contribution of funds, the Secretary-General will consult the permanent delegation of the donor government regarding the use of its contribution by the United Nations or Specialized Agencies to purchase supplies and transport or most other directly related costs (either in that government's country or in other countries). The Secretary-General will also consult with the Unified Command on the use to be made of these funds. The Secretary-General will submit financial accounts to the permanent representative ~~of the contributing governments~~ of the contributing governments showing how the funds contributed by their governments have been used.

11. Where no specific offer of assistance has been made, but a member government has indicated, through the Secretary-General, its readiness to enter into direct consultations in order to define the nature of its assistance, the Secretary-General will initiate these consultations and will inform the Unified Command of the results.
12. Where a member government transmits to the Secretary-General an offer from a private firm, the Secretary-General will suggest to the member government that it enter into direct negotiations with the private firm concerned for the purpose of resubmitting it through the government. Whenever practicable, this procedure will be used with regard to offers from non-governmental organizations, except in those cases where the non-governmental organizations are sufficiently well organized to handle the contributions of their national members on an international scale (e.g., League of Red Cross Societies).
13. Representatives of non-governmental organizations or Specialized Agencies who may be attached to the United Nations Command, Tokyo, for the purpose of providing their agencies with on-the-spot reports regarding the utilization

Any information they may be able to provide will be used by the organizations concerned, by the Secretary-General, and by the Unified Command as background material only.

- 11. The Unified Command will provide the Secretary-General with periodic over-all reports on the relief needs of the Korean people and on the implementation of the Korean relief program. The data in these reports may be used by the Secretary-General in connection with his reports to the Economic and Social Council which are required under the Council's resolution on Korean relief.

1. New ECA policy on procurement and functions is outlined in letter just received by Administrator from the President as follows verbatim:

"As a result of the recent action of the Security Council of the United Nations in placing over-all responsibility and authority for civilian reliefs and support in Korea, as well as for the conduct of military operations, in the Unified Command, it is now timely to clarify the functions of your administration in relation to the Republic of Korea.

"In accordance with our established national policy of supporting actions of the United Nations, substantial armed forces and military resources of the United States have been made available to the Commander-in-Chief, United Nations Command, for his use in discharging his military responsibilities. Your administration has been providing civilian supplies and technical aid on an emergency basis to assist in preventing the development of economic conditions in the area that would prejudice the success of the military operations now in progress.

"It is my earnest desire that continuity be maintained in the flow of economic aid to the Republic of Korea. Such aid as can be provided by your administration within the limits of

This aid should be coordinated with the contributions of other countries into the Civilian Supply and Relief Program which is being implemented under the authority and responsibility of the Unified Command. I believe that your administration is well equipped by experience to perform certain important and specialized functions within this over-all program.

"Pending the adoption of a United Nations program for relief and rehabilitation in Korea, the Economic Cooperation Administration, within available funds, shall be responsible for the following types of assistance to the Republic of Korea, under appropriate arrangements with the Government of the Republic of Korea and the United Nations Command:

A. The provision of equipment, supplies, and advisory aid required to maximize the output of Korean agricultural and fisheries resources, and of essential civilian industrial production facilities which are not directly utilized by the United Nations Command for predominantly military purposes.

B. Fiscal advisory assistance to combat the threat of inflation and to help the Republic of Korea to develop appropriate controls in these fields.

C. The continued development and execution of programs for the training of personnel in the administration and operation of economic agencies and enterprises.

D. The development of requirements and suggested plans for the post-war rehabilitation of public utilities, mines, harbors, and other facilities important to the economy of the Republic of Korea. Such suggested plans should be prepared for submission to whatever agency or agencies may be established to deal with post-war rehabilitation and reconstruction problems.

E. The development and analysis of information regarding economic problems in the Republic of Korea which will contribute to timely action in respect to these problems by the appropriate agencies.

F. Upon the request of the United Nations Command, provide assistance in arranging with local authorities in Korea for the proper distribution and issue of supplies in order to prevent conditions of disease and unrest and render advisory assistance in the procurement of supplies for such purposes.

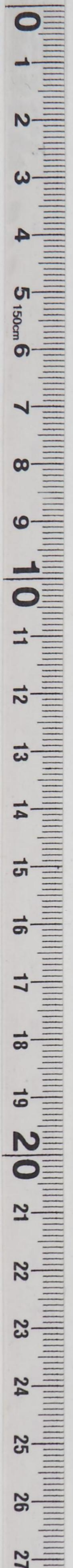

Clothing, shelter, medical supplies, and similar items; also, as a general rule, of responsibility for the provision of other categories of needed supplies which serve common military and civilian purposes. "For the orderly performance of the foregoing functions, it will be necessary for you to review and adjust where necessary the assignments, at appropriate levels, of qualified staff of your administration to agencies of the Republic of Korea and units of the United Nations command in Korea and Japan.

"I am sending copies of this letter to the Secretary of State and the Secretary of Defense for their information and guidance in taking the necessary actions to put this arrangement into effect."

2. ECA and D/A have informally approved following interpretation of letter:

ECA will honor contracts signed, and sub authorizations and PA's approved, prior to 15 Sept. All commitments made thereafter should conform to directions contained in President's letter. In general, ECA may not procure goods and supplies for direct civilian relief, EG, food, clothing, shelter, and medical supplies, and, as stated in the President's letter, the Department of Defense will make suitable arrangements to finance requirements for civilian relief. However, supplies and equipment for production of relief supplies and to repair and rebuild facilities for the production of relief supplies are suitable ECA procurement. ECA will be responsible also for provision of equipment and supplies to maximize agricultural, fisheries, and industrial production. During hostilities period, procurement of materials, supplies, and equipment for public utilities, transport and industrial, transport and industrial facilities must be limited to goods for facilities not directly controlled or utilized by CINC UNC for predominantly military purposes. Thus, such commodities as rolling stock, materials for repair of docks, warehouses, railroad stations will not be proper objects of ECA procurement so long as these facilities are controlled or utilized primarily by the military.

ECA and D/A conferring on further clarification respective responsibilities problem and procurement and agreement is being sought on responsibilities in terms specific program and commodities. Will attempt obtain Bureau of Budget concurrence to list and will advise you progress.

1. KorCiv Number 13, a joint Army, State, ECA cable from Washington to CINCFE (TAB A) gives procedure for co-ordinating non-military assistance for ROK. The parts pertinent to this command are briefly as follows:

a. In Korea:

(1) Requirements determined by ECA and ROK, and by Eighth Army (G-4) who also determines requirements of ROK forces for civilian type supplies (food, clothing, medicine).

(2) Requirements forwarded by Eighth Army (G-4) to CINCFE (G-4 GHQ).

b. In Japan:

(1) G-4, GHQ

(a) establishes priorities.

(b) With ECA, determines eligibility for ECA financing procurement of requirements.

(c) With ESS determines ability of Japanese economy to supply.

(d) Determines balance not available from Japanese economy.

(e) Transmits to ECA (Tokyo) for procurement a list of those requirements which can be financed by ECA, paragraph (b) above, and which can be procured locally paragraph (c) above, after review by GHQ Tech services for impact on other projects. (Note: Underlined portion not part of KORCIV 13 cable.)

(f) In coordination with ECA (Tokyo) sends joint cable to DA (G-4), ECA (Washington) and Dept of State giving total phased requirements and that portion to be procured locally.

(2) (a) If time and other considerations allow, and it is determined that requirements are appropriate for submission to ECA, the request is forwarded to ECA, Washington for action.

(b) If time does not permit, and requirements are eligible

for ECA financing and the supplies to fill requirements are available locally, Chief of ECA Mission, Tokyo is authorized to effect procurement.

2. a. DA msg W 91846, 19 Sep (TAB B) states that developments in Washington indicate that DA will assume from ECA responsibility for non-military assistance to Korea, and that ECA's responsibility will be limited to future rehabilitation. It further states that Army has responsibility for furnishing supplies to prevent disease and unrest and the minimum construction or reconstruction essential to military operations.

b. Although both the future and the present tense are used in this message, there is no indication that it is to be construed as a joint Army, State, ECA directive rescinding KORCIV 13 (TAB A).

3. After receipt of TAB B by this Headquarters, G-4 Supply was informed by phone by Acting Chief of Mission, ECA for Korea, Dr. Edgar A. J. Johnson, that his office would not finance nor procure any items for ROK that could not be considered as for future rehabilitation purposes. In conformity with this the ECA Tokyo office returned requests, previously submitted, for relief supplies and for items of civilian type goods for ROK forces.

4. Because of the urgency of the need for these supplies, this headquarters has been directing CG JLCOM to procure them. DA msg WCL 91955, 20 Sep (TAB C) which states, among other things, that authority is granted to use DA appropriated funds for items not funded by ECA, is being used by Comp as authority to pay for these items.

5. Proposed radio (TAB D) to DA refers to previous radios (TABS A, B, and C); states ECA Tokyo's actions in refusing to procure and action by this headquarters to procure necessary supplies.

6. In order that DA may be apprised of the current situation here relative to non-military assistance to Korea, it is recommended that the attached draft (TAB D) be approved and returned to G-4 for preparation and dispatch.

This is CIVCOR No. 36. Subject: Civilian Refugee Relief Program - Korea. This is the first report of Public Health and Welfare, UN Command in Korea, on civilian refugee relief covering the period 5 Sept to 13 Sept inclusive. Report follows:

1. Pending recruitment of health and welfare personnel from UN, personnel from Public Health and Welfare Section, UN Command (Tokyo), were sent from Japan arriving in Korea 5 Sept to establish, in the field, procedures for providing relief to the civilian population of Korea.
2. Contacts were made with the CG Eighth US Army Korea, the HOK Govt ministries concerned, Economic Cooperation Administration and UN. Procedures for coordination of activities were developed.
3. One team is working at the national level. Two teams of health and welfare personnel have been assigned to work at the provincial level with the two provincial governments now functioning within the area held by UN forces. Actual ground recon has been made of the entire area within the perimeter including the forward battle area to determine the actual number and condition of refugees.
4. The situation was found to be temporarily stabilized. Villages within the forward fighting area are burned out in a strip about 10 miles deep along the perimeter of the area held by UN forces. This perimeter extends from a point west of Masan northward to Naegwan and thence eastward to Pohang.
5. The second zone along the perimeter extending from the burned out areas back approximately 10 to 15 miles in depth to division rear boundaries, contains villages and towns which have been evacuated and are vacant but have little damage and may be reoccupied by their inhabitants as soon as the military situation permits.
6. The third zone consists of villages which had been evacuated by their inhabitants who were anticipating further retrograde movement of UN

Forces. Most of the temporary evacuees from the third zone have already returned to their homes. Previous estimates of approximately 1,500,000 refugees included these temporary evacuees.

7. Most reliable data presently available, based on personal observations Public Health and Welfare personnel throughout the principal areas involved, shows the following number of refugees to be present within the perimeter. Taegu 5,000, Kyongu 100,000, Chongdo 100,000, Potosung 30,000, Kyongson, 30,000, Masan 6,000, Kumhae 13,000, Kojedo 4,500, Chinsan 2,300, total 290,800.

8. Korean Medical Teams each consisting of one doctor, one nurse and an assistant are stationed in all large refugee camps or centered within clusters of smaller camps. Other detached camps are visited periodically by itinerant or temporary teams. Medical supplies for care of refugees had been almost completely consumed prior to arrival of personnel from Public Health and Welfare, UN Command. Available Korean personnel are being organized into teams for immunization and environmental sanitation work.

9. Medical supplies procured on emergency basis from Japan have arrived and are being distributed under supervision of Public Health and Welfare personnel.

10. Refugees are being immunized for smallpox, typhoid, cholera, and typhus. DDT delousing procedures are being carried out. Field purification of water supplies for refugees has been initiated.

11. Since all available large hospitals which were very limited in number in Korea are being used by the military forces for battle casualties, hospitalization for serious illness among refugees is being provided at government expense in small private hospitals. Additional buildings which will be converted into civilian hospitals are being requisitioned by the government to provide more adequate medical care for refugees. Plans have been formulated for the establishment of convalescent camps for Korean Army hospital discharges who have reached the maximum of hospital care improvement.

12. Production of medical supplies in Korea has been nil. Reports indicate stocks of medical supplies imported prior to the invasion and warehoused in the Seoul-Inchon Area for the civilian population as a whole, were seized by Communist military forces and have been utilized by them for their own battle casualties. Therefore initial estimates of the Public Health and Welfare Program for the UN Command will provide medical and sanitation supplies for the whole civil population. Food, clothing, and shelter (including fuel) will be provided for refugees and for former refugees who have returned to their place of residence and whose homes and/or personal property have been partially or totally destroyed.

14. As soon as the military situation changes, it is anticipated that the refugees now in the areas listed will immediately return to their villages.

15. The major residual refugee problem will then be one of providing temporary shelter, food, clothing, blankets and medical supplies within the belt of destruction as indicated above and in such other areas as may be destroyed as result of future military activity.

16. Future periodic reports will cover changes in the situation and program above as necessitated by future military operations.
