Statement of Major General Cheng
Lu-k'an, Deputy Director of Army
Medical Headquarters, Chinese Army.
Kau-tung Province, Kiangsu
1928, gave me a medical degree.
Oct 1941 I was at ICHANG, HUPEI
Province, when the Chinese Army
counter attacked against the Japanese.
The Japanese were in a bad situation,
in danger of being surrounded by the
Chinese. The Japanese resorted to the
use of poison gas, and in my
position at the first aid station I
personally saw men who were
burnt about the eyes, the arm
pits, and the crotch. I had no
opportunity to make a written
diagnosis of the cases, but the
Foreign Red Cross doctors and myself
diagnosed the cases as mustard
gas poisoning, and saw some

30 or 40 soldiers affected in the manner described above. I sent some soldiers back to Chungking to be cured at the hospital and for a further diagnosis. I was informed that some 600 or 700 men were gassed at the front, and included in this number were the men I saw. The photos in Exhibit "A" I directed to be taken. I will endeavor to get the names of the doctor and other persons who can also testify about this.

I was the man who made report by Cuba about bacteriological warfare to the Ministry of Health, and concerning the sowing of bacteriological Bubonic plague germs by the Japanese in China. Henry Chin Chan translated the statement and he signed in Chinese.
