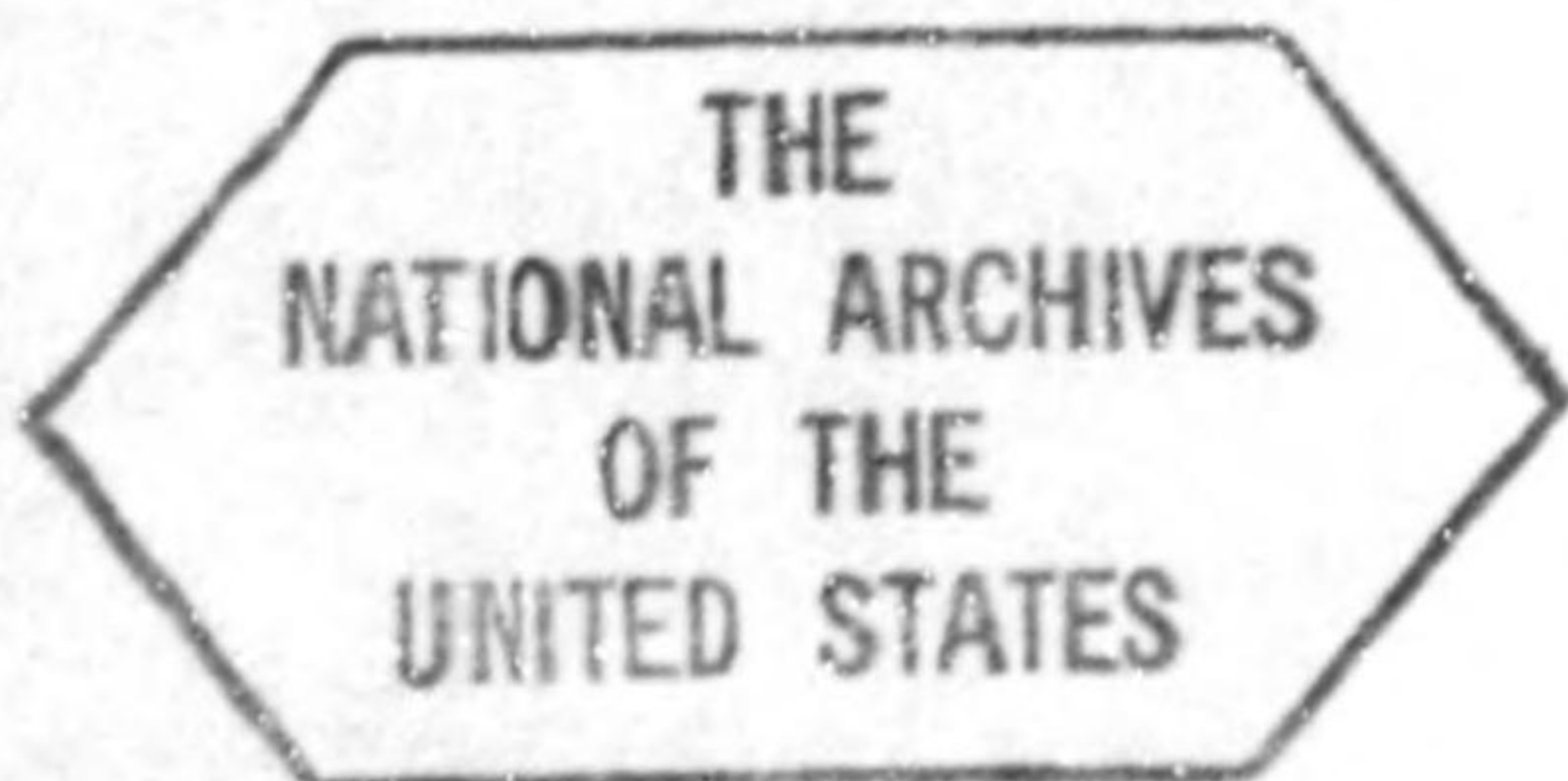

1. Herewith is one copy of concept of "MINNOW" Basic Outline Plan for employment of Occupation Forces in civil disturbances in Japan. This concept has received command approval and early completion of the plan has been directed.

2. Preparation of an Annex, designated as "3 b (3) (c)," is requested to incorporate the principles of operation, powers and limitations of appropriate commanders of Occupation Forces in the conduct of direct military government under SCAP directive as visualized in attached concept.

3. Completion of this material as a matter of priority is requested. CG, Eighth Army is currently engaged in formulation of alert plans which cannot be finalized and disseminated prior to issue of the "MINNOW" Plan.

Civil Disturbances

1. Establishment of Direct Military Government

Direct military government in Japan will be authorized by SCAP only when the extent of the civil disturbance emergency can no longer be controlled by the Japanese Civil Government. In such an event SCAP will declare a state of "Limited Emergency" or "Major Emergency" in a defined area with directive to Commanding General, Eighth Army, to establish direct Military Government therein.

2. Responsibility

The Commanding General, Eighth U. S. Army, is responsible for the execution of the policies of SCAP and for direct military government in Japan when initiated.

3. Objectives of Direct Military Government

Direct military government will be initiated by the Army only in that part of Japan where authorized. All other portions will continue under the Japanese Civil Government acting under the direction of SCAP. The objectives of direct military government are:

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(a) to take over any and all phases of civil government where the Japanese Civil Government can no longer function effectively.

(b) to return the areas to responsible Japanese Civil Government at the earliest possible opportunity.

4. Policies

The policies under which direct military government will operate are:

(a) Complete responsibility during the emergency will be assumed by CG - Eighth U. S. Army.

(b) Delegation of authority in military government matters by CG Eighth Army is permitted to CG of Corps with sub-delegation to CG of Divs so that emergency conditions in the field can be handled as the situation demands. This may require a temporary attachment of military government units to Divs.

(c) The Military Government units under control of the Eighth Army at the several echelons will have direct control over all phases of government where the responsible Japanese Civil Government has failed. This will include but not be limited to matters of supervision of political sub-divisions, maintenance of law and order, supervision of courts, civilian supply, public health and sanitation, censorship, communications, transportation, public works and utilities, money, banking and public finance, price control and rationing, natural resources, commerce and trade, labor, custody of property, control of population movement, education, public welfare and all other matters which are in the nature of civilian as distinguished from military matters.

(d) Direct military government will be guided by principles and policies which have already been and those hereafter enunciated by SCAP. Where local conditions require any variance from these adopted policies, a report will be prepared and specific authority requested for such variance, the emergency situation permitting.

(e) On matters where no policy directive has been issued by SCAP, the principles of FM 27-5 and FM 27-10 will apply.

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(f) Where direct military government is initiated it will still be the policy to use any or all agencies of Japanese Civil Government which are found responsible and capable of carrying out all or a portion of their functions. The extent of use is a matter for local determination.

(g) Agencies of GHQ SCAP will assist the CG Eighth Army in accomplishment of SCAP directives within the affected area as requested by the latter.

(h) Direct military government shall not be continued any longer than necessary, and shall be terminated when directed by SCAP.

5. Personnel

Additional military government personnel and units, as available, will be assigned by this Headquarters to Eighth U. S. Army for employment by the Commanding General as he may direct. This will include military government staff officers, personnel assigned to Hq and Hq detachments or companies, civil affairs teams, specialists in various technical fields and civilians. Reassignment of military government personnel within Army, Corps or Divs may have to be made to care for local limited or major civil disturbances.

6. Reports

The Commanding General Eighth U. S. Army will make special weekly activities reports for all areas within which an emergency has been declared to exist. These reports will cover extent of civil disturbance, functions of government taken over by direct military government, progress in quelling civil disturbance, estimate of probable duration of emergency and other significant matters to keep this Headquarters advised of the local situation. Additional reports may be required by this Headquarters from time to time.
