THE PROBLEM

To devise the best means for providing teamwork between the State Department and the military establishment as each performs its proper role in the solution of current or long-term planning problems.

DISCUSSION

1. Nature of the need for better arrangements for exchange of information and advice.

There is an obvious need for close cooperative relationship between the State Department and the component agencies of the military establishment. Some means is necessary whereby in the early stages of studies of both current problems and long-term planning the State Department can obtain military advice which can be taken into account before the departmental position is formulated, and the military establishment can consider the political implications before crystallizing its own military views. Such means should be informal and expeditious, yet adequately comprehensive and indicative of the views of the other department.

2. Importance of each department making its proper functional contribution to projects under consideration.

In such exchange of information and advice on problems of mutual interest, State should restrict itself to the foreign relations aspects and the military establishment to the strategic and other military aspects of the matter. There should be development of a spirit in the several departments that the important goals are the objectives of the U.S. Government rather than of any particular department, and that governmental goals must be achieved by each of the executive departments performing its proper role.

The closest kind of working relationship should exist between State and Army on occupied areas matters, where the military establishment has a day-to-day operating responsibility which requires it to deal with politico-economic matters.

3. Basic relationship should be between the Secretary of State and Secretary of Defense.

The fundamental relationship between State and the military establishment should be between the Secretary of State and the Secretary of Defense, or with subordinate departments of the military establishment only as the Secretary of Defense may indicate.

4. Informal Contact in early stages is needed.

Informal exchange of information and advice in the early stages of development of projects of mutual interest to the State Department and the military establishment will tend to reduce divergence of position at higher levels.

5. Questions and answers must be clear.

When either department seeks informal information or advice from the other, it is obviously important that adequate care be given to the precision of the questions asked. It will sometimes prove profitable to use informal memoranda as a support to oral discussion in the communication of both questions and replies.

6. Exchange of Cables.

Prompt and adequate exchange of information copies of cables between State and the military establishment is essential in effecting better coordination. Present procedures appear to cause undue delays in receipt of information by the officers concerned.

7. Exchange of Liaison Officers.

A suggestion has been advanced that a substantial contribution to this general problem might be provided by establishment in the offices of the Secretary of State and Secretary of Defense, respectively, of a qualified and high level representative of the other department who might provide liaison with respect to mutual policy problems. Although such an arrangement would have definite advantages, it would be very difficult to find an individual, however competent, who would be a sufficient jack-of-all-trades to provide a substitute for direct dealings between specialists working on particular problems.

8. Special officer in State Department to foster coordination.

There has been another suggestion that there be established in the State Department, at least, an officer of the Department, operating directly under the Under Secretary's policy deputy, who would have special responsibility for coordinating and supervising cooperative activities with the military establishment and agencies such as the National Security Resources Board and the Atomic Energy Commission. It is believed such an arrangement would present the same problem as cited in para. 7 with respect to liaison officers.

9. Re-Vitalization of SANACC type of machinery.

It appears important that suitable efficient interdepartmental machinery be employed for handling mutual problems involving the State Department and the military establishment which require thorough and rather formal study preliminary to definite action. These problems may include:

- a. Problems of mutual concern which are not of such a broad policy character as to require ultimately the attention of the NSC.
- b. Problems for which studies are required as a basis for NSC action.
- c. Problems of implementation resulting from NSC action.

Present SANACC machinery is basically designed to fulfill this purpose and solution of general problem discussed in this paper would be facilitated by a review and re-vitalization of this machinery, with active encouragement by the Secretaries of State and Defense for its efficient use for handling of appropriate types of problems. Such review should include an examination of the subcommittee structure of SANACC, with elimination of obsolete or unnecessary ones.

In connection with such review, examination should also be made of the relationship between SANACC and NSC to insure that this relationship is clear and that the respective spheres of operations of the two organizations are fully understood.

10. Regular high level contact between the two departments.

Regular high level contact between the Secretary of State and Secretary of Defense would be desirable in order to provide frequent exchange of views on major political and strategic problems. Such contact might be achieved by periodic, perhaps bi-weekly, luncheon meetings to be attended by appropriate policy officials of the two departments. However, the group should be small in order to foster productive discussion.

11. Intelligence relations.

State has found unsatisfactory a lack of direct liaison with Joint Intelligence Group of JCS. In view of special nature of this matter and current studies of the intelligence organization within the government, this subject should be included in a separate study.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The Secretary of State and Secretary of Defense should actively encourage within his Department the closest practical informal relationship between the policy-making offices and officials of the two departments, and should issue instructions within their departments to this effect. The fundamental relationship involved should be between the Secretary of State and the Secretary of Defense. It should be impressed on all levels of both department the importance of each department making its proper functional contribution to the objectives of the US Government.

To facilitate the effectiveness of this informal relationship the two departments should, if practical, exchange lists of officials who normally deal with matters in the several major geographical areas. Where desirable SANACC Secretariat should be utilized as a central point or clearing house between the Departments.

2. Departments of State and Defense should review procedures for furnishing to each other information copies of communications with field agencies.

3. Existing SANAGC machinery should be reviewed, brought up to date and re-vitalized, with special attention to reduction of subcommittees to the minimum practical number of general fields of consideration. Other matters requiring interdepartmental treatment should be handled by ad hoc committees. Departmental representatives assigned to subcommittees should, so far as practicable, be individuals who would be in informal contact with respect to day-to-day problems. Secretaries of State and Defense should encourage use of this machinery.

4. Regular high level contact between the two departments for discussing major policy problems of mutual interest.

5. State and Defense joint in a study of the relationship between State and the Joint Intelligence Group of JCS.
