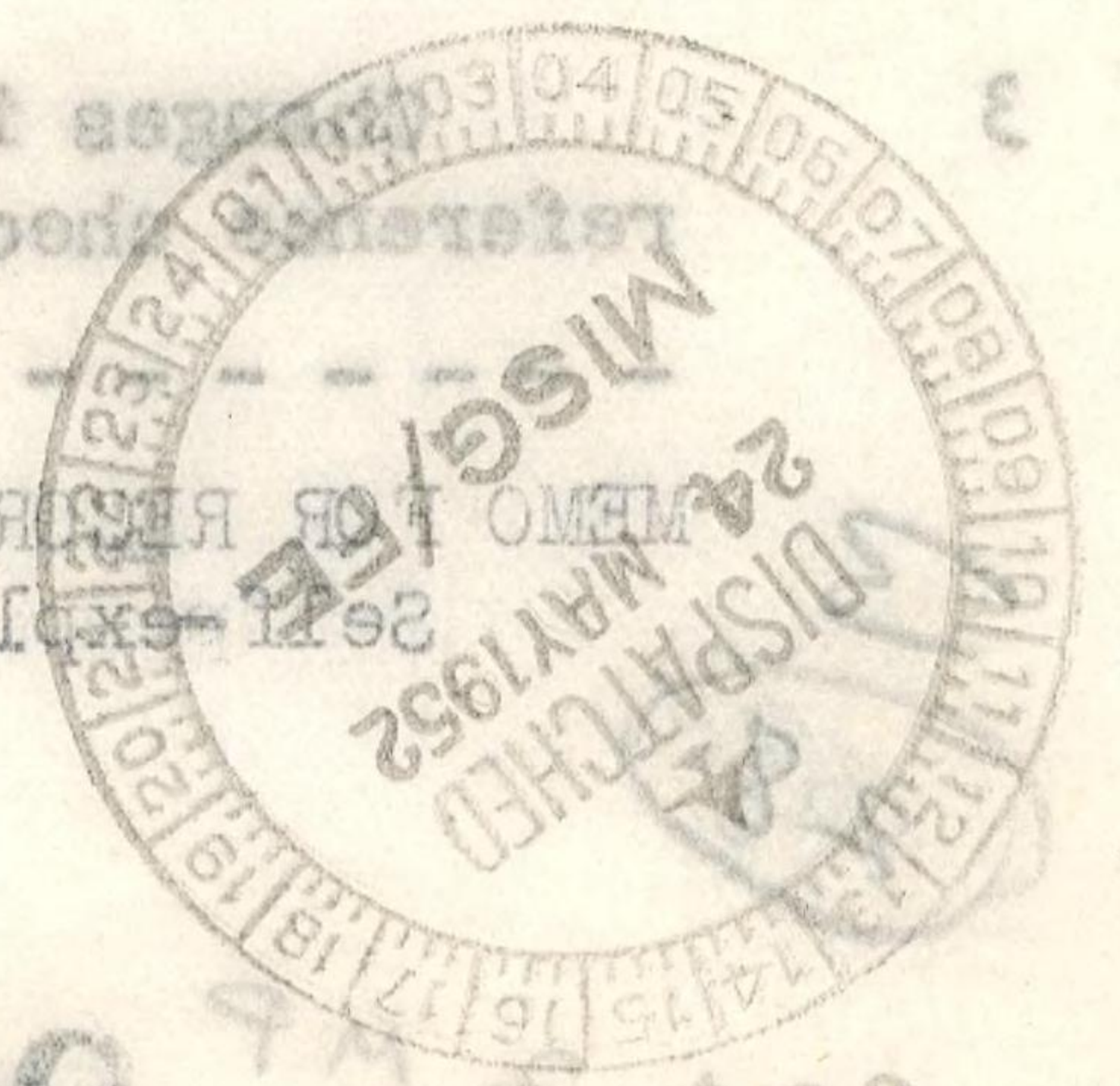

2. 1. As a part of its assigned mission, G2 (MISG/FE) maintains current records only on personnel proficient in the languages of primary interest in the Far East Command, namely, Japanese, Russian, Chinese, and Korean. Action has been already initiated to make available from FEC and EUSAK sources Korean and/or Chinese linguists who may be required in the event of an armistice, and it is believed that the required 22 Korean interpreters will be available.

2. Procurement of clerks, drivers, orderlies and linguists other than those mentioned in par 1 above, are not included in the G2, FEC mission. It is recommended, therefore, that AG screen and establish a locator system for those requirements indicated in par 4 of Incl 1, excluding the Korean interpreters.

1. Paragraph 40 b of the present draft armistice agreement states in part: "Additional personnel (additional to the team members) such as drivers, clerks, interpreters, and communication personnel, and such equipment as may be required by the Teams to perform their missions, shall be furnished by the Commander of each side, as required, in the Demilitarized Zone and in the territory under his military control. The Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission may provide itself and the Neutral Nations Inspection Teams with such of the above personnel and equipment of its own as it may desire; provided, however, that such personnel shall be personnel of the same neutral nations of which the Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission is composed."

2. This headquarters made a staff study including a proposed Table of Distribution for the UNC portion of the Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission and its Neutral Nations Inspection Teams and forwarded it to the Department of the Army on 9 Mar 52 for consideration by the UNC nominated neutral nations. It was recommended in this study that the Neutral Nations furnish necessary interpreters and clerks for their teams. On 19 Apr 52 a message was received from the Department of the Army stating that the UNC nominated neutrals were unable to provide Korean or Chinese speaking personnel.

3. Apparently no reliance can be placed on either our neutrals or the Communist nominated neutrals being able to furnish the needed interpreters. For this reason and for the reason that the agreement as quoted in paragraph 1 above requires Neutral Nations Supervisory Commission approval before any additional personnel may be provided by the neutrals, it is considered that the UNC should be prepared to provide the Neutral Nations Inspection Teams in South Korea with all the additional personnel that will be required.

4. A firm requirement cannot be given for the reasons indicated above and the fact that the names of the neutral nations to compose the Supervisory Commission have not been agreed upon. However, an estimate of the personnel that may be required is given below:

1. The Far East Command is receiving each month enlisted personnel in MOS's which are overstrength in the command and for which no requisitions from units are on hand. Consequently, this condition results in malassignments, build-up of overstrengths in certain MOS's, and overstrength MOS's taking up spaces which should be filled by personnel in short supply.

2. The attached report indicates projected enlisted strengths by MOS as of 1 July, and is forwarded for your analysis in determining those MOS's which are excessive to the needs of the command. The figures in this study were extracted from QGA-MR-1114 Report 29 February as prepared by SAD.

3. Each month DA is furnished a list of those MOS's in excess of the needs of FEC requesting that no personnel in those MOS's be shipped during the second succeeding month. In order to assist AG in determining which MOS to report, it is requested that you furnish, by check sheet, not later than 7 May a list of MOS's monitored by your branch of service which should be curtailed from shipment during July only. Care should be exercised in not selecting an MOS in lower grades overstrength when critical shortage exists in higher grades of the same MOS. As a criteria in the past, an MOS over 30% overstrength has been considered excessive.

4. The attached study may be retained for your information and file. It is anticipated that revision of this study will be furnished each month for your assistance in declaring certain MOS's excessive. In addition this analysis may be used to assist you in determining critical MOS for monthly letter to DA from AG Headquarters FEC.

The proposed troop list for the ROK Army has been reviewed by G2 from two standpoints: first, the general capabilities of the organization for the collection and processing of intelligence information; and second, the details of the organizations which are now tabulated in the troop list, and which have an intelligence implication.

2. With reference to the first point, the following comments are submitted;

a. In time of peace, intelligence information is collected by two principal means: established clandestine nets within foreign territory, and signal intercepts. There is no apparent provision in the troop list for any form of clandestine collection agency. It is conceivable that an assumption is being made to the effect that such an organization is properly "civil" rather than military; however, CINCFE has found that such an approach is inadequate in meeting the intelligence requirements of the military. Perhaps, in Korea, this would not be the case; but without examining the entire structure of the ROK civil and military establishment, it is impossible to make a commitment with respect to the Army alone.

b. Furthermore, in time of peace, the establishment and training of military intelligence service personnel (who will provide 60% of the intelligence information during combat operations) is a necessary adjunct to a sound military organization. CINCFE has recently determined the necessity for such an organization within the theater troop basis; and the Armed Forces of the Philippines have had a similar organization for several years. It appears that the preparation of the troop list for the ROK Army could be used to provide an admirable example of the manner in which the U. S. Army intends to approach this problem.

c. It is difficult to determine whether all requirements for a sound intelligence collection and processing organization have been met by an examination of the organization of the ROK Army only. There is no indication in the attached papers of the extent of the ROK Air Force (or ROK Army Air Force) or of the ROK Navy (or Coast Guard) organizations - both of which are necessary complements to the intelligence organization of the ROK Armed Forces. Radar coverage, reconnaissance aircraft, and light aircraft for air OP's are illustrations of an apparent void in the organization of the ROK forces.

3. With reference to the second point:

a. Consideration should be given to the fact that in the U. S. Army, Technical Intelligence embraces the seven technical services, not merely Ordnance.

b. There appears to be a duplication in the missions of the Headquarters Intelligence Detachment and the Counterintelligence Corps Detachment. In actual practice, the principal mission of the Headquarters Intelligence Detachment (HID) is in the clandestine collection of intelligence information rather than counterintelligence. Recommend that Par 6 of ROKA Unit #30-1601-ROK HID be changed to reflect the true mission of that unit which is intelligence collection by clandestine means. Further recommend that the HID be taken out from under Security Division and placed directly under the G-2.

c. In order to adequately train recruits and replacements in all phases of basic intelligence and to awaken in them a general recognition and appreciation of its value, the training course at ROK Army Replacement Training Center, No. 1 should include the following basic subjects:

- (1) Recognition of enemy materiel and equipment.
- (2) Handling of Prisoners of War.
- (3) Importance of proper processing of captured enemy documents.

d. An intelligence school is considered essential in any proposed structure of ROKA to furnish trained replacements and filler personnel for the intelligence sections and agencies of ROKA as well as to provide specialized intelligence training for staff officers. This school should also be responsible for coordinating all intelligence training throughout the Army by training the instructors and furnishing technical advice for applicable intelligence courses in replacement training centers, as well as for officer candidate schools and other officer training installations (such as the General Staff College). Through the means of this centralized control and supervision, more standardized and efficient intelligence methods can be established in ROKA and the principles and appreciation of the intelligence more thoroughly and uniformly diffused throughout the ranks. The proposed complement for the intelligence school is considered adequate, however a more accurate appraisal of these strength figures would have to be predicated on an analysis of the actual program of instruction to be presented. It is also considered advisable that in the organization of ROKA this centralized Intelligence School be placed within the framework of the MISO concept as recommended for ROKA in paragraph 3g below, since among the primary responsibilities of MISO are the training, control of assignments and supervision of activities of all intelligence specialists.

e. No comment is made at this time on the number of personnel proposed for the ROK Army General Staff College since no information is available.

- (1) Combat Intelligence
- (2) Duties and responsibilities of AC of S, G-2
- (3) Intelligence collecting agencies
- (4) Analysis and evaluation of intelligence
- (5) Operation of clandestine intelligence activities
- (6) Estimates, annexes, and orders.

f. Reference the Counterintelligence Corps. Based on the proposed ROK Army structure, it is felt that the ROK CIC should probably consist of one (1) Army team (AC-BC combination) utilizing sixty-three (63) spaces; three (3) Corps teams (AA*BA) combination) utilizing seventeen (17) spaces each; and ten (10) Division teams (AA-BA combination) utilizing seventeen (17) spaces each (T/O & E 30-500, 15 Sept 48 asamended). This is in accordance with CIC organization within the U. S. Army although the CIC Center Center at Fort Holabird is increasing the strength of the U. S. CIC Corps Teams by 5 spaces as a result of CIC combat experience in Korea. Such an organization would involve a total of 284 spaces. (69 Officers, 81 Warrant Officers, and 134 EM). In addition, provisions should be made for a CIC pipeline of 41 spaces, and a CIC instructor overhead portion of the HID school of 10 spaces. Thus, the overall total of 335 spaces would result in a saving of 65 spaces over the proposed organization which provides for a total of 400 spaces. It is felt that 400 spaces are unnecessary for CIC within the proposed ROK Army since presumably action against subversive activities carried on within the civilian population would be the responsibility of a South Korean counterpart of our FBI. It is, also, felt that the CIC should be under operational control of the AC of S, G-2, ROK Army, and its jurisdiction and activities should be limited primarily to military areas, bases and installations occupied by ROK military forces similar to the CIC in the Zone of Interior.

g. It is recommended that a Military Intelligence Service Organization similar in design to that of the U. S. Army counterpart be included in the ROKA troop list. The recommended MISO would consist of one (1) MIS Bn. Hq. which, with its support MIS Co. and API Co., would have a strength of 62 Officers and

209 EM, and would provide intelligence specialist support for ROK Army G-2; three (3) MIS companies of 14 Officers and 35 EM each (one for each support Corps); and ten (10) MIS Platoons of 8 Officers and 23 EM each (one in support of each Division). The aggregate strength of this MISO would be 728 (184 Officers and 544 EM). These MISO units would be administratively ROK Army Hqunits attached for operational control to the various Corps and Divisions in the manner of similar U. S. units in the theater of operations. They are considered essential to maintain the intelligence net of ROKA in a state of combat readiness, particularly since a general lack of understanding and awareness of the value of military intelligence has been evident in ROKA units at all levels in the Korean War. However, a peacetime assigned strength of 85% authorized strength is not considered dangerous to operational efficiency provided an adequate intelligence school is operated by ROKA capable of producing replacement and/or trained filler personnel in time of need.

Furthermore, in time of peace, the establishment and training of military intelligence service personnel (who will provide 60% of the intelligence information during combat operations) is a necessary adjunct to a sound military organization. CINCPAC has recently determined the necessity for such an organization within the theater troop basis; and the Armed Forces of the Philippines have had a similar organization for several years. It appears that the preparation of the troop list for the ROK Army could be used to provide an admirable example of the manner in which the U. S. Army intends to approach this problem.

c. It is difficult to determine whether all requirements for a sound intelligence collection and processing organization have been met by an examination of the organization of the ROK Army only. There is no indication in the attached papers of the extent of the ROK Air Force (or ROK Army Air Force) or of the ROK Navy (or Coast Guard) organizations - both of which are necessary complements to the intelligence organization of the ROK Armed Forces. Radar coverage, reconnaissance aircraft, and light aircraft for air OP's are illustrations of an apparent void in the

organization of the ROK forces.

3. With reference to the second point:

a. Consideration should be given to the fact that in the U. S. Army, Technical Intelligence embraces the seven technical services, not merely Ordnance.

b. There appears to be a duplication in the missions of the Headquarters Intelligence Detachment and the Counterintelligence Corps Detachment. In actual practice, the principal mission of the Headquarters Intelligence Detachment (HID) is the clandestine collection of intelligence information rather than counterintelligence. Recommend that Par 6 of ROKA Unit #30-1601-ROK HID be changed to reflect the true mission of that unit which is intelligence collection by clandestine means. Further recommend that the HID be taken out from under Security Division and placed directly under the G-2.

c. In order to adequately train recruits and replacements in all phases of basic intelligence and to awaken in them a general recognition and appreciation of its value, the training course at ROK Army Replacement Training Center No. 1 should include the following basic subjects:

- (1) Recognition of enemy materiel and equipment.
- (2) Handling of Prisoners of War.
- (3) Importance of proper processing of captured enemy documents.

d. An intelligence school is considered essential in any proposed structure of ROKA to furnish trained replacements and filler personnel for the intelligence sections and agencies of ROKA as well as to provide specialized intelligence training for staff officers. This school should also be responsible for coordinating all intelligence training throughout the Army by training the instructors and furnishing technical advice for applicable intelligence courses in replacement training centers, as well as for officer candidate schools and other officer training installations (such as the General Staff College). Through the means

of this centralized control and supervision, more standardized and efficient intelligence methods can be established in ROKA and the principles and appreciation of intelligence more thoroughly and uniformly diffused throughout the ranks. The proposed complement for the intelligence school is considered adequate, however a more accurate appraisal of these strength figures would have to be predicated on an analysis of the actual program of instruction to be presented. It is also considered advisable that in the organization of ROKA this centralized Intelligence School be placed within the framework of the MISO concept as recommended for ROKA in paragraph 3g below, since among the primary responsibilities of MISO are the training, control of assignments and supervision of activities of all intelligence specialists.

e. No comment is made at this time on the number of personnel proposed for the ROK Army General Staff College since no information is available as to the number and type of intelligence courses to be presented. It is felt, however, that the following basic intelligence subjects should be included:

- (1) Combat Intelligence
- (2) Duties and responsibilities of AC of S, G-2
- (3) Intelligence collecting agencies
- (4) Analysis and evaluation of intelligence
- (5) Operation of clandestine intelligence activities
- (6) Estimates, annexes, and orders.

f. Reference the Counterintelligence Corps. Based on the proposed ROK Army structure, it is felt that the ROK CIC should probably consist of one (1) Army team (AC-BC combination) utilizing sixty-three (63) spaces; three (3) Corps teams (AA-BA combination) utilizing seventeen (17) spaces each; and ten (10) Division teams (AA-BA combination) utilizing seventeen (17) spaces each (T/O & E 30-500, 15 Sept 48 as amended). with CIC organization within the U. S. Army although the CIC Center at Fort Holabird is increasing the strength of the U. S. CIC Corps Teams by 5 spaces as a result of CIC combat experience in Korea. Such an organization would involve a total of 284 spaces. (69 Officers, 81 Warrant Officers, and 134 EM) In addition, provisions should be made for a CIC pipeline of 41 spaces, and a CIC instructor-overhead portion of the HID school of 10 spaces. Thus, the overall total of 335 spaces would result in a saving of 65 spaces over the proposed organization which provides for a total of 400 spaces. Organic units within the MISO designed to give intelligence specialist support to Division, Corps and ROK Army G2 Sections; handle training and assignment of intelligence specialists and coordinate and supervise their activities at all levels.

Since the guiding purpose of this study is to organize a ROK Army capable of independent operations in the field and in view of the absence of any organized and reliable reserve Army training corps in ROK Army, it is considered essential that ROK Army have a peacetime MISO which could provide minimum support and also serve as a nucleus for expansion in time of emergency.

7. Reason for number of units in Peacetime ROK Army.

One (1) MIS Organization to consist of a MIS Battalion at the Army level, a MIS Company to service each corps, and a MIS Platoon

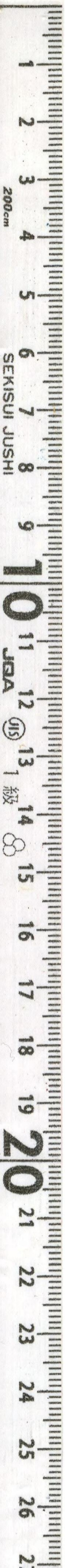

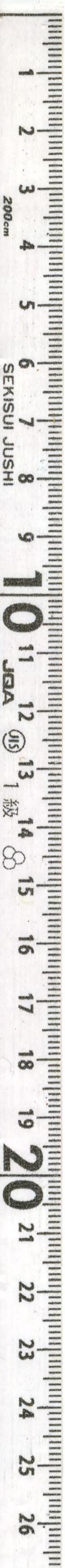

Its jurisdiction and activities should be confined primarily to civil matters as in the case of the FBI and other non-military U. S. governmental agencies.

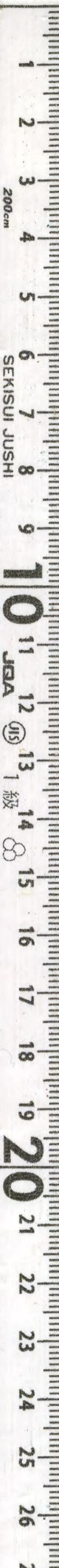

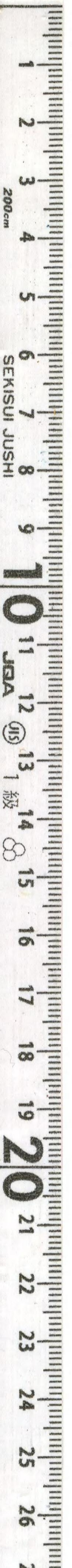

1. A paragraph from a personal letter from Col Van Natta to Col Rasmussen, dated 19 February, is quoted for your information and appears pertinent to the subject above:

"Reference the "thirty Chinese interpreters to translate documents requested by the ROKA", this is just a plan. The ROK Army G-2 has just found out that we have such a thing as a MIS organization, so now he wants one too. The thirty Chinese interpreters are merely his opening wedge to build himself a little empire. So far, he has no documents to translate nor is it very likely that anyone will take his request for interpreters seriously. He may get them included in a recommended T O & E, but that is about all."
