He was the author of "The Ragged Earl," produced by Andrew Mack, and "Rinaldo," produced by Joseph Haworth. "Chatterton" was first produced by Julia Marlowe in 1894.

The formal commemoration of the Anniversary will take place at a later date in the present school year.

ON Monday, February 18, 1867, the New England Conservatory of Music opened its first classes in the Music Hall building, Boston. Its directors were Messrs. Eben Tourjée, who had previously used the class system of instruction in music at the East Greenwich Musical Institute, and at the Musical Institute in Providence, Rhode Island; and Robert Goldbeck, a New York pianist and composer. In 1868 Mr. Goldbeck went to Chicago, and the directorship was assumed by Dr. Tourjée alone. The instructors were announced as follows: pianoforte, Otto Dresel, B. J. Lang, Ernst Perabo, S. A. Emery, Robert Goldbeck; harmony and composition, Messrs. Goldbeck and Emery; instrumentation, Carl Faelten; vocal culture, Signor Dama, Messrs. Zerrahn and Tourjée; organ, S. P. Tuckerman, G. E. Whiting; violin, W. H. Schultze; violoncello, Wulf Fries; contrabass, August Stein.

Opening thus with a faculty composed of foremost musicians of the day, and offering advantages which the directors intended to be "equal in rank with those of the renowned Conservatories of Leipsic, Paris, Stuttgart, Prague and others," the new institution at once secured a large enrollment of pupils. In 1870 it was duly incorporated under the laws of Massachusetts. In that year the first class was graduated. In 1874 Dr. Tourjée, as director, first offered instruction to prospective teachers of music in public schools. In 1882, the Conservatory having outgrown its quarters in Music Hall, the St. James Hotel in Franklin Square was purchased and converted to the uses of a music school.

Dr. Tourjée died in 1891, and was succeeded in the directorship by Carl Faelten. In 1897 the trustees elected the present director, George W. Chadwick. In 1901 the New England Conservatory orchestra, previously one of stringed instruments, accompanied by the organ and conducted by Mr. Chadwick, through his efforts became a complete symphonic organization. In 1902 the Conservatory was moved from Franklin Square House to the building now occupied at Huntington Avenue and Gainsborough Street. In 1904 Ralph L. Flanders was chosen Manager, and in 1907 Wallace Goodrich was appointed Dean of the Faculty. Mr. Eben D. Jordan, President of the Board of Trustees for a decade past, died in August, 1916. He was succeeded by Mr. Samuel Carr. In 1917 the New England Conservatory celebrates the fiftieth anniversary of its founding and the twentieth year of Mr. Chadwick's directorship.

1. JOHANN SEBASTIAN BACH (1685-1750)

CANTATA: "Ach, Herr, mich armen Sünder"

CHORUS

TENOR RECITATIVE AND SOLO, MR. RULON Y. ROBISON ALTO RECITATIVE, MISS DESSA M. WEISBURGH BASS SOLO, MR. BENNETT CHORALE

Bach wrote between two and three hundred cantatas for the festivals and Sundays of the Protestant church year. The cantata Ach, Herr, Mich armen Sünder, written for the Third Sunday after Trinity is based on the chorale "O Haupt voll Blut und Wunden." The melody of the chorale is given out in the introduction, is carried by the basses throughout the first chorus, and is sung as a conclusion to the work; it also appears in fragmentary form as part of the accompaniment to the alto recitative. This cantata is characteristic of Bach's treatment of the form.

CHORUS: "Mein G'müth ist mir verwirret" (Hassler)

The melody of this chorus first appeared in 1601 as the theme of a secular choral piece by Hans Leo Hassler, entitled "Mein G'müth ist mir verwirret" ("My soul is greatly troubled, and all because of a Tender Maiden"). In 1613 it was put to the text of the hymn "Herzlich thut mich verlangen," and in 1656 it served as the setting for Gerhardt's familliar hymn "O Haupt voll Blut und Wunden" ("O Sacred Head now Wounded"). Bach made it the central melody of the St. Matthew Passion and in the Christmas Oratorio used it

twice. In addition it occurs in four of his cantatas and served him as the basis of organ and other instrumental pieces.

CHORALE: "When I too am departing"

(from the ST. MATTHEW PASSION)

The adaptability of this melody to varied harmonization undoubtedly made a great appeal to Bach. This arrangement is perhaps the most beautiful and ingenious among his many choral settings of the melody.

Aria: "Slumber beloved, and take thy repose" (from the Christmas Oratorio)

MISS MARIE G. O'CONNELL

Bach originally intended the melody of the Slumber Song for a secular work called "The Choice of Hercules." There he assigned it to be sung by PLEASURE who uses it to lull HERCULES to sleep with admonitions of a highly unethical nature. That the composer later transferred this melody to the Christmas Oratorio to be the Slumber Song of the Christ Child shows that no such marked differences between sacred and secular musical styles existed in the 18th century as now.

CHORUS: "Glory to God in the Highest"

(from the Christmas Oratorio)

Bach treated the chorus very much as though it were part of the orchestra. Unlike Handel, he apparently had little appreciation of the intrinsic qualities of voices apart from their significance as a medium through which to express his musical ideas. The voices are often placed in ineffective registers, and are given passages which more properly belong to the technique of instruments. Notwithstanding this fact, the sheer inspiration and vitality of the music make it great even in a medium to which it is not exactly suited.

2. GEORG FRIEDRICH HANDEL (1685-1759)

CHORUS: "Your voices raise" (from the SIXTH CHANDOS ANTHEM)

This anthem was composed during the year 1719-20 while Handel was in the service of the Duke of Chandos. It is representative of Handel's early choral work, a result of the assimilation of three influences; first, the strict musical training he had received as a student in Germany; second, the appreciation of true melody acquired during his study in Italy; and third, the fundamental sincerity which he found in the work of Purcell and which was so strongly a part of Handel himself. This anthem clearly belongs to Handel's prosperous period.

ARIA: "In gentle murmurs will I mourn" (from JEPTHA)

MISS MARION DAVISON

JEPTHA was composed ten years after The Messiah. Handel's sight was beginning to fail and the composition was many times interrupted. It was finally completed and produced in 1752.

ARIA: "Revenge, revenge, Timotheus cries"

(from ALEXANDER'S FEAST)

MR. HENRY KELLY

The qualities of virility and energy commonly expressed by the bass voice, exactly fit in with Handel's attitude toward life; so that his own personality is, perhaps, better expressed in his solos for bass than in those for the other voices. The middle section of this piece beginning "Behold, a ghastly band" clearly looks forward to the romantic music of the later 19th century.

CHORUS AND QUARTET from the FUNERAL ANTHEM:

"Their bodies are buried in peace"

"But their name liveth evermore"

This composition shows the influence of Purcell in certain melodic and rhythmic features. It was composed in 1737.

ARIA: "Total eclipse, no sun, no moon" (from Samson) MR. ROBISON

After Handel became blind he continued to appear as conductor of his own works and as organist. The spectacle of the composer listening to this solo, his own musical picture of Samson's blindness, is said to have moved the audience deeply. His power to portray vividly the import of the text may be seen in the downward skip of the seventh at the word "dark" in the phrase "sun, moon, and stars are dark to me."

ARIA: "O, had I Jubal's lyre" (from Joshua) Miss ELSBETH JONES

Joshua stands as a monument to Handel's indomitable will. He had more than once been forced into bankruptcy by the jealousy of his rivals and the wounded pride of the court, and had suffered, in addition, serious impairments of his health. He returned undaunted to his work, however, and in 1747, six years before he became blind, he produced the oratorio of Joshua. "Oh, had I Jubal's lyre" shows Handel's appreciation of the Italian vocal style.

CHORUS: "Let their celestial concerts all unite" (from SAMSON)

Samson, produced in 1743, in spite of hostility proved successful from the first. It contains more popular numbers than any other of Handel's oratorios, The Messiah excepted. The chorus "Let your celestial concerts" is thoroughly representative of Handel's skill in choral composition. In it he alternates contrapuntal and harmonic passages, places the voices at their most telling registers and achieves effects of choral brilliance and massiveness such as we find only in his mature choral style. This chorus is like the man himself; irresistible, dauntless, superb.

Royall Tyler was born in Boston July 18, 1757. He graduated from Harvard College and, after studying law, became Aide-de-camp to General Benjamin Lincoln during the Revolution and later during Shay's Rebellion. Coming to New York on a mission connected with Shay's Rebellion he became interested in the theatre and wrote "The Contrast," which was performed at the John Street Theatre in New York City, April 16th, 1787, by the American Company under Hallam and Henry. It was repeated several times in New York and was played in Baltimore, 1777-8, in Philadelphia, 1790, and in Boston, 1792. Tyler wrote several other plays which were produced, but he devoted himself definitely to the profession of law, becoming Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Vermont in 1807. He died in August, 1826.

"The Contrast" was first produced in Boston Oct. 18, 1792, at the New Exhibition room on Board Alley (now Hawley Street) and was called a Moral Lecture. Several years later General George Washington attended dramatic performances while on a visit to Boston; they were thus made popular, for the first time.
