Commander A. D. FRASER in a PB4Y-1P aircraft of Fleet Air Photographic Squadron Five took off from Agana Airfield, Guam, M. I. on 28 April 1945 at 1100 King to photograph enemy installations on Marcus Island. He arrived over the target at 1600 King and took good vertical photographs from an altitude of 12,000 ft. He encountered one burst of antiaircraft fire which was placed directly aft of the plane. No enemy interception was encountered. The enemy appeared to be working in the runway. He landed at Agana 2200 King.
