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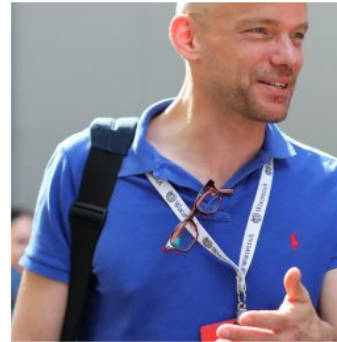

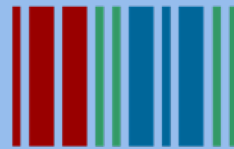

Wikidata is one of the largest and most popular LOD platforms in the world (1/2)



- Structured descriptions of 108M things
People, Animals and plants, Events, Countries, provinces, municipalities, cities, villages, Streets, roads, squares, Buildings, Vehicles, Companies and institutions, Works of art (film, music, paintings etc.), Chemicals , Astromic objects, Genes, Scientific articles.
- Things, not strings (entities, Qs and Ps)
- Centralized, no data silos, 1 data logic and language (GUI, SPARQL, API)

Connected

- Entities are interconnected (triples, Q-P-Q)
- Entities are connected to 8300+ databases worldwide (hub function)
- Entities are connected to Wikimedia infrastructure: Wikipedia, Commons, 700+ Wikimedia platforms

Global

- Global scope, (much) broader than institutional/heritage/national domain
- Multilingual, language independent, 300+ languages

Cooperation

- Collaborative → International community, 25K+ content creators
- Anyone may contribute/edit data, add, improve, delete, merge, translate, etc.

People and machines

- Human readable, human writable → Data available via GUIs in HTML
- Machine readable, machine writable → Data available via APIs in JSON, XML/RDF, CSV etc.

Open & free

- No trackers, no ads
- No copyright or database rights (CC0 license)
- Everyone may reuse data: query, share, copy, process, download, sell, etc.

Durable

- Strongly growing & sustainable, since October 2012



Added value: What can Wikidata add for GLAMs?



- 1) Increase visibility, findability and reusability of data & collections
 - Greater audience reach, worldwide
 - Collection data in cross-domain, global, multilingual context → Increasing interoperability of institution with the outside world
 - Community: External expertise, skills, tools and enthusiasm to enrich & connect collection data

- 2) New functionalities for data (and images)
 - Functionalities that institutions do not (or cannot) offer in their own services
 - Regarding Search, Data enrichment, - quality control, - visualization and - formats, Image metadata, Machine interactions
 - Both for thesauri and (Special) heritage collections
 - For humans and machines

- 3) Toolkit & platform to create and publish LOD
 - When no internal tools or workflows are available

- 4) Developing and sharing knowledge & skills based on LOD
 - Both internally and externally
 - Strengthening cooperation with external (network) partners via Wikidata/media

Needs of heritage institutions for which Wikidata is not suitable

- X Publish domain-specific / specialist / 'esoteric' LOD
- X Publish very large LOD sets (e.g. catalogues, thesauri)
- X Own control over who can add/change data
- X Collaboration with selected partners in a closed, controlled environment
- X Recording of non-public data
- X Own control over IT hosting LOD

Wikidata is de vrije en gratis database die gestructureerde, linkende open data van Wikipedia en overige Wikimedia-projecten centraal opslaat. Wikidata kan gelezen en bewerkt worden door zowel mensen als computers. Iedereen kan zonder beperkingen (want: CC0-licentie) gebruikmaken van de beschikbare gegevens en verbanden, en kan er bovendien zelf aan bijdragen. De database bestaat inmiddels zeven jaar. In die tijd heeft een actieve community er ruim 62 miljoen personen, plaatsen, gebeurtenissen, organisaties, organismen en andere 'dingen' (entiteiten) in beschreven. Door de sterke koppeling met Wikipedia – sinds jaren in de top-10 van meest geraadpleegde websites – zijn de gegevens in Wikidata bovendien uiterst zichtbaar. Het uiteindelijke doel is om de hele wereld op een gestructureerde manier te beschrijven, zodat computers ermee overweg kunnen. Vanwege de vrije licentie en de veelgebruikte protocollen (SPARQL, JSON, RDF, XML en, Mediawiki API) wordt de data uit Wikidata ook veelvuldig buiten de Wiki-context hergebruikt, in Google en Amazons Alexa bijvoorbeeld.

Weinig controle

Hoe geweldig Wikidata ook is, voor kennis- en ergoedinstellingen kan juist die openheid, schrijfbaarheid en onderwerpsbreedte een nadeel vormen. Einde oefening voor LOD-hungry en Wiki-aware instellingen? Nee, gelukkig kun je de

software waar Wikidata op draait – dus Wikidata minus de data – ook op een eigen server installeren en er dan je eigen datamodel en data instoppen. Dan heb je een eigen Wikibase opgezet. De Wikibase-software is open source en heeft alle voordelen van Wikidata, minus bovengenoemde nadelen. Over een eigen Wikibase-instantie heb je een stuk meer controle: je kunt alleen geautoriseerde gebruikers het recht geven om bij te dragen en je kunt er je eigen diepgaande, specialistische data(model) in kwijt. Tegelijkertijd kan iedereen – mensen en software – jouw Wikibase gewoon raadplegen, net als bij Wikidata. En functionaliteit die voor Wikidata ontwikkeld wordt, komt vaak ook terug in Wikibase. SPARQL, Mediawiki API, datavisualisaties, kant-en-klare code snippets voor Python en andere talen, alles out of the box.

Ontwikkelingen

De nationale bibliotheken van Duitsland (DNB) en Frankrijk (BnF) doen inmiddels serieuze experimenten met Wikibase om hun thesauri naar de LOD-cloud te krijgen. In Nederland doet het Kunstmuseum Den Haag als een van de eerste instellingen een pilot om de website delftsaardewerk.nl een eigen Wikibase te geven. Om partijen uit de academische en ergoedewereld kennis te laten maken met de voor- en nadelen van Wikibase en Wikidata, is de KB van plan begin 2020 een studiedag rondom deze onderwerpen te organiseren.

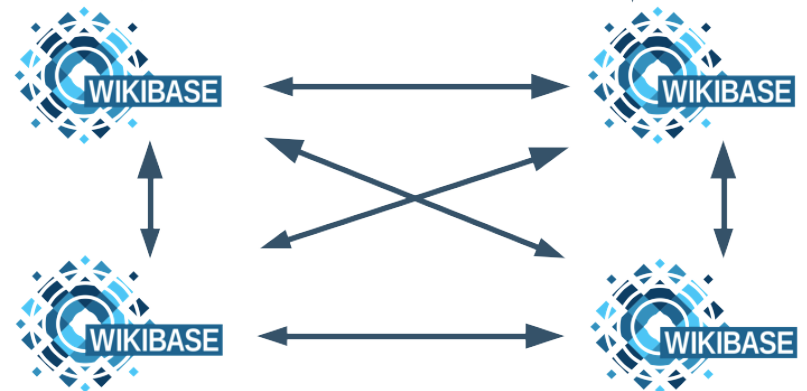


This is the basis upon which people, companies and institutions of all sizes can generate new insights, build new apps and services, and change the world for the better.

Summary of the data model [\[edit \]](#)

Wikibase knowledge base content can be summarized as follows:

A Wikibase knowledge base is a collection of Entities. **Entities** are the basic elements of the knowledge base, which can be described and referenced using the Wikibase data model. There are two predefined kinds of Entities: Items and Properties. Wikibase may be extended to support additional types of Entities.

The description of Items and Properties are structured as follows.

1. Item

1. **Item identifier** (number prefixed with Q)
2. **Fingerprint**, consisting of:
 1. Multilingual **label***
 2. Multilingual **description***
 3. Multilingual **aliases**
3. **Statements**, each consisting of:
 1. **Claim**, consisting of:
 1. Property
 2. Value
 3. Qualifiers (additional property-value pairs)
 2. **References** (each consisting of one or more property-value pairs)
 3. **Rank**
4. **Site links**

Wikibase as an Infrastructure for Knowledge Graphs: the EU Knowledge Graph

Abstract

One of the drawbacks of Wikibase is that it does not allow the reuse of external RDF vocabularies. Entities and properties will always be QIDs and PIDs. The only available workaround is to create items and properties in Wikibase, and indicate using a custom property that they are equivalent to some RDF vocabulary. Moreover, the data model of Wikibase is more restrictive than the general RDF data model. For example, blank nodes are not allowed. The object of a property must be defined at creation time. It is not possible to define a property that has both URIs and literals. The Wikibase data model is also more rigid because it restricts to one syntax for property creation, namely n-ary [5]. This implies that it is not possible to ingest an external RDF dataset into Wikibase. Additionally, a limitation of Wikibase is that its SPARQL endpoint is read-only, making it impossible to update data via SPARQL. All data has to be ingested using the APIs.

Technology interoperability in

	Classical approach	Wikibase
RDF support	Full support	The information can be dumped as RDF but is not natively in this format. RDF data is hard to ingest.
Reuse of external vocabularies and ontologies	Full support	One cannot use external vocabularies directly, but only align them with new properties in the Wikibase.
Scalability	Depending on the underlying triplestore	Ingesting large datasets is time-consuming but some projects are trying to address this issue ⁴⁶ [10].

Analysing and promoting ontology interoperability in Wikibase

Abstract

Wikibase, the open-source software behind Wikidata, increasingly gains popularity among third-party Linked Data publishers. However, the platform's unique data model decreases the degree of interoperability with existing Semantic Web standards and tools that underlie Linked Data as codified by Linked Data principles. In particular, this unique data model of Wikibase also undermines the direct reuse of ontologies and vocabularies, in a manner compliant with Semantic Web standards and Linked Data principles. To this end, firstly, we compare the Wikibase data model to the established RDF data model. Secondly, we enumerate a series of challenges for importing existing ontologies into Wikibase. Thirdly, we present practical solutions to these challenges and introduce a tool for importing and re-using ontologies within Wikibase. Thus, the paper aims to promote ontology interoperability in Wikibase and by doing so hopes to contribute to higher degree of inter-linkage of Wikibase instances with Linked Open Data.

3) Institutional needs

The second home of the GND

In the world of libraries, the GND has long served as a referencing and rationalisation tool, as did the four authority files that preceded it. It is integrated into certain frameworks and proprietary software structures that are, however, relatively inaccessible to users from outside the world of libraries. We believe that we can use Wikibase to make it easier for some of these target groups to collaborate on the GND.

To this end, we wish to import all the existing GND data records and their corresponding links into a Wikibase entity in 2021. This may sound like a simple task. However, Wikibase's importation interfaces are still very much aligned with the needs of Wikidata. For this reason, we have sought professional support from a Wikibase specialist, who is assisting us as a service provider in the transfer of the database infrastructure, the data importation and the creation of user-friendly input screens. In the next step, we will then invite experienced and new GND users to test the data-entry and search processes in the new environment so that we can further improve these.

During the second half of 2021, we are planning a technical workflow for synchronising the GND Wikibase entity with the CBS system⁷. The plan is to enable new and existing users without any Win-IBW⁸ access to enter their data as a suggestion in the Wikibase entity.

One long-term goal is to offer a user-friendly and supportive data-recording environment for the GND. The *GND web forms*⁹ represent a first step in this direction, as they are considerably more user-friendly than the data-entry systems used by libraries. The web forms currently can be used to record people and corporations. However, this currently envisaged approach is not flexible enough. In addition to the two aforementioned GND record types, there are four more. These six record types unite approximately 50 entity codes,¹⁰ each with specific properties via which the respective entities can be recorded as GND data records. These would require a dynamic entry form that adapts to the entity type or usage context chosen, offers necessary and typical entry elements, highlights useful entries and thus guides the user through the entry process. It remains to be seen whether Wikibase represents the right platform for this in the medium term. At present, Wikibase lacks such features. For now, no update to the generic entry interface is planned "ex works". There is also no option of limiting the offering to fundamental elements

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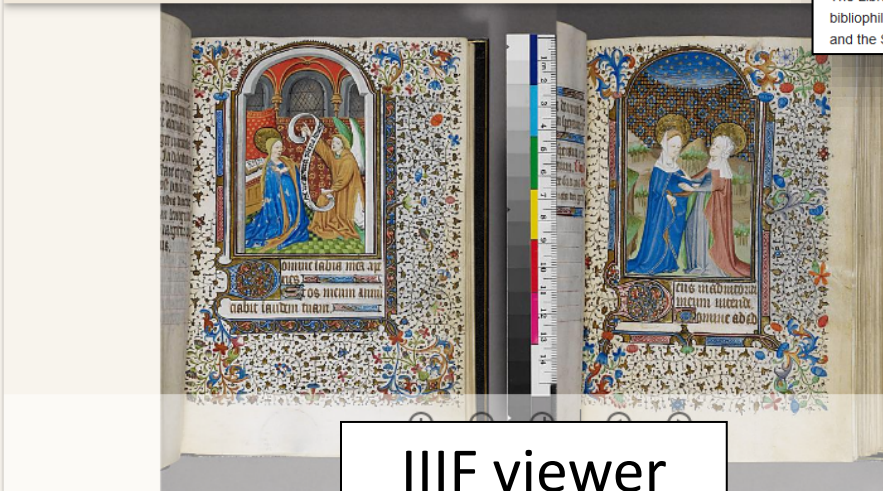

The **Grolier Club** is a *private club* and *society of bibliophiles* in *New York City*. Founded in January 1884, it is the oldest existing bibliophilic club in North America. The club is named after *Jean Grolier de Servières*, *Viscount d'Aguisy*, Treasurer General of France, whose library was famous; his motto, "*Jo. Grolierii et amicorum*" [of or belonging to Jean Grolier and his friends], suggested his generosity in sharing books.^[1] The Club's stated objective is "the literary study of the arts pertaining to the production of books, including the occasional publication of books designed to illustrate, promote and encourage these arts; and the acquisition, furnishing and maintenance of a suitable club building for the safekeeping of its property, wherein meetings, lectures and exhibitions shall take place from time to time ..."^[2]

The Grolier Club maintains a research library specializing in books, bibliography and bibliophily, printing (especially the history of printing and examples of fine printing), binding, illustration and bookselling. The Grolier Club has one of the more extensive collections of book auction and bookseller catalogs in North America.^{[3][4][5]} The Library has the archives of a number of prominent bibliophiles such as *Sir Thomas Philipps*,^[6] and of bibliophile and print collecting groups, such as the *Hroswitha Club* of women book collectors (1944–c. 1999)^{[7][8]} and the Society of Iconophiles.^[8]


