

SUBJECT: Legislative Program — 1967

The legislative program the Florida Sheriffs Association will sponsor during the 1967 session of the Florida Legislature is a short but vital one.

Essentially, our major program will be aimed at strengthening the Florida Sheriffs Bureau, so as to make it an even more potent law enforcement weapon in the war on crime. Specifically, the Association will support vigorously the increased appropriations so urgently needed by the Bureau to provide additional personnel, equipment and facilities for this statewide crime fighting agency. Already a major force in Florida's law enforcement picture, the Bureau urgently needs more men, money and materials to meet the evergrowing demands from police agencies throughout the length and breadth of the state.

The Bureau's mobile crime laboratories, its identification facilities, modus operandi files, special investigative assistants and technical know-how are able to handle only a fraction of the requests for these services.

Substantial increases in appropriations for each and every facet of the Bureau's operations are a must, if Florida is to win the war against crime.

Assuming these much needed additional funds and facilities will be made available, the scope of the Bureau's activities may then be expanded. On this basis the Florida Sheriffs Association will support a change in the basic law so as to empower the Governor to send Bureau agents into any county in the state to investigate crime at any time. Greater authority together with additional appropriations for the Bureau will do much to advance the cause of good law enforcement throughout Florida.

In addition to these matters affecting the Florida Sheriffs Bureau, the Florida Sheriffs Association will actively support, in the forthcoming Legislature, the adoption of minimum standards for the recruitment and training of law enforcement officers at the county, city and state level. Such a standards program has been carefully considered over the past two years by a special legislative interim committee, and this committee has made specific recommendations designed to achieve the necessary objectives.

The Florida Sheriffs Association has endorsed these proposals and feels certain that passage of such legislation will do much to upgrade all aspects of law enforcement including personnel, salaries, standards of training and education, and other advancements much needed in this field of endeavor.

Other improvements in general law enforcement will be sought, endorsed and sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, together with other interested groups. For example: The Association intends to support the Florida Medical Association in its efforts to obtain adequate medical examiner laws. It will support the efforts of the Adjutant General to amend certain archaic aspects of the firearms law dealing with abandoned and confiscated weapons; and will endorse legislation advocated by other groups of police officers to increase retirement and insurance benefits for law enforcement personnel and their survivors.

The Sheriffs Association, in cooperation with the Florida Association for Mental Health, the Florida Medical Association, county judges and other officials, has for many months been studying the problem of mental patients confined in county jails awaiting a sanity hearing or transfer to a mental hospital.

Any legislation resulting from this study and offering a practical answer to the problem will have the full support of the Sheriffs of Florida.

Finally, and perhaps most important from the viewpoint of the preservation of democratic government, the Sheriffs Association will urge the Legislature to retain the basic county officials, specifically including the Sheriff, as constitutional officers in whatever new document may be enacted in connection with the proposed revision of Florida's Constitution.

The reasons for the misguided efforts on the part of a limited few who seek to destroy county and local government by eliminating constitutional and elective offices from the organic law are difficult to comprehend. Local self-government, uniformly applied by officials selected from and by the citizens of the local community, is the bulwark of democracy as we know it.

The Florida Sheriffs Association will vigorously oppose any and every effort to destroy local self-government and urges the members of the Legislature to retain the Sheriff as the constitutional chief law enforcement officer in each county of Florida.

President's Message

GROWING

A new and growing concern with crime and law enforcement is evident throughout Florida and the country. This citizen concern is long overdue. We in law enforcement have been well aware that the day when a badge and gun were sufficient to provide peace and security long ago passed and that modern techniques and new procedures are essential to combat the inroads of general lawlessness and organized crime. In scarcely more than two decades, the Sheriffs of Florida have passed from the horse and buggy era through the modernized and mechanized stage to the period of jet-speed and computerized enforcement which is now upon us.

This is the age of the Big "Cs" in law enforcement—Coordination, Communications and Computers. To these may also be added the "C's" of citizen concern and compensation. As President of the Florida Sheriffs Association for the year 1967, it is my intention to work actively and constantly to improve coordination, instill concern, increase compensation through better law enforcement salaries, extend communications and install computerization.

One of the principal tools to aid in accomplishing these objectives is the Florida Sheriffs Bureau. A

CITIZEN CONCERN IS LONG OVERDUE

state-wide communications system linking this vital center of law enforcement, technical information and special assistance with all Sheriffs and police officers throughout the State, computer controlled, would be the greatest single weapon we could forge in our war against crime. The Bureau has fantastic, but little-known, facilities in the way of laboratories, records systems, identification procedures, and other crime-fighting data which could be made instantly available to all law enforcement officers with modern communications and computer facilities.

It shall also be my aim to achieve better cooperation and coordination of existing law enforcement agencies. There is too much duplication in the efforts of the many agencies and I am confident that greater total results could be achieved by clearly defining the areas of authority of the various state and county agencies so that each might concentrate its greatest power in the particular field for which it was created. In this effort, I hope to enlist the support of all law enforcement officers and citizens.

Upgrading of law enforcement also can be aided through the adoption of minimum standards for recruitment and training, which will be considered by the next Legislature. The Sheriffs Association, through its law enforcement academy, and several police departments and other training agencies throughout the State have long been active in this field, and the greater utilization of these existing training facilities will do much to provide better qualified and better paid law enforcement officers.

The never-ending war on crime costs money. Organized crime never suffers the problem of under financing; and if we are to wage war on equal terms, our side must likewise be adequately funded. To this end I ask the Legislature and each Board of County Commissioners to seek to do their very best in providing adequate funds for all State and county law enforcement agencies.

This will be a year of crises. Crime is on the increase, not only in Florida, but in the nation and the world. Law enforcement is one of the oldest functions of government and its fundamental objective of protecting life and property and preserving peace must be carried out in a modern world with modern techniques. As President of the Florida Sheriffs Association, I will endeavor to lead the way during 1967.

FLORIDA NEEDS A STATE-WIDE

There is such a thing as being too modest—and the Florida Sheriffs Bureau is apparently guilty.

The Bureau has gone about its job in a quiet, efficient way for almost 12 years and many Floridians—from high ranking officials to the man on the street—do not know what it does or what it is capable of doing.

Criminals know—the hundreds behind bars who have been convicted of serious crimes with the Bureau's assistance or the hundreds who know their days are numbered because of the Bureau's crimesolving potential.

☆ ☆ ☆

BUT, THE PEOPLE WHO REALLY COUNT—public officials, the press, and concerned law-abiding citizens—apparently don't.

If a group of citizens studying crime conditions in Florida had really known what the Bureau does, would they have discussed—as they did recently—the need for a central clearing house of information about crime and criminals?

Certainly not, because the Sheriffs Bureau is already performing this function with its "miles of files" containing fingerprints, photographs and records of criminals; its data on wanted persons, missing persons and stolen property; its intelligence unit that compiles volumes of confidential informa-

tion about big time criminals and racket syndicates; and its highly-praised crime bulletin that feeds a steady flow of information about crimes and criminals to city, county and state police agencies.

* * *

IF A HIGH RANKING STATE OFFICIAL had known about the outstanding crime laboratory operated by the Sheriffs Bureau, would he have come back from a tour of the FBI crime laboratory in Washington saying that "this is what we need in Florida"?

Certainly not. In fact after he was given a tour of the Sheriffs Bureau crime lab he said "I am amazed. I had to go to Washington to discover what we have right here in our own back yard."

If a prominent public figure had known about the Sheriffs Bureau's training activities (fully authorized by law and limited only by lack of funds), would he have advocated establishing a police academy to serve all levels of law enforcement state-wide?

☆ ☆ ☆

IT IS UNLIKELY THAT HE WOULD HAVE, because this would be a duplication of the training academy the Sheriffs Bureau is already operating (see details about Florida Law Enforcement Academy elsewhere in this issue).

Admittedly, the present academy is not geared to meet the great need for training in this state, but it has the potential to do this if properly supported and encouraged rather than ignored or overlooked.

If an otherwise knowledgeable newspaperman had been fully aware of what the Sheriffs Bureau does to help all levels of law enforcement in the state, would he have described the Bureau as "handcuffed"—as too limited in its scope of activity?

Possibly not.

He was looking primarily at the fact that the Bureau cannot send its investigators into a county to investigate crimes except at the request of the local Sheriff.

ON PAPER THIS APPEARS TO BE a serious handicap to the Bureau. In actual practice it is about

as confining as a showgirl's costume in a Miami Beach night club.

In the first place, the Bureau only has six investigators available to answer requests for assistance from Sheriffs throughout the State. It cannot handle all the requests it receives now, and to place its investigators at the beck and call of other enforcement agencies would accomplish nothing.

Secondly, although the present legal restriction is more imagined than real, Florida's Sheriffs are going to ask the legislature to remove it and amend the law so that the Governor can send the Bureau into any county to investigate crimes.



THIRDLY, THE WORK DONE by trained Sheriffs Bureau investigators is only a small part of the total crime fighting effort put forth by the Bureau, and therefore, the great bulk of the Bureau's services—its fine crime laboratory, its vital crime files, its communications systems, and its trained technicians—are available to all levels of law enforcement from the one-man police department to the big state agency.

And finally, although Bureau investigators can respond only to a request from a Sheriff under the present law, they invariably find themselves working closely with all levels of law enforcement. In big cases involving city, county and state investigators, they frequently help to coordinate the team effort.



IN TRAINING, TOO, the Sheriffs Bureau serves all levels of law enforcement. A look at the Florida Law Enforcement Academy records shows that 259 city police officers, 513 deputy sheriffs, 131 officers from state agencies, four federal agents and 13 officers from other agencies were enrolled between the opening of the Academy, in February, 1964 and December, 1966.

In view of all this, why do well-intentioned groups and individuals from time to time propose a new state-wide crime fighting agency, a state crime laboratory, a central clearing house for crime information or an academy to provide police training statewide to all levels of law enforcement, when all of these proposals would merely duplicate services already provided by the Florida Sheriffs Bureau?

The answer is obvious.



THE BUREAU IS A VICTIM of its own modesty—of its unwritten but nevertheless well-founded policy of concentrating on the job at hand and letting somebody else worry about who gets the headlines.

Such a policy has its merits. It means that the Bureau avoids the competition and petty jealousies that sometimes develop between law enforcement agencies. It means the Bureau does not need a high-priced publicity man (or for that matter a low-priced one) on its payroll. It means that the Bureau allows nothing in its budget for a slick, thick annual report to distribute to news media.

Unfortunately, it also means that the Bureau has almost become "the agency nobody knows."

☆ ☆ ☆

HOODLUMS KNOW ALL ABOUT the Bureau. Sheriffs, deputies, city police officers and state enforcement agents who keep the Bureau's trained technicians "snowed under" with requests for assistance know all about it too.

But other people who should know the score—newsmen, legislators, conscientious citizens, public officials—do not know all about the Bureau.

They can't be blamed—in their serious efforts to find a solution to Florida's crime problem—for saying that Florida **NEEDS** a state-wide crime fighting agency.


Hopefully, they will discover that Florida HAS a statewide crime fighting agency—one that for almost 12 years has been doing a "Superman" job on a "Mickey Mouse" budget.

And then, hopefully, they will make certain that the Sheriffs Bureau gets the money and the manpower and the public support it needs to realize its full potential.


When this happens, modesty will again become a virtue.

Test Tubes Can't Solve This One

Court Appearances Of Crime Laboratory Staff Members

TALLAHASSEE — There's a problem down at the Florida Sheriffs Bureau crime laboratory that can't be solved with test tubes, microscopes or with the mysterious control knobs and inscrutable dials of sophisticated electronic gadgets.

It stems from the fact that the lab is constantly overloaded with every conceivable type of criminal evidence from murder weapons to human hairs and blood stains.

And who's to blame?

Well, first there are the lab technicians themselves who have been working overtime and doing such a good job of turning raw evidence into court convictions that city, county and state enforcement agencies are sending them more and more business.



AND DON'T OVERLOOK the special agents in the Bureau's training and research division who have been training hundreds of police officers in the latest techniques of collecting and submitting evidence. As these officers increase their skills — and as they learn more about what the crime lab can do to help them — the flow of evidence to the crime lab increases.

Blame the courts too. Their rulings have made confessions almost worthless, and officers have to depend more and more on scientifically sound physical evidence to get convictions.

COURTS FIGURE IN THE PROBLEM in another way too. The work that trained technicians and scientists do in the lab is worth very little unless the same men can go into court and testify as expert witnesses about their findings.

They can't simply file a written report with the court. They have to take the witness stand to give attorneys an opportunity to examine and cross-examine them.

This means they spend a large portion of their time on the witness stand, traveling to courts all over Florida and waiting in courtrooms for their turn to testify.

LOW SALARIES AND A SHORTAGE of qualified personnel help to aggravate the situation. The pay levels in the Sheriffs Bureau budget won't attract men in other agencies; and higher salaries elsewhere have lured good men away.

Faced with this dilemma, the Bureau has been forced to train its own qualified people. This, however, cuts down the efficiency of the trained people and results in a loss of valuable time. Sometimes when a man becomes well trained he leaves the Bureau for better pay elsewhere.

FACTS ABOUT THE



CREATED — October 1, 1955, by the 1955 Florida Legislature to function as a state agency.

ADMINISTERED BY — A seven-man board composed of the Governor, Attorney General and five Sheriffs. A Director carries out the policies and directives of this board.

LOCATION — Bryant Building, Tallahassee (Gadsden Street and Apalachee Parkway)

PURPOSE — To help city, county and state police agencies by giving technical assistance, training police officers, serving as a clearing house for vital information about crimes and criminals, and coordinating law enforcement at all levels.

To accomplish this purpose the Bureau has:


A CRIME LABORATORY — where evidence is scientifically analyzed and evaluated to solve crimes and convict criminals.

TRAINED INVESTIGATORS — who help local authorities to investigate and solve crimes of all kinds in all sections of the state.



Bureau is located in Bryant Building

- MILES OF FILES containing over one-million items such as records, photographs and finger-prints of lawbreakers; detailed reports on crime investigations; and data on wanted persons, missing persons and stolen property.
- A CRIME BULLETIN that feeds information about wanted persons, missing persons and stolen property to city, county and state police agencies throughout Florida and elsewhere.
- A COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM that keeps the Bureau in touch by teletype, radio and telephone with police agencies inside and outside Florida.
- POLYGRAPH (LIE DETECTOR) EXAMINERS—who are available in all sections of the state to scientifically test the veracity of suspects and witnesses—clearing innocent persons as often as they help to convict guilty ones.
- DOCUMENT EXAMINERS sometimes incorrectly referred to as "handwriting experts" who use scientific methods to identify and decipher documents used as evidence in crime cases.
- FINGERPRINT TECHNICIANS who are trained to quickly classify and identify crime-solving fingerprints.
- A MOBILE CRIME UNIT in a large van-type truck which is loaded with equipment to process evidence at a crime scene scientifically.
- A PHOTO LABORATORY equipped to produce vital evidence in black and white or color, movies or still photos—ranging from an aerial photo of a crime scene to a photo enlargement of a microscopic bit of evidence.
- AN INTELLIGENCE SECTION that compiles data on "big time" criminals and crime syndicates and makes information available to other agencies under strict security regulations.
- A FIREARMS IDENTIFICATION SECTION where ballistics experts compare and identify bullets, shell casings and firearms.



"Instant Information" Bureau's Goal

"Instant information" flashed from crime files in Tallahassee to any part of the state in split seconds is one of the goals the Florida Sheriffs Bureau is aiming at for the 1967-69 biennium.

A new high-speed teletype network and a computer are the tools that will be used to accomplish this goal.

The teletype network will link the Bureau with law enforcement agencies all over the nation and throughout the state, including every Sheriff's Office; and the computer will be used as a switching device to keep the information flowing at a speed far above that maintained by the present overloaded

"tear-tape" switching center.



IN ADDITION TO OPERATING as an automatic switching center, the computer will also have data storage capacities which will be used jointly by the Sheriffs Bureau and the Department of Public Safety.

Initially the Bureau plans to put its wanted criminals, stolen property files and pawned property files into the computer, and to make the information available to all Florida enforcement agencies on a 24-hour basis.

The Department of Public Safety is expected to store driver's license information in the computer.

Other vital crime data will be added as fast as possible to phase out antiquated manual card index files and replace them with a faster-than-thought computerized filing system.

The improved high-speed communications system will put a teletype terminal in each Florida Highway Patrol Station and in each Sheriff's Office. All police departments will be phased in later to provide a complete state-wide network.



ALL OF THE AGENCIES on the network will feed information by wire to the computer center and they will also be able to interrogate the computer directly.

This will create a greater stockpile of crime data than is now possible; and direct contact from agency to computer will make information available almost instantaneously.

An officer on patrol following a suspicious looking car will be able to determine, by radioing his headquarters and having a message flashed by wire to the computer, whether the car is stolen before he ever stops it and questions the occupants.


THIS KIND OF "INSTANT INFORMATION" will skyrocket the recovery of stolen property, hike the number of arrests for thievery and have a marked effect on the general crime rate.

"This," said Sheriffs Bureau Director Ed Yarbrough, "will be the beginning of a computerized communications network that will ultimately connect all law enforcement agencies from the national level to state, county and metropolitan police departments.

"It will be a great step forward for law enforce-

ment in Florida."

TECHNICAL RECORDS SECTION Fingerprints On File



TOTAL CASES INVESTIGATED



FOR EXAMPLE, the 1965 legislature authorized the Bureau to create two new lab analyst positions, but a nation-wide search failed to produce any qualified people willing to accept the prescribed salary.

Finally the Bureau hired two people with lesser qualifications and it took from nine to 11 months to train them.

A nation-wide study shows that Bureau salaries for laboratory personnel are low in comparison with other states and cannot compete with other crime labs. ESSENTIALLY THE PROBLEM is one of money and manpower—money to pay salaries that will attract qualified lab personnel, and manpower to handle the growing work load of vital crime evidence.

The problem can be solved, and it must be. Otherwise, the crime lab will become ineffective and Florida's war on crime will lose one of its most important weapons—a weapon that never makes headlines but is equally respected by police officers on the "firing line" and prisoners in the state prison "chow line."





So let's take a backward look at the highlights of a decade in which the Ranch progressed from a dream and a "nest egg" of \$5,000 to a million-dollar institution with a growing family of 100 fine boys.

FACTS

About the Ranch

LOCATION—11 miles north of Live Oak, Florida, on the Suwannee River and about midway between Jacksonville and Tallahassee.

FOUNDED—in 1957 by the Florida Sheriffs Association.

BEGAN OPERATION—in February, 1959, when the first boys were admitted.

FINANCING—supported entirely by public donations. (They are deductible for income tax purposes.)

SIZE-737 acres of rolling farm-

ENROLLMENT-100 boys. Eventual goal: 400 boys.

PURPOSE — to provide a good home and a secure future for Florida's needy and worthy boys—to give them love, security, discipline and all of the essential advantages that are every American boy's birthright. The Ranch is not a "reform school" or a "correctional institution." Boys enrolled at the Ranch are there simply because they need a good home—because they are the innocent victims of neglect or lack of opportunity.

AGE LIMITS—To be admitted a boy must be between the

AGE LIMITS—To be admitted a boy must be between the ages of 8 and 16. Once he is admitted, the Ranch becomes his home and he remains there through high school and college unless his home situation improves or another good

home develops.

ELIGIBILITY — Each boy who meets the mental and physical requirements must also be approved by the Sheriff and the Juvenile Court Judge of the county in which he resides.

SOURCE OF BOYS—Applicants are referred to Sheriffs by in-

After years of discussion, this was the year of decision. A projects committee of the Florida Sheriffs Association met at Sheriff Willis McCall's hunting camp, near Eustis, June 29, and recommended that \$5,000 be placed in a special trust fund to start a Boys Ranch as a permanent home for worthy and needy boys. On July 23 the Board of Directors of the Sheriffs Association, meeting at Kissimmee, approved the recommendation and a state-wide search was begun for a suitable building site. The Ranch became a reality on October 2, when the Sheriffs Association met in St. Petersburg to: (1) pass a trust agreement placing the ranch project in the hands of a board of trustees composed of Sheriffs and civilians, with the latter in the majority; (2) approve a 722-acre site on the Suwannee River, near Live Oak; and (3) appoint Hillsborough County Sheriff Ed Blackburn, Jr., as the first Executive Director. On this same date Sheriff John Spottswood, then President of the Sheriffs Association, became the first chairman of the Boys Ranch Board of Trustees.



REMEMBER WHEN . . . the Ranch was just an idea "on paper" and we selected a scenic spot in Tallahassee for our first fund raising poster pictures? A gate was painted on the photograph; and Robert Stauffer, son of the Sheriffs Association's Field Secretary, posed as the "homeless boy." The Sheriff selected for the picture was George Watts, of Chipley, who is now a member of the Attorney General's staff.



Spottswood, then Sheriff of Monroe County, was the first Chairman of the Boys Ranch Board of Trustees. McMullen became Treasurer in the early days of the Ranch and is still serving in that capacity.

Mike later became a star athlete at Suwannee High School, in Live Oak, where he was the 1965 captain of the football team and received a "Lineman of the Year" trophy. He was graduated from high school in June, 1966, and enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps. Early in 1967 he left Camp Pendleton, California, en route to Viet Nam, following in the footsteps of his brother, Wally Edwards, who is pictured elsewhere in this issue.







. . . And Where it Will Stop Nobody Knows

The Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch grows and grows and where it will stop nobody knows because the waiting list of needy and worthy boys who have applied for admission is growing too. Right now our facilities are filled to capacity with a record enrollment of 100 boys and we are turning away youngsters who desperately need a good home and a secure future. Obviously the Ranch must continue to ex-

pand as fast as funds become available to build and operate additional facilities—and who knows where that will eventually lead? The map below doesn't give the answer. It merely provides a master plan for the second decade of progress. After these facilities have been completed, it is very likely that Ranch officials will start developing sites in other areas of the state—and so she grows.



It May Be Easier Than You Realize

Many of our supporters indicate they would like to make a large contribution to the Boys Ranch but they just can't afford it.

If this is your problem, here is a suggestion:

Go see your favorite insurance agent and tell him you want to take out a life insurance policy with the Boys Ranch as the irrevocable beneficiary. Then you pay just a few dollars a month on the insurance premium, and the Boys Ranch holds the policy as a guarantee of your "deferred gift."

For example, a loyal supporter in his

late forties took out a life insurance policy that will give the Boys Ranch \$4,000 when he dies, and it is costing him less than \$18 a month.

Furthermore, since the Ranch is the irrevocable beneficiary (this means the beneficiary can't be changed), his premium payments are deductible for income tax purposes - just the same as any donation to the Ranch.

Others have done the same thing and the Ranch now holds insurance policies with a total value of over \$50,000.

More Accessible

The Boys Ranch, once remote, will soon be on "the beaten path." Interstate Route 10, Jacksonville to Pensacola Expressway, is currently being extended from Lake City westward to a point a few miles from the Ranch. Interstate 75, Great Lakes to Miami artery is also

We Must Keep it "Going and Growing"

Family life is breaking down. More and more parents are running away from the responsibility of raising their children.

Other parents — through serious illness, death and similar tragedies — are unable to properly care for their offspring.

Each year our society produces a new crop of troubled children who, through no fault of their own, have become homeless, needy or neglected.

Therefore, the destiny of the Boys Ranch is crystal clear. It must continue to expand as fast as voluntary contributions from generous supporters will permit.

This means more operating funds to pay for essentials like food, clothing and shelter.

This also means additional facilities such as:

- Four Residence Cottages at \$60,000 each (\$240,000)
- An Intensive Remedial Education Unit (\$30,000)
- A Gymnasium, Recreational Center and Music Room (\$200,000)
- An Arts and Crafts Building (\$65,000)
- Five Staff Houses (\$60,000)
- Sewage, Drainage and Water System (\$118,000)

These are what we call our current needs — the facilities that will have to be built to bring the present Boys Ranch to its full capacity.

And, after that what?

Ranch officials have already asked this question and their answer is that additional Boys Ranches will have to be built in other sections of the state.

They are also studying the possibility of small group homes to accommodate 8 to 12 boys with special needs and potentialities. These homes would be spotted near educational and medical centers.

All this is over the horizon, but it is obvious that there is only one future course for the Boys Ranch if it is to fulfill its mission as a nationally famous symbol of human compassion — we must keep it "going and growing."

FIRE STATION UNDER CONSTRUCTION

A \$25,000 fire station and repair shop is under construction at the Boys Ranch and is expected to be in use before the end of this year.

The Florida State Firemen's Association is raising funds to finance the project and was nearing the \$25,000 goal when construction started on March 1.

The attractive brick building will provide space for two fire engines, a two-stall mechanic's shop and an apartment for the staff member who will fill the dual role of fire chief and chief mechanic.

Claude R. Kirk, Jr. was elected Governor of the State of Florida at the age of 40 on November 8, 1966, and became the State's first Republican chief executive in 94 years. His rise to the highest office in state government followed a successful career in the fields of insurance and investment banking.

Governor Kirk was born January 7, 1926, in San Bernardino, California, the first child of Claude R. Kirk, Sr., a native of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and Mrs. Kirk, a native of Athens, Arkansas. The family also includes a daughter, Mrs. Richard Morton, now 30, a resident of Houston, Texas.

The family moved from California to Oak Park, Illinois, in 1936 and the senior Kirk entered the manufacturing business producing weighing scales.

Governor Kirk attended grammar schools in the Chicago suburban communities of Oak Park and River Forest.

The family moved to Montgomery, Alabama, when World War II caused the curtailment of non-essential manufacturing concerns.

Governor Kirk entered the U. S. Marine Corps at the completion of his high school education at Lanier High, in Montgomery, in 1943. He was accepted for officer training and met rigid academic standards at Emory and Duke Universities, receiving his commission as a second lieutenant at the age of 19.

His three-year tour of duty with the Marines ended in 1946 without overseas duty.

The Kirk family had remained in Montgomery where Mrs. Kirk was serving as an assistant to the clerk of the Alabama House of Representatives. The senior Mr. Kirk had operated an auto parts business.

Claude, Jr. entered the University of Alabama in 1947 and received his law degree in 1949. He was married to a schoolmate, Miss Sarah Stokes, of Montgomery.

During his college career he taught jiu-jitsu to the Alabama State Patrol, and sold insurance.

Following graduation from Law School, Governor Kirk went to Birmingham, Alabama, where he continued selling insurance.

He was recalled to service during the Korean Conflict and served both as an infantry first lieutenant and as a naval fire control spotter. He completed this tour of service in 1952 and returned as holder of the Air Medal.

At the time he returned to civilian life in 1952—with a wife, 2 children, no car and just \$408 in assets

—he joined forces with two other men to form American Heritage Life Insurance Company with headquarters in Jacksonville, Florida.

Governor Kirk's rise in the business world started with the formation of this company. It began with a stock subscription of \$500,000 and just 10 years later had grown to a successful venture with business in force totaling \$847,082,495.

Governor Kirk directed the activities of American Heritage until he moved to a partnership in Hayden, Stone, Inc., Wall Street investment bankers.

His first venture in politics came in 1960 when he spearheaded the Florida campaign for presidential candidate Richard M. Nixon. He changed his registration from Democrat to Republican as a result of that campaign and made his first bid for public office as a candidate for U. S. Senator against Spessard Holland in 1964.

Following the Senatorial campaign, Governor Kirk formed his own firm, Kirk Investment Company, and continued actively in this endeavor until he made his successful bid for the Governorship in 1966.

Governor Kirk is a Lay Reader in the Episcopal Church and for 3 years while in Jacksonville served missions at New Berlin and Fort George which he helped to found. During this service he would leave Jacksonville on Sunday and conduct prayer service at New Berlin at 9:00 a.m. and then move on to Fort George to hold another prayer service. As Lay Reader, he served the missions until a pastor was assigned.

Governor Kirk was divorced from his first wife in 1966. Four children were born to this marriage. They are: Sarah Stokes Kirk, 18, a Freshman at Florida State University; Katherine Gilmer Kirk, 17, a high school senior; and twin sons, Frank and Will, 12, who reside with their mother in New York.

A few weeks after he was inaugurated, Governor Kirk announced his engagement to Erika Mattfeld, German-born beauty from Brazil, and they were married in West Palm Beach, February 18, 1967. He has a stepdaughter, Adriana Mattfeld Dolabella, 5, who is his wife's daughter by a former marriage.

CABINET

The Executive Branch of Florida's government administers and enforces laws. Florida's constitution invests the "supreme executive power" of the state in the Governor and provides for a six-man cabinet to assist him. Each cabinet member is elected state-wide and given specific duties by the constitution. Many of the major administrative functions of the State government are exercised through "ex officio" boards on which the Governor and cabinet members serve by virtue of their office. The Governor and all six cabinet members serve on boards such as the Budget Commission, Board of Commissioners of State Institutions and Department of Public Safety. Other "ex officio" boards have as few as three members.





FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

This commission is composed of 3 commissioners elected state-wide. It regulates railroads, common carriers, canal companies, telegraph companies, telephone companies, motor vehicle common carriers and privately owned electric, gas, water and sewer companies. Created in 1887 as The Florida Railroad Commission, it became The Florida Railroad and Public Utilities Commission in 1947 and the name was changed to Florida Public Utilities Commission in 1963. The present title was established by the 1965 Legislature. Each commissioner is elected for a four-year term.

Farris Bryant in 1964, following the death of Commissioner Wilbur King, and was elected to a full four year term in the 1966 Democratic primary. 







HON. SPESSARD L. HOL-LAND, (D) U. S. Senator, was born in Bartow, Florida, on July 10, 1892. He attended elementary and secondary schools in Bartow, was graduated with a Ph.B. (magna cum laude) from Emory College and received his law degree at the University of Florida. He also received an honorary LL.D. from Rollins College, University of Miami, Florida Southern College, Emory University and Florida State University of Florida and H.H.D. from the University of Tampa. He served as first elected president of the University of Florid



dent of the University of Florida student body and qualified for a Rhodes Scholarship. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Delta Phi and Alpha Tau Omega fraternities. He taught in the public schools of Warrenton, Georgia, practiced law in Bartow and served as Polk County Prosecuting Attorney, County Judge, member of the Florida State Senate and Governor of Florida from 1941-1945. He was elected to the United States Senate in 1946, reelected in 1952, 1958 and 1964. He is a member of many important committees in Congress and is serving as a member of the Senate Democratic Steering Committee. He served with Coast Artillery Corps in World War I and as an aerial observer in the Army Air Corps in France and was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross. He is a past president of the University of Florida Alumni Association and a trustee of Emory University, Florida Presbyterian College and Florida Southern College. He is a member of VFW, American Legion, Sons of the American Revolution, Kiwanis, Masons, Shrine, Elks and Saints and Sinners. He is a member of the Methodist Church. HON. GEORGE A. SMATHERS, (D) U.S. Senator, was born in Atlantic City, N. J., November 14, 1913, and came to Florida in 1919. 
