GUARD AGAINST ESCAPE

Sheriff Had Been Tipped as to Plot.

COURTHOUSE IS CLEARED

First of Four to Be Tried in Lee Death.

The halls of the Covington Courthouse were cleared of spectators Tuesday when James Powers, 21, of 19 W. Third-st., Covington, was brought into court to stand trial for murder.

Precautions were taken by Peter P. Thiel, sheriff, to prevent the carrying out of an attempt at escape which had been reported to him Tuesday morning.

All spectators were required to stand in the rear of the courtroom while Powers was being brought in. The attempt at escape or rescue failed to materialize.

The selecting of a jury to try Powers was begun before Judge Frank M. Tracy in Kenton Circuit Court Tuesday morning.

Crowd Gathers
A great crowd had gathered in the courtroom to hear the opening of the trial of the four youths who are charged with the fatal shooting of Lee on the night of Jan. 22, 1932, of Morehead, 23, theater manager, in the presence of his parents and two sisters while he sat in an automobile in front of his home, 818 Grand-st., Covington.

Opening of jurors was commenced at 10 a. m. by the attorneys in the case. It was expected the selection of a jury would consume the entire day.

T. Murphy, Martin Brown and Stephens L. Blakely, former commonwealth attorneys, appeared as attorneys for the defendant, while George W. Smith, commonwealth attorney, and Edward J. Tracy, Kenton attorney, conducted the prosecution.

Powers Not Concerned
Powers sat quietly in the courtroom while Judge Tracy conducted preliminary examination of jurors and instructed them in the law before the trial of capital cases. He did not seem to be greatly concerned with proceedings.

The trial of Powers is expected to consume the rest of the week, with George Saunders, 24, of 505 N. Second-st., Cincinnati, Isiah S. Knight, 21, of Second and Crescent streets, Covington, and Ray Rogers, 21, of Newport, will each be placed on trial on the same charge.

McKnight made a full confession to the shooting of Lee and the arrest of the three men, admitting having driven the car used by the bandits, whom he said were attempting to steal a satchel containing \$200, the day's receipts of the theater, which was carried by Miss Lee. He denied knowledge as to who fired the shot that killed Lee.

When Rogers was arrested a short time later he made a confession, to the effect that he had fired the shot. McKnight's statements, but also said he did not know who fired the shot. The other two have consistently denied any knowledge of the whole affair.

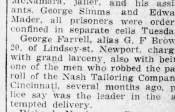
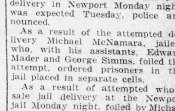
