\* (Section III, paragraph 5, Inclosure 1 to Operational Directive 5/4, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 22 August 1946), shall be subject to reparation claim."



1. Reference: Sections V and VI, Operational Directive No. 5/5, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 24 September 1946. Section VI quotes as follows:

"Instructions for inventory of reparation installations other than arsenals, laboratories, aircraft plants and privately owned munition plants, will be issued at a later date."

2. It has come to the attention of this headquarters that there have been many instances where military government teams have proceeded to inventory reparation installations other than aircraft plants, arsenals, laboratories (items not released to the 5250th Technical Intelligence Company) and privately owned munition plants. Inventory of plants other than those of the above four categories will not be accomplished until instructions are issued by higher headquarters. As of this date, no instructions have been issued by higher headquarters subsequent to the publication of Operational Directive No. 5/5.

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RE: REPORT OF ACTIONS TAKEN FOR THE MEMORANDUM NO. 1219 THAT  
WAS ISSUED BY SCAP TO THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

With reference to above, we issued instructions together with a copy of the Memorandum and its Japanese version on Oct. 30 to all plants under our jurisdiction that are designated to be taken into custody for reparations purposes so that they take all necessary arrangements without fail.

On Nov. 6, all superintendents of the plants convened at the Kyoto Chamber of Commerce & Industry to inaugurate the Liaison Council of Plants Designated For Preservation and Care in Kyoto Prefecture. At this meeting, the chief of Commerce & Industry Section made detailed explanations of the Memorandum, and instructed that the inspection and repair of machinery and mechanical equipments, preparation and preservation of blueprints and instruction papers and the maintenance of accessories should all be made in accordance with the Memorandum, and that, if materials and parts necessary for repair are not available within the plants, it should be directly informed to the Commerce & Industry Section.

Since then, inspection officers have been dispatched to all these plants to see whether the machines are maintained in perfect accordance with the Memorandum. We previously were informed that we were to receive further detailed instruction on this matter from the government; therefore, we have inquired about it by wire to the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, but so far we have received no reply.

As to the Memorandum (SCAPIN 1285) concerning the release of telegraphic and telephonic exchange-installations, we ~~it~~ gave verbal instructions at the above-mentioned meeting to all plants to make preparations. In this matter, we have received no instructions from the Ministry of Commerce & Industry.

Herewith attached is a copy of the instructions we issued on Oct. 30 to the plants designated for preservation and care.

SUBJECT: Unauthorized Correspondence Containing Directions and Orders to Japanese Agencies.

TO : See Distribution

1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will normally issue orders and instructions to the Japanese through the Imperial Japanese Government at Tokyo. Orders to subordinate governmental agencies, necessary to carry out the orders and instructions of SCAP will be issued by the Imperial Japanese Government through its own administrative channels. The issuance of orders to any Japanese governmental agencies by subordinate commanders will not be undertaken, except when specifically ordered by this headquarters or in the event of emergencies. Military Government units are authorized to contact local governmental officials for the purpose of obtaining information and reports and for making inspections.

2. Directives to agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government are written only by or on the express authority of SCAP. It is not contemplated that military government organizations operating on the prefectural level will assume such authority. The confusion which results from issuing orders arbitrarily might well delay the attainment of Occupation objectives.

SUBJECT : Information of General Application Pertaining to Directive Number (SCAPIN-1277), File AG 387.6 (17 Oct 46)ESS/IN, dtd 17 October 1946, subject: Reparations Selections Within the Synthetic Rubber Industry.

1. With reference to Memorandum Number (SCAPIN-1277), from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Imperial Japanese Government, this directive is published for the information of all concerned.
2. The purpose of issuing the attached letter to the Imperial Japanese Government and accompanying letter to the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army is to insure availability for interim reparations removals of listed facilities in the best possible condition.
3. Seized facilities should not be permitted to operate except where a portion of the equipment of a listed plant has been converted to production considered essential to the Japanese economy, production may be continued for a period of 60 days. A report on such production with recommendations as to further continued operation should be submitted thru channels to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
4. It is emphasized that when any of the equipment is shut down the Japanese should be required to take special precaution to avoid damage which may result from corrosive action of some of the material handled in the equipment. The units should be thoroughly purged of all corrosive gases before disassembly, and corrosive materials should be carefully removed before packaging of the equipment.
5. A letter of command instructions pertaining to the execution of the subject memorandum follows through command channels.




