SUBJECT: Inventory of Maizuru Naval Arsenal

1. The Maizuru Naval Arsenal was divided into five (5) sections for inventory purposes and each section, representing a different type of plant (i.e. Shipyards, Naval Arsenal, Laboratory) was assigned a separate code number. Due to a misunderstanding of this break-down the machinery of this installation was improperly coded by the Finance Bureau. This mistake was not noticed during the spot-check and has only recently come to the attention of this office.

2. It is requested that the plant cover sheets and inventory sheets for Kyoto Prefecture (22), plants (24) and (29), forwarded to E&SS, SCAP on 13 November and 17 October respectively, be returned to this office for renumbering and correct segregation under proper code numbers.

1. In compliance with per 7a, OI #2, Hq I Corps, dtd 15 Feb 1946 the enclosed application is forwarded for your consideration.
2. In view of the critical shortage of oxygen for industrial uses and the limited facilities for producing it in this area, it is recommended that this application be approved.
3. The production of this oxygen would help the industrial plants in the Maizuru Area but it is planned on such a small scale (2 employees) that the removal of these facilities for reparations purpose at a later date would cause no set-back to continued operation of industry in this area.

1. The Maizuru Naval Arsenal is designated as Plant No. 24, Kyoto Prefecture, on the list of military and naval installations subject to reparations. The Maizuru Municipal Office has requested that the city be permitted to use a portion of the facilities of this arsenal for the manufacture of oxygen gas. The gas produced would be used for both municipal and private industrial purposes. The entire operation is not extensive in nature, and would involve the use of only a small amount of equipment subject to reparations.

2. Inasmuch as the project has originated with the municipal authorities and is for the benefit of the city, this headquarters recommends that favorable consideration be given the application. The project is intended only on a temporary basis, and adequate care of the equipment subject to reparations will be provided.

1. The enclosed petitions are forwarded for your consideration.
2. In view of the fact that this installation was a former Navy Yard there is no basis for removal except the reasons stated in the various petitions.
3. The town of Maizuru has been built around and for the operation of these ship yards and allied industries and the operation of these industries on a peacetime basis is the only present means of livelihood for a majority of the town's population. If the ability to convert these facilities to peacetime production or operation is removed, and the wages of some 9000 families cut-off, the economy of the entire town will be heavily effected.

1. The Maizuru Naval Yard is designated as Plant No. 45, Kyoto Prefecture, on the list of installations subject to reparations. The Iino Sangyo Kaisha, Ltd., has been authorized by the Japanese Finance Ministry to operate the portions of this yard for which approval has been received from higher headquarters. The Iino Industrial Company has been extremely aggressive in the past in its effort to increase its authorized activities, and it is believed that this company is sponsoring the present petition.

2. Removal of the Maizuru Naval Yard will undoubtedly be of serious consequence to the economy of the city of Maizuru. The Maizuru Naval Base, of which the yard was a major portion, was one of four major naval bases in Japan. The naval yard had a lengthy prewar record of operation, primarily for production of warships. During the war, the city and yard experienced considerable growth, due primarily to the activities of the Japanese Navy. The plant is properly listed as a major dockyard of military significance. No criteria has yet been announced by your headquarters as a basis for selection of yards of this nature. It is the opinion of this headquarters that the Maizuru Naval Yard definitely belongs on the reparations list. 216

SUBJECT: Permission for use of certain equipment at Maizuru Naval Base presently earmarked for OD No.5 requirements.

TO : Commanding General, Eighth Army

THRU : Channels.

1. Pursuant to instructions the above Headquarters is in process of setting up a new Headquarters establishment for Military Government in Fukui Ken consisting of Office, Quarters, and Dependent Housing facilities. Three buildings are involved and because of fire bomb damage extensive rehabilitation is required. Due to the fact that this Minor-ken contains two fire bomb destroyed cities (Fukui 90%) (Tsuruga 75%) the local Japanese Officials are hard put to supply such needed items as transformers Heat Plants, water supply pump, and stand by electric generators etc. The local scarcity of these items are known to this Headquarters as a result of post work with the officials on rehabilitation matters. Until recent reorganization this Headquarters also had jurisdiction over Maizuru Naval Base, Kyoto-Fu. It is known that considerable of the necessary items for installation of the New Headquarters plant at Fukui are at Maizuru Naval Base either under Home Ministry or local Military Government as an OD No. 5 matter.

2. It is requested that the local Japanese Government or this organization be authorized to secure use of available necessary items now at Maizuru Naval Base under OD No. 5, in order that the Military Government Headquarters installation for Fukui Ken may be completed with out delay. This Headquarters is presently housed in a temporary manner at Tsuruga-shi, not the Ken Capital. There are no other available structures suitable for repair and use in Fukui-shi, the Ken Capital. Outside of a small C.I.C. detachment this Military Government Team is the only U.S. Army unit in the Ken. There are no tactical troops stationed here. Fullest possible cooperation in this matter is needed as the task of rehabilitation for occupancy prior to coming of winter is a large one. Enclosed are some photo shots of these structures

1. The Inclosure(s) a series of photos were delivered by our courier to your message center. We have only our FILE copies remaining. These photos depicted the fire gutted interiors of the subject buildings on Procurement Demand and were included as additional information to assist you in making a decision.
2. As mentioned in basic letter the buildings, office and quarters are on an approved Procurement Demand which states the contractors are to furnish all material and equipment. The dependent Housing building request has been properly processed and here again the contractor is to furnish all material and equipment.
3. This Headquarters has no particular desire to secure any OD #5 equipment but is taking a realistic view point regarding successful and prompt completion of the approved construction of new Headquarters accommodations. Due to War destruction, transformers and wire are very scarce in Fukui-ken. This Headquarters, previously having jurisdiction over Kyoto-fu, is aware of the transformers formerly belonging to Home Ministry at Maizuru Naval Base. It is understood that even the Japanese may under certain conditions secure these transformers for their own use. Outside of a very small C.I.C. Detachment this Headquarters' quarters will constitute the only U.S. Occupation Force installation in the Ken. It will be called upon to provide transient accommodations; there are no hotels (Western Style). Supply of coal is dubious. There are excellent hydro electric plants, making electric heat feasible. This Headquarters merely wishes to assist the Japanese to help us. They have already applied to Maizuru without success, for these transformers. Personnel of this organization put the past winter in structures heated by braziers and pot stoves and an improved condition for the coming winter is desired and has been ordered to be provided by I Corps Headquarters Mil Govt Section. The present electric supply is 80 volts and is otherwise inadequate to run our 110 to 115 volt refrigerator, movie projector, etc. If arrangements can be made to approve withdrawal of necessary transformers from Maizuru by the Japanese this Headquarters will see to it that the equipment sought is reasonable. Your assistance is requested in this matter.

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2. The Center is being supervised by a Military Government Detachment from this office, consisting of two (2) Military Government officers and three (3) enlisted men. The Tactical Troops in command have also placed a detachment from the 35th Infantry, under the command of Lieutenant Stroud, to assist in supervising the repatriation work of the Center.

3. Major Robers, 25th Division Surgeon, inspected the Center on 13 March. His comments on the sanitary condition were generally favorable.

4. A branch of the Maizuru Repatriation Center has been established at Nishi Maizuru for processing all Japanese nationals returning from overseas. By the time this type of repatriates begin to arrive, the Nishi Maizuru Center will be capable of handling its daily quota with dispatch.

5. Exhibit "A" of the report submitted on 28 February contained the duties of the Japanese Naval Personnel at Maizuru claimed to be the reason for their continued presence at the base. Since that date a thorough investigation has been made and the findings show the Japanese personnel have only one function or duty, that of sweeping mines. Exhibit "C" here attached, is a schedule of mine sweeping showing completion dates as formulated and set by the Japanese Navy. Your attention is invited to the expected change in their mine sweeping plans as given in paragraph 2 of Exhibit "C".

6. In paragraph 1 c, of 28 February Report, this office reported large quantities of supplies had been turned over to the Japanese Navy Personnel in question, at Maizuru, by the Home Ministry. The following will show the amounts of clothing, fuel oils, grease and food stocks, that were returned to the Japanese Navy Personnel. Other supplies were returned to them but not in large quantities. You will note that in a great many cases, there is no unit designating the quantity given. In supplying this data, the Home Ministry failed to state whether these figures are pounds, kilograms, or what they are. You will further note that there are two (2) columns; the first headed "ships of demobilization bureau"; the second is headed "corps or government demobilization bureau". Both of these organizations are controlled and governed by the Japanese Naval Personnel at the base.

7. This office recommends:

- a. That the United States Navy set up a supervisory control of Japanese Navy operations in area in question.
- b. That the United States Navy formulate mine sweeping program, giving dates of completion.
- c. That upon completion of mine sweeping of this area, the Japanese Navy Personnel be removed from the area.

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- d. That upon disposing of the Japanese Navy Personnel, that any and all stocks of food, materials, and other supplies be returned to the Occupational Troops in command of the area for further disposition.
- e. That the proper authorities be instructed to determine whether or not the items of food, clothing, etc., returned to the Japanese Navy Personnel are out of line with reference to their function and the number of personnel present for duty.

2. Expected change of minesweeping plan.

According to the telegram dated 5 March, from the Imperial Japanese Second Demobilization Ministry, it received from the U.S. Navy the direction as follows:

- (1) The navigation course of Nishi-Karatsu, the Shimonoseki Straits and that of between the Sea of Bungo and Tamano should be swept fastest of all.
- (2) For this purpose as many minesweepers as possible should be applied fast by every branch of Mine-sweeping Section on the coast of the Japan Sea and other branches.

In compliance with the direction above mentioned, conference will be held on coming 11th March, at the S.D.M., to decide the problem of moving the minesweepers, and considerable number of those chasers and light patrols which are under the control of each Branch of Mine-sweeping Section (Maizuru, Niigata, Fushiki, Nanao, Tsuruga and Sakai) are estimated to be brought out to the direction of Kwanmon Straits and Seto Inland Sea after the middle of March. Accordingly, the present schedule of Mine-sweeping needs a fundamental amendment and the time of completion of Mine-sweeping is estimated to be postponed very much concerning the time in

question we intend to inform you as soon as a new schedule shall be made.

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
