

with the *Cæcum*, were attached to the *Mesentery*, in such a Manner, as to be but two Inches distant from the *Pylorus*; which, with about one Third of the *Stomach*, was by this Means drawn into the *Bag*. The Beginning of the *Duodenum* just entered the *Bag*, and then returned out again; which with but a small Portion of the *Jejunum*, was the Chief that remained in the *Abdomen*.
