### DEDICATION

"'He just walked into the crowd, and he didn't say a word, not a word, and everybody just left. Gosh.'

"Now we ask you, what could one rather small man who was unarmed do that two or more armed towers of campus legality could not do? Simple. He could break up a near riot that started when two campus policemen tried to break up a simple game of quad ball. He had the respect of the man . . ."

This statement from a Chronicle editorial exemplifies the esteem which is held by the student body for Dean Robert B. Cox. For fifteen years he has served as Dean of Undergraduate Men of Duke University. He is closer to the students than any other member of the administration, and is a personal friend to any who seek his help or advice. His main official duty is to serve as advisor to undergraduate men in all nonacademic matters. This duty includes approving social functions, advising organizations, keeping activity records, giving personal counsel, and the unpopular task of handling disciplinary cases. On many occasions he is called out of bed at 3:00 in the morning to help a student in distress. He is often the only person to whom one may turn with a personal problem, and in many cases his advice has had a great effect on the later life of the man.

In addition to his other duties, Dean Cox is advisor to all pre-med and pre-dental students, and is often instrumental in placing these men in med or dental schools, since his own recommendation is highly respected by schools throughout the country.

As advisor to fraternities, Dean Cox has for many years stood for the fraternal system on the Duke Campus, even though at times this has placed him in disagreement with other members of the administration. He is, in fact, active in his own fraternity in that he is a Province Chief of the Alpha Tau Omega fraternity, and is advisor to the local chapter.

Originally from Bolivar, Tennessee, Dean Cox attended Peabody College where he received his A.M. degree in 1926. After teaching at East Tennessee State College for several years, he came to Duke as Dean in 1945, and has served in this capacity since that time. For this service we of the 1960 CHANTICLEER, on behalf of the Student Body, dedicate this book to the man who is truly our "Great White Father."









HONORARIES

Honoraries on the Duke campus recognize outstanding students, stimulate interest in various fields and furnish leadership training for future citizens. There are honors for service to the university, honors in athletics, military training programs, honors for all-round ability in scholastic and extracurricular fields, proficiency in specific subjects, and sixty honors for academic excellence.

Phi Eta Sigma on West and Ivy on East honor those students who acieve outstanding scholastic records during their Freshman year. The two Sophomore service honoraries are Beta Omega Sigma for the men and Sandals for the women.

Two widely known national honoraries are Phi Beta Kappa, primarily on the scholastic level, and Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, which recognizes excellence both on the academic and extracurricular levels.

In the Senior year, seven women and seven men are chosen for one of Duke's highest leadership distinctions. The women are selected for White Duchy and the men for Red Friars. Two other Senior honoraries for students having high standards of scholarship, leadership, character and service are Phi Kappa Delta for the women and Omicron Delta Kappa for the men.

# PHI ETA SIGMA





It is difficult to understand how members of Phi Eta Sigma can maintain the high averages necessary for membership while carrying out their very active program to stimulate and improve intellectual activity on campus. To become a member of this exclusive club, a student must achieve a 3.5 average for his first semester at Duke or an overall 3.5 for his entire freshman year. This task is difficult enough, but the amazing part is that most of the members continue to make these grades during their sophomore year while helping and encouraging other students. This year's program, under President Roy Bostock, was aimed at the freshmen, and it included sending letters to members of the incoming freshman class, tutoring freshmen in difficult subjects, and sponsoring a dinner for all members of the class of '63 who had a "B" average at mid-semester.

With Mrs. W. S. Persons as advisor, Ivy was first organized as a local scholastic honorary in 1937. This year Dr. W. M. Blackburn took over as advisor in the absence of Miss Maxine Westphal, Ivy sponsor since 1954. As a means of fulfilling its purpose to encourage and promote good scholarship among freshmen women, Ivy attempts to focus the attention of the student body on intellectual advancement. Tapping for membership those freshman women who have earned an average of 3.25 in either their first semester or entire freshman year, Ivy this year totaled 49 members.

In November, Ivy sponsored a dinner in honor of all freshman women maintaining a B average at mid-semester. Throughout the year Ivy members marshalled for numerous Women's College functions and donated books to the Women's College Library. New members are inducted twice a year as a part of a special awards assembly.










# ARNOLD AIR SOCIETY

Pi Tau Sigma, the national honorary fraternity for mechanical engineers, established a chapter at Duke, Pi Iota, May 13, 1944. Members are selected from the top thirty-five percent of the senior class and the top twenty-five percent of the junior class. They pledge to foster the high ideals of the engineering profession and to develop in mechanical engineering students the attributes necessary for effective leadership.

During the academic year, the chapter sponsored review lectures for the E.I.T. examination and presented an annual award to the senior mechanical engineer who presented the best paper, either in classwork or in professional society competition.

President Jon Blyth and Vice-President Bob Swanson held the top offices in Duke's Pi Tau Sigma Chapter. The Chapter held meetings twice a month and had two initiation banquets during the year. Kappa Kappa Psi, the national honorary music fraternity, found a place at Duke in 1922, with the founding of Alpha Gamma Chapter. In 1945, this Chapter became inactive due to the war, but it became active again in the spring of 1958.





## MEN'S STUDENT GOVERN

Every male student entering Duke University becomes, upon payment of his university fees and association dues, a member of the Men's Student Government Association.

The purpose of this organization is to function as the supreme instrument of government in regulating the affairs of all male students on the Duke University campus. It strives to promote the best interests of Duke University while advancing the welfare of the individual students on the Duke campus at all times.

M.S.G.A. functions within the limits of its Constitution and within the powers granted the Association by the administrative authorities of Duke University. The organization of M.S.G.A. is divided into 3 main branches: executive, legislative, and judiciary. The executive branch is responsible for organizing all proposed legislation and, after the approval of the bills by the Senate, responsible for seeing that the approved statutes are carried out. The judicial power of the Association is vested in a Judicial Board and a Court of Appeals.

The Constitution of the M.S.G.A. places great emphasis on the office of the President, who is the official representative of the Association to the University Ad-

ministration and the only one to whom they may look for immediate responsibility. The President's Cabinet, which includes the Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Secretary of Education, Secretary of Student Life, and the N.S.A. Coordinator, meets to discuss the policy which the Student Government shall follow, and formulates plans for the future. Cabinet meetings are open to all students and a student may present his ideas at any Cabinet meeting.


The legislative powers of the M.S.G.A. are vested in a Student Senate consisting of two representatives from each of the four classes and the executive officers of the Association. The Senate discusses matters of campus-wide interest and has the power to regulate, supervise, charter, and determine the status of all men's student campus organizations.

The judicial branch is represented by the Judicial Board, composed of nine student Justices, one serving as Chief Justice. The Board handles all cases of misconduct involving students of Trinity College and the College of Engineering.

This year the Senate has acted more in the broad perspective of student government than it has in the past. It has studied problems of a national scope and has, on occasion, sent copies of resolutions to members of Congress in order to inform them of student opinion on the subject in question. The National and International Affairs Committee has also been created by the Senate to increase student awareness. The Education Committee made a study of the problems of pre-registration and worked in an attempt to alleviate the situation. The Student Life Committee worked with the Long Range Planning Committee in cooperation with the Education Committee and has drawn up a teacher course evaluation sheet. The N.S.A. initiated an Education Travel Incorporation which provided for inexpensive student tours in Europe.

### WOMEN'S STUDENT GOV

The Woman's Student Government Association of Duke University should and does mean more to each coed than just another monthly meeting to attend. In the first place every student of the Woman's College is a member of W.S.G.A., and the Executive Council which she helps to elect is dedicated to serving as a link between her and the administration. Secondly the overall aim of W.S.G.A. is to create an atmosphere at the college which complements the individual needs of students.

The need for such a governing body at Duke University was first realized in 1919, and it was created to organize the activities of women on campus. Later in 1924 the association's importance was fully recognized when the Woman's College was incorporated into the University. Since then the association has grown to cover such various committees and subcommittees as the House President's Board, the Freshman Advisory Council, Social Standards Committee, National Student Association, the Judicial Board, Coordinate Board, the Foreign Student Committee, the Student Forum Committee and the Campus Chest,

All members of the Executive Council are elected the year before they take office except for the freshman class representative. The executive officers along with the four class representatives, the committee chairmen, and the house presidents compose the Executive Council, but the general maintenance and support of Council programs must come from the student body. As a result, East campus coeds find plenty of opportunity to express their ideas and to see their plans put into action by serving on one of the various committees, besides attending the monthly Monday evening meetings. This is the only time when the entire student body of the Woman's College meets and is able to discuss together those problems which are pertinent to all.

1959-60 was an active year for East Campus through its W.S.G.A. The council sent representatives to the regional convention of the National Student Association, organized the Leadership Training Program, and continued its work on the Academic

Honor Code, which had been initiated the year before in courses above the 200-level in conjunction with M.S.G.A. and the Judicial Board. Mock trials were sponsored by the Judicial Board to acquaint the student body with the procedures followed in such cases. Constantly interested in self-improvement, W.S.G.A. also re-evaluated its plans and programs by means of a student-faculty committee.

Having replaced the Honor Code, the new Code of Campus Living covers the general regulations of the Woman's college and is contained in the Handbook published by the association and distributed to all freshmen in the fall. A handbook examination on this code is mandatory for all first-year students.

Working with M.S.G.A. in many phases of student government and activity has helped W.S.G.A. promote many worthwhile advancements. This year the joint planning of the associations produced the National Student Travel Agency, the purpose of which is to help advise and plan summer trips for interested members of the student body. Several summer tours were proposed for students interested in European travel.

Just being a governing body is not the sole function of W.S.G.A. and as can easily be seen, the members of the Executive Council with Mary Maddry as president have led the way to many advancements in creating and maintaining the individuality of the East Campus organization.



The Men's Judicial Board is the supreme judicial agency of M.S.G.A. As such it tries all cases involving breach of University Law as well as encouraging high personal standards and responsibility. It also serves as a final court of appeals for decisions made in other subsidiaries of M.S.G.A. Although all decisions are subject to administrative review, such action has rarely been taken in the past. Trials, held

at weekly meetings, are closed to protect the student unless otherwise requested by the defendant.

The Board consists of nine members including its chairman. These members are chosen by the President of the Student Government and are approved by the Senate. They include six senior class students and three juniors. These juniors become members of the Board for the next year unless they are elected to other offices and are prevented by other commitments.

An extremely vital, although not widely publicized, group on East Campus is its Judicial Board. Its twelve members work closely together to reflect campus opinion, administer the Code of Campus Living and serve as a board of appeals in cases arising in the House Judicial Committees and the Traffic Court. In addition, they reappraise and recommend changes in regulations in order to meet the everchanging needs and desires of the student body. The ten dorm representatives also preside over judicial proceedings in the House.

Chief considerations in their elections are the qualities of leadership, the ability to command respect, the daring to stand for ideals, good judgment and the courage to use understanding with recognition that everyone is human, the ability to be objective, and dedication to the principles upon which the Woman's College is founded.


## FRESHMEN AD

Organized three years ago, the Engineer's Guidance Council was formed for the purpose of tutoring freshmen enrolled in the College of Engineering. The fifty-four members work independently every week with about four assigned orientees. The main purpose of the advisory group is to help the prospective engineers adjust to their required courses, and, at the same time, meet the demands of extra-curricular activities during their first semester of college life.

Tutoring sessions in physics are established prior to each hour exam. Instructors are also available for the other fundamental engineering courses—algebra, trigonometry, physics, geometry and mechanical drawing.

The council is an auxiliary of the Engineers Student Council and meets prior to the tutoring sessions in order to deal with current business. Mike Mattingly was chairman of the council this year.

### SYMPOSIUM COMMITTEE

For several years forces have been at work investigating the possibilities of a Symposium Committee. Last year a planning committee was formed which made concrete arrangements, and chose by invitation a group of people to make up the present committee. The result of their immediate efforts and of the long-range work was the symposium held last fall on October 6, 7, and 8. The topic was the "U.S.-Soviet Conflict" and the schedule included a short talk by one of the guest speakers plus open discussion at the afternoon sessions; the evening sessions presented a formal lecture followed by a question-answer period.

The Symposium Committee plays a unique role on campus and fulfills a definite need. It was designed for a dual purpose: to gather and serve as focus for information of social, cultural, or political significance; and to stimulate an interest in intellectual pursuit. The committee includes representatives from major organizations, the administrations of both campuses, the faculty, and members at large. The new committee was chosen shortly after the beginning of second semester and worked hard at weekly meetings to choose next year's topic, to locate possible speakers, and to arrange all details.

### THE STUDENT FORUM

The Student Forum, founded in 1934, was the first group on campus to sponsor events of cultural significance. Among its varied programs are included concerts, art exhibits, and the presentation of dance groups and musical programs. The Forum is particularly unique in that it endeavors to have receptions for each guest so that Duke students can meet and talk with the various artists.

Perhaps the highlight of the year's program was the presentation of "Carmen" by the Grass Roots Opera Company on February 8, 1960. The Forum was instrumental in carrying out the Symposium on The U.S.-Soviet Conflict in the fall of 1959. In the spring a four-day Architecture Show emphasized college architecture and initiated investigation of the possibilities for a fine arts building at Duke.

#### SOCIAL STANDARDS

As a special auxiliary to W.S.G.A., the Social Standards Committee was headed this year by Amburn Huskins as chairman and Jini Davis as calendar chairman. The committee was designed in 1927 to help maintain high ideals in East behavior and dress, and to organize an adequate social calendar for the school year. As the link between administrative standards and student opinion, Social Standards has initiated this year several revisions in accepted casual dress of Duke coeds.

The various activities sponsored by the committee this year included two Co-Ed Balls at which the Chanticleer Beauty Queen and the May Queen were crowned, the Twilight Hours concerts, and decoration of the Union at Christmas.

"Design for a Duchess," a booklet explaining Duke social ideals, was published by this Committee and distributed to the freshmen during the summer. The Committee also printed the annual Duke pictorial calendar in December.

The organization of Social Standards is composed of two representatives from each dormitory, a calendar chairman, three freshmen at large, and a chairman elected by the student body.

#### COURT OF APPEALS

The Court of Appeals is a division of the judicial board of the M.S.G.A. For five years, it has assisted the students of Duke University in appealing cases involving University traffic regulations, liabilities for damage to University property and delinquency in payment of M.S.G.A. fees. The majority of the cases involve violations of University traffic regulations in which the student feels that he has been unjustly accused. When the student receives a traffic ticket he may get an appeal form at the traffic office and attempt to appeal his case. A student may also obtain an appeal form when reported for property damage from the Housing Bureau or M.S.G.A.

The Court of Appeals meets on alternate Thursday nights at which time five judges give personal consideration to each case and try to reach a fair and immediate decision without the defendant appearing. The decisions are usually final. Because of its high and important position, the Court of Appeals is a vital part of student government.

#### TRADITIONS BOARD

The Traditions Board established at Duke in 1951 was headed this year by Charles Hartwig, Chairman. The Board is composed of representatives from many campus organizations. Included in its extensive orientation program for the freshmen are the teaching of Duke traditions, school songs, cheers, customs, and history; and the distribution of dinks. A Traditions Test is given to all freshmen early in the fall, and those who fail to score a passing grade on it are brought before the Traditions board which gives instruction, counsel, and punishment. During the first semester freshmen who fail to comply with the traditions of the University or regulations pertaining to the Traditions Program must go before the board. The three objectives of the Board are: to strengthen the traditions of Duke University, to acquaint the Freshmen with the history of Duke, and to encourage a strong feeling of unity and school spirit in each freshman class.

### NSA

The National Student Association, a confederation of students from over 400 colleges and universities in the United States, is the representative voice of American student opinion both here and abroad. Run and controlled by college students, it seeks to cut across political, religious, racial, and social differences to further the ideal of a genuine world-wide community of students, based on common problems, committments, and goals.

Participating schools profit from the valuable opportunity for exchange of ideas among student bodies, as well as from the chance to participate in the meetings and policy-making of such national projects and student oriented groups as World University Service, and the American Council on Education. They are also eligible to receive scholarships under such programs as the International Student Relations Seminar and to enjoy low cost foreign travel, as was provided here by the N.S.A. Travel Bureau, open all year on both campuses. On November 6, 7, and 8, the two Duke branches of N.S.A. were co-sponsors for the fall conference of the Carolinas-Virginia region.

### CAMPUS CHEST

Initiated several years ago to organize the many charity drives which were held on campus, the Campus Chests on East and West campuses (which includes Hanes House) hold similar but separate annual drives. Operated on the system of a United Fund, the Chests enable the student to contribute to various worthy funds with a single contribution. Each year after the contributions are solicited on both campuses, the total donations are divided among several approved charitable organizations which are chosen and reviewed annually by a special committee of the Campus Chest on West, and by a student vote conducted by W.S.G.A. on East. The charities are evaluated on the basis of personal interviews and the work done by the charity.

Among the organizations receiving contributions from East Campus this year were the Foreign Student Fund, the Alice M. Baldwin Scholarship, the American Friend's Service Committee, the Student Engineering Fund, the American Cancer Society, the World University Service, the Durham Needlework Guild, the North Carolina Society for Crippled Children, and the Y.W.C.A. Edgemont project.

The East Campus drive, headed by Barbara Buening and held in the fall, exceeded its goal set at \$3,000. The West Campus drive, headed by John Bigger, approximated its goal of \$3,500 during the ten day drive from March 7 to 17.

### YMCA

The Young Men's Christian Association is one of the largest campus organizations, with approximately eighty-five percent of the men's student body on roll. Its purpose is to provide Christian service to the university and the Durham community. Reaching into all phases of campus work, the Y.M.C.A. is organized into various committees, providing every interested student an opportunity for positive action and service. On the community scenes, Y Men actively support both the Edgemont Center and Wright's refuge. On campus, Y activities vary from visitations to hospitalized students to the maintenance of a lost and found department. ### YWCA

To facilitate carrying out a more effective program, the Y.W.C.A., with approximately ninety percent of East Campus and Hanes House women as members, works through committees and the individual dormitories. It has two major divisions, the Freshman Y and the "Big Y", each with its own cabinet, officers, and projects. Y activities began in August. "Y Not", a booklet compiled by last years freshman Y, was sent to freshmen. This was followed by a full schedule of events including weekly dorm devotions and discussions, and regular work at Edgemont, Butner State Mental Hospital, Duke Hospital, the Veteran's Hospital and Wright's Refuge. 




To provide the Duke student body with the important second-half of a complete education, as expressed in the familiar University motto "Eruditio Et Religio", are many denominational and interfaith groups. These provide inspirational services as well as challenging discussions, varied programs of interest within and without the faith, and the chance to relax in an atmosphere of companionship. Many of the groups give plays, readings, and other dramatic presentations of both religious and non-religious nature. Fall and spring outings are also held.

The denominational groups include the Baptist Student Union, the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation, the Unitarian Fellowship, the Methodist Student Fellowship, the Lutheran Student Association, the Newman Club, the Society of Friends, the Westminster Fellowship, the Christian Science Organization, and the Episcopal Student Fellowship. These programs are co-ordinated and are enriched through the interaction of the committees of the Religious Council. Inter-denominational groups such as the Duke Christian Fellowship and the Church Vocations Fellowship also foster this spirit of co-operation and warm companionship.

Constructed structurally as the focal point of West Campus and Duke University life is the awe-inspiring Chapel. Every Sunday morning the Chapel is filled with worshippers from all parts of the University Community. The non-denominational services are conducted by the various members of the religious staff, including Chaplain to the University, Dean of the Chapel, members of the faculty in both the Divinity School and Undergraduate Religion Department and guest preachers. They are frequently assisted by students in the Divinity school, and the entire service is benefitted by the inspirational presentations of religious music by the chapel choir.

The Chaplain to the University and the University Religious Council are the ultimate directors of religious life at Duke. The Council includes presidents and advisors of all religious groups, student representatives elected from the various colleges, members of the Religious Life Staff, plus faculty and administration representatives.



The Men's Glee Club of Duke University was organized in 1927 by J. Foster Barnes. It has gained national stature in the field of choral music, and is now under the direction of Professor Paul Young. In its history of thirty-three years at Duke, the choral group has toured throughout the country and achieved a notable measure of national success when they appeared on the Perry Como Show in 1958. Their northern tours were begun in 1920, but it was not until 1951 that their extensive southern tour was added to the regular schedule.

The Men's Glee Club contributes to the musical activities of Duke University as a whole by providing the highest quality of choral music for men's voices. The membership consists of approximately ninety voices which are determined by auditions held early in the fall. The president for the 1959-60 season was Will Redmond.

Meeting for rehearsal twice a week, the Glee Club provides many groups of trained singers for organizations on campus, in Durham, and in the surrounding areas.

Their season this year began in October with the presentation of their annual concert for Dad's Day. They then traveled on a tour of the Mid-west, which included a concert in Town Hall in New York City. Early in the second semester, they gave their annual Spring Concert and the 1959-60 season was concluded with a tour to New York during Spring holidays and their North Carolina Spring Tour.

## ASME

Similar to other professional organizations on campus, the Duke chapter of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers provides its members with the opportunity to meet with fellow students having the same interests. Its two-fold purpose is to keep abreast of latest technical and theoretical advancements in the field, and to stimulate enthusiasm in student projects and encourage participation in them.

To fulfill its aim, the group has a full program of activities. The monthly meetings introduce leading speakers who participate in discussion as well as lecture on their particular areas. Also included in this year's activities were a series of lectures presented by the Office of Ordnance Research under the joint sponsorship of the A.S.C.E. and A.I.E.E.

## RADIO COUNCIL





The Radio Council is the final governing body of the Duke Broad-casting System, and works in an advisory capacity with it. Created contemporaneously with the station itself in 1948, the Council was established as a guide to the ultimate aims of WDBS, functioning through the joint efforts of students, faculty, and administration. It is composed of student representatives from both East and West campus and Hanes House, three faculty advisors, the Dean of Women, the Dean of Men, and the five station managers, whom it elects.

The Council formulates general policy as well as deciding specific issues such as approval of the budget and unusual expenditures. Perhaps of its most important functions is that of electing the Station, Engineering, Production, Sales, and Business Managers. The responsibility of the managers involves the immediate problems and policies of the station. Their election takes place in March, the new managers assuming responsibility with the advice of the outgoing group.

The Radio Council and the personnel of WDBS met in May to climax a full and successful year at the annual banquet. Awards for outstanding talent and service during the past year were presented at that time.

Whether it's Beethoven or basketball, WDBS offers a distinguished and varied program during its 18½ hours of daily operation, keyed to the interests and tastes of the listening University Community. During the past 11 years, WDBS has been recognized as one of the finest college stations in the nation. And no wonder! From its system of auditioning and announcer training to the program layout, the station is managed like a "pro." Interspersed with up-to-the-minute news reports and other items of interest, its regular feature programs range the spectrum of musical mood and rhythm. They show the effort of careful planning, and are especially timely; for instance, Sunday afternoons from 2:00 to 5:00, fine classical music was broadcast, while in the wee hours certain uninhibited gentlemen was heard nonchalantly ad-libbing between record requests. During exams, there was an uninterrupted program of quiet "study" music.

The station provides on the spot coverage of all Duke basketball and most baseball games. Other features of interest were the Radiothon, a drive in which WDBS assisted the Campus Chest Drive by playing requests in return for contributions to the Campus Chest, and a Record Hop on the East Campus tennis courts for Freshmen during Orientation Week. It also held an Open House during Orientation Week. A non-broadcasting activity is the annual banquet, held in the late spring.







#### NAVAL ROTC

The basic purpose of the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps is perhaps best taken from John Paul Jones, founder of the Naval tradition, who said that "it is by no means enough that an officer of the Navy should be a capable mariner. He must be that, of course, but also a great deal more. He should be, as well, a gentleman of liberal education, refined manner, punctilious courtesy, and the nicest sense of personal honor."

To fulfill this purpose, the U. S. Navy maintains a capable staff of officers and enlisted personnel at Duke, led by Captain C. C. Ainsworth, Professor of Naval Science. In addition to courses generally covering every phase of Naval activity, the unit sponsors

many extra-curricular activities among which are a drill team; a rifle team; a newsletter, the Dolphin; an honorary, the Corsairs; and for the Marines, the Semper Fidelis Club.

At the present time there are two programs offered by the N.R.O.T.C., Contract and Regular. Contract students volunteer for the program and are obligated for two years active duty after being commissioned as Ensigns, U.S.N.R. The Regular students are selected by the Navy on the basis of written and physical exams and personal interviews. They receive full tuition and fees, including books and \$50 per month salary. In return, these students are obligated for four years active duty as Regular Navy Officers. Both Regular and Contract students may be eligible for the Marine Option Program and receive commissions in the U.S. Marine Corps.














Faced with a grueling schedule, including rugged intersectional competition such as Georgia Tech, Ohio State, Pittsburgh, and Army, the Blue Devils were able to salvage four victories and lost three heartbreakers in the ten game 1959 campaign.


The Blue Devils first showed a spark of great potential in the season's second game when they stormed to two fourth period touchdowns to take a 13-7 lead over Ohio State. But the ill-fated Dukes had to settle for a 14-13 loss as the Buckeyes rolled to another score in the final minutes of the game. Again Duke rose to greatness when the tremendous line play of Mike Me-Gee paced the team to a 10-7 upset over Georgia Tech. McGee was awarded AP Lineman of the Week honors for the performance. And then the Devils stole honors from Wake Forest's feared aerial offense by putting on their own aerial show which netted three TD passes ineluding 50 and 55 yard heaves.

In addition to his Lineman of the Week honors and the Outland Award, McGee was also named to Look's All-America team and was selected as Player of the Year in the ACC. The ACC Sports Writers Association named McGee and sophomore halfback Joel Arrington to the All-ACC 1st team, and Dwight Bumgarner and Jim Gardner were named on the 2nd team.



## DUKE vs. SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina used a crushing ground game, a staunch defense, and a flashy 55-yard scoring play to take a 12-7 win from the Blue Devils in the season opener at Columbia.

The Gamecocks took the lead late in the opening stanza after blocking Dean Wright's attempted quick kick on the Duke 10-yard stripe. Halfback Ken Norton raced around end for the final 7 yards.

Duke evened the score on the first play of the second period when Don Altman tossed to Claude Moorman on a 58-yard scoring play. Art Browning kicked the extra to put the Devils ahead 7-6. Twice in the remaining minutes of the first half the Duke forward wall rose to strike down the Gamecocks inside the Duke 5-yard line.

In the final stanza after a Duke drive stalled on the USC 8, the Gamecocks moved to the 45 in 11 plays. Then Norton swept his left end on a reverse, picked up blocking, and streaked down the sidelines for the winning score.

Leading ground gainer for the Devils was Dan Lee who picked up 31 of Duke's 82 yards rushing. The Devils added 72 via the air lanes while South Carolina rolled to 249 yards rushing and 13 yards passing.

## DUKE vs. OHIO STATE

A 22-yard scoring aerial with less than two minutes remaining enabled Ohio State to edge the Blue Devils 14-13 before 82,834 fans in Columbus.

The only score of the first half came after the opening kickoff when Ohio State drove 58 yards in 8 plays.

Sophomore Jack Wilson led the Devils back into contention in the second half picking up 56 yards in a 73-yard TD drive. Wilson cracked over from the 3 for the six-pointer to cut the Buckeye lead to 7-6.

Midway in the final period Art Browning's field goal attempt from the 17 was blocked, but Bob Fetsko recovered for the Devils on the Buckeye 10-yard line. Three plays later Jerry McGee smashed over from the one and Browning added the PAT to put Duke ahead 13-7.

Then the Buckeyes came back all the way in the air with the final strike coming from 22 yards out. The PAT attempt split the uprights to give Ohio State the 14-13 edge.

## DUKE vs. RICE


Alert defensive play and the flashy running of Joel Arrington led Duke to a 24-7 win over Rice in Duke Stadium.

Two Rice fumbles picked off by the Blue Devils deep in the Owl's territory set up Duke's two first half TD's. Dan Lee scooped up the first bobble on the 15-yard line and three plays later he scampered into the end zone from the 11. Jack Bush booted his first of three consecutive PAT's. A few plays later Jim Gardner fell on another loose ball on the Owl's 29. Arrington made the tally from the two.

After Rice came back in the second half to make the score 14-7, Bunny Bell climaxed a 66-yard drive with a scoring plunge from the one. Late in the game, Bush added the final 3 points with a field goal from the one.

The Pitt Panthers completely throttled Duke's offense as they took an easy 12-0 win in Pitt Stadium. Duke was held to 5 first downs, 50 yards rushing, and 53 yards passing by the rugged Pitt defense.

Following the opening kickoff Pitt rolled 65 yards in ten plays to take an early lead. The Blue Devils had three big breaks in the second period—Joel Arrington recovered a fumble on the Pitt 24, Dan Gelbert blocked a punt on the Panthers' 46, and Jack Wilson intercepted a pass on the Pitt 46—but they were unable to move toward paydirt.

The final score came early in the last period when Ivan Toncic rifled a 56-yard TD strike to Mike Ditka. The Devils then made a final effort through the air with Don Altman hitting Dwight Bumgarner twice, but they could get no closer than the Panthers' 27.

#### DUKE vs. ARMY

Army quarterback Joe Caldwell filled the air with 203 yards worth of passes to lead the Cadets to a 21-6 win over the Blue Devils at Duke Stadium.

Army threatened to make a rout of the Devils' homecoming when they marched 66 yards to a score the first time they got possession of the ball. Three first half drives moved Duke as close as the Army 30, 33, and 34, but each time the Cadet defenders staved off further penetration to protect their 7-0 lead.


In the third period the Cadets, again spear-headed by Caldwell's pitching arm, drove 52 yards to another score, to take a 14-0 lead. But Duke came right back, with Jack Wilson and Bob Crummie leading the way, to move 64 yards in 11 plays. Crummie cracked across from the two for the six-pointer. On a try for a two-point extra, Dean Wright was stopped on the one after hauling in a Don Altman aerial.

With time runing out the Devils went to the air in desperation. George Harris fired to Dwight Bumgarner, but the ball was shaken loose on a jarring tackle and a Cadet defender latched onto the ball and raced to the Duke 10. On the third play the Cadets cracked across for the final tally and added their third consecutive conversion.



#### DUKE vs. N. C. STATE

A spectacular second period exhibition by Jack Wilson and the accurate toe of Art Browning sparked Duke to a muddy 17-15 victory over N. C. State at Raleigh.

The Wolfpack broke into the scoring column first with a 55-yard drive in the opening stanza. The final two yards came on a quarterback sneak and the conversion made it 7-0.

In the second period the running of George Harris paced the Blue Devils on a 73-yard march. Wilson

skirted the left side for the final 10 yards. Browning added the extra. Only a few plays later Wilson snatched a Wolfpack pass and raced 60 yards down the right sideline to put the Devils ahead. Browning's PAT made the score 17-7.

State closed the gap to 17-15 in the final quarter with a 39-yard, 13-play drive and a pass completion for the two-pointer. Then in a thrilling finish the Wolfpack drove 45 yards in the final 45 seconds only to miss a field goal attempt from the Duke 26.

The umbrellas are back up as Steve Kusmus (83), Bunny Bell (25), and George Harris (18), rush in to aid Jerry McGee (11) in making the tackle.



## DUKE vs. TECH

An 83-yard touchdown sprint by Joel Arrington, the magic toe of Art Browning, and earth-shaking defensive play by the Duke line led by All-American Mike McGee enabled Duke to take a startling 10-7 win over highly-favored Georgia Tech in Atlanta.

Arrington's burst came in the opening quarter on the first play after Duke had taken a punt on their own 17. Arrington crashed over right guard, outstepped the Tech secondary, and streaked down the sideline to paydirt.

Tech's only score came on a 25-yard sweep following a fumble recovery on the Duke 25 early in the second half.

Browning kicked his game winning field goal with about 7 minutes to play. Booted from the 28, it was the longest field goal in Duke history.

## DUKE vs. CLEMSON

Clemson turned back Duke drives at the 9 and 11 yard lines in the final minutes of play to take a 6-0 win from the Devils.

The lone TD of the game came on a 30-yard pass play executed with less than 30 seconds left to play in the first half. In the first quarter the Tigers had driven to the Duke 5, but the Blue Devils would yield no more. Then in the third period Clemson drove to a first down on the Duke 3, but four smashes into the stubborn Blue Devil forward wall netted only 2 yards.

The Devils first scoring threat came in the final period when the Devils moved from their own 10 to the Clemson 11. Shortly after Clemson had stopped the drive, Bunny Bell recovered a Tiger fumble on the 26. But after Dean Wright smashed to the 15, the Devils were unable to move.

## DUKE vs. WAKE FOREST

Two long aerial strikes by George Harris enabled Duke to down Wake Forest 27-15 before 25,000 Dad's Day spectators at Duke Stadium.

Duke struck first in the high scoring contest when Jack Wilson hauled in a 55-yard TD toss from Harris in the first period. Wake Forest came right back with an 82-yard drive climaxed by a 12-yard scoring pass by Norman Snead to make the score 7-6 at the end of the period.

In the second quarter Dan Lee's 40-yard burst set the stage for a 5-yard TD smash by Joel Arrington. Then with only 2 seconds left in the half, Harris hit Bunny Bell with a 50-yard aerial for another sixpointer, and Art Browning added his third PAT to make the score 21-7.

After a 22-yard field goal by the Deacons, the Blue Devils began moving again, scoring on a 13-yard running pass play from Wilson to Arrington. Four completions by Snead netted another score for Wake Forest, the final pass coming from 11 yards out.




Jack Wilson drives for a vital first down on the Wake 5-yard stripe after taking a pass from Don Altman on a fourth down fake field goal play.




### DUKE vs. CAROLINA

The University of North Carolina rolled to two touchdowns in each of the first three periods and added another in the fourth quarter to trounce the Blue Devils 50-0 in Duke Stadium.

The first time Carolina got the ball they moved 56 yards to a score in 13 plays. Then they recovered Bunny Bell's fumble on the Duke 22, and four plays later Don Klochak hit paydirt. The next time the Tarheels got possession it took only 12 plays to cover the 69 yards to the goal. Later in the second period, Carolina picked up another fumble on the Duke 35, and four plays netted another score.

To open the second half Don Klochak raced 93 yards with the kickoff for another TD. An intercepted a pass and a 32-yard scamper added two more TD's to finish the scoring. Finally, late in the game George Harris passed the Devils down to the Carolina one, but another fumble ended that drive.



Duke's cagers bounced back from a 12-10 season to cop five consecutive tournament victories to take the ACC Tournament crown and two NCAA Tournament victories.

The Blue Devils gave a warning of things to come during the Christmas vacation when they breezed past Alabama and Navy to win the Birmingham Classic. Five "Iron-Dukes" went the route during the tourney: Carroll Youngkin, Doug Kistler, Johnny Frye, Howard Hurt, and Jack Mullen. Then the Duke five knocked off nationally ranked Utah in the opening round of the Dixie Classic before they ran out of steam.

After Fred Kast and John Cantwell took over starting posts during the latter part of the regular season, Coach Vic Bubus returned to his "Birmingham Five" for the ACC Tourney. Bouncing back from their 25 point loss to North Carolina the previous week, the Devils opened the tourney with an impressive 82-69 win over South Carolina. Kistler, a terror in the pivot during the last third of the season, dumped in 26 points. Youngkin took over the following night and rang up 30 points and 17 rebounds as Duke avenged its three previous losses to the Carolina Tar Heels by taking a 71-69 thriller.

The next evening the Blue Devils toppled Wake Forest 63-59 to bring Duke its first ACC title since 1946. Kistler was again the big gun as he fired in 22 points, and Howard Hurt added another 14.







After taking the ACC crown and a ranking among the top twenty teams in the nation in the AP and UP final polls, the Blue Devils moved into NCAA Tournament competition against favored Princeton, champions of the Ivy League. Duke stripped the nets for a 57.4 per cent accuracy from the floor to trounce the Tigers 84-60. Kistler hit an amazing 8 of 11 from the floor, had 20 points in the first half, and totaled 26 for the evening to pace the Devil's offense.

At the NCAA Regional Tournament in Charlotte the torrid Blue Devils continued their winning ways by staving off a desperate comeback attempt to edge St. Joseph's 58-56. Youngkin dumped in 22 and Hurt 15. But the Duke squad could get no further than the regional finals as the NYU Violets took the wind from the sails of the high-flying Devils with a 74-59 thrashing. NYU jumped to a commanding lead early in the contest, and the game Duke quintet was unable to recover.

The Blue Devils thus ended its first season under the tutorage of Vic Bubus with a 17-11 record, the ACC championship, the Birmingham Classic championship, and a spot in the finals of the NCAA Regional Tournament—and the entire starting unit will be returning for the 1960-1961 campaign.






# TRACK

The 1958-1959 track team went undefeated for the third time in four years. Bolstered by such stars as Linden, who amassed more points than any other man in Duke track history, the thinclads went on to finish second in the Penn Relays, win the distance medley relay in the Florida Relays, and break several records each time they went out.

The indoor season was very successful for the 1959-1960 season. Duke finished third in the ACC, with Cary Weisiger doubling as the mile and half-mile champion. The thinclads then came home and registered easy wins over South Carolina and Wake Forest.

Once again, the Dukes were exceptionally strong in the distance events, with Weisiger, Nourse, Bazemore, and Menaker leading the way. Stevenson in the high-jump, Yancey in the pole vault, Preston in the discus and shot put, and Kurtz in the javelin offered needed support.

Highlights of the season were the Penn Relays in which the distance medley relay team figured as a strong contender, along with the Olympic Team possibilities of Dave Sime, Cary Weisiger, and Tom Bazemore.











Headed by Tom Jones, the Intramural Managers this year planned the events, arranged the schedules, furnished the referees, and made available the winners' trophies.







Describing this new position as a high administrative office, Dr. Edens termed the appointment as "one of the most important . . . we will make in the next few years, . . . will supervise the fund-raising and direct the development program."

He must listen patiently to problems of the faculty; receive pointed suggestions from the alumni and parents of students; counsel students; attend board meetings; examine the school policies; and search diligently for ways to better the university. #### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

Under the leadership of Chairman Norman A. Cocke, the Board of Trustees constitutes the legislative branch of the university's government. Each of the thiry-six policy-making members of the board, elected by the North Carolina Methodist Church conferences and by the Alumni Association, holds his position for six years.

The monetary appropriations voted by the Board receive the most publicity. However, the group's activities are not restricted merely to the financial organization of Duke. It confirms appointments to the faculty, legislates the rules, regulation, and by-laws of the university; elects the president of the university; issues diplomas; and confers marks of honor and recognition.

Meeting only twice a year, the Board elects an Executive Committee to carry out business in the interim between meetings. The Executive Committee, composed of seven members, two of whom—President Edens and Mr. Cocke — are ex-officio, meets once a month.

The far-sighted guidance of the Board has been responsible for the progress of Duke University.



To fulfill the request of James B. Duke, founder of Duke University, the administration of Duke was established to assert that "great care and discrimination be exercised in admitting as students only those whose previous records show character, determination, and application evincing a wholesome and real ambition in life."

A new class is formed each year of undergraduate men possessing these required qualities. Of this year's freshmen class, it is estimated that approximately sixty percent of the 762 enrollment will graduate in June, 1963. To a great extent, the success of that sixty percent rests with the men who will direct their progress—the deans of Trinity College.

Alan Manchester, Dean of Trinity College, is a graduate of three nationally known universities and a member of Phi Beta Kappa. Robert Cox, Dean of







Duke's Graduate School of Arts and Sciences comprises twenty-two departments which basically cover the major courses of study found at the University. Because of its scope, there are more graduate students enrolled in this section than in any other.

Both the Master of Forestry and the Doctor of Forestry degrees are offered by the School of Forestry, the smallest of the graduate schools. Various greenhouses, a special School of Forestry Library, and the Arboretum are available to graduate students in this field.

Offered by the School of Law are the degrees of LL.B., LL.M., and, the highest degree, the Doctor of Judicial Science. The courses are comprehensive and cover most every field of law desired by the student. The school also includes a Legal Aid Clinic.

Composed largely of undergraduate nurses, the School of Nursing offers to graduates a B.S. and a M.S. in Nursing. On-the-job experience is gained through work in the Duke Hospital, the Durham Health Department, and the North Carolina Cerebral Palsy Hospital.

Located in the Duke Hospital, the School of Medicine offers a B.S. in Medicine, a B.S. in Medical Technology and the degree of Doctor of Medicine. Fields such as surgery, pediatrics, psychiatry and internal medicine are currently the most popular.

Rated among the top ten in the nation, the Divinity School has faculty members educated in all the Protestant faiths. The degrees of Bachelor of Divinity and Master of Religious Education are offered to those who successfully meet the requirements of study.

The activities of the junior class were directed toward drawing the class members together for their final two years.



The freshman year of a nursing student, as is the case for any other new college student, is a year of adjustment and orientation towards her profession and major. The first year's work is centered primarily around a liberal arts education, but it also contains a nursing course of elementary interpersonal relationships. After the freshman year, the student gets the opportunity to put her newly acquired knowledge to practical use when she goes on the ward, after capping, as a sophomore. During her second year of training, the student nurse learns many of the nursing principles and techniques she will use throughout her career. The summer between the sophomore and junior year marks the start of a student's service time, which continues through her

senior year. During this time a student works on Pediatrics, Maternity, Medical and Surgical Wards; she also works in the O.R., in obstetrics, and on the psychiatric ward. The time passes quickly, each week bringing new experiences in interpersonal relationships, handling new situations, and dealing with new problems. With graduation, the nurse passes from the status of student to that of registered nurse; there lies before her the nursing career and life she has sought the last four years with its moments of sorrow and pain, which are quickly blotted out by the happiness and renewed faith in life coming from a patient's departure from the hospital with a new baby or restored health.
