1. Details: Sapporo CIC Field Office learned from confidential source the following information concerning scheduled strikes in Hokkaido:

a. At 0700, 3 Jul 52, approximately 1,980 members of Kamui Coal Mine Union of Hokkaido Coal and Steamship Company, Kamu-mura, Kamikawa-gun, Hokkaido (AMS L571, sheet 28, WD 9742), will begin a 48-hour work stoppage strike. Estimated loss in production is 2,000 tons of coal valued at 16,000,000 yen. Decision to strike was made by the union itself and was not directed by their national organization, Japan Coal Mines Union (Tanro). No Japan Communist Party (JCP) influence was indicated. Strike is to support union demands for the following:

- (1) Better dispensary facilities.
- (2) Use of company auditorium for labor propaganda pictures.
- (3) wage increases.


b. At 0700, 5 Jul 52, 60 branch unions in Hokkaido affiliated with Tanro are expected to go on a 24-hour strike for summer allowances. Union is asking for an allowance of 19,000 yen per member, but management is reported to be offering 9,500 yen. Strike is directed by Tanro Central Headquarters in Tokyo-to, but the final decision to strike is up to regional headquarters and individual unions. Estimated loss of production not known. JCP influence indicated.

c. US Forces, Japan, or PD contracts are not directly affected by either of the above strikes.

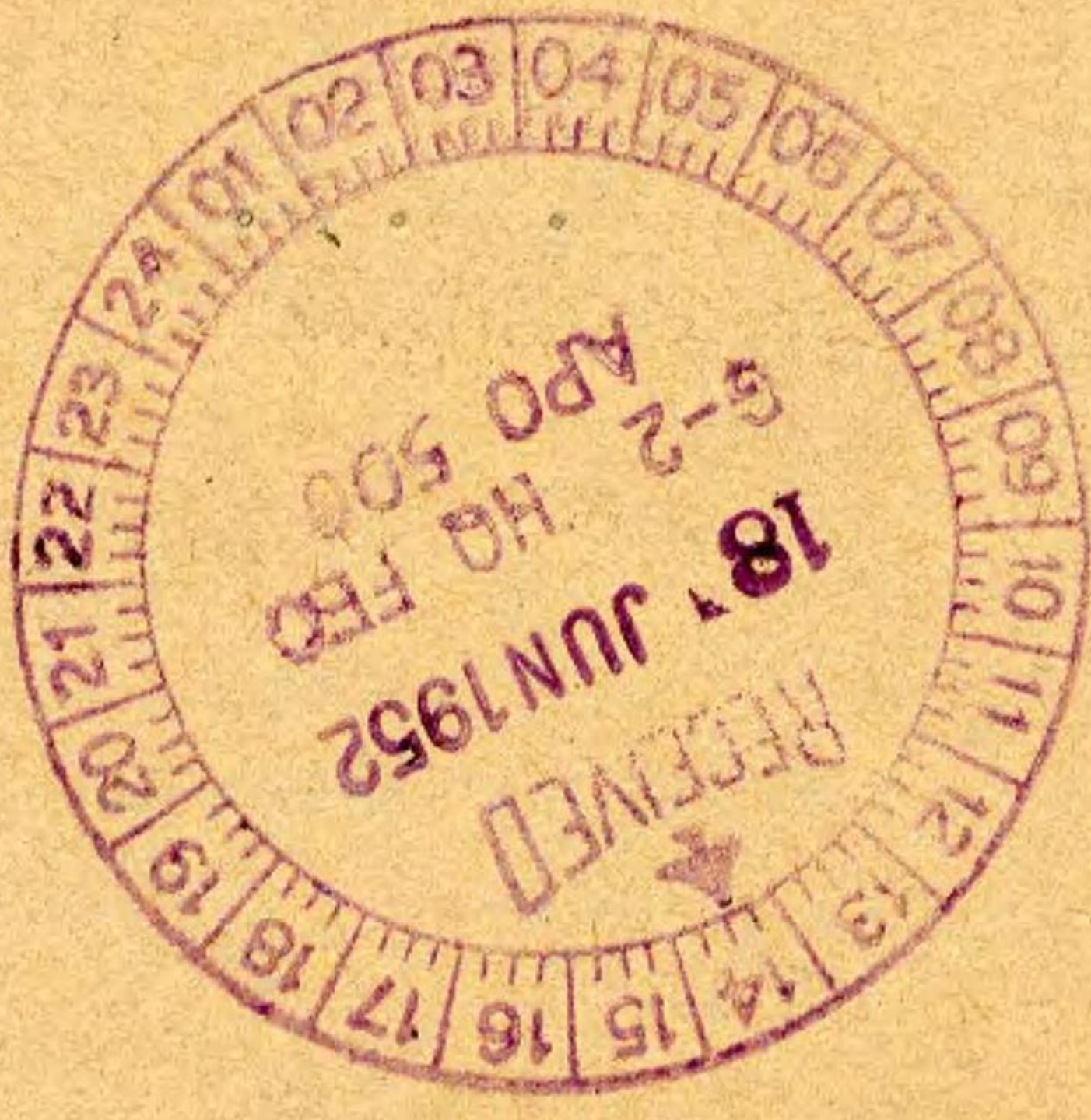
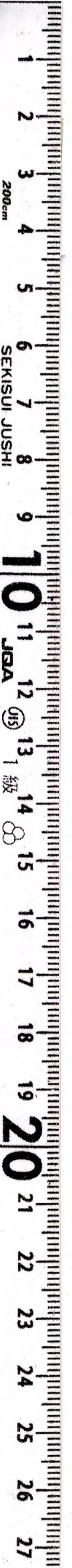

FAR EAST ANNEX TO  
WEEKLY FOREIGN INFORMATION POLICY GUIDANCE (WFIPG)

Nos. 110 and 111

May 22, 1952

GENERAL

1. Geneva Protocol of 1925. Refer to the Department's Circular Telegram Number 968 of May 20. Emphasize that the adoption of genuinely effective disarmament procedures as proposed by the United States and others in the United Nations Disarmament Commission, is prevented by Soviet intransigence.

2. Pacific Security Pact. Do not pick up rumors concerning development of multi-lateral Pacific Security arrangements. Do not become involved in discussion with the allegation that Australia desires to avoid such a pact because of racial differences. In the Philippines you may point out, if pressed, that the Mutual Security Treaty with the United States, and other United States commitments for Philippine security, obviate the need for a multi-lateral arrangement. In Thailand you may refer, if necessary, to the responsibility of the United Nations for the security of its members.

3. RUBBER

Standing Guidance. Refer to FE Annex Number 70 of July 31, 1951, on this subject. Give minimum play consistent with credibility to developments in U. S. rubber policy until further notice.

4. KOREA. Treatment of any forthcoming official report dealing with events at Koje-do and Communist seizure of General Dodd should stress overall design of Communist control and manipulation of UNC-held POWs for propaganda purposes. Emphasis should not repeat not be given to isolated instances related in report. It should be pointed out Koje episodes are evidence of extent to which Communists will go in attempt to obscure implications of refusal of so many POW's to return to Communist control. They also exemplify further broader Communist assault of accepted standards of international conduct and behavior to undermine moral basis on which modern international community can exist.

PHILIPPINES

1. Official Philippine and United States statements on the ratification of the US-Philippine mutual defense pact and supporting press comments should be used fully.

## Stress:

a. Pact's contribution along with Australia and New Zealand security pacts to Pacific security and general world peace;

b. Community of interest between Philippines and United States in protecting peace and insuring progress under democratic systems.

CAUTION

Avoid comments about possible development of a Pacific pact. See Item 2 under GENERAL above. Avoid reference to Philippine reaction to Japanese Peace Treaty which has become political football in the Philippines.

GENERAL

Rubber. General Services Administration press statement June 11 announcing abolition US controls on importation liquid latex SHIB be followed closely in news and comment. February 23 press statement of GSA, announcing the end of controls on crude rubber imports, should be recalled. Speculation re the effects of GSA action should be avoided but available official statistics on importation of rubber and latex and dollar revenues accruing to the exporting nations therefrom may be reported to areas as appropriate.

India-Japan. Report peace treaty as generally favorable development, suggesting that treaty contributes to stability and welfare both countries. However, carefully avoid using material that would reopen discussion of circumstances re India's refusal to participate last year in the signing of treaty at San Francisco.

UK Representatives Visit to Far East. Emphasize that the visit of Field Marshall Lord Alexander, Minister of Defense, and Selwyn Lloyd, Minister of State of the United Kingdom, to Japan and Korea is a symbol of Allied unity and determination to carry through in Far Eastern commitments. Refer to Alexander's press conference in Tokyo, June 11 (Far East Bulletin 139, June 12) expressing complete confidence in Clark and the UN Command.

Panmunjom. Point out that Allied initiative in proposing a three-day recess in the negotiations was due directly to the fact that the Communists had reduced the meetings to a sounding board for the grossest kind of lying and slander. Emphasize that the Allies are determined to continue attempts to achieve an honorable armistice. However, the Allies will not permit the Communists to pervert the sessions to their own corrupt purposes.

JAPAN

Economic. Play up Ambassador Murphy's June 10 speech as evidence of continuing US understanding of and interest in Japanese economic problems. Call attention to the Secretary's press conference statement of May 21 (Far East Bulletin No. 121) that the US needs "a forward looking trade policy designed to achieve genuine prosperity for ourselves and other free nations" as an important expression of official opinion as to the kind of foreign economic policy the US should follow. Contrast this attitude with the recent phoney "trade agreement" which three Japanese who attended the "Moscow Peace Conference" signed in Peking in a purely private capacity. Point out that the Peking agreement is another attempt to entice Japan into disastrous political alignments by false promises of economic rewards. Note especially that trade proposals from the Communist side have not produced any benefits to Japan and are not likely to do so.
