

All rail travel in Japan performed in connection with emergency or morale leave, under provisions of War Dept Cir 172, 1 July 47, and General Hdqs Far East Command Cir 50, 8 May 47, as differentiated from ordinary leave, shall be without cost to the individual.

"Coal Power Unlimited" - Coal its production, transportation, uses and by-products with working conditions and homelife of minors.


"A Day in School" - Education technique in primary and intermediate grades. Concludes with very good example of PTA activity.

3. Supply Reminder:

2. Report:

Forecast #4 for Miscellaneous Indigenous Procurement For Occupation Forces Requirements is due in Hq 8th Army 1 July 1948. This Forecast covers 1st half of 1949. Circular 25 Hq 8th Army will be used as reference. Particular attention will be paid to par 6 section II Cir 25 which lists services and materials not to be forecasted. Example: Maintenance & Repair of Dependent houses and other real estate need not be forecasted since this is an Engineer item listed under par 5b. Effective 1 July 48 the operation and maintenance clause, in all real estate Procurement Demands will be declared inoperative. Procurement Demand JPNO 684 will be used Throughout Shikoku for US troops. for operation and maintenance of all real estate.

The policy for issuing work orders against JPNO 684 after 1 July 48 will be announced at a later date. Above forecast will be prepared and forwarded so as to reach this headquarters not later than 10 June 48. Attached to forecast will be a Certified True Copy of each JPNO type JPNZ type Procurement Demand in effect in each prefecture which requires a monthly receipt complete with a bill of particulars. JPNO 684 and JPNO 700 are excluded. In addition to the above a Certified True Copy of all JPNR type Procurement Demands & Receipts marked information copy will be prepared and forwarded so as to reach this headquarters not later than 26 May 1948. Above report will include all real estate held by MG Units such as Dependent houses, boat docks, motor pools, strips of land, buildings etc.

Separate forecast of newspapers required by letter Headquarters Eighth Army dtd 5 May 48 will be prepared so as to reach this headquarters by 1 June 48.

4. Summer Schedule:

The working hours for all Military Government Units of this command, effective 20 May 48, was posted as 0800-1700-Monday through Friday, 0800-1200 Saturday. This is further amplified as follows: All DAC personnel, in order to accomplish their 40 hour week without overtime, will have Wednesday afternoons as a holiday. Wednesday afternoons will be used to accomplish all training, TIP,

immunization, inspections, etc that are required for military personnel. Japanese employees should also be given Wednesday afternoon as a holiday, unless constructively utilized, to avoid paying overtime.

5. Medical & Dental Care:

In the future in each case where military or DAC personnel are required to leave the Island for medical or dental care a certificate from the attending Medical or dental officer will accompany the request for orders. In cases where this is not possible, orders will be cut upon request of unit adjutant, but the certificate must follow immediately. All certificates will be filed at this headquarters with the file copy of travel orders.

6. Payment of Officers:

All officers, including Air Force Officers of this region will be paid through the Kobe Base Finance Office. It is each officer's responsibility to prepare and submit the necessary vouchers and certificates. NO travel will be authorized off the Island for the purpose of obtaining pay.

7. Japanese Food:

All personnel are reminded that it is illegal and dangerous to purchase and/or eat any food of Japanese origin. Sea food and ground grown fruits and vegetables are especially dangerous and should be very thoroughly cooked if it is impossible to avoid their use. Severe and long-drawn-out illnesses difficult to treat may be incurred if these instructions are disregarded.

8. Food Service Supervision Report, RCS P-17:

Effective with the report for May 48 subject report will be prepared as follows:

1. Column: M/R Strength -- This will be the accumulative strength for the month. ie: 1st & 2d & 3d & 4th etc;
2. Headcount: The actual number of persons fed during the month.

3. Total rations drawn - Total rations drawn excluding any reserve or emergency rations which are drawn. Any emergency or reserve rations will be listed as a separate figure with proper notations.

2. Inventories:

3. Complaints:

Attention of team commanders is invited to provisions of par 5b, AR 20-5, 22 April 1948, with reference to insuring that all personnel on duty with the command have been acquainted with the procedures whereby they may seek redress for alleged grievances and that they have been given an opportunity to present, in person or in writing, to an inspector general their individual grievances not less frequently than once during each quarter of a fiscal year.

Team commanders will insure that personnel are acquainted with redress procedures (AR 600-10; AW 121, Sec II; WD Cir 74, 1946, as amended by Sec II, WD Cir 295; and FEC Cir 17, 1947) and that all potential complainants are urged to take up their complaints and grievances with their immediate commander for command consideration before presenting them to an inspector general.

To facilitate compliance with AR 20-5, an acting inspector general will endeavor to visit each team once each quarter for the purpose of offering personnel a convenient opportunity to submit complaints. Should personnel desire to submit complaints at any time other than during the visit of an acting inspector general, they may do so either by informing this headquarters of the desire to submit complaints whereupon an acting inspector general will visit the team, or by mailing their written complaints to either of the following acting inspectors general of this region:

- a. Names of ice manufacturing plants, their respective maximum manufacturing capacity and their present effective capacity in metric tons per day.
- b. Names of cold storage plants, their maximum capacity and present effective capacity in cubic feet.
- c. Names of high freezing plants, their maximum capacity and present effective capacity in metric tons per day.
- d. If the effective capacity is less than 60% of the maximum capacity give the reason why.
- e. A list of supplies, materials or equipment needed to increase production during the period June through September in order to preserve the expected catch of fish during this period. Only include items on which national action is required. Do not include items available locally or items on order and known to be arriving shortly.
- f. Teams may also comment briefly on any other matter which quick national action will help minimize fish spoilage during the summer, if they so desire.



2. Leave Requests:

Unit commanders approving leave requests from individuals will include in forwarding indorsement the following statement. "If approved the absence of this (officer) (EM) will not exceed 50% of personnel assigned.

3. Travel:

The following is quoted from BCOF letter Q606.100 (MOV) dated 23 April 1948. Amendment #1.

a. "Effective 1 May 48 use of DUTY TRAVEL PASSES in the BCOF Area will cease. Personnel travelling in military coaches attached to Japanese trains require either a Japanese 2nd Class ticket purchased from the Allied Forces Ticket Office, for non-duty travel, or a BCOF rail ticket (Form T1), issued by the RTO, plus a copy of the duty movement order for duty travel.

b. Personnel travelling in military coaches attached to Japanese trains in the American areas, other than yellow-ball coaches, require either a Japanese 2nd Class ticket for non-duty travel or a DUTY TRAVEL PASS in addition to the normal duty movement order, for duty travel.

c. Units located within the American Area will issue with the duty movement order a DUTY TRAVEL PASS endorsing the number of the pass in RED next to the TDN on the movement order.

d. Individuals issued with DUTY TRAVEL PASSES will return their passes to the issuing unit on completion of their journey; except that when proceeding from Japan they will hand them into the E.S.O. or A.T.O. for return to issuing unit.

e. Units located in American Areas will keep a register of ALL DUTY TRAVEL PASSES issued by them and will stamp the back of the passes with the unit stamp. HQ Brit Com Sub Area TOKYO will keep a reserve of DUTY TRAVEL PASSES for use by the guard bns. Additional passes can be obtained on application to this HQ (A Branch).

f. All units other than those stationed in American Areas will return ALL DUTY TRAVEL PASSES to this HQ (A Branch) immediately after 1 May 48.





It is requested that all household heads, Takamatsu only, have their electric fans ready to be picked up by Island Supply at 1000 hours on Thursday,





This further breakdown will take care of complete statistics of both the old and new screening boards. If subject report has already been completed (due 15 May 48), it will be sufficient to include this information separately and this headquarters will make the necessary changes of final reports.

In reply to another question on this report, it is desired that figures for action taken by the Central Inquiry Committee be included if they affect schools teachers, and education officials of respective prefectures. The Central Inquiry Committee screens university and higher school personnel and the chiefs (bucho) and sub-chiefs (kacho) of prefectural education sections. In some cases, this will extend to lesser officials of prefectural education sections if they carry sufficient Civil Service rank. In other words, as a general principle, the Central Inquiry Committee has jurisdiction of the screening of officials of the rank of Kotokan or higher and also screens all bucho and kacho no matter what their rank. (Their are sometimes cases of kacho who are not Kotokan).

5. Economic Section:

Reports submitted by the Japanese on the new Co-ops require in Table 2 some data on the transfer of assets from the Nogyokai. There will be no entries for the time being in these columns as a ruling has been made that transfers will be held up. The authority is given in NRS Weekly Bulletin #130, page 2, and reads as follows:

"The Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry submitted a copy of a telegram requesting prefectural governors to withhold approval of transfer of Nogyokai property under Article 2, Law 133 (1947) pending the receipt of further instructions. The telegram was approved by Natural Resources Section and dispatched 10 Apr 48".

6. Payment of Wages of Union Officials:

1. The following are extracts of the contract between the Communication Minister and the All Japan Communication Workers Union.

Article 21: A (Communication Minister) permits the union members to exclusively engaged in the union affairs. Number of them shall be decided by mutual consent. Written explanation of the Communication Labor Contract.

Explanation of Article 21: "To exclusively engage in the union affairs", means to do union's affairs on a full time basis without regard to their original work. Salaries for them are paid by the union in civilized European countries, but in consideration of poor financial conditions in Japanese labor unions, the article provides for the salaries to be paid by the government for the time being. The number of full time workers is to be fixed at the management conference composed of the Communication Office and the All Japan Communication Workers Headquarters, and they will be allocated to each local district.

2. Article 32:

This contract shall be effective for one year from the date of conclusion. However, if it is recognized that there is sudden change in general economic situation or other truly inevitable reason, the contract can be amended by mutual consent. In case neither A nor B expresses an intention to amend or abolish the contract by one month prior to the expiration of it the contract shall be effective for another year. Even if the intention to amend or abolish is expressed the contract shall be effective until the new contract is signed.

Eighth Army Labor Section, advise that this is a legal contract and action cannot be taken unless, the union has more officials than authorized in the terms of the contract.

2. Amendment:

Amendment ref par 4, line 3, DB #20 dtd 23 Apr 48 to delete the work near.

3. Economics:

a. NRS Weekly Summary #130 repeats the contention that only in the Tohoku area is it authorized to substitute sweet potato deliveries for the required delivery against rice quotas for 1947. In prefectures where there are villages under 100% of delivery against rice quotas, special efforts should be made to get full collection.

b. Eighth Army Military Government telephoned this headquarters today requesting compliance with DX 99995 dated 31 March which provides for the release custody for Reparations, all oil storage tanks listed for Reparations which are less than 10,000 gallons capacity. Kochi should originate letter of release giving code numbers and locations, other prefectures are required to submit negative reports.

c. The new OD 27 coming out provides for an Inventory by the Japanese on Critical Materials. Military government teams will require the Japanese to bring in these inventories with names, addresses and other data written in English. Figures must be in arabic numerals. This is advance notice as the reports must be in to Eighth Army MG by 8 May.

4. Civil Education:

For the benefit of CE officers who may not have a clear idea of how appeals from teacher screening board decisions work, the following explanation is given:

1. The appeal goes to the Central Inquiry Committee.
2. If the decision of the local screening board is upheld by the Central Committee, it is just sent back and the person is purged.
3. If, in the opinion of the Central Committee, there is insufficient evidence, the Committee "prepares" the report for return to the local board. This "preparation" includes submitting it to CI&E SCAP.
4. CI&E SCAP reviews the case and if there is agreement as to the findings of the Central Committee, it is sent back down to the local board asking for more evidence.
5. The local board can reverse itself or can send the case back again to the Central Committee with additional data.

This process can be repeated indefinitely and while it is going on many prospective purges can draw a percentage or all of their pay depending on the prefecture. CE officers should determine whether this practice takes place in their prefectures.

Uniforms:

1. Effective 0700, 1 May 1948, the proscribed uniform for members of this command while within the limits of Shikoku and waters adjacent thereto will be:
Cotton Khaki shirt (with insignia on the collar)
Cotton Khaki trousers
Cotton Khaki cap (either service or garrison)
Without necktie
Cotton neckties may be worn (optional after duty hours)

2. Until Eighth Army has proscribed cotton uniform for wear throughout Japan, members of this command will continue to wear the wool OD uniform when off the Island.

6. Distribution of Glass:

Eighth Army CE Section has informed this headquarters that the Mombusho has requested prefectural governors to report on the receipt and distribution of glass to schools in 1947. Military Government teams should see that these reports are made without delay and made properly. Pertinent information gleaned from these reports should then be informally reported to this headquarters.


7. Civilian Personnel Section:

Effective with the pay period 21 March-3 April salary payments for civilians working with MG outside the Tokyo-Yokohama area will be made in limited depository checks which may be cashed at any Finance Office in Japan or at the branch banks of the National City Bank of New York in Tokyo and Osaka.
