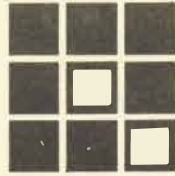

## Design Award Given RIT

New York's highest award for architecture was presented to Rochester Institute of Technology last week at the Flagship Hotel by the New York State Association of Architects Inc. (NYSAA).

It was the first year for the award to be presented annually for excellence in design of related buildings. The honor follows closely an American Institute of Architects award which was presented to RIT in May.

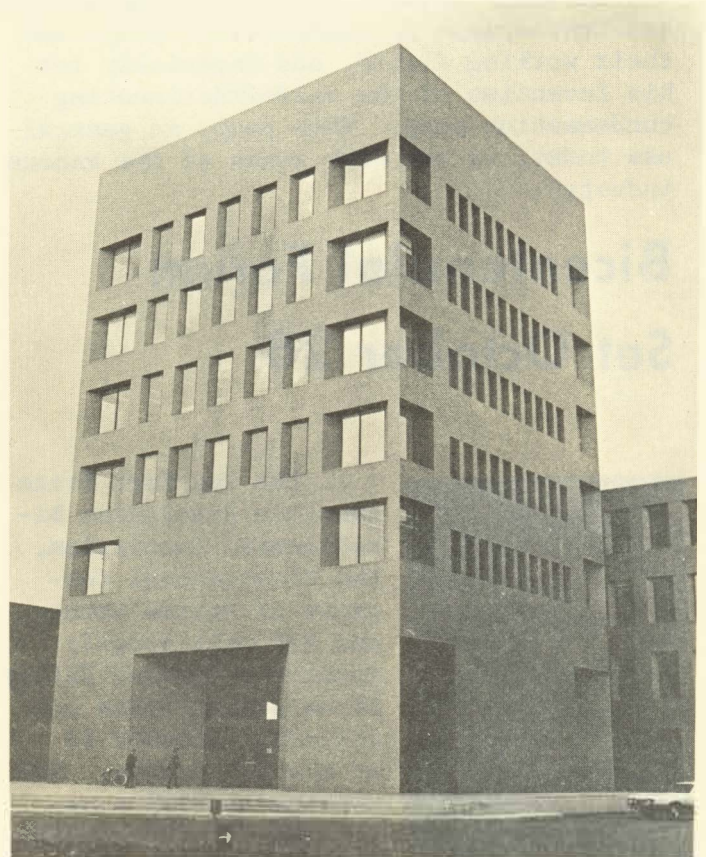
Dr. Mark Ellingson, former RIT president, and Donald McMaster, former chairman of the Building Committee for the RIT Board of Trustees, accepted the honor for the Institute and Lawrence B. Anderson received a copy of the citation as coordinating architect. Robert W. Crozier, president of the New York State Association of Architects, made the presentation.

"The establishment of the award evolves partly as it becomes apparent that several New York State communities have demonstrated excellence in city and regional planning, and partly from the limitation imposed by the national AIA policy to make only one award a year per region in this category," Crozier said.

RIT moved from downtown Rochester to its new \$90 million, 1,300 acre campus in Henrietta, N.Y. in 1968. The Institute is planning 5th year anniversary activities next spring.

Coordinating architect for the project was Anderson, of Anderson, Beckwith and Haible of Boston, Mass., who, with Dan Kiley (landscape architect), recruited the following architects: Edward Larrabee Barnes, Kevin Roche and John Dinkerloo, Hugh Stubbins, and Harry M. Weese, for individual buildings on the campus.

A \$24.5 million National Technical Institute for the Deaf complex is presently under construction at RIT. Architecture in the new construction is coordinated and consistent with the architecture for which RIT is being honored.



# Hickman Receives Welch Award



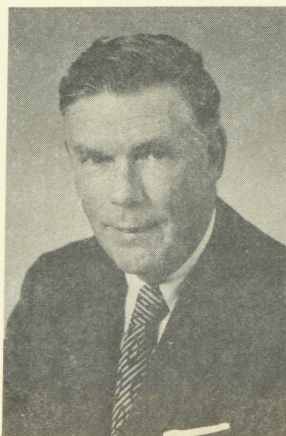
Dr. Kenneth C. Hickman, director of the Distillation Research Laboratory at RIT, was presented the third Medard W. Welch Award by the American Vacuum Society at its Annual Symposium in Chicago this month.

The award was given in recognition of Dr. Hickman's four

and one-half decades of outstanding research and development in condensation pumps and their working fluids, and especially for his invention of the self-fractionating condensation pump. This pump, in general use today, is the work horse of the vacuum industry.

## Bicentennial Forum

### Set October 28



The New York State American Revolution Bicentennial Commission, the Bicentennial Congress of Monroe County and RIT will jointly sponsor a Genesee Valley Bicentennial Forum on Saturday, October 28 at the RIT campus. Beginning at 9:45 a.m., the one-day forum will be held in Room 1250, College of Engineering.

Local historians, civic leaders, patriotic societies, educational institutions and interested individuals have been invited to attend or send representatives.

Keynote speaker will be Dr. Richard P. McCormick, professor of history and University Historian at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey. A leading member of the New Jersey Historical Commission, Dr. McCormick was also appointed in 1971 as a member of the federal American Revolution Bicentennial Commission.

Born and educated in England, Dr. Hickman joined Eastman Kodak in 1925 and had a successful career in photography before embarking on his vacuum activities.

He is the author of numerous technical papers. More than 100 patents have been granted him.

He is a member of the American Chemical Society and the Federated Biological Society, a fellow of the Chemical Society (London), a life fellow in the Royal Photographic Society, a life fellow of the New York Academy of Sciences and an honorary member of the American Vacuum Society.
