ASPARAGUS

CULTURE—Sow seed in early spring in well drained soil, having a sun exposure, in rows 1 foot apart. Cover the seeds from $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ inch deep. Thin out seedlings to three or four inches in a row, saving only the strongest. The one year plants should be set out in the spring in good rich sandy soil 20 to 24 inches deep. Plenty of well rotted manure should be worked into the ground. One ounce of seed will plant 40 feet of drill.

MARY WASHINGTON—This is a rust resisting variety. It is very early and yields well. Pkt. 5c; oz. 15c; 1-4 lb. 40c. Postage paid.

BEANS

CULTURE: Sow the early part of May when ground is warm and all danger of frost is over. Plant in drills about 2 inches deep and from 18 inches to 3 feet apart. 1 lb. to 100 feet of drill, 60 pounds to the acre.






