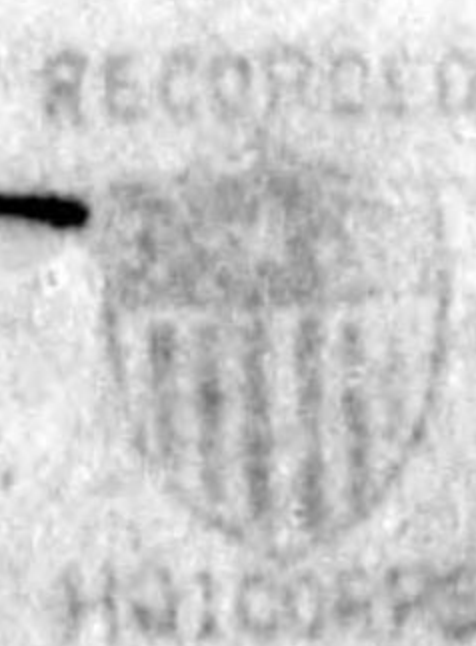

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.3 (11 Feb 49) CCS, SCAPIN 1972, dated 11 February 1949, subject as above.

2. The Commanding General, Eighth Army will extend the necessary surveillance to insure compliance by the Ministry of Communications, and the Ministry of Commerce and Industry with the provisions of the reference memorandum.

3. Surveillance by the Eighth Army occupation forces will include ascertaining from time to time that all individual line services installed and working within the premises of the hotel have been made in compliance with the regulation of the directive. They will insure that the officially procured long distance lines of the occupation forces are not used to complete long distance calls originating at hotels and handled through the hotel switchboards and public pay station systems. In exercising general and particular surveillance of the regulations of the subject memorandum, they will cooperate with the Economic and Scientific Section (Trade Services Division) and the Civil Communications Section (Telephone and Telegraph Division) of GHQ SCAP.

MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Provision of Telephone Services on the Premises of Hotels
Operated by the Board of Trade

1. In order to meet the domestic telephone service requirements of commercial entrants quartered in each hotel in Japan operated by the Board of Trade of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, and of the general public who come into the premises of the hotels, the Board of Trade of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry and the Ministry of Communications will be governed by the provisions and regulations set forth in inclosure 1 hereto, effective 1 March 1949 at 0001 hours.


2. Direct communication between Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and Ministry of Communications regarding matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

Regulations Covering the Provision of Telephone Services on the Premises of Hotels Operated by the Board of Trade of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry

1. Hotel private branch exchange service will be engineered, installed and maintained to adequately handle requirements of the hotel's guests, and of the hotel's administrative staff for outgoing, incoming and inter-communicating telephone calls. This will involve the provision of an adequate number of private branch exchange switchboard positions, central office trunks and stations (properly distributed to rooms and offices throughout the hotel).

2. An attended public paystation system will be engineered, installed and maintained in a location in the hotel that can be conveniently reached from the lobby of the hotel to meet public requirements for outgoing calls. No agency or firm other than the hotel will be permitted to operate public or semi-public paystations in the premises of the hotel.

3. Any individual line service terminated on the premises of the hotel and subscribed for by either the Board of Trade or its hotel management, or by commercial entrants will be for the exclusive use of the subscriber, and will be subscribed for directly with the Ministry of Communications by the subscriber.

4. The Board of Trade and its hotel management will provide an adequate force of English-speaking operators to cover the private branch exchange switchboard and the attended public paystations system to provide a uniform good grade of service. The Ministry of Communications will assist the hotel management in training the operators for the work to be done, and will send to the hotel, as occasion demands a private branch exchange service supervisor to observe the quality of service being rendered by the hotel's operator force and to advise with the Chief of the hotel's operator force.

5. Each outgoing local call completed through the hotel's private branch exchange switchboard and/or the attended public paystation system for the hotel guests and the general public will be paid for in Japanese yen regardless of whether or not the person placing the call is a commercial entrant, a member of the occupation forces or anyone else. The charge per call will be four (4) yen.

6. Each long distance call completed through the hotel private branch exchange switchboard and/or the public paystation system for the hotel guests and the general public will be paid for in Japanese yen regardless of whether or not the person placing the call is a commercial entrant, a member of the occupation forces or anyone else. Cancellation charges for long distance calls placed but not completed due to no failure on the part of the Ministry of Communications will be paid for accordingly in yen.

7. The following classes of long distance telephone service will be available to anyone placing calls through the hotel's private branch

exchange switchboard and/or public paystation system at the rates indicated:

<u>Class</u>	<u>Rate Treatment</u>
* a. Ordinary	Ordinary rate
* b. Urgent	Twice the ordinary rate
* c. Special Urgent	Three times the ordinary rate
* d. <u>Time Appointment</u>	Four times the ordinary rate
e. "AF Call"	Five times the ordinary rate

* (Ordinary, Urgent, Special Urgent and Time Appointment calls will be completed over the regular Japanese long distance facilities only, and will not be handled over the special facilities or by the special long distance operators used for handling "AF Call" message service).

The charges for long distance call cancellations will be applied at the regularly established yen rates.

8. No long distance calls originated through the hotel's switchboard, and/or public paystation systems, will be transmitted over the official long distance lines of the occupation forces.

9. The Ministry of Communications will bill monthly and collect from the hotel its regularly established rate of two (2) yen for each outgoing local call completed through the hotel's private branch exchange switchboard and/or public paystation system. Charges for completed long distance calls and for long distance call cancellations will be billed monthly and collected from the hotel with rate treatment applicable as set forth in paragraph 7 above, less a ten (10) percent credit which will be shown on the bill as a commission to the hotel as compensation for assistance rendered in handling calls.

10. The Ministry of Communications and the Board of Trade will coordinate in issuing instructions to their respective employees which are appropriate and necessary to implement the provisions of all the above regulations.

SUBJECT: Information of General Application Pertaining to Directive SCAPIN 1972, file AG 311.3 (11 Feb 49) CCS, this Headquarters dated 11 Feb 49, subject: Provision of Telephone Services on the Premises of Hotels Operated by the Board of Trade

1. With reference to the subject memorandum the following is published for the information of all concerned.

2. The subject memorandum is issued for the purpose of regulating the provision of adequate domestic telephone facilities in trade hotels operated by the Board of Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry which quarter commercial entrants and at times military and accredited civilian personnel of the occupation forces. Further purposes served are the regulation of charges to be made for local and long distance calls handled through the hotel switchboards and public paystation systems for guests of the hotels, and for the general public who come within the premises of the hotels.

3. Military and accredited civilian personnel who on occasion are guests of the hotels are required to pay charges in yen as the hotel managements will not be in a position to determine which calls placed by them could be accepted as being properly chargeable to occupation force expense.

1. Reference is made to the attached inclosures:

a. Inclosure Number one:

Telephone No. 36054 (Civil Education)

(1) Both of these calls were made as AF calls after repeated attempts to establish contact over the G.I. system. Both calls were necessary and were of an official nature.

d. Inclosure No. four:

Telephone No. 36133 (Commerce and Industry)

- (1) The work of the Kyushu Central Liaison office necessitates calls to practically every corner of Japan. The importance of the Liaison Office to the Military Government program cannot be estimated. This headquarters considers these calls to be necessary.



1. Request that additional telephone facilities between Fukuoka and Kagoshima be provided.

2. At present, there is only one telephone circuit between Kumamoto and Kagoshima. This one circuit serves the Kagoshima Military Government Team, Kagoshima CIC and the Air Force installation. Little difficulty is encountered in reaching Kumamoto but the problem of reaching Kagoshima has been increasingly difficult. It is pointed out that in addition to the tactical business that is handled on the telephone, Military Government business, normal administration and supply, plus the CIC and Air Force business, has bogged the circuit down to such an extent that it prompts this headquarters to request assistance in obtaining additional circuits.

3. The volume of Military Government telephone calls plus the CIC calls and other calls originating in Fukuoka City and area is considered to be of such a volume as to warrant direct lines to Kagoshima. The obtaining of subject lines are urgently requested.



1. The attached communications order and justification are forwarded for your approval. These changes are recommended to bring about a more efficient handling of telephone traffic through Fukuoka Toll to Military Government Teams on Kyushu.

a. With reference to circuits to Kagoshima, it will be noted that there is at the present time only one (1) circuit between Kumamoto and Kagoshima to handle all traffic into Kagoshima. This circuit must be retained to handle the load resulting from CIC coordination between these two points and that traffic incident to the logistic support, by the 21st Infantry Regiment at Kumamoto, of all Military activities in the Kagoshima area. This has resulted in considerable delay being encountered in handling calls from the Military Government Region Headquarters in Fukuoka, through Kumamoto to Kagoshima. It is for this reason that it is urgently recommended that one of the Fukuoka-Kumamoto circuits be discontinued as such and extended to provide a direct circuit between Kagoshima and Fukuoka Toll.

b. It is also recommended that the circuit Miyazaki-Oita be discontinued as such and extended to provide one (1) circuit between Fukuoka and Miyazaki. This will provide for more efficient handling of calls from all points on Kyushu to Miyazaki since it eliminates the necessity of routing calls through the Oita Military Government board, or the Beppu board, on calls originating in, or coming through Fukuoka.

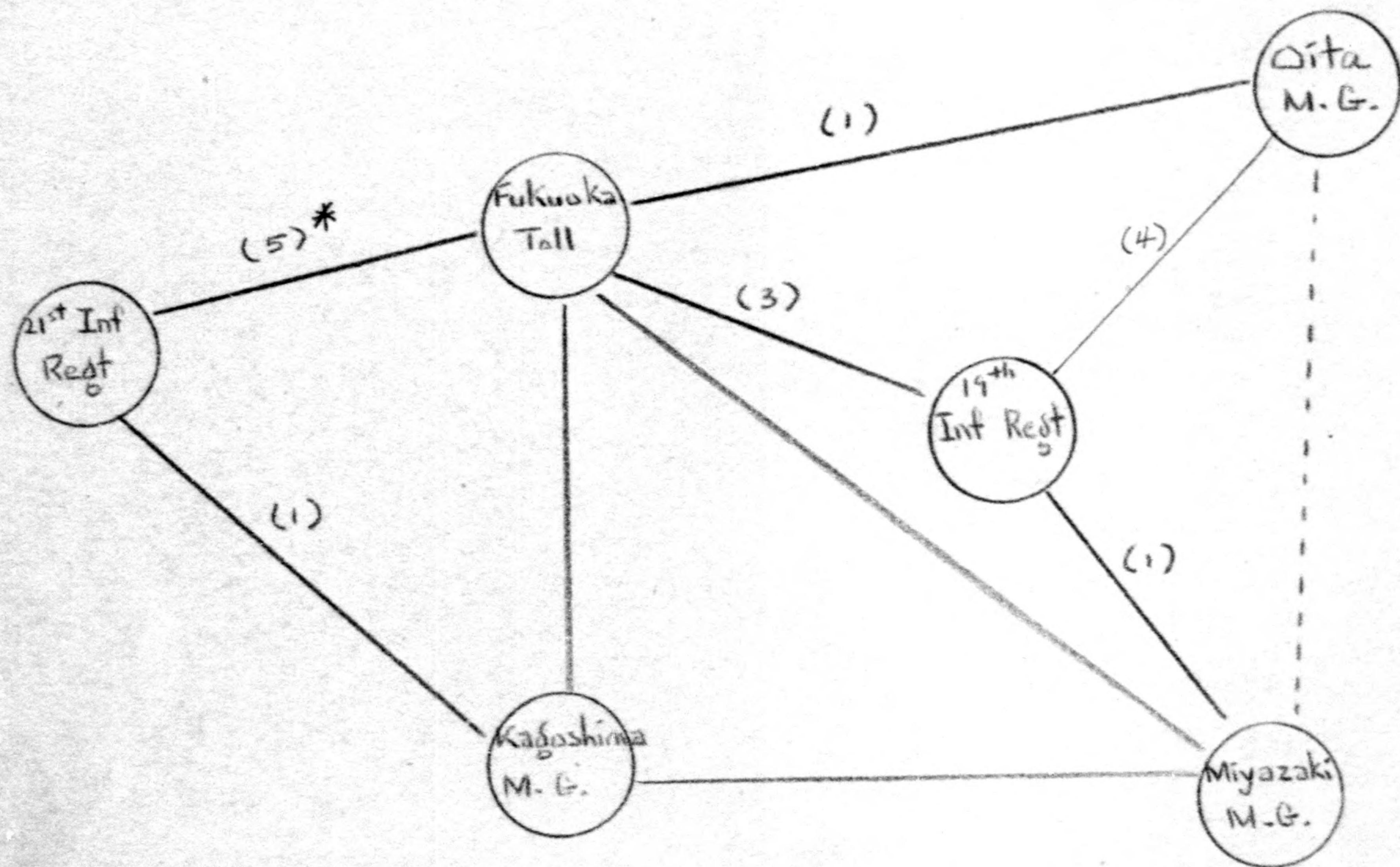
2. At the present time, there is one circuit terminated on telephone at CIC Headquarters in Kagoshima and Miyazaki. All calls between the Military Government units at these two cities are now being handled as AF calls through the Japanese Commercial system. Greater efficiency will result from this circuit being placed between switchboards where it will be available for both CIC and Military Government.
