1. CAS in C/N 1, 11 Sep 51, requested Wpns and Ammo be issued to CAS for use in the NPRJ Offrs School at Camp Kurihama. CAS C/N 1 also requested certain training items be issued for the 81 mm mortars presently on hand in NPRJ units.
2. G4 C/N 2, 13 Sep 51, forwarded CAS requirements to G3 and recommended the following:
 - a. A T/A be prepared to cover those miscellaneous NPRJ requirements, such as schools, which are not covered by an approved T/O&E.

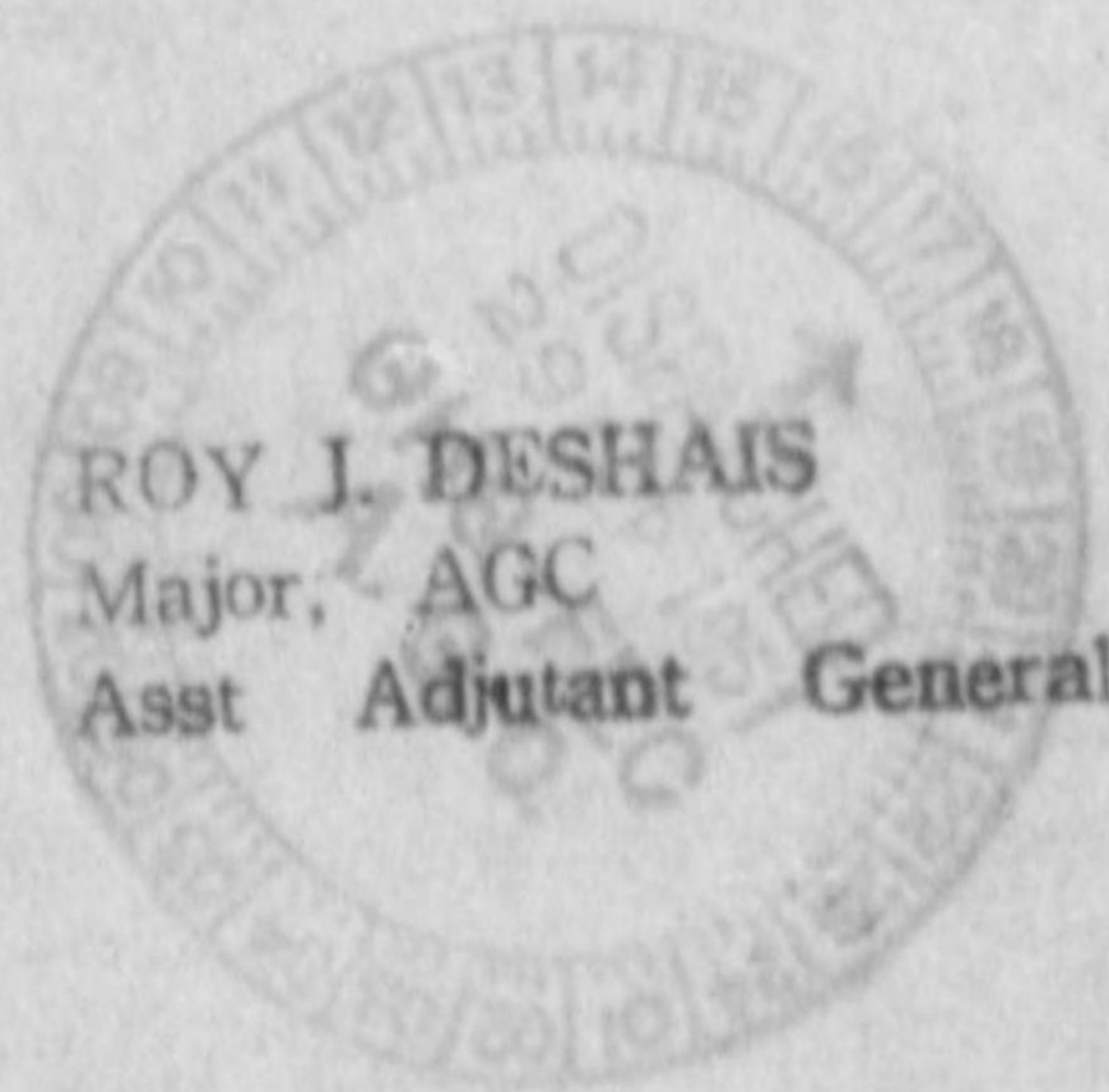

1. It is requested that JIC Ordnance installations perform necessary field maintenance on U.S. Ordnance loan equipment in the hands of NPRJ units.
 2. U.S. Ordnance loan equipment in the hands of NPRJ units consists of small arms of all types. These weapons are located in all NPRJ camps. A list of this equipment is attached as inclosure No. 1.
 3. From the NPRJ standpoint, the most desirable arrangement would be for NPRJ camps to ship or bring their weapons requiring field maintenance to a nearby JIC field maintenance installation. Shipping arrangements can be made by the Region Logistic Advisor at each Region Headquarters with the nearest JIC Ordnance installation that has been designated to perform this mission. Region headquarters are located as follows:
 - 1st Region - Camp Palmer (near Tokyo)
 - 2nd Region - Sapporo
 - 3rd Region - Itami (near Kyoto)
 - 4th Region - Fukuoka
- To simplify handling details, it is suggested that one JIC Ordnance maintenance installation near each region headquarters be designated to perform this maintenance mission.
4. NPRJ Ordnance maintenance units are not able at present to perform any field maintenance on these weapons as the NPRJ maintenance units have none of the necessary equipment to perform this mission.
 5. If this request is not granted, U. S. loan weapons will have to be removed from service in the NPRJ as they become unserviceable thru lack of field maintenance, or else turned in to JIC for replacement. As replacement would necessarily be slow, such a procedure would seriously hamper the training of NPRJ.
