Qualifications of Chief Officers and of Fire Officers

REGULATIONS, DATED 2ND JUNE, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION SIX OF THE FIRE SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

1947. No. 87

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (2) of section six of the Fire Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :---

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Fire Services (Qualifications of Chief Officers and of Fire Officers) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

(3) In these Regulations except where the contrary intention appears "fire authority" means a fire authority established under the Fire Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1947.

2. The qualifications of chief officers shall be as set forth in Part I of the Schedule to these Regulations.

3. The qualifications of fire officers shall be as set forth in Part II of the schedule to these Regulations.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the date hereof.

SCHEDULE

PART I

QUALIFICATIONS OF CHIEF OFFICERS

No person shall be qualified to be appointed a chief officer of a fire authority unless— (1) he has had not less than five years' practical experience of fire-fighting in—

- (a) the National Fire Service (Northern Ireland) or the National Fire Service of Great Britain and has at any time held a rank not lower than that of Column Officer therein ; or
- (b) a whole-time fire brigade and has at any time held the position of chief officer of such a brigade ; and
- (2) he produces satisfactory evidence that his health and character are good ; and
- (3) he is a natural born British subject and the son of a father also a natural born British subject, and has, during the whole of the period of five years ending on the date of his appointment, been resident in the United Kingdom ; and
- (4) at the date of his appointment he is not more than forty-five years of age; save that a person shall not be disqualified for appointment on grounds of age alone if at the date of his appointment he is serving in the National Fire Service (Northern Ireland) or in the fire brigade of a fire authority.

PART II

QUALIFICATIONS OF FIRE OFFICERS

FIRE SERVICES

- (a) the National Fire Service (Northern Ireland) or the National Fire Service of Great Britain and has at any time held a rank not lower than that of Section Leader therein; or
- (b) a whole-time fire brigade and has at any time held a position in such a brigade substantially equivalent to a rank not lower than that of Section Leader in the National Fire Service (Northern Ireland); and
- (2) he produces satisfactory evidence that his health and character are good ; and
- (3) he is a natural born British subject and the son of a father also a natural born British subject, and has, during the whole of the period of five years ending on the date of his appointment, been resident in the United Kingdom ; and
- (4) at the date of his appointment he is not more than forty years of age; save that a person shall not be disqualified for appointment on grounds of age alone if at the date of his appointment he is serving in the National Fire Service (Northern Ireland) or in the fire brigade of a fire authority.

Standard Fire Provision

REGULATIONS DATED 31ST DECEMBER, 1947, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF . HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION FOUR OF THE FIRE SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sub-section (2) of section four of the Fire Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Fire Services (Standard Fire Provision) (Northern Fire Authority) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1947.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of the Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

(3) In these Regulations and in the Schedule hereto ----

"the Northern Fire Authority" and "the Northern Fire District" have the same meaning as in the Fire Services (Northern Fire District and Fire Authority) Order (Northern Ireland), 1947, and "the Belfast Fire Authority" has the same meaning as in the Fire Services (Belfast Fire District and Fire Authority) Order (Northern Ireland), 1947;

"appliances", "chief officer", "equipment", "fire brigade", "fire engines", "fire officer "and "standard fire provision" have the same meaning as in the Fire Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1947;
