#### IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVEL TO KOREA.

1. It is required that all personnel departing for Korea, including those on temporary duty status, be immunized against smallpox, typhus, cholera, and typhoid-paratyphoid within the six (6) months period prior to such departure. It is also required that a successful smallpox vaccination be accomplished within a period of not less than fourteen (14) days nor more than six (6) months prior to leaving Korea. Therefore, in order to avoid the necessity for revaccination in Korea and possible delay in returning, all personnel traveling to Korea on temporary duty will make certain that they have received a successful smallpox vaccination within the six (6) months period prior to the expected date of return from Korea.

2. All General Headquarters personnel contemplating traveling to Korea will report to a medical dispensary for a check of immunization status and the accomplishment of the necessary procedures.

2. MESSAGE FROM SECRETARY OF THE ARMY FRANK PACE.

1. The following message from Secretary of The Army Frank Pace, reply thereto by General Matthew B. Ridgway, Commander-in-Chief, United Nations Command, and message by the latter to this headquarters, is quoted in part for dissemination to all members of this command.

Message from Secretary of The Army Frank Pace:

"Recent defensive and offensive operations conducted by Eighth Army have been so outstanding as to merit highest praise. These great accomplishments more than fulfill the personal estimate you gave me in April. They provide inspiration to our entire effort."

Reply to Secretary of The Army Pace by General Ridgway:
