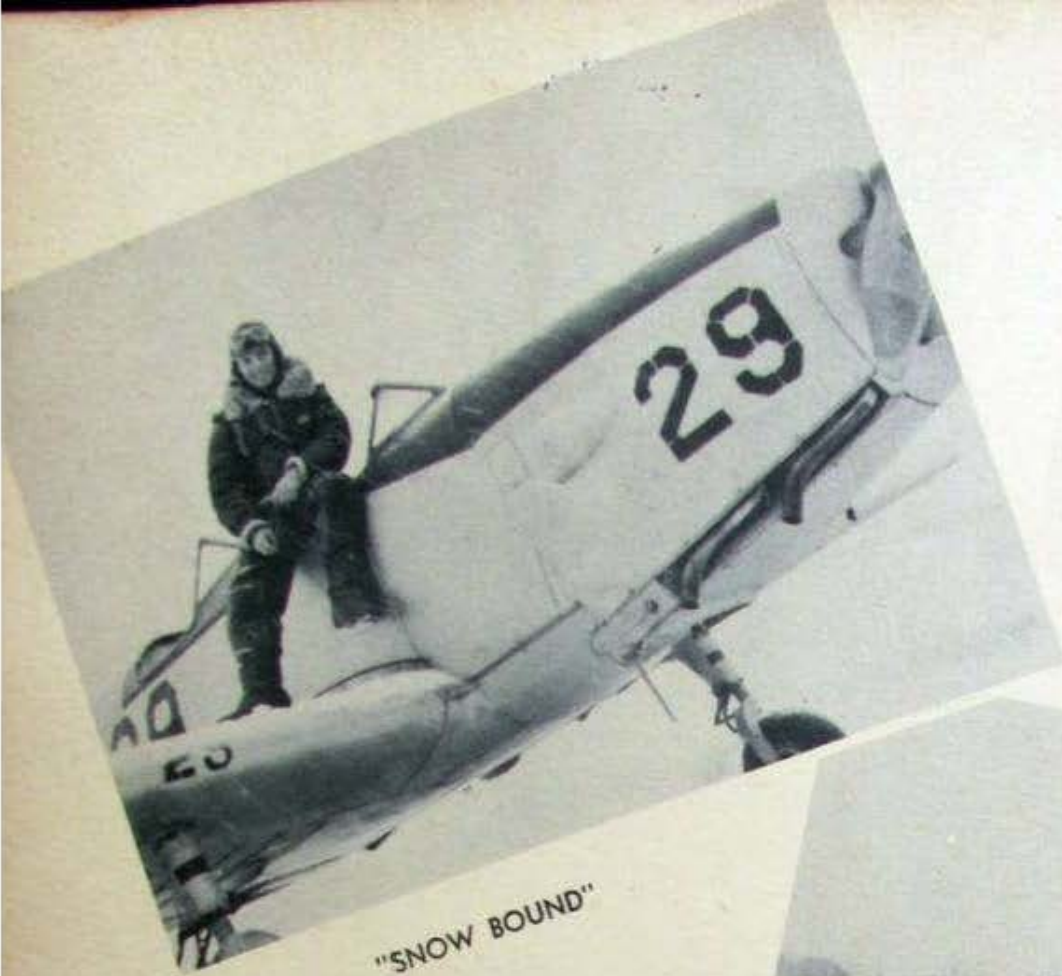
# *high flight . . .*

Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.



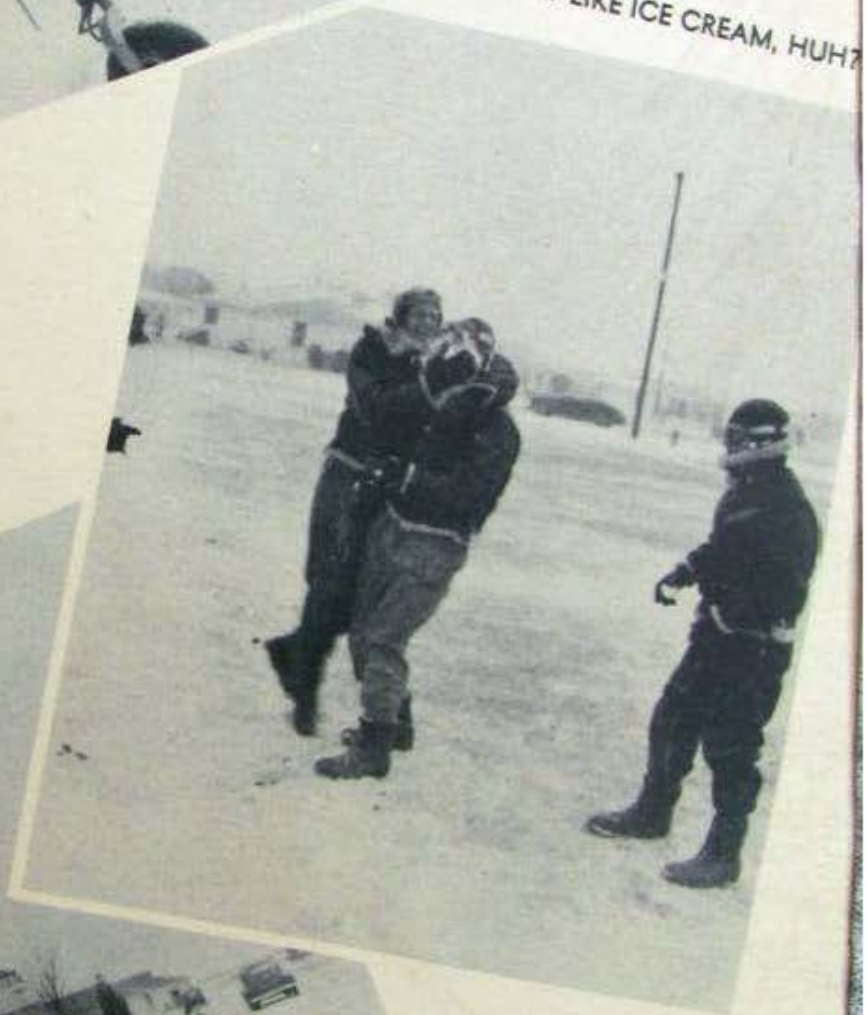

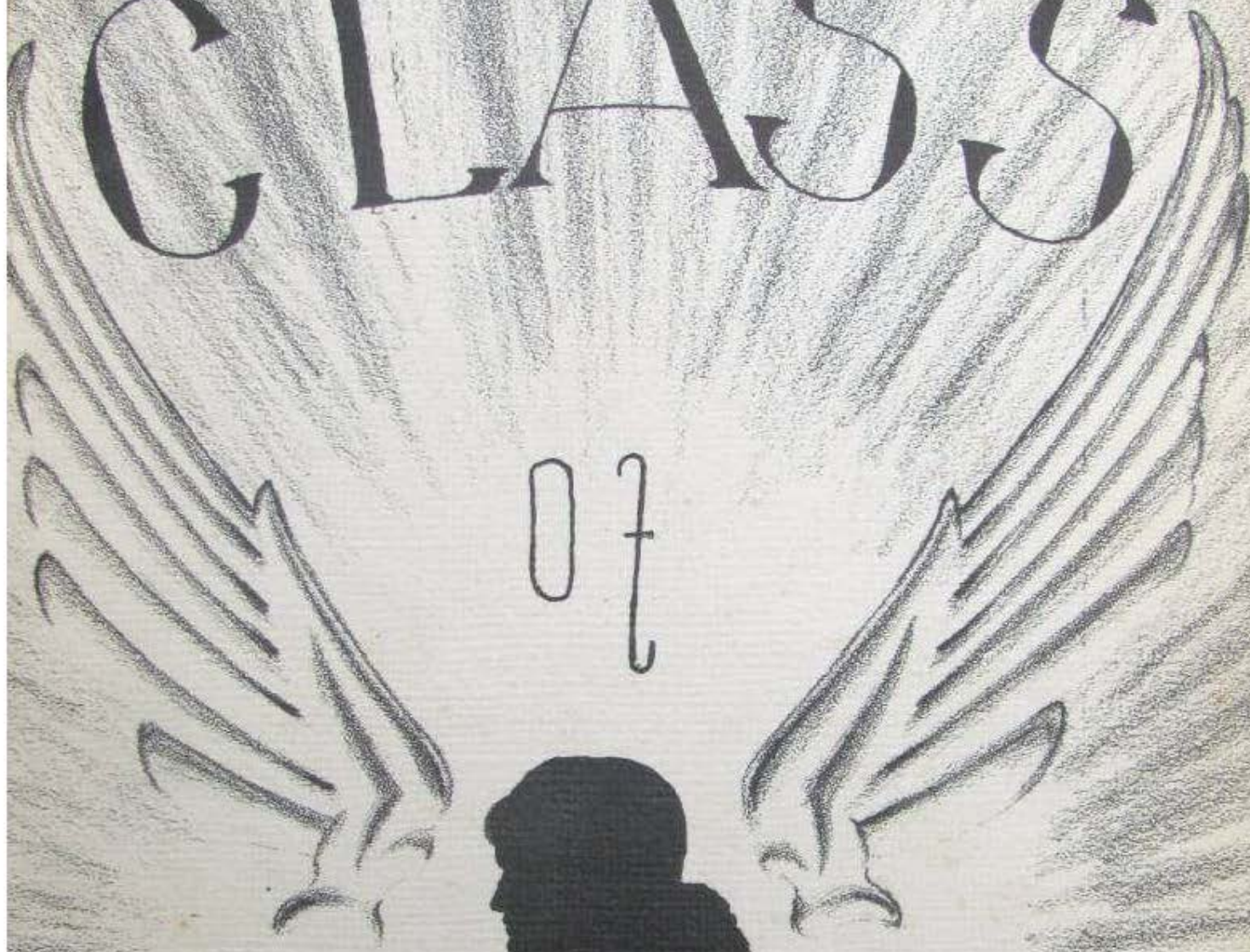

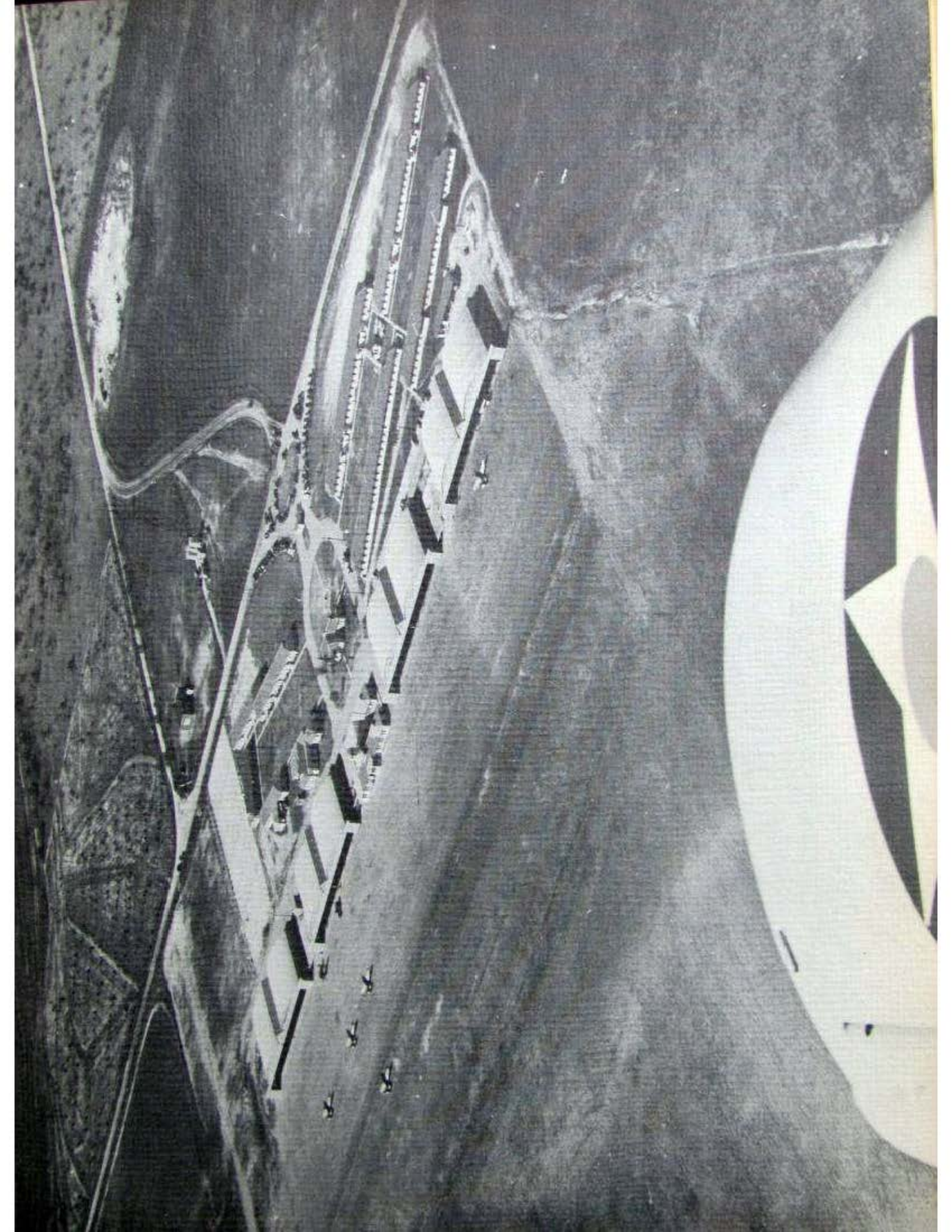




## *Dedication*
