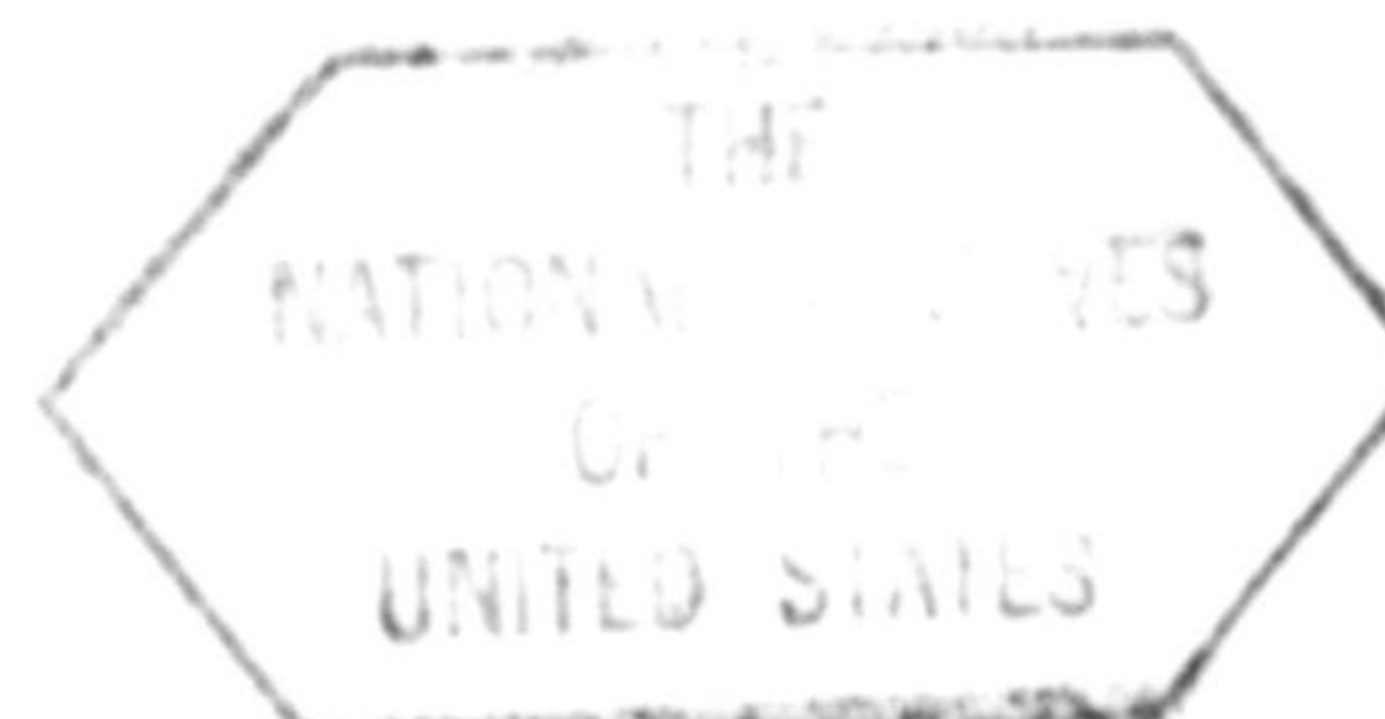

The present currency policy of the Government is inadequate to settle the matter fundamentally, because so long as the unbalanced situation between gold-yen and circulation-yen exists, the Japanese currency will be far from being stabilized. Therefore I believe that the best policy to settle the matter is to recover the gold standard system.

In April 1946 he, according to the same statement, forwarded it to the SCAP and the Chief of EASS, GHQ, without receiving any reaction. In view of these facts, it is considered to be waste of time and energy to translate this lengthy opinion on the problem of Yen value.

IV Members' voices

Some of the members of the association seem somewhat discontented about the monthly collection of fees. This may be due from their not wholly understanding the association's regulations, but no rumors have as yet been heard among the members expressing Mr. Imai as a boss's existence.

Furthermore, investigations have been made into a person name of KANEKO Ichiro, submitting the card to KCAR regarding the association, but no one of the name could be found in the address given, "No.3, Shiba Takanawa Kita-machi, Minato-ku." Therefore no details could be obtainable about the contents of the postal card.

Under the circumstances as stated above, the police investigation failing to discover any unlawful act on the part of association president, IMAI Genichiro, the present report is confined to the informations so far could be obtainable.

(II) About Block Association & Neighborhood Association:

The dissolution of this association is the business in charge of the head of a ward office and

1. As to the preceding SHIN-SAKAMOTO-CHO BLOCK ASSOCIATION and NEIBORHOOD ASSOCIATION^{they} were ordered to break up by the head of the Daito Ward Office in March, 1947.
 2. At present, in the said town, there exists an association named IRI-SAKA MINSHU KYOKAI or Iri-Saka Democratic Cooperation Association, but this association is for the cooperation in crime prevention, fire protection, public health, etc. Its object are the enhancement of democratic spirit and mutual friendship and besides it does not hold as its leaders any purgees or old block association officials. It is an organization which can be joined or quit without any restraint and is regarded to be quite different in nature from the old block association.
 3. This association was formed in January, 1949.
 4. 199 households out of 253 in Shin-Sakamoto-cho and Iriya-cho join this association.
 5. The president, SHIRAI Kohtsuchi, 47, a dentist, 320 Iriya-cho, Daito-ku.

(III) About Collection of Contribution

A. Collection of Membership Fee.

1. The said association collects the membership fee for its operation fund, but the association is granted the

permission by the head of the Ward Office under the Metropolitan Ordinance No. 16, the ordinance concerning "the collection of contribution's by money and other articles."

2. The membership fee is from 50 to 100 yen per month per household as the member pleases and there is no fact any resident in this section has been coerced into contribution.
3. The term of the permission expires on 31 March 1951.
4. The balance is entered in detail, free from suspicion.

B. Contribution for Festival

1. On 18 and 19 May 1950, the president of the association asked the members to contribute their mite towards the expenses for the festival of the Onaterusaki Shrine but never held them under contribution.
2. A donation of ¥100 was received from KAZAMA Koichiro, the informant, but the subscription-book was not presented to him.
3. As to the festival lanterns, they were fixed after the agreement between the Residents including the said Kazama and YAMAMOTO Kikujiro, a "tobi", 63 Shinsakamoto-cho who had talked over the matter with the said president and there was no fact of their being coerced.

Consequently, only 45 houses out of 110 which, stand in this section, extending from No.7 to No. 100 Shin Sakamoto-cho, hang out lanterns.

On this occasion, Kazama contributed ¥100 for the lanterns.

4. As to the use of the contribution, the association made the "Balance Sheet for the Festival of the Onaterusaki Shrine for 1950" at that time and it was opened to the public and there is no sign of unlawful act about this matter.

Subject: Asking for prohibition of compulsory collection of contribution for feast

The other day I was forced to pay ¥300 as the contribution for the feast of the Onoteruzaki Shrine by the officer of the town association. He also fixed ^{a bracket to hang} ~~the base for~~ a paper lantern at my house and afterwards I was obliged to pay ¥190 for it.

Such compulsory collection of money can be said to be a violation of the Constitution. Therefore I ask you to prohibit them from such acts.

We townsfolk in general have not been explained about the expenditure of the sum collected from every home. I presume that the sum would be spent by a certain, limited number of men of the town in having a party. We majority of the towns people have nothing to do with the festival; we have no faith in the "Onoteruzaki" Shrine.

Furthermore, the Shinsakamoto-cho Town Association is officially collecting ¥ 50 per family every month as the town association fee, however, we do not want to have such a town association.

 Subject: Complaint of KAGAYA Ichiro.

Around 10 April last, when a meeting was held by officers of TAKATANOYAMA Shop-keepers' Association, located at No. 112, Tozuka-machi 2-chome, Shinjuku-ku, for election of the president, there assembled only 6 members (KAGAYA Ichiro, SEKI Yasohachi, KIKUCHI Kansaburo, NAKAMURA Kintaro and MASUBUCHI Shuji) including the host SUZUKI among 23 of expected attendants. Worried about the Association's future, the attendance drafted a bill of daily instalment system for the purpose of facilitating tax-payment and promoting mutual friendships among the members.

Through the efforts of KAGAYA, SEKI, SUZUKI and KIKUCHI, a Daily-Instalment Society was formed gathering 49 persons as its members. The Society started its work with the objects of promotion of friendships and relief of those who suffered from disasters among members. Contents of adopted agreement are:

- 1) to limit the sum of instalment at 100 Yen per share,
- 2) each member will have a pass-book of his own name and he can draw his deposit from the trustee SANKYO SHINYO KUMIAI (The Sankyo Credit Union) at No. 5 Tozuka-machi 3-chome, Shinjuku-ku, without sanction or seal of officers, whenever he wants to,
- 3) a clerk of the said Credit Union will go round bill-collecting.

Under such circumstances, we deem that the Society had not restricted its members or had no intention of exploiting the Society to enlarge powers of any political party, and it was wholly operated by general will of members, although business procedures were carried out by the said officers.

Later the agreement with each member's signature and seal was in the custody of SUZUKI Taizo, but was missed afterwards.

Dissatisfied with SUZUKI's irresponsible attitude in doing his business not only the case stated above but to neglect to specify the date and time to start the bill-collecting, KAGAYA made the complaint of it, it is supposed.

Subject: Asking for revision of method of accepting application for metropolitan dwelling-house

Present method and system of accepting the applications for the metropolitan dwelling houses seems to me to be quite unreasonable. Because the officials in charge of the matter make it a rule to accept the applications without inspecting on the true state of the applicants' dwelling conditions.

Therefore I ask you to instruct the officials concerned in the matter to revise the said faulty method and system.

At present I, with my family, is living in a rented small room of a house, however, I have been requested to evacuate the room immediately by the owner, therefore, I have very earnestly applied for the public housing seven times. Each time I was unlucky in lot-drawing and failed in obtaining a public housing.

On the other hand, it is being said that on many occasions persons who are not in bad need of housing have been successful in lot-drawing, or some of such persons are being said that they are earning profit by utilizing the housing they have obtained. It is further being said that there might be some corruption scandals among public officials in charge of public housing.

When I went up to the Construction Bureau of Tokyo-to on 20 March this year, I overheard the following conversation between a middle-aged lady and an official in charge of housing affairs:

Lady: "I have applied for the public housing eight times, however, on each occasion I was unsuccessful in lot-drawing; as I have to evacuate my rented room by the end of this month I am in an acute need of need of a housing."

Official: "I am very sorry, Lady, however, I can not do you any favor unless you are successful in lot-drawing."

Lady: "A friend of mine, who is not in a bad need of a housing, has applied for the public housing on the ground that the location was very favorable for opening a shop, and he has succeeded in lot-drawing."

Official: "I believe he was very lucky."

Lady: " Applications for the housing are simply accepted, without screening or investization on the status of appicants, therefore, such a man who pursues profit is being given an oppotunity of obtaining a public housing."

Official: "Such preliminary screening or investigation can not be carried out under the existing system or the strength of personnel."

I. History of the Takanawa Kitamachi Shinwa Kai (Takanawa Kitamachi Friendship Association)

Shortly after the disbandment of the former street association and neighborhood association following the war's end, the Takanawa Kitamachi Friendship Association came into being, a combined organization of the Takanawa Fire Prevention Association, Takanawa Crime Prevention Association and Takanawa Hygienic Association. Later the Hygienic Association was ordered dissolved upon which on December 25, 1947, the remaining Takanawa Fire Prevention Association and the Takanawa Crime Prevention Association were combined to form the present Kitamachi Friendship Association. Ever since then IMAI Genichiro, 51, residing at No.22, Takanawa Kita-machi, Minato-ku, elected by the members has been its president.

 II. Nature of the Friendship Association

The Friendship Association was formed in December 1947 with the object mentioned in the articles of the association.

 Members : about 270

Members are admitted on signing the agreement on their free will and likewise they may freely withdraw in accordance with the provisions of Art. 7 of the association.

a) Membership fee

The highest membership fee is ¥100 per month, while the lowest being ¥20, which collection is currently being practiced.

Investigation has been made into the alleged coercive collection of the fees. Seven persons including collector MARUYAMA Rikichi, 63, (no occupation) residing at No.22, Shimo-Takanawa-cho, Minato-ku and SUDA Yaki (wine dealer) residing at No.21, Takanawa Kita-machi, have been investigated but no such fact as the alleged coercive collection has been disclosed.

b) Receipt and disbursement of fees.

Printed annual statement of accounts is distributed to each members, making clear the receipt and disbursement of the fees.

- c) In the postal card submitted to KCAR by KANEKO Ichiro, dated May 10, is found a report stating to the effect that the association is, under the pretext for collecting the fees, enlisting members to collect pass-books of the rations distribution public corporation for the distribution of rations or mobilizing them to help posting notices of house-cleaning days. On this regards, the association conducted investigation of 10 persons concerned including ISHII Yoshi-jiro, residing at No.31, Takanawa Kita-machi, disclosed the fact that the association had never resorted to such practice, neither was there a fact that such practice had been resorted to by the fees collector.

Further, an investigation has been conducted into ten persons including AIKAWA yoshio, residing at No.26, Takanawa Kita-machi, who joined the membership after the formation of the association, having moved into the present address after the formation of the association. Five of these ten persons have not as yet joined the membership, and those who have joined on their moving into the present address, unanimously declared that they were invited to join the membership by the fees collector MARUYAMA Rikichi, on the condition that if they agreed the object of the association. All of these persons had not been coercively invited into the association. "Living as neighbors in the same street, we take into consideration the kindness to be shown, directly or indirectly, by others, and such was the reason for our joining the association", they declare.

However, in some places in the street, the neighbors are by turn collecting cards for rice distribution or money for it. But there practices have nothing to do with the association. Housewives are doing it on their own accord.

As I sympathized with them who had no place to live, I lent them a room with an agreement that they would use it only for a short time.

Their way of living is much different from our's and some of the things they do are terrible to us.

The Polish gentleman is wild. Misunderstanding us, he often calls us hard names by using only Japanese he knows "Bakayaro" or "Konchikusho." He tries to look through a hole at women taking bath. He does too many horrible things. They haven't fulfilled their promise to move. They threaten us by the words "We are allied nationals," "Aren't you afraid of M.P.s," or "Remember you are defeated nationals." I can not expect when they will leave.





I, Akiko Go hereby entreat the permission of the entry of Kan Kon Go to Japan whose certificate of registration of a foreign national is enclosed.

Kan Kon Go came to Japan in 1941 for the purpose of receiving education. Being apart from his parents, since then he was obliged to neglect his duty as a son though he wanted to fulfil the duty. Meanwhile a contract was completed between Kobayashi & Co., Ltd. in Osaka and him at the end of last year. He was very glad as it was arranged that he would go to Korea as a buyer for purchasing waste hard and bast fibers.

Then he incidentally received an air mail telling him of his father's serious illness. As Go was the eldest son, he had to go immediately to Korea due to his father's longing for Go's returning to Korea, not waiting until the issue of a passport, for which the formalities of applying was very troublesome and took time. Since after he went to Korea, he took a good care of his father and endeavoured to extend the business of the company. While he was in Pusan for the purpose of inspecting the shipping of the third purchase, the war broke out, and as he would not get any way to come back Japan ever since. I admit that it was his own fault to go to Korea without waiting until the issue of a passport for him, though there was no other way to hasten the issue at that time. However, please understand that he could not go back to Seoul either because of a sudden breaking out of the war.

He was registered in Japan, besides the surety and his economic life in future have been established in this country, therefore I petition for the permission of his entry to Japan. Please be so kind as to see that the solution of the whole anxiety and trouble of his family depend on this petition. I would like to ask for your kind measures on this matter.
