REPORT OF PROGRESS ON ORPHANS CHRISTMAS ACTIVITIES

The Chairman of the Camp Osaka Orphans Fund Committee, Mrs. Cecil W. Nist, wife of the Commanding Officer of Camp Osaka, announced the receipt of a donation of Three hundred dollars (\$300.00) from the Camp Osaka Officers Club.

The Camp Osaka Noncommissioned Officers Club had previously donated Two hundred dollars (\$200.00), and Three hundred and seventeen dollars (\$317.00) had been collected in the jars placed at the Post Exchange and the clubs.

The Coca-Cola Bottling Company and the Pepsi-Cola Bottling Company have each donated seventy-five (75) cases of their product to be distributed to the thirty-six hundred and eleven (3,611) orphans in the Osaka Prefecture.

Colonel Allan Craig, Commanding Officer of the Osaka Army Hospital, reported a collection of Five hundred and twelve dollars (\$512.00) to give a Christmas party for the five hundred and eight (508) orphans they are sponsoring.

Captain Marion J. Knight, Commanding Officer of 8025th Composite Service Company, reported a collection of Two hundred and fifteen dollars (\$215.00).

Chief Warrant Officer Edward L. Bird, Leader of the 55th Army Band, reported that his unit had collected Forty-five dollars (\$45.00).

Captain William C. Byrns, Commanding Officer of 3006th AFRS Detachment, reported a collection of Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).

Major Roy B. Dunleavy, Commanding Officer of the Third CIC District, reported a collection of Two hundred and eighteen dollars and thirty-five cents (\$218.35), to entertain the forty-six (46) orphans they have sponsored. The CIC District has decided to take care of the orphanage on a long-range basis in addition to their Christmas party.

Captain Barney A. Carroll, Commanding Officer of the Osaka Signal Detachment, reports a collection of One hundred and eleven dollars (\$111.00) for the party for the fifty-nine (59) orphans they have sponsored.

Captain Joseph A. DePuglia, Commanding Officer of the 561st MP Service Company, reported a collection of One hundred and twenty-nine dollars and five cents (\$129.05).

Captain Athol L. Burgen, Commanding Officer of the 562d MP Service Company, reported a collection of One hundred and eighteen dollars (\$118.00).

Captain W. E. Haskins, Commanding Officer, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Southwestern Command, reported a collection of Eighty dollars and twenty-two cents (\$80.22), and a large assortment of soaps and candies donated by the members of his command.

Captain W. R. Radar of the 22d CID Sub-Detachment, reported a collection of Sixty dollars (\$60.00) to take care of the thirty-two (32) children that they are sponsoring.

Lt Colonel Wyan E. Thiessen, Executive Officer of Camp Osaka, reported that he is going to take the thirteen (13) girls from the Zyoshi Kikiyo Orphanage to Christmas dinner, where they will get turkey and all the trimmings, candies, nuts, clothing and toys.

The Superintendent of the American Schools in Osaka has asked that an orphanage be assigned to his school so that they may have a Christmas party for them. The Kikusui Gakuon, with forty-seven (47) orphans, and the Kotaku Gakuon, with fifty-nine (59) orphans have been assigned to the school.

Club 25 has requested an assignment of the Takawashi Gakuon with fifty-nine (59) children and the Koyo Gakuon with sixty-one (61) children. Club 25 entertained these same two groups last Christmas and requested that they be allowed to entertain the same groups again this year.

The collection of clothing, soap, candy and canned milk is progressing nicely after receptacles were placed in Camp Osaka Post Exchange and Commissary.

Mrs. A. H. Krause, wife of Master Sergeant Krause, Sergeant-Major of Camp Osaka, has knitted fifteen (15) pairs of mittens for the orphans and will continue knitting up until the time of the Christmas parties.

A group of ladies from Camp Osaka, headed by Mrs. J. P. Landauer, wife of Lt Colonel J. P. Landauer, 25th Division IG Officer, called on the Marine Forces stationed at Itami Air Force Base today to collect funds for the orphans' drive.

1. References:

Subject: Accounting for Expenses Incident to United States Operations
in Korea, dated 14 July 1950.

b. Letter, Headquarters and Service Command, HC 230.14
(GPGA), Subject: Utilization of Indigenous Personnel, dated 10 July
1950.

2. No TOW funds can be made available as reimbursement for TOW
funds utilized in support of Korean operations.

3. The amount of TOW funds expended in support of Korean
operations constitutes a reduction in the Annual Funding Program
by that amount. The continued use of yen funds in support of Korean
operations effectively reduces the yen available for legitimate
Occupation Forces requirements.

4. The provisions of reference 1 b above remain in effect.
Since indigenous labor costs incident to Korean operations are
charged against TOW funds, it is imperative that employment of
additional labor for this purpose be held to a minimum. Every
effort will be exerted to accomplish required functions within the
currently authorized manning levels.

5. In view of the above, it is reiterated that wherever
possible, U. S. Funds will be utilized in support of Korean operations
and the use of yen funds will be kept to an absolute minimum.



SUBJECT: Army Emergency Relief Fund Drive


TO: All Officers, EM, and military families of the Osaka Area.

SUBJECT: Use of Headquarters and Non-appropriated Funds

TO: Unit Commanders, Headquarters and Service Group

1. This letter amplifies paragraph 2 of Administrative Memorandum Number 25, this headquarters, dated 17 February 1950, subject, "Unit Funds". Its purpose is to encourage a more comprehensive and proper use of unit funds. This letter and the check sheets attached to the above mentioned memorandum should be reviewed by members of unit fund councils and by individuals who are responsible for the auditing of unit funds.

2. It appears that unit commanders, in some instances, are not fully aware of the purpose of unit funds and the benefits which can be derived from their use. In some instances, funds have been used primarily for parties and malt beverages (which are authorized) while dayrooms, mess halls and other rooms in which soldiers congregate have been neglected.

3. The following are authorized expenditures: This list is not complete but may be used as a guide for other expenditures:

a. Furnishings for dayroom and mess hall, such as:

Curtains	Sofas
Carpeting	Paint
Pictures	Radio
Chairs	Irons
Tables	Washing Machine

b. The purchase of distinctive insignia of the unit.

c. The purchase of magazine binders, book covers and stationary bearing the insignia of the unit, providing such stationary is made available to all members of the unit.

d. The purchase of trophy show cases.

e. The purchase of sports and game equipment immediately necessary and not available through Special Services Supply, such as:



3. f. The award of a trophy as an individual prize for proficiency in military pursuits, such as, an engraved cigarette case or cigarette lighter indicating basis of award, fishing pole, fishing reel, tennis racket, ice skates, shaving kit, sun glasses and similar items provided expenditures for such items will not exceed ten dollars (\$10.00). A cash award not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) may be given in lieu of a prize.

g. For sports events any prize except actual cash or bonds is authorized providing the cost does not exceed ten dollars (\$10.00). All prizes or awards issued are made on the basis that all soldiers have equal opportunity to participate.

4. Monthly distributions to Unit and Headquarters Funds provide a relatively consistent income which permits the execution of a wellrounded welfare program and further provides for the maintenance and replacement of fund property. Unnecessary hoarding to the detriment of these programs should be avoided. Unit commanders should give serious consideration to the proper use of unit funds and attempt to gain maximum benefit from their use.

1. It is requested that this organization not be required to re-establish a unit fund. The previous unit fund was closed out in November 1949, reference inclosure No. 1.

2. Pertinent reasons on which this request is based are as follows:

a. This organization has only five (5) EM assigned. Of these only three (3) are quartered in this unit's billet which houses, in addition, fifteen (15) DAC's and thirty-five (35) Foreign Nationals. Adequate radios and recreational facilities exist in the billet.

b. The billet is centrally located in Osaka and there are numerous clubs and movies in the area.

3. Any money that would normally be made available by this fund would be insufficient to provide material additional recreation.

4. The welfare of these men has not been adversely affected by the closing out of the previous unit fund.

5. It is felt that the cost of administration of this fund for so few men (3) living in a mixed billet would not warrant re-establishing the fund.

Headquarters Fund

TO: Commanding General

1. This headquarters has received a special one-time grant from the Far East Command Central Welfare Fund, which increases the Eighth Army Headquarters Fund in the amount of approximately one dollar per man of Eighth Army.

2. The plan for disbursement adopted by this headquarters is to retain this special grant in the Eighth Army Headquarters Fund, and to automatically replenish subordinate headquarters funds monthly, based upon their financial statements, until the grant is exhausted.

3. The funds thus made available will give wider latitude to subordinate commanders by providing immediately available funds for uses as authorized in Far East Command Circular 1, 1 January 1949, such as those minor projects for which individual requests for funds would otherwise be necessary.

4. Current regulations permit headquarters funds to be expended for minor construction, maintenance, and repair of recreational facilities. However, construction requests previously submitted will not be undertaken without authorization of this headquarters.

5. The accumulation of headquarters funds serves no useful purpose and precludes maximum distribution to subordinate funds from the Eighth Army Headquarters Fund. Monthly distributions to Welfare Funds provide a continuing income to finance welfare programs and to provide for maintenance and replacement of fund property. The policy of this headquarters is to hold accumulations to a minimum and to expend welfare funds wisely, according to preconceived plans, for the benefit and well-being of the activities served by the fund.
