PLANETS.

MERCURY will be the *Morning* Star until March 4. It will then be the *Evening* Star until April 21—after which it will be the *Morning* Star until June 22—and from thence *Evening* Star to August 27. It will then be the *Morning* Star until October 15—thence *Evening* Star to December 13—It will then be the *Morning* Star.

VENUS will be the *Morning* Star until October 8, after which it will be the *Evening* Star.

MARS will be the *Evening* Star until July 26, after which it will be the *Morning* Star the remainder of the year.

JUPITER will be the *Evening* Star until June 26, after which it will be the *Morning* Star.

SATURN will be *Morning* Star until February 1. It will then be *Evening* Star until August 10—after which it will be the *Morning* Star.

ELONGATIONS OF MERCURY AND VENUS.

MERCURY will be in its greatest *Western* elongation July 18, May 22 and September 12 ; and in its greatest *Eastern* elongation March 31, July 28 and November 27.

VENUS will be in its greatest *Western* elongation February 12.

ECLIPSES.

There will be six Eclipses this year—*four* of the Sun, and *two* of the Moon.

I. February 2. A partial Eclipse of the sun. This eclipse will only be visible in a small portion of the Southern Ocean above the parallel of Lat 55° S.

II. February 17. A total Eclipse of the moon, visible in all parts of N. America :

About one half of the Sun's Northern limb will be obscured.

VI. August 27 and 28. A partial Eclipse of the sun, invisible in America, Europe and Asia.—a small portion of it will be seen at the Cape of Good Hope. It will commence in the vicinity of the Island of Madagascar, and end near the South Pole.

Beginning, 27th.....11h. 16m. A. } Mean time at Halifax.
Ending 28th 2h. 17m. M. }

Eclipses take place every half year, and at each period there may be one, two, or three ; if only one, it must be an eclipse of the Sun ; if two, there will be one of each luminary ; and if three, there will be two of Sun, with one of the moon between them. Eclipses of the Sun are caused by the interposition of the body of the Moon between our eyes and the Sun—and Eclipses of the Moon by a real deprivation of light from the Moon occasioned by the shadow of the earth.

THE wondrous conformation of the heavens has interested mankind from the earliest ages,—from the period when our first parents rejoiced together in the garden of Eden, to that auspicious moment when the “wise men of the east” beheld the glorious star of Bethlehem beaming in the firmament.

Comets, from the earliest period of man's history, have been regarded with feelings of superstition, and as the harbingers of extraordinary events. Such impressions now dwell only on the minds of the weak and ignorant ; yet the suddenness of the approach of comets, their often eccentric movements and changes of appearance, and their enormous magnitude, will ever cause these phenomena to be contemplated with reverential awe.

The expected comet, as stated in last year's Almanack, is that of 1264 and 1556, and, as was also stated, would most probably make its appearance between June, 1857, and August, 1858.

Several astronomers have investigated, by laborious calculations, the question of the identity of this comet. It appears that the elements upon which their respective calculations have been formed have differed considerably ; and not being so exact as those upon which some other comets were calculated, their observations are considered somewhat imperfect. It is, however, very probable that a great comet, revolving round the sun in the long period of nearly three centuries, was observed in 1264 and 1556. Assuming the comets of these years to be apparitions of the same body, its return towards the sun may be anticipated after the lapse of a corresponding interval. The wanderer is now overdue, as full three centuries have elapsed since 1556. But as its period of revolution may be lengthened by planetary perturbations, the look-out will not be hopeless for a year or two longer. It is, therefore, not unlikely that the comet will revisit us between the present and the next year (if it does not appear before). It is, however, quite possible that this may be done without a chance of the object becoming visible, or at any rate conspicuous to the naked eye ; while it is certain from observations of the Comet of 1556, that its orbit is so situated that it cannot

approach the Earth within some five millions of miles, which is more than nineteen times the distance of the moon.

Should the Comet disclose itself to our view, having the same or nearly the same orbit with the one of 1556, its identity with it will be established, and a body be added to our system, following an elliptical path so immensely elongated as to require the period of 300 years to travel through it. Should it not be seen, it may still have been drawn back by the chain of solar influence, after a journey of thousands of millions of miles beyond the remotest of the known planets, without being visible, owing to unfavourable circumstances for observation, or to the vast changes in magnitude and appearance which cometary bodies have been observed to undergo. Should neither event transpire, no reproach will rest upon astronomers, as they have not announced the expected Comet with that certainty of assertion with which an eclipse, or a transit is predicted, but simply as a matter of fair probability.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

Column **LEFT HAND PAGE.**

- 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.
- 3 “ 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
- 5—The Sun’s declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column
- 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or a quarter before eight o’clock in the morning at Halifax.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time; and there are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing; namely, about April 15, June 15, Sept. 1, and Decr. 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.
- 7—Days’ length in hours and minutes.
- 8—The rising of the Moon.
- 9—The setting of the Moon.
- 10—The time of the Moon’s southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro’, Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.
- 11—The symbols in this column indicate the moon’s place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon’s Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER’S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- 1—Contains the days of the month.
- 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
- 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.
- 4— “ “ Pictou, N. S. and Cape Tormentine, N. B.
- 5— “ “ Annapolis, N. S., St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine.
- 6— “ “ St. Johns, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L’establissement du port*—is at Halifax, 7h.30m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., & Portland, 11h.14m.; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h., and St. Johns, N. F. L., 6h.30m.

All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.

THE EPHEMERIS OF THE PRINCIPAL PLANETS.—The hour of *meridian passage*, *right ascension* and *declination* of each of the principal planets is given for the 1st and 15th of each month. For any other day than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate of 3m. 55. 91s. per day, reckoned from the nearest given day—to be added for an earlier day—subtracted if for a later day.

As a general rule, all succulent food, or such as contains large quantities of water, is best for winter food for Milch Cows, for the production of large quantities of milk in winter. Most field-roots contain about seven-eighths to nine-tenths water; and these are therefore milk producers. Bran, largely mixed with water, operates in a similar manner. Still-fed cows are often taught to drink enormous quantities of "slop," and so yield large milkings of a poor, washy, unhealthy product. Carrots and corn-stalks (the latter being usually quite a juicy food, when the stocks themselves are consumed as when small grown by being thickly sown, as directed in the calendar for June,) increase the quantity, but still more the richness of winter milk. The following is also another mode of feeding for getting the greatest quantity and best quality of milk:— for every cow, boll half a bushel of turnips; when boiled soft, add 4 qts of bran, mix well, and let it stand till cool. Give your cow a boiled mess of this once a day, and you will find the milk to increase, and the milk does not taste of the turnips as it does when they are fed raw. By adding the bran while the turnips are hot, the bran swells, and you get the full good of it.

PROFESSOR GREGORY, of Aberdeen, observes: "It has been ascertained that if you mix with the food of poultry a sufficient quantity of egg shells or chalk, which they eat greedily, they will lay twice or thrice as many eggs as before. A well-fed fowl is disposed to lay a large number of eggs, but cannot do so without the materials of the shells, however nourishing in other respects her food may be; indeed, a fowl fed on food and water, free from carbonate of lime, and not finding any in the soil, or in the shape of mortar, which they often eat on the walls, would lay no eggs at all with the best will in the world." Fowls or Chickens may be fattened in four or five days by feeding them three times daily with rice boiled in milk, always fresh—as sourness prevents them from fattening. Give them clear water to drink. By this method the flesh is made particularly white. To pickle eggs, boil them in a saucepan until they become quite hard—then after removing the shells, lay them carefully in large-mouthed jars, and pour over them scalding vinegar, well seasoned with whole pepper, allspice, a few races of ginger and a few cloves or garlic. When cold, bung down closely, and in a month they are fit for use.

The season for grafting is approaching. There is no kind of labour which brings a richer return than a few hours spent in grafting. There is no difficulty now in procuring scions of the most approved varieties, gratis, or at a rate merely nominal. The best scions for apple trees, are obtained from the last year's growth, on the points of bearing limbs. The scions may be cut any time during February or March, and placed in a cellar with the butts upon the ground where the air will not strike them. Grafting wax may be made in the proportion of 2½ lbs. rosin, 1 lb. tallow, and ¼ lb. beeswax, melted together and poured into a tub of water. If it should be too sticky, more beeswax may be used. Probably the best time for grafting apple trees is from the 15th. of April to the 10th. of May. If the grafting is to be done in May, the scions should be cut earlier in the season. The best mode for preserving scions is to fill a large box with fine pulverized moss, or still better, with moist saw-dust, in which the grafts are simply immersed, and which are thus packed away or withdrawn with the greatest ease at any desired moment. A box of saw-dust, in a cool cellar, will remain moist without watering for many weeks.

ONE of the most profitable crops the farmer can raise, is corn for fodder. Plough and harrow,—furrow with a one-horse plough in one direction, 2½ or 3 feet apart,—strew from a half-bushel hand-basket, at the rate of 3 bushels of seed per acre, along the furrows,—cover with a harrow or cultivator run lengthwise,—pass the one-horse cultivator between the rows when the corn is a foot high; all the weeds will soon be smothered by the corn, and no hoeing is needed. Mow, bind, and dry very thoroughly. Make very small stacks, to prevent heating—salt well. Four to six tons are yielded by one acre: the stalks being fine all are eaten. Do not sow broadcast. It is said that 3 tons of this fodder for cows is better than 4 tons of the best hay. The value of the crop depends much on the seed sown. The common large sweet corn is considered the best. It may be cut when not more than a foot high, as it will start again and afford a second cutting, but it is deemed best when the stalk is fully grown, and the grain beginning to form.

It has been a common saying among farmers, that timothy hay should not be cut until ripe: that is, until the heads were plump and full of seed. The loss farmers sustain by thus letting their grass get too ripe, is immense. Both science and experience demonstrate that the proper time for cutting grass, is when it is in blossom. All plants on arriving at maturity have their starch, and sugar, and gum, in large quantities converted into woody fibre—a wise provision of Providence for enabling the stem to bear the mature seeds. And as sugar, gum and starch are nutritive elements, it is desirable that these should be preserved, and hence the point for successful grass-cutting is that between the full development of the plant, and before the formation of their seeds; in other words when they are in flower. The best hay is that which is made without becoming too dry; but to prevent mouldiness, it should be moderately salted. The intermixture of the salt is more perfect when it is frequently applied in successive layers. One peck to a peck and a half is not too much for a ton of hay. Let farmers see that a sufficient supply of salt is on hand before they commence haying, and then it will not be so likely to be neglected.

The time is approaching when farmers will no longer be satisfied with the present combination of earth, ruts and mud holes in forming what is commonly known as public highways. The rapid increase in railroads and other means of transmission, has imparted quite new ideas of locomotion; and many are becoming very much averse to ploughing through mortar beds with loaded teams. A most durable and desirable substitute may be found in one, wherever scattered stones and gravel beds are accessible. The foundation is made of a layer of rounded stones, which being always more or less irregular, the smaller or sharp end is placed upward; smaller stones are laid near the side of the track-way, and the larger towards the middle, thus giving the road an even convex form — the spaces are then filled with small broken stone or gravel, which by the travelling upon it, is firmly wedged in the stones already laid, and the whole becomes a solid, hard, immovable mass. There are many parts of the country where the fields of the farmer are encumbered with a superabundance of stones, which may be had without cost; and when in addition to this, gravel is accessible, these roads may be made at a very moderate expense, and if well constructed will last a long time.

THE PRAIRIE FARMER, (an American Agricultural Magazine,) in an article on the parsnip, states: "It is excellent as food for horses, cattle, and swine. It is more nutritious than the carrot. The winter butter from the Cows of Jersey and Guernsey, fed on the parsnip, is almost as rich in flavour and colour, as when they are fed in pastures. It bears frost well. If left in the ground all winter, it will be good in the spring. Wood Ashes make a good manure for it. It is more hardy and less liable to disease and to insects than the carrot. Its culture should be that of the turnip and carrot, being a green crop and requiring a deep soil for the growth of its roots. They should be singled whenever the plant can be seen, to a distance of 6 or 8 inches apart in the drill—the stems and leaves spreading more than those of the carrot, require more room. Should be sown as early as possible in the spring; it may also be sown in the fall. The Carrot, Parsnip and Mangel Wurtzel suffer little from insects.

A careful, saving, manufacture, and good application of MANURE, would promote a great improvement with many. Much of the value of the products of the barn-yard are lost from want of a good supply of straw, dried muck or peat, to absorb the liquid portions. Much is lost by its wrong application, and especially by the want of its thorough admixture with the soil by repeated ploughings and harrowings—the benefits from manure might be very easily tripled on most farms. We do not mean here to include, at all, those who suffer their manure to remain in the yard five years till nine-tenths is lost by fermentation and vapour; nor those who do not apply it at all; nor the man who built his hog pen across a stream, that the cleanings might be conveniently shoveled into the water and washed away. Manure may be even well applied, and well mixed with the soil, and then wasted by an exhausting course.

PREPARATIONS must now be made for a long and severe winter. The summer vehicles and implements should be dried, cleaned, and stowed away. The fences should be put in order, so that none of the fields may be exposed to the poaching of cattle, sheep or hogs. The farmer should walk often about with a hammer and pocket full of nails, patching and repairing the barns and sheds where they require it. The yard should be well-bedded with turf, peat, muck, straw, weeds, saw-dust, or other vegetable matters, at the same time they should be so constructed that the soluble parts of the manure, which are the best, shall not be lost. Finish digging and storing of roots and the fall ploughing. One good ploughing of clay land in the fall is worth two or three in the spring. Husk the corn, make cider, examine and make cuts for the drainage of surface water—underground drains are preferable to surface cuts. The children should be kept close at school, and the farmer should never forget that more attention is due from him toward the improvement of his children than that of land or stock.

The stock now require increased attention—they should be supplied with plenty of water and salt, and fed regularly two or three times every day. Let the farmer keep out of the woods, for farming is not a branch of lumbering, nor are active lumbermen likely to make thrifty husbandmen. Tarash grain, and take produce to market; the good wife ought to have her quota ready of cheese, butter, fowls, hams, sausages, mitens, socks, cloth, wool and feathers; these are all as good as money in town. Let all accounts be settled and debts paid. The crops for each field ought to be arranged, not only for the ensuing summer, but for several years in advance; let there be always a systematic rotation of crops on the farm; let every one take in and study an agricultural periodical, and strive to combine science with practice—practice with science. Fuel and fencing stuff must be prepared and made ready for hauling as soon as possible; cut up as much of the former as possible, and pile it away under cover for summer use—this seems novel, but the farmer will understand, though the lumberman may not. Farewell 1859!

LIGHT HOUSES

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New-Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race, Nfld.; Gulf and River St. Lawrence; and Strait of Belle-Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East Side Halifax harbour. *A fixed light.*

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax harbour. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbour, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg harbour. *Two lights—flash light above; fixed light below.*

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island. *A plain, revolving light.*

FORT POINT harbor light, at the head of Liverpool harbour, southern entrance of the river. *A bright, fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand, when entering the harbour.

PORT MEDWAY—Beacon Light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the port. Building square, painted *white*, with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides, *plain white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

SHELBUENE—McNutt's Island. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. *A flash light*, of fifteen seconds.

CAPE FORECHU LIGHT—On Cape Forechu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth harbor—*A plain revolving light*, visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. Building painted white, and is elevated 135 feet above the level of the sea.

CAPE SABLE, SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South point of Seal Island. *A plain, white light*, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain, white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north-eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. *A fixed, white light.*

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed, white light.*

HORTON BLEFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Mines, 95 feet above sea level, high-water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted white; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blowmedon), and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An Octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to La Have River. *A bright, flash light*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy feet above sea level.

RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR LIGHT—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear, fixed light*, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in Lat. 43° 39' N. and Long. 64° 66' W.

PUBNICO HARBOR LIGHT—A Beacon Light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico Harbor, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A fixed, red light*, on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high-water level, (rise and fall twelve feet), and stands fifty fathoms from low-water mark. The point of beach is bold.

A FOG BELL has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute.

EASTERN BEAVER, or WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A revolving light.*

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other,

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU—*A fixed light.*

EDDY, or SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbor, head of Chelabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU LIGHT—On the south-east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—on the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, fifty-two feet above high-water mark.

ARICHAU BEACON—A Light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, thirty-four feet above the sea-level.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light*.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbor. *A fixed light*.

SEA-WOLF, OR MARGARIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a-half miles. *A plain, white light*. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted white, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island, the light may become observed by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from the Margarie and North Canso lights.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high-water; rise and fall, six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, off the Eastern coast of Cape Breton. Lat. 40 degrees, 11 5 N., and Long. 59 degrees, 45 50 W., and exhibits a *bright, flash light*, every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is sixty-five feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of twelve miles.

St. PAUL'S ISLAND—*A fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end.

SCATTARIE ISLAND—*A revolving light*, on the east end of the Island.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white, flash light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light, in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and the southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull—this may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—*Two fixed, white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high-water, and bear from

each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, (British or American). Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as they will be, then, not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, 1st more than five miles to the E. of the lights.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain, *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white*, with a *red* cross on it.

POINT LE PRAU LIGHTS—Upon this projecting headland, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT—At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. *A fixed, white light*. The building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACO LIGHT—*A revolving, white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quaco Head, showing twice fall and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENLAGE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain, white light*.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT—This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

A **LIGHT HOUSE** has been erected upon **CAPE RACE**, Newfoundland, *a fixed white light*, from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E., round by the S. E. and S. to W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped red and white vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down. The light house is in Lat. 46 degrees 39 minutes 19 seconds N., Long. 53 degrees 2 minutes 38 seconds W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 degrees W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle :

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT—An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south west point of the island. *A single fixed white light*. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour. Lat. N. 54° 53' 00"; Long. W. 55° 26' 00". Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles.

POINTE AMOUR LIGHT, Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Fortean Bay, Lat. N. $57^{\circ} 27' 30''$; Long. W. $56^{\circ} 53' 40''$. *A single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $18\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $21\frac{1}{4}$ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

ANTIPOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme point west end of the island of Anti-costi—Lat. N. $49^{\circ} 52' 30''$, Long. W. $64^{\circ} 35' 00''$. *A single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT—East coast of Gaspé, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. $48^{\circ} 51' 00''$, Long. W. $64^{\circ} 15' 00''$. *A single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather $16\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $19\frac{1}{4}$ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

Signals will be given at or near each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

The Mails for the United Kingdom are closed finally at Halifax every alternate *Thursday* Evening at 8 o'clock. Letters, &c., for England, which may be dropped into the box *after the hour of closing* and up to the arrival of the Packet, will be forwarded in a bag, loose—but such letters CANNOT BE PREPAID, either in money or stamps. The Royal Mail Steamers leave Boston for Halifax and Liverpool, G. B., every alternate *Wednesday*; arrive at Halifax on *Thursday* evening or very early the succeeding morning, leaving Halifax immediately after receiving the Mails.

Letters to or from England, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d., *prepayment optional*;—can be prepaid by using a 6d. or two 3d. Stamps, together with *half of a three-penny Stamp* cut diagonally. Registered letters addressed to the United Kingdom, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; to Australia, &c., and foreign countries, and other places, passing through the United Kingdom, 1s. 3d., in addition to the postage—the 3d. Stamp only is allowed to be cut and that diagonally. Newspapers free.

The Postage on Books from Great Britain to Nova Scotia, or *vice versa*, is for a packet not exceeding 4 oz., 4d.; 4 oz. and not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb., 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. and not exceeding 1 lb., 1s. 3d.; 1 lb. and not exceeding 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb., 1s. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. and not exceeding 2 lb., 2s. 6d.; and so on, increasing 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. or fraction of a $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Printed or lithographed letters addressed to any part of the UNITED KINGDOM can be sent like other printed matter, as follows: for a single letter or packet of letters, open at the sides or ends, not exceeding 4 oz., 4d., and so on, according to the scale above for charging books. One book package may contain separate Books, Publications, Almanacks, and Maps and Paper, Parchment or Vellum; the latter three materials may be written or

printed on—the package may contain the name and address of the sender. Rollers may accompany prints and maps, and markers may be sent with books. No letter must be sent with or written on a book package, and no such package must exceed *two feet* in length, width or depth. The Postage must in all cases be *prepaid* by Stamps.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* United States are made up at Halifax to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York.*" Letters 10d.; Newspapers 1d. each.

The Mails for the United States *via* Boston, per Royal Mail Steamers are made up on *Tuesday Evening* of the week in which the Packet from England is due, at 3 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, *supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer from Liverpool arrive previous to Tuesday night—the Mails as heretofore will close *immediately on her arrival.*

A closed Mail for Canada is made up and forwarded at the same time in charge of the British Officer. Letters so forwarded must be specially addressed "Closed Mail for Canada;" postage 7½d.—*prepayment optional.*

The Mails for Bermuda and the West Indies, are made up *finally* at Halifax on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston, at 8 o'clock.

Letters 5d.—when posted in the interior, 3d. additional, this must be prepaid. Newspapers 1½d. each, which must be prepaid by Stamp.

Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda for Chagres and the Pacific, Chili and Peru, Havanna, Honduras, Lagnyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands.

Postage to Foreign West Indies, *five pence* when posted at Halifax: 3d. additional when posted in the interior—*must be prepaid.* Newspapers 1½d. each, *to be prepaid by Stamp.*

The Mails for Newfoundland, (and Cape Breton, during the Summer months,) are made up at Halifax, *once a month*, during the months of December, January, February and March; and *once a fortnight* during the months of April, May, June, July, August, September, October and November, closing *finally* on the *Thursday Evening* of the week in which the Royal Mail Steamer is expected to arrive from Boston.—Postage 5d.; when posted in the interior 3d. additional. Newspapers 1½d. each, which must be prepaid.

The Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded to Sydney, C.B. from whence they are despatched by the French Packet during the summer months, and from Halifax direct in the winter-months. Letters 5d when posted at Halifax, and 3d. inland when posted in the interior—*prepayment optional.*

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage of 3l. on a letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight has been established throughout British North America. To any part of the United States 6d.; to Oregon and California 9d.,

Letters posted in any Town within the Province for delivery in the same Town, are liable to a rate of *one penny* for every ½ ounce.

Newspapers pass *free* to any part of the Province, British North America and the United States when sent by *land Mail*—to be put up in Covers open at the ends.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, and other printed matter of a like description, put up in covers open at the ends, and

without any written communication, may be sent from any part of the Province to any place within the same, as well as through Nova Scotia, at the rate of *one penny per oz.*—*prepayment optional*, except when addressed to the United States, in which case the postage must be *prepaid*.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals, or Books, bound or unbound, done up in covers open at the ends, unaccompanied by any written communication, may be transmitted as above mentioned through the Mail in this Province: not exceeding 2 oz., in weight—free; 2 oz. and not 3, 1d.; 3 oz. and not 4, 1½d.; 4 oz. and not 5, 2d.; adding ½d for every additional oz. up to 48 oz., beyond which weight they cannot be sent by Mail.

Parliamentary papers pass free through Nova Scotia; if forwarded by packet, 1d. for every 4 ounces.

British reprints of copyright works from the United States, by *land mail* or *steamer*, charged letter postage.

For Dartmouth, *daily*—postage 1d.

For Musquodoboit Harbor, every Tuesday morning, at 9 o'clock. Return Mail due on Monday afternoon at 5 o'clock.

For Prospect, on Saturday afternoon, at 2 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday morning, at 11 o'clock.

For Ketch Harbor and Sambro, on Friday evening at 10 o'clock. Return Mail due on Saturday.

✉ Letters for *Registry* must be posted half an hour previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be forwarded, and the *postage*, as well as the registration fee, must be *prepaid*.

Letters *prepaid by Stamps*, and dropped into the Letter Box any time during the night, and up to 5 o'clock, A.M., will be forwarded by the mails despatched same morning.

When the mails from England arrive before 9, P.M., they are delivered the same evening, and after that hour, at 7 next morning.

All other Mails arriving before 7 P.M., will be delivered the same evening,—if after that hour and before 8, at 6 o'clock,—and if after 8, at 7 o'clock the following morning.

The Postmaster-General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.

The Postmaster-General has the exclusive privilege of receiving and conveying letters within the Province—any person receiving and conveying letters will incur a penalty of 5s. for every letter so conveyed; except, 1. Letters sent to be mailed in the first Way or Post Office; 2. Letters addressed to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a private vessel not being a packet boat; 3. Letters sent by a messenger on purpose, concerning the private affairs of the sender or receiver; 4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Post Office; 5. Letters of merchants, owners of merchant vessels, or cargo sent by such vessels, and delivered to the persons to whom addressed without charge or pay. No person is obliged to send any pamphlet, printed book, or newspaper, by post. Masters of vessels arriving in the Province are entitled to 1½d for each letter they deliver to the Postmaster at the first office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate when inward bound.
