
#### Wikimedia Foundation highlights

- <u>Draft movement strategic direction</u> -- the draft strategic direction has been published on-wiki, and the strategy team is in the process of reviewing feedback from Wikimania and through the wikis. Thank you to everyone for submitting comments. Draft two will be published sometime in early to mid September. Then we will have a 2-week period for community review. If all goes according to plan, the final draft will be posted by the end of September.
- <u>How to draft training modules</u> -- SuSa completed a "How to" draft for community members to design and build their own training modules for programs and events. This draft will be tweaked and posted on Meta-Wiki.
- Inclusion survey -- T&C launched the Inclusion survey, open to all Wikimedia Foundation staff, contractors, temps, and interns. Participation is voluntary, and candid responses are encouraged. Look for the survey link in an email that was sent by Angel Lewis. The survey closes tomorrow, 1 September.

#### **Coming up in September**

- <u>Wikimedia CEE Annual meeting.</u> September 22-26, Warsaw, Poland. The sixth annual conference for the regional Wikimedia network of Central and Eastern Europe is bringing together affiliates from the region, to promote, support and develop, cross-border collaboration.
- <u>2017 Wikimedia Strategy process</u>. September. Draft two of the strategic direction will be available for community review in early to mid September. Please continue to add comments!





# ...in countries that are far apart.











Wikipedia's prominence is both its greatest strength and its greatest weakness for attracting new editors.

Inspiring, trusted, and well connected intermediaries are a critical asset in recruiting and supporting new editors.



The complexity and separation of how Wikipedia is made, and the community behind it, make it difficult to convert readers to editors and new editors into experienced editors.





**New editors' greatest** challenges are not technological, but conceptual. They struggle to learn Wikipedia's policies and how to shape content "the Wikipedia way".

New editors go outside Wikipedia for help because they prefer targeted and sometimes personal, support.
