THE GRADUATE SCHOOL

Under the guidance of Dr. Chester McKee, Dean of the Graduate School, several hundred men and women are enrolled on the Graduate School this year.

As they undertook the strenuous demands of the school, they vied for Master's Degrees in five Schools: Agriculture; Arts and Sciences; Business and Industry; Education; and Engineering. In addition, others were working toward Ph. D's in Agronomy, Animal Sciences, Plant Sciences, Biological Sciences, Engineering, and Physical Sciences, and Social Sciences.

Established in 1936, the Graduate School has done much to further the interests of higher education in Mississippi. Throughout the free world, men and women with graduate degrees from Mississippi State University may be found working for the betterment of our society.

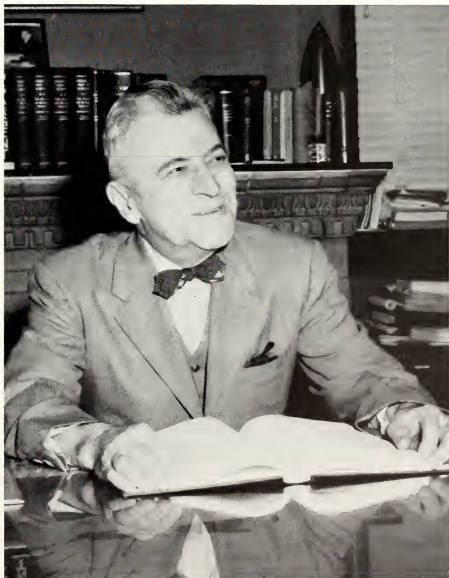




THE SCHOOL OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

The School of Arts and Sciences evolved from the old School of Science, consisting of the departments of Bacteriology, Botany, Chemistry, English, Geology, Modern Languages, Physics, Zoology and Entomology. Added fields are History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Religion, Political Science, and Sociology.

The School of Arts and Sciences was established in 1911, and in 1914 the department of Chemistry became the first chemistry department in the Southeast to be accredited by the American Chemical Society.





THE SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE

In this modern age where life situations are changing daily, educational programs of every kind and at every level must operate in a constant state of re-adjustments in order to keep pace with the times. Agriculture is no longer a mere matter of learning how to operate one's farm. It is a science, a business, a profession, and an industry. Students of agriculture are not only being permitted but encouraged to accept a more flexible choice of electives, and the opportunity to put into practice the more modern concept of combining Business, Science, and Technical Agriculture, in building a well-rounded educational program around their individual interest.





THE SCHOOL OF FORESTRY

Work in the Forestry School, like that in most schools, was not limited to classroom work, but included many interesting and educational hours of work in the field, putting classroom principles in practice.

Physical facilities for forestry instruction are centered about the Northeast Mississippi Experimental Forest, an 8,000 acre tract owned by the University and managed by the School of Forestry. This property, which furnishes valuable source materials for the foresters, lies within 11 miles of the school and is well stocked with a variety of timber species, tree species, and age classes.

Mississippi State University and the School of Forestry, serve the people in a two-fold way: education of competent foresters and keeping Mississippi Green.

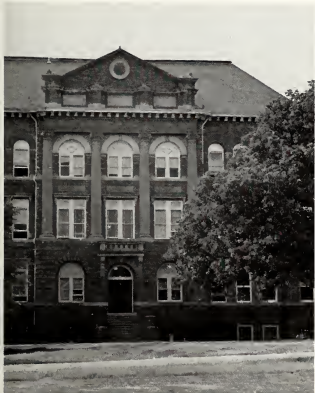




THE SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

The School of Education functions primarily to provide both pre-service and in-service programs for students who are interested in teaching in the elementary and secondary schools, in serving as school administrators, in coaching athletics, in serving as school counselors, and in serving as band directors. In accomplishing this purpose it affords opportunity for the student to gain broad learning in those basic areas of culture common to cultivated folk and in those areas of culture appropriate to the teaching profession.

In addition to being fully accredited by both the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the state accrediting agencies, the School of Education maintains standards which enable its graduates to satisfy the requirements of the Mississippi State Board of Education for obtaining professional teaching and administrative certificates.





THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY

Dr. W. C. Flewellen, Jr., completed his second year as Dean of the School of Business and Industry and under him it has continued to grow into one of the finest in the Southeast. The school contains five departments: Accounting; Business Administration; General Business; Economics; and Management. The School of Business and Industry is the second largest school at the University and Accounting is its largest department.





THE SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING

The School of Engineering consists of eight teaching departments: Aeronautical Engineering, Ceramic Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Engineering Graphics, Mechanical Engineering and Petroleum Engineering. All engineering curriculums are designed to give the student an understanding of the fundamental principles underlying the science of engineering and engineering practice. Each curriculum consists of four sequences: Basic Sciences and Mathematics, Humanities and Social Studies, Engineering Sciences, and Engineering Analysis and Design.

Omicron Delta Kappa, National Leadership Honor Society for college men, was founded December 3, 1914, at Washington and Lee University. The Alpha Chi Circle was established at Mississippi State University on May 21, 1937.

Omicron Delta Kappa promotes the idea that leadership of exceptional quality and versatility in college should be recognized, that representative men in all phases of college life should cooperate in worthwhile endeavor, and that outstanding students, faculty, and administration members should meet on a basis of mutual interest, understanding, and helpfulness. Omicron Delta Kappa was the first college honor society of a national scope to accord recognition and honor for meritorious leadership and service in extracurricular activities and to encourage the development of general campus citizenship. Omicron Delta Kappa places emphasis on a strong secondary membership requirement of scholarship.

Membership in Omicron Delta Kappa is awarded to undergraduate junior and senior men, to male graduate students, to male members of the faculty and alumni, and to other men who have attained outstanding success in professional life. Indispensable qualifications for membership are exemplary character, responsible leadership and discriminatory service in campus life, superior scholarship, genuine fellowship, and a consecration to democratic ideals. Election is based on merit, is irrespective of a person's affiliation with other organizations, and is without solicitation to insure acceptance of membership.

Delta Sigma Pi is an international fraternity. There are now over 115 chapters throughout the world, with a membership in excess of 45,000.

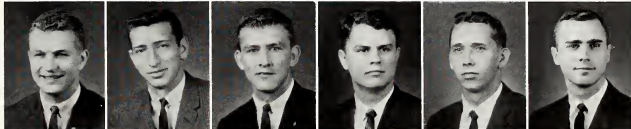

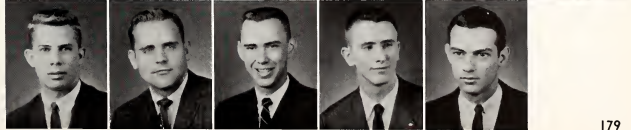

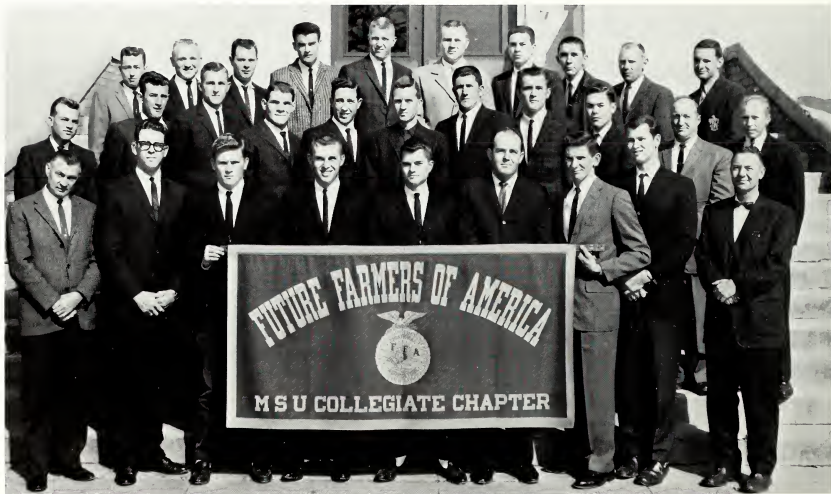

No national student organization enjoys greater freedom of self-government under adult counsel and guidance than does the FFA. Organized in November 1928, it has served to motivate and vitalize the systematic instruction offered to students of vocational agriculture and to provide further training in leadership and citizenship.

The Collegiate Chapter of FFA, sponsored by the Department of Agricultural Education, uses the same paraphernalia and ceremonies as do the local chapters in high schools. The work of the collegiate chapter is an intracurricular activity, having its origin in and being dedicated to the pre-employment training of teachers of vocational agriculture.

On October 13, 1890, at Cornell University, there was a group of students meeting with a common purpose in mind. These students were endeavoring to find expression for their common desires for fellowship and intellectual association thus forming Delta Chi Fraternity. It was originally founded as a law fraternity, but in 1927, the law requirement was dropped and students in all fields of study were acceptable for membership.

Mississippi State University Colony of Delta Chi was established here on campus on February 1, 1963. Delta Chi, the youngest fraternity on the campus, has plans for a house in the near future. The present charter members will be initiated this summer and hopes are in order to procure our charter this fall.

At the present time we are concentrating on beneficial expansion and the drafting of by-laws. While social activities are limited in this early stage we have plans for several functions.

FLORIDA'S DEPTH DEFEATS BULLDOGS, DANTONE SHINES

JACKSON, Miss., Sept. 22—The Florida Gators used power and depth to overcome a stubborn Mississippi State team before 32,000 fans in Jackson.

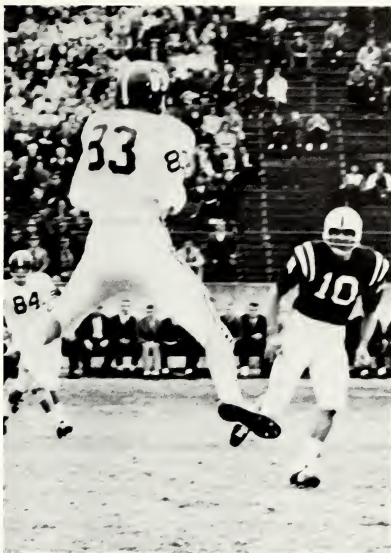
Randy Hutto set up the first State score when he boomed a 52 yard punt to the Gator 14 yard line. The Bulldog defense held and Florida had to kick. On the second play from the 48, Charlie Furlow hit John Sparks with a 12 yard pass. With that pass completion, Furlow broke the school record of 99. The Gators held on the 14 so State called on Sammy Dantone who kicked a 33 yard field goal.

In the second period State recovered a fumble on the Florida 17, but once again the Gators held and again Dantone kicked a field goal to put State ahead 6-0.

Late in the second period the Gators took possession of the ball on State's 10 yard line after a low pass from center. On the fourth play from scrimmage, Libertore took the ball in to tie the score. The extra point was blocked by Johnny Baker and Pat Watson.

The Bulldogs continued to move in the second half but again they were stopped. Dantone kicked from 24 yards out for his third field goal of the game, and State led for the second time in the game, 9-6.

Florida came back strong after this and scored two touchdowns to make the final score 19-9.



FISHER SPARKS 7-6 VICTORY OVER VOLS

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Oct. 6—The Mississippi State Bulldogs, led by Sonny Fisher, turned back the University of Tennessee before 22,013 fans in one of the hardest fought football games encountered by the two schools.

After a scoreless first half in which the Bulldogs missed several opportunities to score, State recovered a fumble on the UT 23. They moved the ball down to the 2 yard line on runs by Billy Cook, J. E. Loicano, and Fisher, and from there Fisher dove over for what appeared to be a touchdown but a penalty moved the ball back to the six. Loicano and Burrell moved the ball to the 2 and when Tennessee got set for a running play Fisher rolled to the weak side and threw to Burrell for the touchdown. Dantone kicked the extra point and State led 7-0, a lead they never relinquished.

Tennessee scored in the fourth period after an interception by Mallon Faircloth. After a long pass from Faircloth to Pritchard to the 10 yard line, Faircloth swung wide to the right and went in for the touchdown. Tennessee elected to go for two points on a fake kick, but the Bulldog line put on such a rush that the pass fell short of its target. This proved to be the difference as State won 7-6.





BULLDOGS SLAUGHTER TULANE FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEC WIN

NEW ORLEANS, La., Oct. 12—The Mississippi State Bulldogs used a potent ground and air attack as they rolled over the Tulane Greenwave by the score of 35-6 in New Orleans.

Halfback Ode Burrell started the scoring in the opening minutes when he scampered 90 yards to paydirt. Dantone converted his first of five extra points for a 7-0 lead.

Howard Benton scored the second touchdown when he fell on a J. E. Loicano fumble in the end zone.

Late in the second period Tulane pushed across its only score of the game when Ted Miller passed to Gordon Ruch, but the Bulldogs showed their ability to score as Charlie Furlow hit Randy Hutto with a 33 yard touchdown pass with only seconds left on the clock. The half ended 21-6.

In the second half Furlow and Hutto picked up where they left off as Hutto caught an 18 yard pass for a touchdown. Dantone made the score 28-6 with his fourth conversion.

In the final period, quarterback Jim McBride teamed with halfback Larry Swarengen for the final score of the game. The play covered 15 yards.

In winning, the Bulldogs upped their season's record to a two and one mark. The victory was the second in SEC play.

STATE EDGES HOUSTON 9-3 ON LAST MINUTE PASS BY FURLOW

HOUSTON, Texas, Oct. 20—Mississippi State quarterback Charlie Furlow passed 24 yards to halfback Ode Burrell with a minute and a half left to play to give the Bulldogs a 9-3 victory over the University of Houston in a water-logged battle.

Houston took a three point lead in the first quarter on Bill McMillan's 25-yard field goal, and this lead loomed larger and larger as a heavy rain fell throughout the second half.

In the last quarter, as the rain became heavier, State pushed Houston back to the 12-yard line. Due mainly to the tremendous rushes of Johnny Baker throughout the night Houston decided to ground the ball in the end-zone to get a free kick.

With the score 3-2, Houston kicked off only to have the ball run back to their own 41. Furlow passed nine yards to Randy Hutto and Weaver ground out an eight yard gain.

With one minute and 42 seconds remaining, Furlow passed 24 yards to Burrell in the end zone for the touchdown.

Sammy Dantone converted and the Bulldogs had won their third game in a row.



TIGERS UPSET BULLDOGS FOR FIRST WIN OVER AN SEC TEAM

STATE COLLEGE, Miss., Oct. 27—Mississippi State scored first but the glory was short lived as Memphis State overcame the early lead for their first victory in history over an SEC team. The final score was 28-7.

The Bulldogs scored quickly in the first period when in just four plays, led by a 42 yard pass from Charlie Furlow to Johnny Baker, State took a 7-0 lead. Burrell carried over from the 16 yard line and Dantone added the extra point and State appeared to be headed for a pleasant afternoon.

Memphis State's Charles Killett plunged over from the two yard line in the second period and the score at halftime was 7-7.

In the second half it was Memphis State all the way as they scored the first time they got the ball. The Tigers scored again in the third period as Cassinelli carried over from the five after an intercepted pass.

In the final minute of play, the Tigers added a fourth touchdown after a short Mississippi State punt and a fifteen yard penalty.

In the nine previous encounters with Mississippi State, Memphis State had provided tough competition but until this year they had not been able to defeat the Bulldogs.



NATIONALLY RANKED ALABAMA DEFEATS BULLDOGS 20-0

STATE COLLEGE, Miss., Nov. 3—The Alabama Crimson Tide methodically ground out yards and touchdowns here Saturday afternoon to defeat the Mississippi State Bulldogs 20-0. The Tide, second-ranked in the nation, recorded their 18th straight victory.

The Bulldogs, in taking their third defeat to square the season record at 3-3, threatened on more than one occasion although never seriously, such as inside the 10 — and, to their credit, battled until the final gun.

Individually, John Sparks led State with 29 yards on 7 carries; Burrell had 26 on 7; and Sonny Fisher had 18 on 5. Furlow completed one of 5 passes, Fisher two of five and McBride one of ten. Randy Hutto took two passes for 40 yards, and Sparks had one for 22 yards.

Alabama opened the scoring the first time it gained possession, moving 64 yards in just 7 plays with a 16 yarder by Namath, and passes to Williamson and Wilson before Clark bulled over for the score. The Tide scored again in the second quarter with a pass from Namath to Battle. Namath passed again to Battle for the Tide's third score.

Coach Paul Davis in speaking of the game — first in a murderers row schedule against Auburn, LSU, and Ole Miss — said that mistakes — fumbles and pass interceptions — hurt State, especially in the first half.





AUBURN HOLDS BULLDOG THREAT FOR 9-3 VICTORY

AUBURN, Ala., Nov. 10—Auburn scored all of its points in the third quarter and held off a last minute Mississippi State upset bid to win 9-3. Auburn was forced to hold the Bulldogs four yards from the goal line in the closing seconds.

Mississippi State scored the first points of the game with less than two minutes remaining in the first half on a 38-yard field goal by Sammy Dantone. Furlow had set up the field goal by punting out of bounds on the Auburn two-yard line.

George Rose cracked over in the third quarter for Auburn's only touchdown. They scored their field goal with 8:24 gone in the third quarter on a 24-yard boot by Woodall.

Mississippi State made its comeback bid after Johnny Baker deflected a pass and center Johnny Windham intercepted it on the Auburn 24. Sonny Fisher hit Jimmy Jenkins for 15 for a first. He then rifled one to John Sparks on the four yard line.

Furlow came in and threw 6 yards to Sparks on third down. But on the fourth down play with forty seconds to play Auburn broke through to throw Furlow for an 8-yard loss.

LOUISIANA STATE BEATS STATE'S BULLDOGS 28-0

JACKSON, Miss., Nov. 17—A crowd of 40,000 fans came hoping to see the Bulldogs upset LSU at Jackson, but when the final whistle blew the Bayou Bengals had the upper hand 28-0.

The Bulldogs could do no good with their offense against the three-deep Bengals until the final period when the visitors let up a little on their rock-hard defense and State went to the air with Charlie Bob Furlow passes at every opportunity.

The Tigers scored in the first quarter with Stovall going over from the 6. In the second period the Tigers scored twice with Campbell going over from the eight and Wilkins going over from the three. Stovall scored the last LSU touchdown.

The defeat was the fourth in a row for State and left the Bulldogs with a 3-5 record going into the December 1 windup with Ole Miss.

Mississippi State gained only 2 yards net rushing, but they did pass for 123 yards for a net yards gained of 125 yards. In the first half State failed to gain a single 1st down, but in the second half the Bulldogs moved the ball much better in picking up 8 first downs.



REBELS RALLY TO NIP TOUGH BULLDOGS 13-6

UNIVERSITY, MISS., Dec. 1—Ole Miss won the football game 13-6 but Mississippi State gathered the glory. The rebels were forced to the utmost to complete their first undefeated season in history. From the very start the underdog Bulldogs battled valiantly for victory.

Mississippi State shocked the Rebs with an 81-yard march for the touchdown with the game only four minutes and 47 seconds old. Charlie Furlow, who broke a school record for most completions with 13, threw to Ode Burrell for 13 yards. Ole Miss held State the next play.

Then Furlow, pursued by three tacklers, faded back and hit Billy Cook with a bulls-eye that carried to the Ole Miss 8-yard line. On the third play from scrimmage Burrell carried in for the touchdown, and State had a 6-0 lead over the stunned Rebels.

The Rebs sent Louis Guy across in the second quarter, and it for a long time seemed as if Irwin's extra point would be the difference in the ballgame. But Ole Miss' Weatherly surprised the Bulldogs with a bootleg play in latter part of the fourth quarter, and Ole Miss had a 13-6 lead.

It was a tremendous game for the Bulldogs, and nary a Reb left the field without wholesome respect for his rivals.

Coach "Babe" McCarthy and his Mississippi State Bulldogs brought home the SEC Championship for the third consecutive year and the fourth in five years.

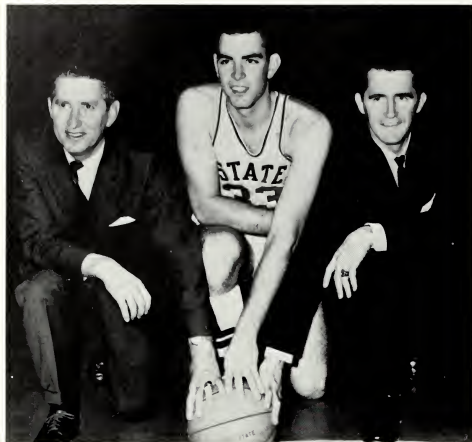
Although losing two games in the tough SEC, the Bulldogs whipped the three best teams — Auburn, Georgia Tech, and Kentucky.

Coach McCarthy, in eight seasons at Mississippi State, has won four SEC Championships and has led the Bulldogs to 148 victories against only 51 defeats.

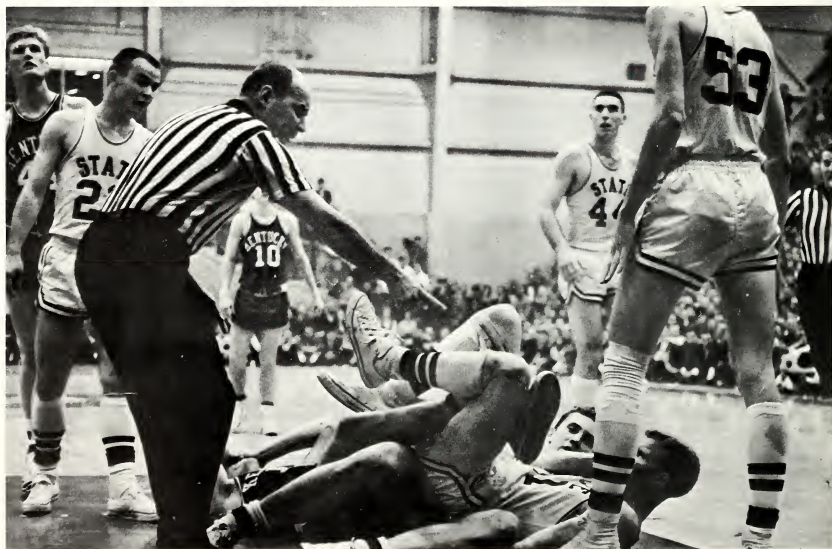

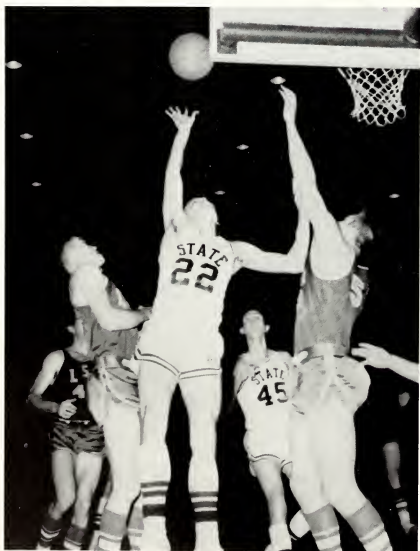

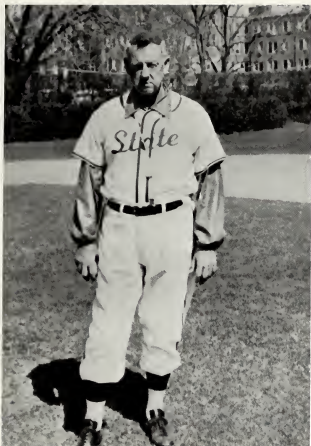

The 1962 Maroon Baseballers had one of their finest seasons on record. The Maroons finished the regular season with 20 wins, three losses, and one tie. The regular conference play saw the Maroons capture a 14-1-1 mark. The lone defeat came at the hands of LSU. Earlier in the season the Greenwave of Tulane managed to notch a tie from the Maroons at 2-2.

After the regular season the Maroons met the Florida Gators for the SEC playoff series. The Gators won the series by taking two of three games. This marked the fourth time the Maroons had the honor of playing in the series since 1948. They won the SEC in 1948 from Auburn and again in '49 from Kentucky. They again played in 1953 against Georgia and lost.

Bill Etheridge led the team in batting with a respectable .412, followed by Wayne Meadows with a .341 mark. Butch Etheridge led in regular season homers with 6 and in RBIs with 23. Frank Montgomery was the leading hurler with a 10-0 mark.
