Major KATO and the others seemed eager to be of assistance but expressed the opinion that almost all figures and data had been lost or destroyed by borbing and fire. However, by nemory and the little data that remained, they thought that answers (in figures or approximate percentages) could be obtained on:

- 1. The organization set-up and functions of the military clothing Depots.
  - 2. Location and types of the above.
- 3. Production capacities and production figures from 1930 to Sept 1945.
- 4. Approximate percentage of amount contributed by civilian factories.
- 5. Amount of bomb damage suf ered and affect on production.
  - 6. Number of employees.
  - 7. Separation of Cotton and woolen figures.
- 8. How much of goods intended for the military were diverted to civilian use.
  - 9. How much raw material was imported.
- 10. How far in advance was production planned and how closely the planned schedule was adhered to.
  - 11. What reserve stocks were raintained.
  - 12. What stocks still remain.
