

The Future of Wiki Loves Women?

We are exploring how to extend Wiki Loves Women to countries across Africa:

- developing event toolkits for organisers and civil society organisations
- microfunding grant system for events
- Focus group for learning and sharing

 - continued to support all existing gender-focused initiatives across Africa.





Why WLW Focus Groups

- Develop a slow, manageable, collaborative, consultative and supportive programme
- Provide knowledge, theoretical information, practical application and programme development support
- Inform and support Focus members to put skills and knowledge into action:
 - in the form of content expansion and creation directly on Wikipedia, Wikidata and Wikimedia Commons, and
 - o in the development of realistic interventions that are adapted to their unique situations, limitations and resources.
- Build a nurturing, self-sustaining and supportive regional network.
- Share this model with communities across Africa to grow and develop the gender-equity space

What WLW Focus programme involves

- 1. Monthly online Focus Group meetings:
 - an informal discussion space that promotes knowledge transfer, two-way engagement and will be fully participatory.
 - topics of each discussion will be decided by the small group, prior the meeting, but can range from gender-equity in the open movement, to leadership skills, partnership development, etc.
- 2. One-on-one mentorship with an experienced Wikimedian;
- 3. A Focus Group telegram group for collective support
- 4. Participation in the beta testing of the Wiki Loves Women MOOC in late 2021.
- 5. Other opportunities, as they arise.



Expectations of the Focus members

- 1. Attend and actively participate in all Focus Group Sessions.
- 2. Engage with your Mentor.
- 3. Engage with and support Focus Group members via the Telegram group and other means.
- 4. Create a Wiki Loves Women programme within your country, activating your community around gender-equity events, drives or activities, by:
 - a. Provide at least 2 training sessions and 2 editing sessions with your community;
 - b. Host the #SheSaid drive to celebrate notable local women, with the expectations of in-person contribution events.
- 5. [if necessary] apply to the Wikimedia Foundation for a Rapid Grant to support this community activity.
